

THE MARYLAND STATE ASSOCIATION BY-LAWS

- 1. The clerk or his assistant or in their absence the senior minister in years shall call the Association to order if a quorum is present. The Moderator or in his absence the Assistant Moderator shall take charge. If neither is present, a Moderator Pro Tem shall be elected.
- 2. It shall be the duty of the Secretary to enroll the ordained personnel and delegates to this Association who shall sign the register upon arrival with name, address, and Quarterly Meeting they represent. Visitors will also be registered.
- 3. It shall be the duty of each Quarterly Meeting belonging to this Association to send a letter to each annual meeting of this Association reporting in the same its statistics and benevolent work. Any Quarterly Meeting belonging to this Association may be dismissed from the Association by a two-thirds vote of all members present.
- 4. Each session shall be opened by Scripture reading and prayer and shall be closed with prayer.
- 5. By a two-thirds vote of all members present a ruling of the Moderator can be overruled.
- 6. The Moderator shall have the same privileges to speak as any other person, provided the Chair is filled.
- 7. This Association may correspond by letter or otherwise with other religious bodies.
- 8. This Association shall sit with open doors except when it shall go into a committee of the whole.

- 9. Any person not a member of this Association may be allowed to take part in discussion by obtaining permission from the Moderator and properly identifying themselves.
- 10. Anyone desiring to speak shall stand and address the Moderator by the appellation "Brother Moderator" but shall not speak further until recognized by the Moderator.
- 11. It shall be the duty of each member of the Association to be present at the time appointed for each meeting. Anyone wishing to retire should first obtain permission from the Moderator.
- 12. The Moderator of this Association must be an ordained minister and no person may be Moderator more than twice in succession.
- 13. The Moderator shall not allow discussion when not carried on in a Christian spirit or when he thinks it will cause discord or division.
- 14. No person shall be allowed to nominate more than one member of any committee provided the person nominated be elected.
- 15. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to seat delegates in a body in a designated section at the beginning of each session.
- 16. Five members or a majority of the resident members present shall constitute a quorum in conference.

CONSTITUTION

From this time (June alamas Repart, any minister or

We the members of the Free Will Baptist denomination, being baptized upon the profession of our faith in Christ and realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us as a State Association and to preserve and maintain correspondence and coordination among us, do therefore adopt this Constitution for our better denominational government.

- 1. This yearly meeting shall be called the Maryland State Association of Free Will Baptist and shall be composed of such regularly organized and well disciplined Free Will Baptist Quarterly Meetings conveniently located as may embody themselves under this Constitution.
- 2. The business of this Association shall be conducted by the ordained ministers and deacons and elected delegates and clerks who are members of a Quarterly Meeting within this Association. Each Quarterly Meeting is entitled to three delegates from each church, in addition to the ordained personnel who are standing delegates.
- 3. The officers of this Association shall be elected for a term of three years, except the Moderator and Assistant Moderator, which shall be elected annually at the close of the meeting of this Association.
- 4. Any well-organized Free Will Baptist Quarterly Meeting composed of such church as conform to the usages and adopt the doctrines and the Treatise of the Constitution and By-Laws of this Association may at any time, upon application and by majority vote of this Association, become a member thereof.

- 5. From this time (June 1970) forward, any minister or deacon applying for membership in this Association must first meet the qualifications set forth in First Timothy, Chapter 3 and Titus, Chapter 1. No minister or deacon shall hold membership in this Association if he or his wife have a living companion from a previous marriage.
- 6. This Association shall have authority to discipline the Quarterly Meetings of which it is composed and exclude them for practices contrary to the Constitution and By-Laws of this Association.
- 7. The annual meeting of this Association shall convene on Friday morning at 9 o'clock before the fourth Sunday in June and shall have power to adopt any regulations or by-laws not inconsistent with the further regulation of its sessions.
- 8. This Association shall not recognize any minister or delegate unless they comply with the Constitution and By-Laws thereof.
- 9. Parliamentary procedure will be governed by "Robert's Rules of Order."
- 10. The Constitution and By-Laws of this Association may be altered or amended at any regular session by a two-thirds vote of the members present, providing the change has been submitted in writing, and tabled from one previous Annual Session.

All meetings of this Board shall convene with open doors except when resolved into a committee of the whole. Any person not a member of this Board may be allowed to take part in the discussions by obtaining permission from the Moderator.

DISSOLUTION

In the event of the dissolution of the Maryland State Association of Free Will Baptist, any assets of the organization then remaining shall be conveyed to such organizations then existent dedicated to similar objectives to those of this organization, selected by the Executive Board at the time of dissolution, which organization must be exempt under Section 501 (E) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 as amended or under successor provisions of the Code as may be in effect at the time of dissolution.

Friday - June 20, 1980 "Unity" 9:00 A.M. Session

The 14th Annual session of the Maryland State Association of Free Will Baptists convened on Friday, June 20, 1980 at 9 A.M. with the Fairwood Free Will Baptist Church, Fairfax Station, Virginia. The session opened with the congregation singing "Glory to His Name". We were led in prayer by Rev. Wayne Caudill, and joined again in singing "Tis so sweet to trust in Jesus".

Rev. Lester Horton, Host Pastor, welcomed the Association and gave announcements regarding the various meetings and plans for the day. Rev. Teddy Waters gave the response for the conference and a word of thanks to the host church and conference for their provisions.

Rev. Arthur Click read Hebrews 3:1-4 for opening devotions and led in prayer. In the absence of the clerk the Senior Minister, Rev. Dewey Lockee, called the State Association into session. Rev. Vergel A. Maness, Moderator, took charge and read Philippians 2:2-8 as opening thought; Unity - something to be experienced, not just preached.

Rev. Murray Southwell was elected to serve as clerk protem for the conference. The Quarterly Conference letters were read and a motion made, seconded, and carried to accept the letters and each Pastor or authorized person substitute on the list of delegates as necessary. Motion made, second and carried to seat the delegates.

A Committee on Committees was appointed: Chairman - Rev. Elzo Bevan; Bro. Wells; and Bro. Doug King.

The Moderator recognized visitors and corresponding messengers. Rev. John Gibbs representing Nat'l Home Missions; Rev. Jonathan Thigpen representing Randall House and Sunday School and CTS Depts; Rev. Henry Van Kluyve representing Foreign Missions; Rev. Ronald Creech from Free Will Baptist Bible College.

Minutes of last years session were available in print and were not called to be read to the General Body.

The Report of the General Board Meeting Thursday P.M. June 19th was read. Motion made, second, and carried to accept and dispense with item by item. No action was taken on it at this time, but held until afternoon session when the delegates now with the Ladies Auxiliary would be in the General Session.

Rev. John Gibbs gave the report from the Home Missions Dept. Maryland States giving thus far totalled \$6,830 toward this years goal. He gave news of some of the project needs - the desire to begin a work in the New England States; Need for a missionary for Puerto Rico Free Will Baptists; and a meeting upcoming with the Canadian Primitive Baptist Churches with the possibility of them joining our National Association. He asked us to remember the 43 missionary families in prayer, especially for their spiritual needs; and praised the Lord for the 14 new churches started this year and the 1500 persons who made decisions for Christ. He also brought us a report from Lloyd Olson and the Master's Men.

Rev. Jonathan Thigpen gave report from Randall House and the Sunday School and CTS Dept. asking us to pray for the ministry of publishing the Word, and the National Association meeting July in Anaheim, California as they celebrate 200 years of Sunday School.

Rev. Henry Van Kluyve gave the report of the Foreign missions Dept. and challenged us to get out of the "huddle" of church fellowship and "execute the play" in giving out the bread of life to 4.4 Billion lost and needy. Announcement was made of 50 seats still available for the flight to National Association in California from Nashville.

Motion made to remove from the table items from last years business session regarding constitution changes. Article 3 to replace present Article 3. Moved, second, and carried to adopt as presented. (New printing appears in this years opening pages - Constitution.)
Article 10 presented as an addition. Moved, second, and carried to adopt.

Motion made, second, and carried to recess for the Morning Worship Service.

11:00 A.M. WORSHIP SERVICE

The Morning Worship Service was presided over by Rev. Elzo Bevan and opened with congregation singing "Victory in Jesus". Music was under the direction of Steve Bevan with Martha Ramey at the piano, and Sue Williams at the organ. We were led in prayer by Rev. Ronald Creech, and the Congregation sang "At Calvary". Following announcements an offering was taken for the State Association Treasury. Rev. Weaver gave the offeratory prayer. The congregation again joined in singing "Amazing Grace." We were favored with a solo by Rev. John Gibbs "I'm Going Home".

The Morning message "Unity in Purpose" was brought by Rev. Murray Southwell with I Timothy 2:4 as text.

The Purpose for which we need unity - "Who will have all men to be saved, and to come unto the knowledge of the truth." He expressed how we needed to be disciplined as churches and individuals in Time, Talent, and Tithes if we were to accomplish our purpose and make disciples. After the invitation song "Just as I am" we were dismissed with prayer by Jack Barclay for lunch provided by the ladies of the host conference churches.

Rev. Jona Gran Unignen gave report from Rand, 11 Houge

The Moderator, called the meeting to order and gave the report of the Committee on Committees.

Nominating Committee - Rev. Lester Horton, Chairman, Rev. Larson Cave, and Rev. Ralph Weaver.

Budget Committee - Rev. Bill Steele, Chairman, Rev. Curtis Byrd, Rev. Wayne Caudill.

Resolutions Committee - Rev. Teddy Waters, Chairman, Bro. Jack Horsley, Rev. Larry Branham.

The service was turned over to the Woman's Auxiliary with the State Auxiliary President, Mrs. Alyne Maness. presiding over the first portion of the program. Sister Bevan led in prayer, and Mrs. Patricia Mullins read the Treasurer's report. (For this report and the report of the State Auxiliary in morning session see reports at close of General Session Minutes. Sister Zylphia Bondeson gave the charge for the Installation of Officers with the Theme "Look at Your Hands" with Nehemiah 2:17 & 18 for Scripture. Special music was given by Martha Ramey - "Must I empty handed go" and "Seal us Oh Holy Spirit". Bro. Bevan gave the dedication prayer. A love offering was taken for Mrs. Lorene Miley who spoke to us sharing some of the Lord's working through their last term in Africa and also the Looking unto Him for the adjustment of leaving and readjusting to life here in the States. She closed with the song poem "Turn your eyes upon Jesus"

The Business session was reconvened and the State Home Mission partial report was given. Moved, second, and carried to receive it. The State Missionary Report was read. Motion made, second, and carried to receive it.

Rev. Ronald Creech gave a report from the Free Will Baptist Bible College. A report from the Executive Department and a report from the Board of Retirement and Insurance was given out to all those present.

The Treasurer's report was read. Motion made, second, and carried to receive.

Motion made, second, and carried to recess the meeting to Saturday at 9 A.M. Dismissed with prayer by Rev. Steele.

7:00 P.M. Youth Service

The Youth Worship service was presided over by Steve Bevan. We opened with congregational singing "He Keeps Me Singing" and Jonathan Thigpen 1ed in prayer. Announcements were made and the Worship Service continued with Congregation singing "Joy Unspeakable".

Special music was given by Tim Gauldin with a piano solo "Sunrise Tomorrow" and "Blessed Assurance".

Dina Horsley sang "Come Morning" accompanied at the piano by her mother Jean. Congregation sang together "When the Roll is Called up Yonder".

Rev. John Gibbs sang "Follow me" and challenged the youth to settle early with the Lord to do whatever He wants you to do. His message - "Unity in preparation" - with Text from II Timothy 2:21,22 gave us a personal plea for Preparation in Mind - Philippians 2:5; Motives - Proverbs 3:5,6; Mate - God's choice for a marriage partner; Ministry - Romans 12:1,2

The Plan for preparation - Purification; and the Purpose for preparation - Participation - God using you.

After a time of Invitation "I Surrender All", the service was dismissed in prayer by Rev. Larry Branham.

9:00 A.M. Session

The session was called to order by the Moderator and opened with Congregational singing "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms". Morning Devotions were led by Rev. Dewey W. Lockee reading I John 3:1-10. Opening prayer was by Rev. Curtis Byrd.

The Moderator called for action on the General Board Report; notice was made that the Constitution calls for the meeting of the Board on Thursday nights at 7 P.M. Moved and seconded to accept recommendation of the Board "that the Finance Committee be dissolved and that disbursements for the expenses of the Annual State Association be delegated to the Executive Board". Motion carried.

The Promotional Secretary gave his report and notice of resignation. Motion made, second, and carried to receive Bro. Reed Mullins report and resignation.

Moderator called for a completion of the State Home Mission Board report from special meeting held Friday P.M. Report was read by Bro. Horton, Chairman. "We recommend that the Delaware project be continued at the present rate of support until January 1, 1981 at which time the Board will review the project." "We further recommend that the Fredericksburg Project be kept open and that all designated monies be held in reserve "We further urge all our churches to rally for the support of State Missions, especially the Delaware project on a regular basis". Motion made, second, and carried to adopt as read.

Maryland State Association Home Missions Treasurers
Report was read by the Clerk. (copy filed with Reports)
Motion made, second, and carried to receive this report.

Moderator called for the report of the Resolutions Committee. They reported that they had not received any resolutions and felt no Resolution Statement was needed at this time. They requested that the committee be formed a year in advance to have opportunity to work on, however there was opposition to making the Resolutions Committee as a standing committee. Motion made, second, and carried to accept their report. Motion made, second, to continue to appoint this committee annually, and for resolutions to be handed in by the churches at the opening session of the State Association, to be handled by the Resolutions Committee during the annual session. Motion carried.

The Moderator called for the Budget Committee Report, read by Bro. Steele, chairman. (Report at end of Minutes) Motion made, seconded to receive Budget report as read and discuss item by item. Proposed amount of \$1500 for expenses for Promotional Secretary; Motion made and seconded to admend to delete the office of the Promotional Secretary and delegate the responsibility to the Moderator of visiting each quarterly conference meeting at least once in the year, and to publish a quarterly newsletter, reducing the Budget expense to \$500. Motion carried.

Motion made and seconded to amend to include in the Budget the disbursement of an Honorarium to the Clerk and Secretary of \$50 each, adding \$100 to the Budget. Motion carried. Motion made, seconded to accept the Budget with the Amendments. Motion carried.

Nominating Committees report was read by Bro. Lester H orton, Committee chairman. Motion made and second to accept the report and deal with item by item.

- 9. Recommended Bro. Eugene Wampler to serve as State
 Treasurer for a term of three years. Motion carried.
 - Cossie Meade, who has served faithfully as the State Treasurer for 14 years was given a standing vote of appreciation for his years of service.
- 10 Recommended Bro. Emory Fortner as Home Missions
 Treasurer to serve for a term of three years.
 Motion carried.
- The Moderator called for the election of Delegates to the National Association Meeting. Nominated were Martha Ramey and Lottie Horton. Motion carried. The General Board Member was delegated the authority to fill in names of other delegates at the Association meeting if others were able to be present.

 Rev. Lester Horton was elected to serve out Rev. Bevan's term as General Board Member as National had elected him to serve on the National Home Mission Board. Motion carried.

Bro. Wampler requested that all gifts be sent through him if they were to be included on his report. The Director of Finance's Report was handed out. (Please designate all gifts.) Motion made and second to receive his report. Motion carried.

Motion was made that next years State Association be held at Woodland Heights Free Will Baptist Church in Martinsville, Virginia with Rev. Ralph Weaver, Pastor. Motion second and carried. Permission was requested and granted to have a State Banquet for all persons attending the State Association if those planning the program

chose to do so. - Recommended to the transfer of the transfer

Motion was made and second to recess for Worship, and at the close of the Worship Service to adjourne the Business of the 14th Annual Session of the Maryland State Association. Motion carried.

A word of thanks was given for each person who had been involved in the Association. We were dismissed with prayer by Doug Adkins.

We have not made the progress we had hoped to in the past year. We are still praying for a missionary for the Fredericksburg, Virginia project.

We have met with four different men, but as of now we do not have anyone committed to come. We recommend that this project be kept open and all monies designated to this project be held in reserve.

The Mission Board met in March in Fredericksburg with all members present except Brother Arthur Click who was in the hospital seriously ill. At that time the project will be reviewed and discussed during the meeting of the General Board.

REPORT TO MARYLAND STATE ASSOCIATION by Rev. Vergel A. Maness Missionary

Greetings in the Name above every name and in the Name of Him before Whom every knee shall bow. Jesus the Lord of Glory. I wish it were possible for me to address you as has been the opening in the last years of a State Missionary Report, but there are facts which make it necessary that we be just truthful and no more than that. I do believe you are "thinking, rational understanding" people who are aware of the time in which we live. So I greet you in open honesty.

This last year has been a great one in the answer of many prayers. As you are aware last year we were able to secure the land next door to the Church and thereby double our property area--80 feet x 150--now 160 feet x 150 feet. The old house on the property was too poorly constructed to be of use. We attempted to repair and fix up the old building for use as expanded Sunday School area. But there was too much cost to the project and then too little to be gained from the money invested. We then determined after the Maryland State Associational Meeting last year to remove the structure. As you can imagine we had little money to spend on hiring a wrecking crew to do the work so we did it ourselves. Being small in number and those who we did have having little time to put to the labor, most of the actual demolition was done by the missionary and a couple of men. Then the building of a parking lot required more time, expense and many hours of labor to get everything in shape for gravel. We then had no money to buy gravel and the old parking area had been so destructed by the wrecking and reconstruction of the general area that we lost several weeks of prime time for people to visit because of the mud. September thru the first of November we had practically no parking area at all. When we talked to people in the door to door visitation they would respond, "You sure have a mess there don't you". But Thank God this too passed. We now have a fine parking It is large stone and a bit difficult to cross at times in the rainy times but much better.

Last year we were doing about as we are now financially as faras the salary of the Missionary is concerned. We by faith made the projected schedule of the take over of the full salary step by step and be fully self supporting by

this June Associational Meeting 1980. The Church had the added expenses of the parking lot and the increased cost of every thing from gas to electric to sewer etc. as has everyone else in this inflationary time. We were also burt by several of our people who were very good tithing families being layed off or their jobs being cut back. This keeps us just at about the same level as we had been financially. We averaged \$430 per week the first six months of 1979, the second six months we averaged \$419 per week. This year the first six months we averaged \$371 per week. Our average attendance in Sunday School was 75 the first six months of 1979 and 64 the last six months. The first five months of 1980 we have averaged 66 in Sunday School. Inflation, discouragement, lack of parking, and the fact that we were at capacity at the average of 75 has been a very difficult battle to cope with. In the summer of last year the missionary began the project to give more room for the growth of the Sunday School. The building of a house for the new parsonage erstood" by an end of the less age and rol 00.0018

The building of a new parsonage took time and efforts beyond expectations. We have lost some through the lack of understanding as to why we were not growing faster and better..pressure to accomplish what was felt as the impossible in the beginning was a factor in our loss of some. Christian immaturity lost others..but mainly we just could not "force what takes time to accomplish" growth!

Our Prayer meeting has averaged in the thirties (30's) and the Evening Service 35 for the last several months expressing to the Missionary a solid growth and base. During the last year as we have "pressed" and failed to reach the projected and the desired "goals" set going into the 1979-1980 fiscal year of the State Meeting, the missionary has himself become discouraged and in a deep feeling of failure. We have considered the possibility of resigning and leaving the Mission Church to others and seeking God's direction for new fields. BUT IN THE SEARCH of our conscious and the search of GOD'S desire for us we were constantly directed to stay and "LABOR ON".

Paul as he spoke before the people of Ephesus stated, "...I kept back nothing that was profitable for you, but have showed you, and have taught you, publicly, and from

house to house.."(Acts 20:20) Paul again declared in Jerusalem "..I have lived in all good conscious before God until this day." (Acts 23:1) and before Felix he claimed "..I exercise myself to have always a conscious void of offense toward God and Toward men." (Acts 24:16) I am not sure I have always been 100 per cent right in everything I have done and in everything I have led the congregation into, but my conscious bares me record that I have done that which was as best could be discerned at the time to be the right thing to do. I know nothing I would have done differently..unless it would have been.. not to have pushed as hard as I have. The Free Will Baptist Church of New Castle County is strong and stable I believe and at present doing as much as can be expected under the financial strain it now finds itself in.

We have committed ourself to paying \$4,000.00 off on a needed Bus and the pews we secured from the Bethel Free Will Baptist Church. (\$3,000.00 Pews and \$700 remains on the bus). We have now raised \$285.00 for the pews and \$100.00 for the Bus. July 6th we have "Declaration Day from Pew indebtness". We trust to have each pew of the twenty four taken by families or individuals or groups in the church at \$125 each. The day to bring the total into the treasury to pay off the debt is August 24. 1980.

We want to bring this to a close on the reminder that it was five years ago this State Meeting in Martinsville, Virginia when the "idea" of a church in Delaware was just that: an idea, a dream, a hope, a labor to begin and a reality uncertain! Today sitting in the heart of New Castle subdivisions and on a four lane black top major thru-fare we have \$250,000.00 worth of property and a Congregation of Free Will Baptist averaging this month 70 in Worship Services and \$411.00 wk. average offering. Failure is relevant and in the eyes of the beholder. Just as beauty is in the eyes of the beholder we suggest to you, who may search the record and the "missed" goals of a year ago, ask the families who have come to Jesus and those who now are again actively involved in service to their Lord .. "was it worth it, have the missed goals been a failure?" We think not.

We are praying that you will understand that it does take time and most of all patience in the labor of "...Growing and Establishing..." a Free Will Baptist Church to the place of total self support.

We remain forever more your servant through our service to our Lord. Let Him be our Judge and Sustainer in every decision.

Motion was made and approved that we purchase letterheads.

Motion was made and approved that the secretary make up simpler report forms and send to the auxiliaries.

The following motion in regard to delegates was made and approved. That only District officers and Presidents from local auxiliaries be standing delegates, and that two delegates be elected from each District.

It was discussed that we endeavor to support the retirement program more in the following year, possibly with an emphasis on Father by Day offering.
