These additions and any recommended changes shall be ready for discussion at the next annual session.

MARYLAND STATE HOME MISSIONS BOARD REPORT JUNE 21, 1990

The State Home Missions Board met on January 15, 1990, at Fairwood Free Will Baptist Church, with Missionary James Sasser. Brother Sasser presented building plans and costs of material and labor estimates. After receiving and approving the plans, the Home Missions Board recommended that the State Association sign for a loan for the additional funds from the Church Extension Loan Fund. The additional amount being \$120,000.

Facilities are urgently needed at present to accommodate the growth of the church and bring it to self supporting status. Rental income from the property is \$1250/mo., which supports the payments of the present loan. When it is no longer necessary to pay rent for space to worship, the picture will be even brighter.

The Home Missions Board covets your earnest and sincere prayers for the next year, as we look forward to great things happening in Waldorf, and begin to look ahead to other needy areas.

Thank you for your prayer and financial support of the Sasser family. Please continue full financial support as the Church continues to grow until it reaches the point of full self-support.

Roll Call Sunday had a record attendance of 269,425!

Six new missionaries were approved and started services! Millard Sasser, Fresno, California; Mark Thomas, Greeley, Colorado; John Turner, Portland, Oregon; David McGowan, Hamilton, Ohio; Richard Atwood, Dover, Delaware; and Larry Reynolds, Phoenix, Arizona.

Five sets of building plans were drawn up for Home Missions churches!

The Church Extension Loan Fund grew to \$1,737,000!

Income increased approximately \$100,000 over 1988! Your state gave \$16,258.68 to the National Home Missions Department in 1989.

SOUTHEASTERN FREE WILL BAPTIST COLLEGE

The school year of 1989-90 was probably the best overall year we have had in several years. The general morale and attitude of students this year has been great. A number of factors have contributed to this spirit.

- ① Chapel Services Our chapel services were consistently exceptional. I have been able to have excellent rapport with the students. Our outside pastors have done a great job preaching. The best thing that can be said of our chapel services was said by one of our staff as we were leaving chapel one day, "I feel like I have been to church."
- ② Leadership Conference with Student Officers Their input in helping to plan activities, as well as suggestions given in other areas, made students feel more a part of the college. Dr. Stox, Brother Dwyer and myself held a number of sessions on leadership with them.
- The Knights Our traveling basketball team contributed to the excitement this year. We traveled to twelve (12) different Christian schools and played exhibition games using this as a vehicle for recruitment. It was a rallying point for our students.
- Faculty and Staff have been involved much more with students this year particularly in the activities which greatly helped the student-faculty relationships.
- ⑤ Get Acquainted Days We recently had our best Get Acquainted Days ever. There were 105 prospective students and 27 sponsors attending. Of those 105, 43 were seniors or graduates. We revamped the program for these days which I think contributed to the great spirit.
- ® Service 1990 This spring we launched our Service 1990 Program which is an extensive recruiting program. We have committed ourselves to "serve students best." We are inviting our Free Will Baptist young people to "sample our service." We are anticipating 160 students as we plan for our fall semester.
- ① Christian School Blitz In May, we conducted what we called a "Christian School Blitz" and were able to get into twenty-two (22) Christian schools on May 7th. Students who participated were out of classes and invaded the schools spending the day in fellowship with the students and telling them about Southeastern. We received very positive feedback on this endeavor.
- ® Christian Service Department We had a good year in the area of our Christian Service Department. Our students served in twenty-four (24) local churches and nineteen (19) different types of ministries. Our students presented the gospel 1,912 times, prayed with 357 for salvation and witnessed 139 public

professions of faith. (This does not include all the results from traveling groups nor the faculty witness). "Statistically" this means:

- a. One (1) in six (6) gospel presentations result in a salvation decision.
- b. Nearly one third make public professions.
- c. Each student leads three (3) people to Christ.
- d. Students pray with nearly ten (10) people per week to be saved.

We have a great school year planned for next year. Here are a couple of events that you will want to take special note of:

- ☆ Revival and Soul Winning Conference, 1991 Please mark your calendar and note the change in our conference dates for 1991. We will meet one week earlier than we have been meeting-- March 24-27, 1991.
- ☆ Minister's Retreat, January 3-4, 1991 In connection with our Cooperating Board Meeting in January, we plan to have a Minister's Retreat this year. It will be an informal time for preachers to fellowship and get some pointers that will "help" them in their local church ministries. Don't miss this special time designed especially to help the pastor. A brochure listing the program, speakers and minimal cost will be forthcoming in just a few days.

Thank you for your love and support. I appreciate all you have done over the past year. I ask you to continue to send us your students and to help us in a financial way. We are producing good workers. I believe we are worthy of your support.

Thanks again for all you have done. I invite you to come by and see us. If I can be of help to you, please feel free to call on me.

CONSTITUTION

PREAMBLE

We, the members of the Free Will Baptist Denomination being baptized upon the profession of our faith in Christ and realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us as a state association and to preserve and maintain correspondence and coordination among us, do therefore, adopt this Constitution for our better denominational government.

ARTICLES

- This yearly meeting shall be called "The Maryland State Association of Free Will Baptists" and shall be composed of such regularly organized and well-disciplined Free Will Baptist Quarterly Meetings conveniently located as may embody themselves under this Constitution.
- 2. The business of this Association shall be conducted by the ordained ministers and deacons and elected delegates and clerks who are members of a Quarterly Meeting within this Association. Each Quarterly Meeting is entitled to three delegates from each church, in addition to the ordained personnel who are standing delegates.
- The officers of this Association shall be elected for a term of three years, except the Moderator and Assistant Moderator, which shall be elected annually at the close of the meeting of the Association.
- 4. Any well-organized Free Will Baptist Quarterly Meeting composed of such churches as conform to the usages and adopt the Doctrines and the Treatise of the Constitution and By-Laws of this Association may at any time, upon application and by majority vote of this Association, become a member thereof.
- 5. From this time (June 1970) forward, any minister or deacon applying for membership in this Association must first meet the qualifications set forth in I Timothy, Chapter 3, and Titus, Chapter 1. No minister or deacon shall hold membership in this Association if he or his wife have a living companion from a previous marriage.
- This Association shall have authority to discipline the Quarterly Meetings of which it is composed, and exclude them for practices contrary to the Constitution and By-Laws of this Association.
- 7. The annual meeting of this Association shall convene on Friday Morning at 9 o'clock, before the fourth Sunday in June, and shall have power to adopt any regulations or By-Laws not inconsistent with the further regulation of its sessions.
- This Association shall not recognize any minister or delegate unless they comply with the Constitution and By-Laws thereof.
- 9. Parliamentary procedure will be governed by "Robert's Rules Of Order."
- 10. The Constitution and By-Laws of this Association may be altered or ameded at any regular session by a two-thirds vote of the members present, providing the change has been submitted in writing, and tabled from one previous annual session.

THE MARYLAND STATE ASSOCIATION

BY-LAWS

- The Clerk or his assistant, or in their absence, the senior minister in years, shall call the Association to order if a quorum is present. The Moderator (or in his absence the Assistant Moderator) shall take charge. If neither is present, a Moderator Pro-Tem shall be elected.
- It shall be the duty of the Secretary to enroll the ordained personnel and delegates to this Association who shall sign the register upon arrival, with name, address, and Quarterly meeting they represent. Visitors shall also be registered.
- 3. It shall be the duty of each Quarterly Meeting belonging to this Association to send a letter to each annual meeting of this Association reporting in the same its statistics and benevolent work. Any Quarterly meeting belonging to this Association may be dismissed from the Association by two-thirds vote of all members present.
- Each session shall be opened by Scripture reading and Prayer and shall be closed with Prayer.
- By a two-thirds vote of all members present, a ruling of the Moderator can be overruled.
- The Moderator shall have the same privileges to speak as any other person, provided the chair is filled:
- This Association may correspond by letter or otherwise with other religious bodies.
- This Association shall sit with open doors except when it shall go into a committee of the whole.
- Any person not a member of this Association may be allowed to take part in discussion by obtaining permission from the Moderator and properly identifying themselves.
- 10. Anyone desiring to speak shall stand and address the Moderator by the appelation "Brother Moderator", but shall not speak further until recognized by the Moderator.
- 11. It shall be the duty of each member of the Association to be present at the time appointed for each meeting. Anyone wishing to retire should first obtain permission from the Moderator.
- 12. The Moderator of this Association must be an ordained minister.
- 13. The Moderator shall not allow discussion when not carried on in Christian Spirit or when he thinks it will cause discord or division.
- 14. No person shall be allowed to nominate more than one member of any committee provided the person nominated be elected.

BY-LAWS Continued:

- 15. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to seat delegates in a body in a designated section at the beginning of each session.
- 16. A majority of the Quarterly Meetings comprising this body, represented by letter and delegates, shall comprise a quorum.

GENERAL BOARD

The General Board of this Association shall meet at 7:00 PM on Thursday before the regular annual session convenes on Friday Morning, and shall consist of the following: Moderator, Clerk, Executive Committee, also two members-at-large from each Quarterly Meeting, and the Chairmen of all boards and committees. It shall be the duty of all members of this board to be present at the time appointed for each meeting. Proxy representation will be accepted upon presentation of a statement signed by the member. All meetings of this board shall convene with open doors except when resolved into a committee of the whole. Any person not a member of this board may be allowed to take part in the discussions by obtaining permission from the Moderator.

DISSOLUTION

In the event of the dissolution of the Maryland State Association Of Free Will Baptists, any assets of the organization then remaining shall be conveyed to such organizations then existent dedicated to similar objectives to those of this organization, selected by the Executive Board at the time of dissolution, which organization must be exempt under section 501 [E] (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 as amended or under successor provisions of the code as may be in effect at the time of dissolution.
