MINUTES OF QUARTERLY MEETING

The Little River Association of Free Will Baptists held it's first quarterly meeting of 1998 on January 17, at the Tifton First Free Will Baptist Church. The meeting opened with a congregational song, "When He Put a Little Sunshine In", followed with a prayer by Rev. Everette Williams. The devotion was given by Rev. Mitchell Deems, pastor of the Forest Hill FWB Church, and his text was taken from Joel 2:28-32.

The welcome from the host church was given by Rev. Gerald Brown and the response from the association was given by Rev. Keith Lloyd.

Moderator Rowan Sirmans called the meeting to order and Sis. Ann Mercer gave the Credentials Committee report. The report was as follows: 13 churches, 11 pastors, 5 other ministers, 10 deacons, and 56 delegates were present. This made the total number of voting delegates for the day, 82. A motion was made and carried by the standing delegates to seat these representatives.

The State COOP offering was received and totaled \$198.40. The minutes and treasurers report from the last meeting were read and approved as given. Sis. Bambi Griffis and Sis. Melissa Cunningham were appointed to serve as temporary delegates to the Finance Committee due to the absence of other members.

Reports of Boards & Committees:

Executive Committee: Rev. Keith Lloyd read a report from the Executive Committee. The report was received as given and becomes an integral part of these minutes.

Ordaining Council: Rev. Steve Hughes read a letter of good standing from the Georgia Union Association on behalf of Rev. Gerald Brown. Bro. Steve also read a letter of intent

Union Association on behalf of Rev. Gerald Brown. Bro. Steve also read a letter of intent and apology from the Midway Association on behalf of Rev. Damon Dodd. Bro. Dodd's letter of good standing will be provided at the next quarterly meeting. Rev. Gerald Brown was given the right hand of fellowship from Moderator Rowan Sirmans.

LRA Mission Board: Rev. Steve Hughes thanked the association for the support and success of the Mission Rally. Bro. Steve also announced that he would be leaving the Little River Association to assume a pastorate at the Savannah First FWB Church. Bro. Steve graciously volunteered to help the Mission Board any way he could in plans for this year's Mission Rally. The Mission Board report was received as information.

LRA Christian Education Board: Rev. Kent Barwick explained that there had been a mix-up in scheduling, therefore the plans to highlight evangelistic techniques and Sunday School enlargement campaigns had to be post-poned indefinitely. The C.E. report was received as information.

Finance Committee: Bro. Chester Chancey gave the Finance Committee report. His report was received as given and becomes an integral part of these minutes.

GA State Mission Board: Rev. Steve Hiughes informed the association of the intention of the state to sell the North Fayette Mission. They have a letter of intent to purchase from the congregation that is now renting the facility, and they have a tentative location chosen for new construction. Bro. Steve make a motion that Rev. Rowan Sirmans

represent the LRA at the next Mission Board meeting on January 31. The motion was seconded and carried and the report was received as information.

GA State Trustee Board: Bro. Ronnie Hamm reported on the state's action to sell the State Office building in Moultrie and rent a facility until a more suitable location could be found. Bro. Ronnie also commended Bro. C.M. Chafin for his faithfulness to the LRA and his service on the State Trustee Board. His report was received as information.

GA State Camp Board: Bro. Roger Mercer reported that the State Camp Board had set dates for Teen Camp to be held on July 26-31, at the Rock Eagle 4-H Camp in Covington. This report was given as information.

GA Sate Christian Education Board: Rev. Kent Barwick reported that plans for the Minister's Retreat on Jekyll Island were being finalized; a retreat for minister's wives was being discussed; the Sr. Citizens Retreat is being planned. Bro. Kent noted the increased participation in the various retreats. He also gave information about the status of GA's support of the FWBBC students. This report was received as information.

National Fund Raising Drive: Rev. Steve Hughes reported on the State's action to pay the remainder of our commitment from the Contigency Fund. Received as information. Double-in-a Decade Membership Drive: Rev. Keith Lloyd report on the demise of this campaign, but encouraged the accurate reporting of membership from association churches. This report was received as information.

LRA Camp Board: Rev. Kent Barwick, reporting for the Camp Board, recommended the use of the old Ozias church site for an association camp and retreat center; recommended that the LRA build shower facilities at this site; and solicited the physical and financial support of LRA churches in this endeavour. A motion was made and seconded to approve the Camp Board's recommendation. After much discussion and enthusiastic response, the motion carried unanimously. Tentative camp dates for Jr. Camp (grades 1-6) were set at June 14-19. The Camp Board report becomes an integral part of these minutes.

Old Business:

* Rev. Kent Barwick made a motion that the LRA Trustee Board look in to the property in Nashville, GA, that was reportedly given to the LRA, and to present their report to the Executive Committee within a month. The motion was seconded. Further information concerning the property was given by Rev. Everette Williams and Rev. R.S. Hayes. Said property was reported to have been donated by Sis. Aleen Brown for the purpose of establishing a FWB church on Nashville. The motion carried.

New Business:

- * Rev. Max Cunningham was elected to replace Rev. Steve Hughes on the LRA Mission Board.
- * A motion was made by Bro. James Faircloth that the LRA establish a Mission Rally as an annual event instead of voting on it yearly. The motion was seconded and carried.
- * Rev. Charles Parrish, representing the Resolutions Committee, brought two resolutions before the association. The first concerns an expression of thanks for Rev. Steve Hughes and his faithful service to the LRA. The second concerns an expression of thanks to the Tifton First Church for their hospitality as hosts of this meeting. These resolutions were

accepted and acted upon by the association. These resolution will be printed in their entirety following the minutes.

With no further business, announcements from churches were received and a motion to adjourn from the business session was made, seconded and carried.

The congregational hymn "Heaven's Jubilee" was followed by special music from the Tifton First Church. Rev. Sim Youngblood, pastor of the Sunnyside FWB Church, delivered the morning message and his text was taken from Mark 12:28-34 on "The First and Greatest Commandment".

A special prayer for Rev. Steve Hughes was offered by Moderator Rowan Sirmans and the ministers of the LRA. Rev. Gerald Brown dismissed us in prayer and a wonderful lunch was provided by the members of the Tifton First Free Will Baptist Church.

MINUTES OF ANNUAL MEETING

The Little River Association of Free Will Baptists held it's 92nd Annual Meeting on October 17, 1998, at the Homerville Free Will Baptist Church. The Executive Committee will attempt to set up a meeting with the leadership of the Valdosta First FWB Church and offer our assistance in helping them find a Free Will Baptist minister to fill the pulpit. Rev. Charles Parrish agreed to try to schedule this meeting and report back to the Committee.

In further business, the Executive Committee, acting on behalf of the Association, agreed to give \$300.00 to Bro. James Evans, of Benchmark Adventure Ministries, as adequate and fair compensation for his ministry to us during the quarterly meeting. Benchmark Adventure Ministries, after being approved by the Association, had been contacted and scheduled by the LRA Christian Education Board, as an effort to promote Sunday School and church growth in our Association.

The meeting was adjourned in prayer.
