-Minutes-1st Quarterly Session January 7, 2006

The Martin Association of Free Will Baptists convened at NewHome Free Will Baptist Church Miller County at 10:00 a.m. Moderator Bro. Jerry Calhoun called the meeting to order. After opening prayer by Rev. Kent Barwick, the body sang "This Is The Day". Bro. Wendell Cox gave a warm welcome to the Association, and Bro. Billy Adams gave the response. The devotion was given by Bro. Scot Roberts using "His mercies are new every morning" as the theme and Lamentations 3:19-26 as the scripture.

Business Session - All ordained and licensed ministers were asked to stand and be recognized. All ordained deacons were recognized in like manner. All elected delegates were asked to stand. A motion was made, seconded, and carried to seat the delegates. There were no visitors present. The program was adopted by unanimous approval. The roll call of all the churches in the Martin Association was taken with nine churches present. The Moderator appointed a Resolutions Committee (Mandy Roland and Lynn Frazier) and a Credentials Committee (Debra Middleton and Claude Newsome). The Moderator then called for a short recess.

When the meeting reconvened, Sis. Mandy Roland reported the following resolutions from the Resolutions Committee:

- 1. Be it resolved that we encourage our association's younger couples to participate in the Martin Association quarterly meetings.
- 2. Be it resolved we gather as many of the unchurched children of our communities into our churches as soon as possible so they may have the opportunity to learn about salvation through our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.
- 3. Be it resolved that the Martin Association adopts the following verse of scripture as our theme, "If my people, which are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land." II Chronicles 7:14.
- 4. Be it resolved we give our host church a rising vote of thanks for their hospitality.

There was a motion, second and approval to accept these resolutions. Clerk Bobby Richardson then read the minutes from the last meeting. There was a motion, second and approval to accept as read. Attention was then called to the Treasurer's Report, by Sis. Jewel Maddox, which was recorded on page 17 of the 2005 Quarterly Session handbook. There was a motion, second, and approval to receive this report as written.

The State Trustee Board Report was given by Bro. Wendell Cox. Bro. Gerald Thompson gave the State Mission Board Report. He stated we are looking at planting a church in Harris County, between Columbus and LaGrange. Rev. Jeff Sloan from Ft. Wayne, Indiana, has shown an interest in coming to Harris County. The Valdosta work had 25 people at their worship services in December. They are trying to sell the present property and purchase a new location. The Cartersville church is having a problem leasing a building and is now meeting in Bro. Crank's garage. Rev. Kent Barwick then gave the State Christian Education Board Report. He stated that information on the Retreats can be found in the Promotional Bulletin. He also mentioned the "Building Kingdom Stewards" seminar to be held on Feb. 25, 2006 at the Albany First FWB Church. Rev. Barwick also gave the Ordaining Council Report. The Ordaining Council asks that Mt. Gilead Church send a formal letter asking for them to request a letter of good standing from Rev. Randy Hawk's former association. In lieu of a Women Active for Christ Report, Pam Roberts announced the annual WAC Convention to be held on Saturday, Jan. 14, 2006, at Mt. Gilead Church. There was a motion, second, and approval to receive these reports as information.

The Credentials Report was given by Bro. Claude Newsome. Regular fees totaled \$362.50, Beneveolent Fund was \$705.00, National fees were \$300.00, for a total of \$1367.50. Attendance banners were awarded to New Home Miller County for highest number present and Hebrew Church for the highest percent present. There was a motion, second, and approval to receive this report as information.

Miscellaneous business: Delegates were needed for the state meeting, and Bro. Gerald Thompson, Rev. Kent Barwick and Rev. Roger Mercer plan to attend the meeting. There was motion and second to change from quarterly meetings to semi-annual meetings. The motion failed to receive the two-thirds majority vote required for a constitutional change. There was a motion, second, and approval to change the Benevolent Fund from \$1 per member to \$2 per member. An offering was taken. The body then recessed for a short time.

Then worship services began with the congregation singing "Bringing In The Sheaves". Special music was rendered by Tim Allen, Kyle Aligood and Pam Roberts, a New Home Church trio, who sang "Let Me Tell You About Jesus" and "There's A Light Guiding Me". Rev. Benjamin Miller brought the morning message from Nehemiah 8:1-12. He challenged all present to "Allow the Word of God to reclaim its importance in your life". Business Session: All ordained and licensed ministers were asked to stand and be recognized. All ordained deacons were recognized in like manner. All elected delegates were asked to stand. - 3. Be it resolved we gather as many of the unchurched people, especially children, within our community into our churches.
- 4. Be it resolved we give our host church a rising vote of thanks for their hospitality.

There was a motion, second and approval to accept these resolutions. Then the minutes were read by the clerk, Bro. Bobby Richardson. There was a motion, second and approval to accept as read.

Bro. Wendell Cox gave the State Trustee Board Report stating that work was being done on the state office as the monies came in to cover it. He said that

all the exterior work had been completed and the inside lacked only the carpet. Bro. Gerald Thompson gave the State Mission Board Report. He stated we are looking for someone to plant a church in Harris County. The Valdosta work has sold its property for \$236,000 pending approval from the bank, and will be looking to purchase new properties in Lowndes County. Rev. Bill Lewis reported that they are averaging 25-30 in attendance on Sundays. The Cartersville church is now leasing a building and is averaging 20-25 in attendance on Sundays. Rev. Andy Merritt gave the Ordaining Council Report. He stated that Rev. Randy Hawk has been accepted into our assiciation pending a letter of good standing from the Tennessee Union Association -Western Quarterly. Rev. Roger Mercer gave the Camping Board Report. He gave the dates for Teen Camp (May 28 - June 2) and Junior Camp (June 25 -June 30) and the cost for each camper. He encouraged each church to go out and find at least one junior/teen that does not attend their church and pay for them to attend camp this summer. There was a motion, second and approval to receive all of these reports as information.

The Credentials Report was given by Bro. Claude Newsome with 12 churches reporting. Regular fees totaled \$411.00, Benevolent Fund was \$1084.00, National fees were \$200.00, for a total of \$1695.00. Attendance banners were awarded to New Home Decatur Co. for highest number present and Hebrew Church for the highest percent present. There was a motion, second and approval to receive this report as information.

Miscellaneous business - Bro. Jerry Calhoun announced that Rev. Paul Park, a Korean representative, has contacted him about wanting to speak in this area. Revivals were announced by Hebrew, Colquitt, and New Home Decatur Co. Churches. A number of Easter Sunrise Services and a community Easter Egg hunt were also announced. Rev. Talmadge Worsley announced that the Ministerial Association had been told of 200 Asian exchange students coming to Georgia on Aug. 1 for a 10 month stay. Christian homes are being sought to keep these students. The body then recessed for a short time.

The worship service began with the congregation singing "Haven Of Rest". Prayer was offered by Rev. Bennie Cumbie. Special music was rendered by the Cumbie Family who sang "Stand Still" and "Take Me In Your Lifeboat". Rev. Benny Cumbie brought the morning message about the practical qualifications of the missionary. Mentioning the statement from the Mission Board Handbook, "If not us, then who", he stated that there are mission fields all around our churches. The service was dismissed with prayer by Bro. Cumbie, and a bountiful meal was served by the New Home Decatur Co. Church family.

CONSTITUTION

PREAMBLE

We, the Martin Association of Free Will Baptists of Georgia, do establish and ordain this Constitution for the purpose of advocating, promoting, and increasing our fellowship with one another as fellow members of the Church of Jesus Christ, and for the extension of the Kingdom of God through the preaching of the Gospel of the divine Son of God.

ARTICLE I

NAME:

This Association shall be called the Martin Association of Free Will Baptists, and shall be composed of such regularly organized and well-disciplined churches as may embody themselves under this constitution.

ARTICLE II

COMPOSITION AND DELEGATES:

Section 1. This Martin Association shall be composed of its general officers, all ordained and licensed ministers of Gospel, all ordained deacons who are in good standing with the churches of which they are members, duly elected delegates from the local churches comprising the Association, and all Home and Foreign Missionaries who are members in good standing with a church belonging to this Association.

Section 2. Local churches shall be allowed two (2) delegates for the first fifty members or fraction thereof, and one (1) delegate for each additional twenty-five (25) members or fraction thereof.

ARTICLE III

MEETINGS:

The Sessions of this Association shall be held quarterly in January, April, July, and October on Saturday following the first Sunday of these months. The place of meeting to be determined by vote of the Association. It shall be the duty of the member churches to represent by letter and delegates at these meetings and report their condition and statistics on forms provided by the Association. The October session shall be considered the annual session of this Association.

ARTICLE IV

INDEPENDENCE OF THE LOCAL CHURCHES:

Every church in this Association shall be considered an independent body and shall control its own internal affairs, having unrestricted right to administer its own government without interference from any higher body, being under Christ free and independent.

ARTICLE V

ASSOCIATIONAL RELATIONSHIP TO THE LOCAL CHURCHES:

The Martin Association shall be considered an advisory board whose function is to meet quarterly at such places as may be determined according to Article III of this Constitution, and not to adjourn formally until all pertinent matters are disposed of. While in session its duty shall be to examine all questions of interest to this Association and to use its best influence to promote Christian, denominational, and benevolent programs and institutions, such as Sunday Schools, Church Training Service, Woman's Auxiliary, Masters Men, Home and Foreign Missions, and child-care institutions. The only punitive power this Association has in relation to the member churches is the right to withdraw fellowship from such churches who are in open violation of the rules and regulations of said Association or who become unsound in the doctrines and practices of the Free Will Baptist Denomination.

ARTICLE VI

OFFICERS:

Section 1. The officers of this Association shall be Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer, Clerk and Assistant Clerk, each of whom shall be elected at the close of the October session and assume the duties of their offices the next day following their election.

Section 2. No individual shall be elected to more than one office at a time.

Section 3. The Moderator may not serve more than (3) terms in succession. The Clerk and Treasurer may serve for an indefinite period of time.

ARTICLE VII

PROCEDURES FOR JOINING THE ASSOCIATION:

A church desiring to become a member of Martin Association shall submit a petitionary letter to the Association at any of its regular quarterly sessions, stating the date and place of organization, the Pastor's name and address, list of all elected officers, number of

members, and time and place of regular meetings. The church must conform to the doctrines, and practices of the Free Will Baptist Denomination as set forth in the Treatise of Faith and Practice of the National Association of Free Will Baptist

the National Association of Free Will Baptists.

This Association reserves the right to send its Executive Committee to investigate any applicant for membership in this Association if it deems necessary and to subsequently act on the report of said Executive Committee before approval for membership becomes final.

ARTICLE VIII

FINANCE:

Section 1. It is suggested that each church comprising this Association send to the Association on a quarterly basis fifty cents (.50) per member to be determined on a total membership basis. However, at the discretion of the churches, inactive members need not be in the per-capita figure, but it is hoped that the churches will elect to include all members, active and inactive, in determining their total fee.

Section 2. Regular funds to the Associational treasury shall be disbursed on a quarterly basis as follows:

A. Retain in the treasury fifty (50) dollars.

B. State Association, fifteen (15) dollars.

C. For printing minutes, one hundred fifty (150) dollars.

D. Moderator's honorarium, fifty (50) dollars; Clerk's honorarium, fifty (50) dollars; Treasurer's honorarium fifty (50) dollars.

E. The remaining funds will be allocated as follows: State Cooperative Program, 70% - Benevolent Fund, 30%.

ARTICLE IX

COMMITTEES, BOARD, COUNCIL

Section 1. Committees may be chosen for any particular function at any session of the Association as the need arises. Unless otherwise specified, the Moderator shall appoint these committees.

Section 2. Standing Committees may be set up by the Association as the need arises and unless otherwise specified, the Moderator shall appoint these committees.

Section 3. The Standing Committees of this Association shall be the Executive Committee and the Investigating Committee. The Executive Committee shall consist of the Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, and three (3) members to be elected annually by the Association.

The Executive Committee shall act for and in behalf of the Martin Association on matters pertaining to its interests which may arise between sessions and which by their nature require immediate action. Such actions shall, however, be subject to final approval by this Association at its next regular session and consequently must be reported in full to the Association at its regular meeting.

The Investigating Committee shall consist of three (3) members who shall be elected as follows: one for a three (3) year term; one for a two (2) year term; and one for a one (1) year term. Election thereafter shall be for the three (3) year term. This committee shall act on instruction from the Association in investigating any irregularities among the churches which threaten the harmony and well being of the Association. It shall have no legislative or jurisdictional powers within itself, but must report all its findings to the Association for official action.

Section 4. There shall be an Ordaining Council consisting of three (3) ordained ministers in good standing with Martin Association. They shall be elected as follows: one for a three (3) year term; one for a two (2) year term; and one for a one (1) year term. Election thereafter shall be for the three (3) year term.

The Ordaining Council shall examine candidates for ordination to the Gospel ministry under the procedures adopted by this Association.* (Guidelines adopted by the State Association.)

ARTICLE X

ALTERATIONS OR AMENDMENTS:

This Consitution may be altered or amended by the Martin Association at any of its regular sessions by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members present and voting, provided that notice of the proposed alteration or amendment be presented in writing, filed with the Clerk of the Association, and read publicly before the Body at least two (2) times at a previous regular meeting.

BY-LAWS

MARTIN ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

- 1. It is recommended that each church close its books on September 1st and mail the quarterly and annual reports to the clerk two weeks before each session of the Association.
 - 2. It is suggested that the Pastoral year begin September first.
- 3. All business of this Body shall be conducted according to established parliamentary procedures as set forth in Robert's Rules of Order.
- 4. No member shall absent himself from the house without leave from the Moderator, and no member shall leave the Association without the consent of the Body.
- 5. The Woman's Auxiliary, and any other Auxiliary of this Association shall give an annual written report at the October meeting.
- 6. Obituary reports from each church should give name, date of birth, and date of death of deceased members in the annual report to the Association. This information will be given to the Resolutions Committee.
- 7. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to call the meeting to order and to maintain order and harmony.
- 8. It shall be the duty of the Assistant Moderator to assume the duties of the Moderator in his/her absence or upon the request of the Moderator.
- 9. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to keep accurate financial records in terms of receipts, expenditures, and balance of funds to be reported to the Association quarterly and prepared for yearly publication.
- 10. The Assistant Treasurer shall perform such duties as are incumbent on the Treasurer in his/her absence or upon the request of the Treasurer.
- 11. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to keep a minute of the proceedings and to prepare the Minutes for publication, including all items of business, committee reports, and all other matters which effect the program of this Association.
- 12. The Assistant Clerk shall perform such duties as are incumbent on the Clerk in his/her absence or upon request of the Clerk.
- 13. These By-Laws may be amended by a two-thirds (2/3) vote at any regular session.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in Heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday Schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world.

And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.
