



#### THE MARYLAND STATE ASSOCIATION BY-LAWS

- The clerk or his assistant or in their absence the senior minister in years shall call the Association to order if a quorum is present. The Moderator or in his absence the Assistant Moderator shall take charge. If neither is present, a Moderator Pro Tem shall be elected.
- 2. It shall be the duty of the Secretary to enroll the ordained personnel and delegates to this Association who shall sign the register upon arrival with name, address, and Quarterly Meeting they represent. Visitors will also be registered.
- 3. It shall be the duty of each Quarterly Meeting belonging to this Association to send a letter to each annual meeting of this Association reporting in the same its statistics and benevolent work. Any Quarterly Meeting belonging to this Association may be dismissed from the Association by a two-thirds vote of all members present.
- 4. Each session shall be opened by Scripture reading and prayer and shall be closed with prayer.
- 5. By a two-thirds vote of all members present a ruling of the Moderator can be overruled.
- The Moderator shall have the same privileges to speak as any other person, provided the Chair is filled.
- This Association may correspond by letter or otherwise with other religious bodies.
- 8. This Association shall sit with open doors except when it shall go into a committee of the whole.

- 9. Any person not a member of this Association may be allowed to take part in discussion by obtaining permission from the Moderator and properly identifying themselves.
- 10. Anyone desiring to speak shall stand and address the Moderator by the appellation "Brother Moderator" but shall not speak further until recognized by the Moderator.
- 11. It shall be the duty of each member of the Association to be present at the time appointed for each meeting. Anyone wishing to retire should first obtain permission from the Moderator.
- 12. The Moderator of this Association must be an ordained minister and no person may be Moderator More than twice in succession peteto covered
- 13. The Moderator shall not allow discussion when not carried on in a Christian spirit or when he thinks it will cause discord or division.
- 14. No person shall be allowed to nominate more than one member of any committee provided the person nominated be elected.
- 15. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to seat delegates in a body in a designated section at the beginning of each session.
- 16. Five members or a majority of the resident members present shall constitute a quorum in conference.

#### CONSTITUTION

#### PREAMBLE

We the members of the Free Will Baptist denomination, being baptized upon the profession of our faith in Christ and realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us as a State Association and to preserve and maintain correspondence and coordination among us, do therefore adopt this Constitution for our better denominational government.

- This yearly meeting shall be called the Maryland State Association of Free Will Baptist and shall be composed of such regularly organized and well disciplined Free Will Baptist Quarterly Meetings conveniently located as my embody themselves under this Constitution.
- 2. The business of this Association shall be conducted by the ordained ministers and deacons and elected delegates and clerks who are members of a Quarterly Meeting within this Association. Each Quarterly Meeting is entitled to three delegates from each Church, in addition to the ordained personnel who are standing delegates.
- 3. The officers of this Association shall be elected for a term of three years, except the Moderator and Assistant Moderator, which shall be elected annually at the close of the meeting of this Association.
- 4. Any well-organized Free Will Baptist Quarterly Meeting composed of such church as conform to the usages and adopt the doctrines and the Treatise of the Constitution and By-Laws of this Association may at any time, upon application and by majority vote of this Association, become a member thereof.

- 5. From this time (June 1970) forward, any minister or deacon applying for membership in this Association must first meet the qualifications set forth in First Timothy, Chapter 3 and Titus, Chapter 1. No minister or deacon shall hold membership in this Association if he or his wife have a living companion from a previous marriage.
- 6. This Association shall have authority to discipline the Quarterly Meetings of which it is composed and exclude them for practices contrary to the Constitution and By-Laws of this Association.
- 7. The annual meeting of this Association shall convene on Friday morning at 9 o'clock before the fourth Sunday in June and shall have power to adopt any regulations or by-laws not inconsistent with the further regulation of its sessions.
- 8. This Association shall not recognize any minister or delegate unless they comply with the Constitution and By-Laws thereof.
- Parliamentary procedure will be governed by "Robert's Rules of Order."
- 10. The Constitution and By-Laws of this Association may be altered or amended at any regular session by a two-thirds vote of the members present, providing the change has been submitted in writing, and tabled from one previous Annual Session.

#### GENERAL BOARD

The General Board of this Association shall meet at 7 P.M. on Thursday before the regular Annual Session convenes on Friday morning, and shall consist of the following: Moderator, Clerk, Executive Committee, also two members-at-large from each Quarterly Meeting and the Chairman of all Boards and Committees. It shall be the duty of all members of this Board to be present at the time appointed for each meeting. Proxy representation will be accepted upon presentation of a statement signed by the member. All meetings of this Board shall convene with open doors except when resolved into a committee of the whole. Any person not a member of this Board may be allowed to take part in the discussions by obtaining permission from the Moderator.

#### DISSOLUTION

In the event of the dissolution of the Maryland State Association of Free Will Baptist, any assets of the organization then remaining shall be conveyed to such organizations then existent dedicated to similar objectives to those of this organization, selected by the Executive Board at the time of dissolution, which organization must be exempt under Section 501 (E) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 as amended or under successor provisions of the Code as may be in effect at the time of dissolution.

#### MINUTES

THEME: "THE LORDSHIP OF CHRIST" Philippians 2:11

Friday - June 25, 1982 9:00 A.M. Session

the Minutes and Reports.)

The 16th Annual Session of the Maryland State Association was opened with the Congregation singing "How Great Thou Art" led by Music Director, Bro. Jack Horsley, accompanied by Mrs. Jean Horsley at the piano. We were welcomed by Rev. Elzo Bevan, Host Pastor, Mt. Calvary Free Will Baptist Church.

Devotions were led by Rev. Murray Southwell, Clerk, reading I John 3:1-3 and leading in prayer. He then declared the 16th Annual Association in Session.

The Moderator, Rev. Ralph Weaver, took charge and recognized the Asst. Moderator, Rev. Larry Branham, and called for the reading of the letters and seating of the Delegates.

The Quarterly Conference letters were read from the Central Virginia, Northern Virginia, Maryland-New Jersey Conferences. New River Conference letter will be mailed. List of delegates submitted by the churches verified with list of delegates registered in attendance at State Association. Motion made, second, and carried to accept letters as read and seat the delegates. (It was interesting to note the number of churches and ordained and licensed personnel in our State Association. A listing of these is included in this booklet following

The Moderator recognized visitors present; Dr. Thigpen, Free Will Baptist Bible College, and Rev. John Murray and family, Missionaries to France.

The Moderator appointed the Committee on Committees: Rev. Bill Steele, Chairman; Rev. Curtis Byrd; Bro. Ken Stipes. There was no request for a reading of the minutes of last year, so were accepted as printed.

State Home Mission Board Report was presented by Rev.
Lester Horton, Chairman, with a special challenge to
the churches to give to the Maryland State Project a
special offering from time to time. Motion made, second,
and carried to accept the report. The Chairman questioned
coverage of expenses in those areas of mission work other
than the official state project. Motion was made, second,
and carried to cover expenses involved in starting other
Mission Projects -(mileageX4 new churches started this year).

General Board Report was read by the clerk. Motion made, second, and carried to accept the report and deal with item by item.

State Association Treasurer Report was presented. Motion made, second, and carried to accept this report.

Moderator's Report was presented. Motion made, second, and carried to accept his report.

Motion made, second to accept General Board's Recommendation that the Moderator receive Motel expenses in addition to the 20¢ a mile for travel. Motion made, and seconded to amend the motion to include expenses for meals incurred during travel. Motion carried on the amendment, and carried on the vote of original motion.

Home Missions Treasurer Report was presented. Motion made, second, and carried to adopt this report.

Motion made, second, and carried to adopt the General Boards Recommendation that the Moderator appoint the Committee on Committees on Thursday night from the members of the General Board or other ordained personnel present at the meeting, who were members in good standing with the Maryland State Association.

Motion made, second, and carried to adopt the General Boards Recommendation that the General Body appoint a Chairman for the Youth Committee and charge him with the duty of keeping other committee members and churches informed of the progress and plans for the Youth Activities at the annual State Association Neeting.

The Moderator called upon Rev. John Murray to present The National Association Foreign Mission Board Report. He expressed sincere thanks to each church and individual for their prayers and gifts that the Gospel of Jesus Christ might be shared with all nations and peoples. The total giving from Naryland State Association this year was recorded at \$8,668.00. Rev. Murray gave a short report of their personal ministry and requested prayer that the Lord would raise up their needed support in a three month furlough as the church in France was without a Pastor during their absence. Motion made, second, and carried to accept this report.

The Home Mission Board of the National Association Report was presented by Rev. Bevan. Twelve new missionary couples were approved and sent to the fields in 1981; Eight mission churches became self supporting, and one new state was entered - Wisconsin. Maryland State Association gave \$11,436.85 for the support of Home Missions. Motion made, second, and carried to accent this report.

Rev. David Reece, Maryland State Home Missionary to Fredericksburg, Virginia gave a report of God's blessings on the ministry, including the purchase of 5 acres of land for \$10,000.00, amount to be paid off this month. Their goal as a new church is to be self-supporting in a year.

Rev. Vergel Maness, National Home Missionary to Vineland, New Jersey, gave a report of the ministry and the difficulties they have encountered in trying to establish a church, especially the urgent need of getting a loan to pay off the purchase of the property - \$25,000.00 by the end of August, or they are in danger of losing everything.

Announcements were made and then a motion was made, second, and carried to recess for 10 minutes before the Worship service.

## 11:00 A.M. WORSHIP SERVICE

The Morning Worship Service was presided over by Rev. Lester Horton and opened with the congregation singing "All Hail the power of Jesus' Name". Special music "Gloryland Medley" was presented by Jack and Jean Horsley and Pat Evans from the Woodland Heights Free Will Baptist Church, Martinsville, Virginia.

Developing the theme of our Association "The Lordship of Christ" Rev. Hubert Bennett brought the morning message on "The Worship", Scripture text was John 4:24. Lordship designates a position and, or, title of a ruler. Using numerous Scriptures starting with Philippians 2:9 Bro. Bennett expressed how Worship - divine worship - is ascribed to the Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ because He is Lord, because of all that He is and all that He has done, especially in purchasing for us an Eternal Redemption, an Eternal Inheritance, and an Eternal Representation.

Following the invitation and closing words we were dismissed in prayer by Rev. Larry Branham, and recessed for lunch, provided by ladies of Host Church.

#### 1:30 P.M. Session

The Afternoon session, The Woman's Auxiliary Program, was presided over by the President Karen Southwell, and opened with congregation singing "Joy Unspeakable", and prayer led by Mrs. Adams. Their theme verse was I Kings 10:7 "The Half has never been told".

Sister Lottie Horton, Secretary - Treasurer, gave their report. Sister Reece gave a report of the Lord's blessing on the work at Fredericksburg in answer to prayer, and thanked all those who had been faithful in financial and prayer support. Special music was sung by Mrs. Marian Reece and Mrs. Sandy Atwood "My House is Full", no one wants to work in my fields.

Mrs. Mabel Willey, Missionary to Panama, was the speaker for the afternoon, and gave testimony of God's blessing on their labors through the years she and her husband served in Cuba, and the years she has labored in Panama.

Following closing prayer, a love offering was taken, and the Business session was called back into session by the Moderator.

Bro. Steele gave the report for the Committee on Committees.

Resolutions Committee- Rev. Murray Southwell, Chairman, Rev. Larry Branham, Rev. Vergel Maness.

Nominating Committee - Rev. Elzo Bevan, Chairman, Rev. David Reece, Rev. Dewey Lockee.

Budget Committee - Rev. Lester Horton, Chairman, Bro. Clyde Settle, Bro. Cossie Meade.

Motion made, second, and carried to accept as read.

The Moderator then recognized Dr. Roger Reed, from the Sunday School and Church Training Department to give their report. He also gave the reports from the Executive Office and Master's Men. He presented the growth and changes through the years at Randall House, the quality and quantity of materials available and the new literature to come out this fall.

The Moderator called upon Dr. Thigpen to give a report of the Free Will Bible College.

A motion was made, second, and carried to adjourne until the Saturday morning session at 9  $A_{\bullet}M_{\bullet}$ 

### 7:00 P.M. Youth Service

After a good meal at Johnnie's Restaurant a program was presented, presided over by Rev. Atwood.

Special music was presented by --

Rebecca Wells from First Free Will Baptist in Bedford, Virginia. She played and sang "You payed the Price" and "One more Valley".

Dena Horsley of Woodland Heights, Martinsville, Va. accompanied by Jean Horsley at the piane, sang "I'll Walk on Streets of Gold".

Larry Green of Mt. Calvary, Perryman, Maryland accompanied by Teresa Settle at the piano sang "Amazing Grace" and "I Belong to Jesus".

The Fairwood Bible Bowl Team, planning to represent the State at the National Youth Competition, demonstrated their quizzing. The team, Norman Boyd, Donna Boyd, and Wanda Adams were led by their coach - Mrs. Ken Stipes.

The Evening message was brought by Rev. John Hall Jr. speaking on "The Walk" from I John 2:0 "he that saith he abideth in him ought himself also so to walk, even as he walked." Using I Samuel 10:vs. 14-23 he spoke on how we are governed by what we hear, and how music effects teens. The devil is seeking to capture their minds and ruin them. Music of the world effects their forming of opinions, and their walk.

After the message we were dismissed until the 9  $A_{\bullet}N_{\bullet}$  Session on Saturday morning.

(There is no report from the Youth Conference this year. During the afternoon - Friday, they went on a Bus Trip to the Aberdeen Proving Ground Musuem. The Youth that registered are listed with the Delegates and Visitors Lists of those present in Session.)

Saturday - June 26, 1982 BUSINESS SESSION 9:00 A.M. Session

The session opened with congregational singing, "To God be the Glory" led by Music Directors, Jack and Jean Horsley. We were led in prayer by Rev. Branham.

The moderator took charge and called for any miscellaneous business. A motion was made and second that item #12 of the Bylaws be changed to end the sentence "an ordained minister". and delete "and no person may be moderator more than twice in succession."

And that #3 in the Constitution be changed to read "The Officers of this Association shall be elected for a term of three years, except the Moderator and Assistant Moderator, which shall be elected for an indefinite period."

Motion, made second, and carried to table consider the next annual Association. I would be Maryland Motion was made, second, and carried for the Maryland

Motion was made, second, and carried for the Maryland State Mission Board to so-sign with Heritage Free Will Baptist Church for a construction loan from National Association; and the State Board to hold the title until the Building is up and a long term loan can be obtained using the building as collateral.

Announcement was made by Rev. Southwell of the Youth camps in August, Junior week and Teen week.

Motion made, second and carried for the Yorkshire Free Will Baptist Church in Manassas, Va. to host the -1983-17th Annual Session of the Maryland State Association.

The Report of the Committees was called for. The Nominating Committee presented their recommendations. Motion made, second, and carried to adopt and deal with item by item.

Nominated for Youth Committee - Bro. Ken Stipes, for a term of three years, to serve as Chairman; Rev. Richard Atwood, to serve for term of three years; and Rev. David Reece to complete Rev. Roger Mullins term. Motion made, second, and carried to accept these nominations.

State Mission Board - Motion made to re-elect Rev. Tommy Meade and Rev. Ralph Weaver for term of three years, second, and carried to accept.

Executive Committee - Motion made, second, and carried to re-elect Rev. Larry Branham for a term of three years.

Moderator - Motion made, second, and carried to elect Rev. Lester Horton as Moderator for '82-'83, and Rev. Ralph Weaver as Asst. Moderator for '82-'83.

Motion made, second and carried for Bro. Clyde Settle to replace Bro. Kyle Settle as Asst. Treasurer.

The Report of the Budget Committee was read by Bro. Lester Horton, Chairman, and after discussion was moved, second, and carried to adopt. (A copy of the Budget is at the close of Minutes with other Reports.)

The Report of the Resolution committee was read by Brother Southwell, Chairman. Motion was made, second, and carried to adopt the following resolution.

Whereas there is a current controversy throughout our denomination concerning Free Will Baptist College and the beginning of another Free Will Baptist Bible College in the Southeastern Area of the nation known as Southeastern Free Will Baptist Bible College,

Therefore, be it resolved that the Maryland Association of Free Will Baptist Churches go on record as recognizing the right of each individual church and minister the privilege to support the school of their choice, and

Be it further resolved, that this will in no way become a line of fellowship among us.

Motion made, second, and carried to send the following delegates to the National Association: Mrs. Viola Branham, Mrs. Jo Adams, Mrs. Atwood, Mrs. Horton, and Bro. Ken Stipes.

Motion made, second, and carried to give the Host Church a standing vote of appreciation, and a word of thanks to the ladies of the Quarterly Conference for their assistance with the food.

Motion made, second, and carried to adjourne for the Worship Service.

#### 11:00 A.M. WORSHIP SERVICE

Rev. Curtis Byrd presided over the Worship Service. It opened with congregational singing "One Day" and the Morning Offering was received. Special Music was presented by Jack and Jean Horsley and Fat Evans from Woodland Heights, singing "Jesus is right for Whatever is wrong in your life."

The Morning Message was brought by Rev. Bill Steele "The Work" from the text, Titus 3:8,14 - "careful to maintain good works". A change on the inside will be manifested on the outside. The Holiness of God demands we produce Good Works to Glorify His Name, I John 3:1-3.

Following the morning message we were dismissed from the Annual Session in prayer by Dr. Thigpen, and closed by singing "God be with you 'til we meet again".

We are grateful for this opportunity to represent the Free Will Baptist Home For Children at the Maryland State Association of Free Will Baptists.

There are many encouraging moments in child-care work, especially when you begin to see the fruit of your labor in the lives of the children. Along the way there are a few hurts and disappointments, but the blessings outweigh these.

The support of our work is dependent entirely on our churches and friends. We do not receive state or federal aid, but by faith trust the Lord to supply our needs through His people. Our sincere appreciation is expressed to you for your generous and faithful support of this child-care ministry. Children from other states can be admitted to our Home. If you know of those who need the kind of care we offer, please contact us for information.

Contributions from the Maryland State Association during the past 4 years are as follows: 1978 - \$3,495 1979 - \$3,000 1980 - \$3,580 1981 - \$3,095.

You can be a part of our work and help us in some of these ways: Pray for us, come to see us, support with a financial gift, write for a birthday list and remember the children on their birthday, or, if you are interested in a special project, write us for a suggestion. Some churches remember the children on special occasions, such as birthdays and Christmas, while others help provide year-round needs for the Home, such as linens (twin sizes), towels, washclothes, kitchen needs of all kinds, notions, gloves, houseshoes, etc.

We recently began participating in the "Labels for Education" program, and many of you can help us by collecting labels for this project. They are redeemed for needed school and recreation equipment. Labels needed from: Campbell's condensed soups, chunky soups, Campbell's bean products and tomato juice, Franco-American products, V-8 vegetable juice, Swanson canned and blue-green triangle from frozen food products (Swanson).

On May 27th we completed our second year of operation of our own Christian school for the children of the Home. Graduation exercises were held for our 4 graduates: Ruth Turner, Dawn Volanty, Frances and Paul White. We also had two college graduates: Ivan Kennedy completed training as an X-ray technician, and Chris Rutherford finished at FWB Bible College, Nashville, Tennessee.

It was noted the gift received from Anchor Book Store on Home Missions, and was recommended that we use the Book Store to purchase literature, as they give a percentage of their profit to Missions. It was suggested that Bro. Branham take a copy of the minutes with addresses and ask the Book Store to send order blanks to the churches.

It was moved, second, and carried to Recommend to the General Body that the Moderator appoint the Committee on Committees during the General Board Meeting from the members of the General Board or other ordained personnel present at the meeting who were members in good standing with the Maryland State Association - this to take effect next year.

Motion made, second, and carried that the General Board recommend to the General Session that the General Body appoint a chairman for the Youth Committee and charge him

with the duties of keeping other members of the Youth Committee and the Churches informed of the progress and plans for the State Association Youth Meeting. Moved, and second to adjourne, and meeting closed with prayer.

#### STATE HOME MISSIONS BOARD REPORT

This has been another good year for State Missions. The Joint Project in Fredericksburg, VA is being blessed of the Lord. They have purchased five (5) acres of choice land for \$10,000. The amazing thing is that they have been able to pay for it. This is exciting! Since the beginning of the church they have given 10% of their income to the pastor's salary. They have just recently voted to assume another 10% of the pastor's salary. They are to be commended for their attitude and efforts.

Much of Bro. David Reece's support has come in from churches outside our State Association, while some of our own churches have not supported the work. We must get behind this project with our prayers and financial support. As the support from outside the Association declines, our responsibility becomes greater. Another new church has been organized in Stafford, VA, under the leadership of Rev. Joel Cantrell. They have property under contract to build on. They are doing this without any support from the Mission Board.

The Mission Church in Etlan, VA, has moved to a new location in Criglersville, VA, and is now known as the Shiloh Free Will Baptist Church.

We have seen a total of 4 new churches added to our fellowship in the past year. For this we say, PRAISE THE LORD!

Pray with us about many areas in Maryland that we do not have any Free Will Baptist Churches, especially in the area of Andrews Air Force Base near Washington, D.C.
