The Ministers Conference recommended that the State approve the Ministers Reports with the exception of Rev. Paul Kirk and that he be given a letter of explanation. They also discussed approving the letters prior to the State meeting so that the Clerk would have time to make up a summary letter. In addition, they recommended that the Executive Board of the host conference serve as a Credentials

Committee and that the letters be forwarded from the Conference Clerks to prepare a summary to be sent to the State Clerk. It was moved and seconded that the recommendation be adopted. Motion carried.
