

-Minutes-1st Quarterly Session January 13, 2007

The Martin Association of Free Will Baptists convened at 10:00 a.m. at Colquitt First Free Will Baptist Church. Moderator Bro. Jerry Calhoun called the meeting to order. After opening prayer by Rev. Andy Merritt, the body sang "When the Roll is Called up Yonder." Sis. Elise Williams gave a warm welcome to the Assoication, and Bro. Benjamin Miller gave the response. The devotional, entitled "Taming of the Tongue," was given by Bro. Cleve Roland who used James 3:1-8 for the scripture.

Business Session: All ordained and licensed ministers were asked to stand and be recognized. All ordained deacons were recognized in like manner. All elected delegates were asked to stand. A motion was made, seconded, and carried to seat the delegates. There were three visitors recognized: Rev. Fred Hersey and Bro. & Sis. Jim Tolbert. The program was adopted by unanimous approval. The roll call of churches was taken with nine churches present. The Moderator appointed a Resolutions Committee (Sis. Mandy Roland and Sis. Jara Miller) and a Credentials Committee (Bro. Bobby Roberts and Bro. Gerald Thompson). The Moderator then called for a short recess.

When the meeting reconvened, Bro. Randy Adams led in prayer and the offering was taken. Then Sis. Jara Miller reported the following resolutions from the Resolutions Committee:

- 1. Be it resolved that the Martin Association adopt the following scripture verse as our theme for this year: "Pure and undefiled religion before God and the Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their trouble, and to keep oneself unspotted from the world." James 1:27
- 2. Be it resolved we be more vocal in opposing the many moral issues confronting Christians today.
- 3. Be it resolved that we encourage all church members to faithfully attend all church services and related business events.
- 4. Be it resolved we give our host church a rising vote of thanks for their hospitality.

There was a motion, second, and approval to accept these resolutions. Then Bro. Bobby Richardson read the minutes from the last meeting. There was a motion, second, and approval to accept these as read. Then attention was called to the Treasurer's Report in the 2006 Quarterly Session Booklet. There was a motion, second, and approval to receive this report as written.

There was no Executive Committee Report. Bro. Wendell Cox stated that there had been no State Trustee Board Meeting and he had no report. Bro. Gerald Thompson stated that there had been no State Mission Board Meeting, but that they were still looking for someone to plant a church in Harris County. In giving the State Christian Education Board Report, Rep. Kent Barwick reminded everyone to keep checking the Promotional Bulletin for all the upcoming seminars. He further stated that eighty-five teens had attended the recent Teen Retreat. Rev. Barwick stated that the Ordaining Council recommended that the credentials of Rev. Roger Mercer be revoked. The Credentials Report was given by Bro. Bobby Roberts with 12 churches reporting. Regular fees totaled \$420.00, Benevolent Fund was \$1262.00, National fees were \$300.00, for a total \$ 1982.00. Attendance banners were awarded to Colquitt First FWB for highest number present and Highway Church for the highest percent present. There was motion, second, and approval to receive this report as information.

Miscellaneous Business: Delegates were needed for the state meeting in Macon. Bro. Gerald Thompson, Rev. Kent Barwick and Rev. Bobby Whittaker plan to attend the meeting and were appointed to serve as delegates from the Martin Association. Rev. Fred Hersey reported on the "Change the World" Missions Offering due April 29th, 2007. He showed a brief video explaning this program. Then Bro. Jim Tolbert spoke on behalf of FWB Family Ministries in Greenville, Tennessee. He provided numerous brochures including one on the Hope Center, a home for young unwed mothers-to-be. The body then recessed for a short time.

Then worship services began with the congregation singing "Where Could I Go?" and "Just Over in the Glory Land." Special music was rendered by Bro. Buddy Johnson who sang "Rise Again." Rev. Kent Barwick brought the morning message from Matthew 16:13-20. He challenged all present to "make sure that you are part of God's church" by Surrendering, Searching, being Sensitive to the Holy Spirit, Sanitizing, and Staying with the Sciptures. The blessing was prayed by Rev. Talmadge Worsley, and a bountiful meal was served by the Colquitt FWB Church family.

Attendance banners were awarded to Colquitt FWB Church for highest number present and to Highway Church for the highest percent present. There was a motion, second, and approval to receive this report as information.

Miscellaneous business: Nathan and Linda Snow will be speaking in churches in Georgia from Sept. 2007 through April 2008. They would like to come and visit in our churches. Various homecomings, Bible Schools and sings were announced, and the body then recessed for a short time.

The worship services began with the congregation singing "I'll Fly Away." Prayer was offered by Bro. Earl Daniels. Special music was rendered by Sis. Eloise Daniels and Rev. The Martin Association Annual WAC convened Saturday, September 29, 2007 at Thompson Free Will Baptist Church. Theme was "Travel Light." Registration began at 9:30 a.m. The meeting began at 10:00 a.m. Patricia Grimes served as pianist and Martha Cox as Song Director.

The program opened with a congregational hymn, "Jesus Saves." President Maxine Torbert led in prayer. Grace Nix gave a very warm welcome to everyone present. Congregational hymn, "The Regions Beyond." Call for the WNAC report. No one attending the annual convention was present, so no report was given. Maxine Torbert read the scripture for our theme study, from Hebrew Chapter 12.

Motion, seconded, and carried to accept Mission Study report. A WAC information booklet prepared by the District Secretary was distributed to each lady for their persual. They were encouraged to make use of it in their local groups to answer any questions and to be proactive in utilizing the tools provided by GWAC and WNAC. Pam Roberts administered a short quiz to encourage more prayerful involvement in missions.

Arlene Worsley, District Treasurer, distributed copies of the Treasurer's Report and Financial Report. Copies are attached. The reports represent

2 years of transactions, for 2006 and 2007. Balance in the Treasury as of September 28, 2007 was \$892.33. Motion, seconded, and carrried to accept report. Call for Resolutions Committee Report. No report was offered.

Call Martin Association delegates to Georgia Women Active for Christ Convention in Gainsville on March 13-14, 2008. There were no volunteers. Maxine said that any member who later plans to attend could serve as a delegate and let the secretary know.

Representatives from each church was given an opportunity to make announcements. Colquitt Church announced "Ladies Night Out." The reservations had been met, but this would be an ongoing ministry to all ladies in the community in the future. Grace Nix gave the Registration Committee Report: Total in attendance: 22, which includes 20 members and 2 vistors; with 5 churches represented (Colquitt, Mt. Gilead, New Home, New Salem, Thompson). Motion, seconded, and carried to accept registration report.

This convention would have been the time for the presentation of Nominations Committee Report. No committee members were present. So this report was tabled. The term for the existing officers is expired. There was a 10 minute break, after which, the attendance banner was given to Thompson Church. Pam Roberts read the minutes. Motion, seconded, and carried to adopt.

Worship hour began with a congregational hymn, "Bring Them In." An offering was received. The special music was rendered by Martha Cox and Pam Roberts, singing "Come Thou Fount," followed by Pam singing "Broken and Spilled Out." Pam introduced the guest speaker, Mrs. Linda Snow, missionary to Japan. Linda shared her personal testimony. She shared that our most important ministry to the missionary families is prayer. She encouraged us to continue in our support of missions through the WNAC, even though we are a small group. She also shared specific prayer requests. BY-LAWS

MARTIN ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

- 1. It is recommended that each church close its books on September 1st and mail the quarterly and annual reports to the clerk two weeks before each session of the Association.
 - 2. It is suggested that the Pastoral year begin September first.
- 3. All business of this Body shall be conducted according to established parliamentary procedures as set forth in Robert's Rules of Order.
- 4. No member shall absent himself from the house without leave from the Moderator, and no member shall leave the Association without the consent of the Body.
- 5. The Woman's Auxiliary, and any other Auxiliary of this Association shall give an annual written report at the October meeting.
- 6. Obituary reports from each church should give name, date of birth, and date of death of deceased members in the annual report to the Association. This information will be given to the Resolutions Committee.
- 7. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to call the meeting to order and to maintain order and harmony.
- 8. It shall be the duty of the Assistant Moderator to assume the duties of the Moderator in his/her absence or upon the request of the Moderator.
- 9. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to keep accurate financial records in terms of receipts, expenditures, and balance of funds to be reported to the Association quarterly and prepared for yearly publication.
- 10. The Assistant Treasurer shall perform such duties as are incumbent on the Treasurer in his/her absence or upon the request of the Treasurer.
- 11. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to keep a minute of the proceedings and to prepare the Minutes for publication, including all items of business, committee reports, and all other matters which effect the program of this Association.
- 12. The Assistant Clerk shall perform such duties as are incumbent on the Clerk in his/her absence or upon request of the Clerk.
- 13. These By-Laws may be amended by a two-thirds (2/3) vote at any regular session.

CONSTITUTION

PREAMBLE

We, the Martin Association of Free Will Baptists of Georgia, do establish and ordain this Constitution for the purpose of advocating, promoting, and increasing our fellowship with one another as fellow members of the Church of Jesus Christ, and for the extension of the Kingdom of God through the preaching of the Gospel of the divine Son of God.

ARTICLE 1

NAME:

This Association shall be called the Martin Association of Free Will Baptists, and shall be composed of such regularly organized and well-disciplined churches as may embody themselves under this constitution.

ARTICLE II

COMPOSITION AND DELEGATES:

Section 1. This Martin Association shall be composed of its general officers, all ordained and licensed ministers of Gospel, all ordained deacons who are in good standing with the churches of which they are members, duly elected delegates from the local churches comprising the Association, and all Home and Foreign Missionaries who are members in good standing with a church belonging to this Association.

Section 2. Local churches shall be allowed two (2) delegates for the first fifty members or fraction thereof, and one (1) delegate for each additional twenty-five (25) members or fraction thereof.

ARTICLE III

MEETINGS:

The Sessions of this Association shall be held quarterly in January, April, July, and October on Saturday following the first Sunday of these months. The place of meeting to be determined by vote of the Association. It shall be the duty of the member churches to represent by letter and delegates at these meetings and report their condition and statistics on forms provided by the Association. The October session shall be considered the annual session of this Association.

ARTICLE IV

INDEPENDENCE OF THE LOCAL CHURCHES:

Every church in this Association shall be considered an independent body and shall control its own internal affairs, having unrestricted right to administer its own government without interference from any higher body, being under Christ free and independent.

ARTICLE V

ASSOCIATIONAL RELATIONSHIP TO THE LOCAL CHURCHES:

The Martin Association shall be considered an advisory board whose function is to meet quarterly at such places as may be determined according to Article III of this Constitution, and not to adjourn formally until all pertinent matters are disposed of. While in session its duty shall be to examine all questions of interest to this Association and to use its best influence to promote Christian, denominational, and benevolent programs and institutions, such as Sunday Schools, Church Training Service, Woman's Auxiliary, Masters Men, Home and Foreign Missions, and child-care institutions. The only punitive power this Association has in relation to the member churches is the right to withdraw fellowship from such churches who are in open violation of the rules and regulations of said Association or who become unsound in the doctrines and practices of the Free Will Baptist Denomination.

ARTICLE VI

OFFICERS:

Section 1. The officers of this Association shall be Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer, Clerk and Assistant Clerk, each of whom shall be elected at the close of the October session and assume the duties of their offices the next day following their election.

Section 2. No individual shall be elected to more than one office at a time.

Section 3. The Moderator may not serve more than (3) terms in succession. The Clerk and Treasurer may serve for an indefinite period of time.

ARTICLE VII

PROCEDURES FOR JOINING THE ASSOCIATION:

A church desiring to become a member of Martin Association shall submit a petitionary letter to the Association at any of its regular quarterly sessions, stating the date and place of organization, the Pastor's name and address, list of all elected officers, number of

members, and time and place of regular meetings. The church must conform to the doctrines, and practices of the Free Will Baptist Denomination as set forth in the Treatise of Faith and Practice of the National Association of Free Will Baptists.

This Association reserves the right to send its Executive Committee to investigate any applicant for membership in this Association if it deems necessary and to subsequently act on the report of said Executive Committee before approval for membership becomes final.

ARTICLE VIII

FINANCE:

Section 1. It is suggested that each church comprising this Association send to the Association on a quarterly basis fifty cents (.50) per member to be determined on a total membership basis. However, at the discretion of the churches, inactive members need not be in the per-capita figure, but it is hoped that the churches will elect to include all members, active and inactive, in determining their total fee.

Section 2. Regular funds to the Associational treasury shall be disbursed on a quarterly basis as follows:

- A. Retain in the treasury fifty (50) dollars.
- B. State Association, fifteen (15) dollars.
- C. For printing minutes, one hundred fifty (150) dollars.
- D. Moderator's honorarium, fifty (50) dollars; Clerk's honorarium, fifty (50) dollars; Treasurer's honorarium fifty (50) dollars.
- E. The remaining funds will be allocated as follows: State Cooperative Program, 70% Benevolent Fund, 30%.

ARTICLE IX

COMMITTEES, BOARD, COUNCIL

Section 1. Committees may be chosen for any particular function at any session of the Association as the need arises. Unless otherwise specified, the Moderator shall appoint these committees.

Section 2. Standing Committees may be set up by the Association as the need arises and unless otherwise specified, the Moderator shall appoint these committees.

Section 3. The Standing Committees of this Association shall be the Executive Committee and the Investigating Committee. The Executive Committee shall consist of the Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, and three (3) members to be elected annually by the Association.

The Executive Committee shall act for and in behalf of the Martin Association on matters pertaining to its interests which may arise between sessions and which by their nature require immediate action. Such actions shall, however, be subject to final approval by this Association at its next regular session and consequently must be reported in full to the Association at its regular meeting.

The Investigating Committee shall consist of three (3) members who shall be elected as follows: one for a three (3) year term; one for a two (2) year term; and one for a one (1) year term. Election thereafter shall be for the three (3) year term. This committee shall act on instruction from the Association in investigating any irregularities among the churches which threaten the harmony and well being of the Association. It shall have no legislative or jurisdictional powers within itself, but must report all its findings to the Association for official action.

Section 4. There shall be an Ordaining Council consisting of three (3) ordained ministers in good standing with Martin Association. They shall be elected as follows: one for a three (3) year term; one for a two (2) year term; and one for a one (1) year term. Election thereafter shall be for the three (3) year term.

The Ordaining Council shall examine candidates for ordination to the Gospel ministry under the procedures adopted by this Association.* (Guidelines adopted by the State Association.)

ARTICLE X

ALTERATIONS OR AMENDMENTS:

This Consitution may be altered or amended by the Martin Association at any of its regular sessions by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members present and voting, provided that notice of the proposed alteration or amendment be presented in writing, filed with the Clerk of the Association, and read publicly before the Body at least two (2) times at a previous regular meeting.

FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Jesus Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise by His grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to provide things honest in the sight of all men.

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship, and by self-denial, faith, and good works endeavor to grow in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the holy gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in Heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday Schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world.

And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.
