MARTIN DISTRICT WOMAN'S AUXILIARY CONVENTION October 1, 1992

The Martin District Woman's Auxiliary Convention was held at Colquitt Free Will Baptist Church on October 1, 1992, with the theme of "Reaching Young Women: Teacher of Good Things," (Titus 2:3-5). Musicians were Beverly Richardson, Song Director, and Ruth Russell, pianist. Registration began at 7:00 p.m.

Service began with congregational hymn, "Joy Unspeakable." Janice Ursrey led in prayer. Welcome given by Minnie Cobb. Ruth Russell reported on WNAC 1992.

President, Margaret Ann Daniels, opened meeting for business. She noted that copies of WNAC resolutions were available. Ruth Russell gave Credentials report: Auxiliaries reporting - 6 (6 auxiliaries at beginning and at ending of year); members at beginning of year - 75; members added - 6; members lost 11; total members at end of year - 70; total dues paid \$192.50. Janice Ursrey's name to be given to represent our District to serve on the State Nominations Committee.

Minutes were read. MSC to approve as read. Call for any other business - none. Additional visitor recognized: Debbie Sloan.
