

THE MARYLAND STATE ASSOCIATION BY-LAWS

- The clerk or his assistant or in their absence the senior minister in years shall call the Association to order if a quorum is present. The Moderator or in his absence the Assistant Moderator shall take charge. If neither is present, a Moderator Pro Tem shall be elected.
- 2. It shall be the duty of the Secretary to enroll the ordained personnel and delegates to this Association who shall sign the register upon arrival with name, address, and Quarterly Meeting they represent. Visitors will also be registered.
- 3. It shall be the duty of each Quarterly Meeting belonging to this Association to send a letter to each
 annual meeting of this Association reporting in the
 same its statistics and benevolent work. Any
 Quarterly Meeting belonging to this Association may
 be dismissed from the Association by a two-thirds
 vote of all members present.
- 4. Each session shall be opened by Scripture reading and prayer and shall be closed with prayer.
- 5. By a two-thirds vote of all members present a ruling of the Moderator can be overruled.
- 6. The Moderator shall have the same privileges to speak as any other person, provided the Chair is filled.
- 7. This Association may correspond by letter or otherwise with other religious bodies.
- 8. This Association shall sit with open doors except when it shall go into a committee of the whole.

- 9. Any person not a member of this Association may be allowed to take part in discussion by obtaining permission from the Moderator and properly identifying themselves.
- 10. Anyone desiring to speak shall stand and address the Moderator by the appellation "Brother Moderator" but shall not speak further until recognized by the Moderator.

- 11. It shall be the duty of each member of the Association to be present at the time appointed for each meeting. Anyone wishing to retire should first obtain permission from the Moderator.
- 12. The Moderator of this Association must be an ordained minister and no person may be Moderator more than twice in succession.
- 13. The Moderator shall not allow discussion when not carried on in a Christian spirit or when he thinks it will cause discord or division.
- 14. No person shall be allowed to nominate more than one member of any committee provided the person nominated be elected.

PREAMBLE

We the members of the Free Will Baptist denomination, being baptized upon the profession of our faith in Christ and realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us as a State Association and to preserve and maintain correspondence and coordination among us, do therefore adopt this Constitution for our better denominational government.

- This yearly meeting shall be called the Maryland State Association of Free Will Baptist and shall be composed of such regularly organized and well disciplined Free Will Baptist Quarterly Meetings conveniently located as may embody themselves under this Constitution.
- 2. The business of this Association shall be conducted by the ordained ministers and deacons and elected delegates and clerks who are members of a Quarterly Meeting within this Association. Each Quarterly Meeting is entitled to three delegates from each church, in addition to the ordained personnel who are standing delegates.
 - 3. The officers of this Association shall be Clerk,
 Treasurer, and Secretary who shall retain that
 office until terminated by this Association or
 themselves. The Moderator shall be elected at the
 close of the annual meeting of this Association.
- 4. Any well-organized Free Will Baptist Quarterly
 Meeting composed of such church as conform to the
 usages and adopt the doctrines and the Treatise of
 the Constitution and By-Laws of this Association
 may at any time, upon application and by majority
 vote of this Association, become a member thereof.

- 5. From this time (June 1970) forward, any minister or deacon applying for membership in this Association must first meet the qualifications set forth in First Timothy, Chapter 3 and Titus, Chapter 1. No minister or deacon shall hold membership in this Association if he or his wife have a living companion from a previous marriage.
- 6. This Association shall have authority to discipline the Quarterly Meetings of which it is composed and exclude them for practices contrary to the Constitution and By-Laws of this Association.
- 7. The annual meeting of this Association shall convene on Friday morning at 9 o'clock before the fourth Sunday in June and shall have power to adopt any regulations or by-laws not inconsistent with the further regulation of its sessions.
- This Association shall not recognize any minister or delegate unless they comply with the Constitution and By-Laws thereof.
- Parliamentary procedure will be governed by "Robert's Rules of Order."

GENERAL BOARD

The General Board of this Association shall meet at 7 P.M. on Thursday before the regular Annual Session convenes on Friday morning, and shall consist of the following:

Moderator, Clerk, Executive Committee, also two membersat-large from each Quarterly Meeting and the Chairman of all Boards and Committees. It shall be the duty of all members of this Board to be present at the time appointed for each meeting. Proxy representation will be accepted upon presentation of a statement signed by the member. All meetings of this Board shall convene with open doors except when resolved into a committee of the whole. Any person not a member of this Board may be allowed to take part in the discussions by obtaining permission from the Moderator.

DISSOLUTION

In the event of the dissolution of the Maryland State Association of Free Will Baptist, any assets of the organization then remaining shall be conveyed to such organizations then existent dedicated to similar objectives to those of this organization, selected by the Executive Board at the time of dissolution, which organization must be exempt under Section 501(E)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 as amended or under successor provisions of the Code as may be in effect at the time of dissolution.

MINUTES

Friday - June 22, 1979 "STABILITY IN UNSTABLE TIMES" 9:00 A.M. Session

The 13th Annual session of the Maryland State Association of Free Will Baptists convened on Friday, June 22, 1979 at 9 A.M. with the First Free Will Baptist Church, New Castle, Delaware. The session opened with the congregation singing, "At Calvary" led by Steve Bevan.

Rev. Vergel A. Maness, Host Pastor, welcomed the Association and expressed the desire that this session be enjoyed by all. He called upon Rev. Paul Ketteman to lead in opening prayer. General Registration was being done by Mrs. White and Mrs. Killey, and would be continued at intermission time. The youth were registering with Mrs. Lockee, and the ladies registered with the Woman's Auxiliary in session.

Rev. Wayne McDaniel, representing the Maryland-New Jersey Quarterly Conference, welcomed the State Association with Luke 5:7 -- as Partners In the Lord's Work.

Rev. Delmas Meadows brought the morning devotion with thoughts from John 17:14 and Colossians 4:6. He closed with a prayer of thanks and for God's direction throughout the Association.

The 13th Annual Session was called into session by Rev. Dewey W. Lockee and turned over to the Moderator. Rev. Roger Mullins opened the Business Session by appointing Rev. C. Reed Mullins to serve as clerk pro-tem, due to the resignation of Stanley Parnell.

The Moderator called for the reading of the letters from the Quarterly Conferences. The New River Conference, now called The Central Virginia Conference, and Maryland-New Jersey Conference reports were read. Report from Northern Virginia to be mailed to the clerk. Moved, seconded and carried letters be accepted and delegates were seated.

The Moderator appointed a Committee on Committees:

The General Board Report was read and adopted as follows:

1. State Home Missions Report presented with four recommendations. (See State Missions Report Page 19.)

- 2. Recommended by the State Home Missions Board that we recommend to the General Session that we adopt another State Missions Project (a Joint Program with National Home Missiona) to establish a church in Fredricksburg, Virginia; and that the State Home Missions Board be given the authority to interview and obtain the person for the job.
- 3. Report of Expenses of Mission Board (projected Budget \$300)

- 4. Financial report read. Accepted as information to be presented to the General Session.
- 5. Rev. C. Reed Mullins gave his Promotional Secretary
 Report. Moved and seconded report adopted.

 Motion made seconded and carried that the Promotional Secretary be relieved from visiting individual churches, but be required to attend each

quarterly conference meeting at least once a year; and to publish a newsletter once a month of statistics and status of mission work; and that each pastor of the conference submit a mailing list of general membership to receive this letter.

- Rev. Maness presented his Home Missionary Report.
 Accepted to present as information.
- 7. Rev. Horton presented two proposed Constitution changes to become effective June 1980:
 - a. To change reading of Item #3 of Constitution to read, "The officers of this Association shall be elected for a term of three years, except the Moderator and Assistant Moderator, which shall be elected annually at the close of the meeting of this Association."
 - b. And to add an Item #10 to the Constitution to read, "The Constitution and By-Laws of this Association may be altered or amended at any regular session by a two-thirds vote of the members present, providing the change has been submitted in writing, and tabled from one previous Annual Session.
- 8. Motion made, seconded and carried that the recommendation be made to the General Session whereby the responsibility for planning the State meeting be given to the State Executive Committee, the local Quarterly Conference to adopt it, and the host church to carry it out. Also that a Youth committee be formed to plan the Youth Conference and that they work with the State Executive Committee.

Motion made, seconded and carried to recess until 1:30 p.m. to give way to the Morning Worship Service.

The Morning Worship Service presided over by Rev. Larry Branham opened with the congregation singing "Amazing Grace". Rev. Elzo Bevan led in prayer. Rev. Branham expressed pleasure at the good attendance at the Association, especially the number of youth. It was announced that there was a total of 156 present.

Bro. and Sister Campbell from the Free Will Baptist
Church in Philadelphia sang "Thank You Lord for Your
Blessings on Me" and "Remind me Dear Lord". The
congregration sang "In My Heart a Melody" while
the offering was taken.

The morning message was brought by Rev. Ralph
Weaver - "The Command and/or Call to Stability in
Unstable Times", I Cor. 15:58a -- Eph. 6:13b-14a.
Stability defined as firmness of character,
strength, standing in evil days, in opposition
against the enemy. "Stability" - non conformity
to the world.

After a song of invitation "Only Trust Him" and Benediction by Rev. C. Reed Mullins the Association was dismissed for lunch provided by the Quarterly Conference.

The afternoon session opened with congregational singing "Lord Send the Power." The Moderator called Rev. Curtis Byrd to lead in opening prayer.

Moderator called for a report from the Committee on Committees, read by Rev. Steve Bevan, Chairman.

Moved, seconded and carried to accept these committees as recommended. 156 present.

The service was turned over to the Woman's Auxiliary with the State Auxiliary President, Mrs. Alyne Maness, presiding over the program. Mrs. Maness gave a report of the State Project, total amount received last year, and projected goal for this year's project. (For report of the meeting of the State Auxiliary in the morning session see report at close of minutes of General Session.) She introduced the State Woman's Auxiliary officers, and encouraged each church in our Association to form a local Woman's Auxiliary and join with the State work in support of both Home and Foreign Missions. An offering was received to help with the expense of today's program.

Mrs. Maness introduced the guest speaker, Henry VanKluyve, Director of Deputation, Foreign Missions Department, who spoke on "Always Abounding in the Work of the Lord", I Cor. 15:58b. Bro. VanKluyve used the Apostle Paul as an example. He challenged us as Free Will Baptists to grow up - put away childish things. He shared briefly the Foreign Missions Report.

The Auxiliary Treasurer's Report was given and the session was dismissed with prayer.

Youth Banquet

The Youth Banquet was held Friday night at 6:30 p.m. at Castle Hills School on Moore's Lane. Awards were presented for participation in the Youth Competitive Activities. After singing "Leaning On the Everlasting Arms" Rev. Bevan let in prayer and then everyone present partook of a delicious meal. Larry Green was Master of Ceremonies for the banquet and the individual competition on piano, trumpet, guitar and a vocal solo was enjoyed as special music for the evening. Rev. Maness visited with "Granny" and Dr. Malcolm Fry, Director of the National CTS Department, gave the evening message. His text was I Cor. 15:58c and I Cor. 10:13. He reminded everyone that in service of the Lord there will be times of tests and temptations.

SATURDAY BUSSINESS SESSION June 23, 1979

9:00 a.m. Session

The session opened with congregational singing "Victory in Jesus". Psalm 63:1-7 was read for devotions and prayer was offered.

The Moderator called for the Budget Committee's report. It was moved and seconded to adopt the budget. After discussion the motion was amended to decrease the amount of \$1,500 to \$1,000 for expenses of the Promotional Secretary; motion seconded and carried. Vote was called for and the motion carried to accept the Budget in a total of \$28,425.00. (The report of the Budget Committee with this adjustment is given at the end of the minutes.)

Motion made, seconded and carried that the Moderator be the standing Chairman of the Executive Committee.

The Moderator called for the report of the Nominating Committee. The report was read, then voted on item by item.

Moved, seconded and carried that Rev. Vergel Maness serve as Moderator ofnext year's State Association.

Moved, seconded and carried that Rev. Lester Horton serve as Assistant Moderator.

Moved, seconded and carried that Rev. C. Reed Mullins retain the position of Promotional Secretary another three year term.

Motion made and seconded that Bro. David Brown be elected as State Clerk. Motion carried.

Moved, seconded and carried that Rev. Steve Bevan serve on the Finance Committee for a term of three years.

Rev. Tommy Meade and Rev. Ralph Weaver were elected to serve on the State Mission Board for a term of three years.

Rev. Larry Branham was elected to serve on the Executive Committee for a term of three years.

The Report of the Board of Retirement and Insurance from Bro. Hersey was presented by Rev. Maness. The Maryland State Association was thanked for the \$287.60 given last year.

The report of the Sunday School and Church Training Department was presented by Dr. Malcolm Fry, who was then excused to speak to the Youth Conference in session.

The Report of the Home Missions Department was presented by Rev. Maness with a special word to support the Church Extension Loan Fund. Report accepted for information.

Motion made, seconded and carried that next years State Association meeting be held at the Fairwood Free Will Baptist Church, Fairfax Station, Virginia.

Bro. Wayne McDaniel gave a report of the Youth Conference and the winners of the Music and Arts competition. (All winners listed as part of the Youth Conference report.) He reported the expenses of this year's Youth Conference as \$78.30 for the certificates and awards, and presented a proposed budget of \$225.00 for next year to include plaques and awards. Motion made and carried to adopt and pay the expenses of this year's conference.

Motion made, seconded and carried to form a Youth Committee with rotating terms of 1 year, 2 years and 3 years. There was discussion regarding their working together with the State Executive Committee in planning the State Association Meeting thereby incorporating the Youth Program activities.

STATE HOME MISSIONS REPORT

This has been another good year for Maryland State Mission work. We have had three new churches organized and join our Association this year. They are as follows:

These churches have not received financial support from the State Mission Board. However, your prayers and any financial support you can give will be greatly appreciated. The new work at Sparta, N.C. continues to progress according to Pastor Jimmy Hopson. They now have their new building under roof and hope to have it ready for services soon.

What you are seeing here in Delaware is a dream come true. All this has been made possible through the Blessings of God and the consistent effort of our missionary family and the determination of the members of this congregation. We thank God for the prayers and gifts of the friends of the Delaware Project. Brother Maness will give us a more detailed report.

In keeping with the projected schedule of the church we offer the following recommendations:

- 1. Due to the purchase of the adjoining property that increased the church's budget, we recommend that the date of assuming another \$200.00 of the Pastor's salary be extended to September 1, 1979.
- That in keeping with the increase in inflation we increase the pastor's salary \$52.08 per month, effective July 1, 1979.
- 3. That the church assume more support of the pastor as of January 1, 1980 in the amount of another \$150 per month, and another \$150 by June 1, 1980.
- 4. We recommend that we give \$150 toward Brother Maness' expense to the National Association.

In conclusion we appeal to all our churches to continue supporting our State Mission Program on a regular basis that we may be able to assist the projects adopted by this body.

REPORT TO MARYLAND STATE ASSO. VERGEL AMOS MANESS MISSIONARY

June 22,23 1979

Greetings and Welcome to the Free Will Baptist Church of New Castle, Delaware

We take great pride in the ability to welcome you to this Church. Many of you are experiencing the visit for the first time. But this is the results of your prayers and financial support for the last few years. In fact it was June 1975 when we first began in Martinsville, Virginia as your representative to Delaware. That beginning and the dreams of our hearts has come to this.

If you will recall the talk of a Free Will Baptist Church in Wilmington, Delaware first came to the Maryland State Association in June 1973. Reverend Elzo Bevan brought the prayer request to the floor for discussion. Many months of seeking the will of the Lord in the matter followed for many of us. Not until February of 1975 was it clear to this preacher that it was God's will for him to move his family and all of his worldly possessions to the state of Delaware to perform the task.

The present building, the congregation, the individuals you see now were still unknown to each of us. "Faith, and faith alone" directed our steps. The knowledge of God's hand and leadership upon the undertaking has encouraged and sustained us through every difficulty and trial. When one sees the results of many months of labor he has a tendency to forget the efforts that have gone into it. This also calls to mind the need to be thankful for you and the support you gave and are giving so as to make it possible to continue to have a self supporting Free Will Baptist Church with a full time Pastor in New Castle, Delaware. Just today a fourteen year old girl was saved in the office because a missionary could be available to minister to her needs. She had attempted to commit suicide and had been in the hospital and on drugs, but had a deep vacancy in her heart for "SOMETHING". The pastor was able to show her the need in Christ Jesus. She will no doubt be in the services Friday night and in Sunday School this week because you have given an opportunity to have a pastor available.

The Church has come from a stage of total dependence upon the financial support of the missionary, to the stage of self support, to the place we are presently. Presently the missionary is able to depend upon the Church for housing, utilities and two-thirds (2/3) of his salary. Only another \$260.00 a month will fully support it-self. With the inflation and the expansion of the property with its increase in financial obligation and expense of constructing a parking lot this is indeed a miracle. Because of the way we began there have been many limited abilities because of limited income and resources, but the Church has grown and the new parking lot and the enlarged sanctuary with the future plans we will have the ability to minister to the quantity of people we must, to win enough to become self supporting.

Continuing by "Faith" we believe we will accomplish this this year and will be totally self supporting by January 1980. With the present support we are receiving we can continue and be supplied with our needs to the date we have projected. We trust you will continue the present

Maryland State Associational relationship.

We desire to thank the State for the income this last year of \$5,533.58 to our account. The Free Will Baptist Church of New Castle Delaware sent in \$3,000.00 of that amount and the W.N.A.C. woman's auxillary sent in \$135.00. Our Church has been blessed by the faithfulness of so many, For this the missionary is grateful.

Since June of last year we have witnessed 59 conversions and baptized 14 in the Church. We have averaged 70 for each month for the past 11 months...Sunday School. Presently we are averaging in the 80's. (May 79. April 84. March 82) Our Morning Worship averages about the same. Evening average is in the mid 30's.
