



### HISTORY OF NEW HOME FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH, INC.

According to the best information available, New Home Free Will Baptist Association. There were 51 members with Rev. E. A. Drake serving as pastor and G. R. Newberry as clerk. Services held monthly on fourth Sunday. Pastor was paid \$13.24 for the year. About 1903, land was given, and the first frame building was erected where the old sanctuary now stands. Rev. W. H. (Pap) Stevens was pastor. In 1909, Rev. J. W. Norris was pastor, and W. L. Lambert was clerk.

In 1927, New Home voted to replace the old building. A Methodist church building in Boykin was bought, torn down, and moved to the present location where it was rebuilt on the site of the existing sanctuary.

By 1958, services were held on the 2nd and 4th Sunday. Membership had increased to 122, and the pastor was paid \$524.10.

Sunday School rooms were added onto the north side of the sanctuary in 1965. Sunday School attendance had risen to 60, and 56 attended league.

In 1967, the church was having full time services. The Woman's Auxiliary had 20 members with Mrs. Terrell Mock as president. Rev. Bobby Whitaker was pastor, and Leonard Varnum was clerk.

In 1971, an eight-room two-bath brick parsonage was built beside the church, and by 1974 it was debt-free. In 1974 the Sunday School building was completed and debt-free in 1975. In addition, the church was furnished with new pews and carpet. Air conditioning was installed, and the existing sanctuary renovated. Ground-breaking ceremonies were held on May 23, 1976 to begin the new church building. Howard Roberts was in charge of the project with Lewis Melton in charge of masonry work. Much labor was done by the church men, and some labor donated by men of the community. The first service (wedding) was held in the new church on December 4, 1976. Dedication Day was May 15, 1977.

Masters Men was organized in 1974 with Curtis Williams as president.

A new kitchen was built and equipped in 1976 adjacent to the social hall (or old sanctuary), and the parsonage property has been improved.

Other pastors have been Reverends E. F. Williams, M. A. Sheffield, A. P. Norris, A. B. Ard, H. L. Catrett, B. W. Clenney, W. H. Horne, J. B. Lumpkin, I. O. Cook, B. H. Parrish, J. J. Scott, W. S. Driggers, Larry Williams, Bobby Whitaker, Kenneth Kirby, Damon C. Dodd, and Mance Cason.

#### A BRIEF HISTORY OF MT. GLORY CHURCH

Mt. Glory Free Will Baptist Chruch began its work as a mission. In 1912 it was organized into Mt. Glory FWB Church. There were 7 charter members. Bro. Dave Braswell was the first pastor. In 1929 Bro. J. L. Johnson was called and served until his death in 1930. Bro. J. L. Johnson gave the land for the church. In 1920 members from the First Presbyterian Church of Quincy, Fla. helped to organize Sunday School.

### **CHURCH COVENANT**

Having given to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise, by His grace, to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, faith, and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ."

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel; nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the"

unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principles sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society, constantly praying and toiling that the kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday Schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.
