

MARYLAND STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS HOME MISSIONS REPORT JUNE 20, 1996

The State Home Missions Board met on Monday, February 19, 1996 at the Fairwood Free Will Baptist Church to hear the progress reports of missionary, James Fairchild

After discussion of the use and limitations of the new property that was purchased in February 1995, it was decided to pursue the goal of getting the two parcels combined into one legal entity and thus, off the county tax records. An attorney was contacted and this has been completed.

The Board commends Brother Fairchild for his diligent labors and the great response to the salvation messages. Details of finances and attendance are given in his report.

The potential for growth in the work remains tremendous. Careful planning and organization for best use of buildings will be necessary, in order to make room for the expected Fall enlargement.

The church is making property and building payments of \$2,272.37 per month, and contributing substantially to the missionary's account through State Home Missions. The One-A-Week Campaign faltered badly, but some funds have come in through that channel and have been applied against the debt. Let's stand with this good work and contribute to the property and building in every significant way this year as the church heads toward self-supporting status.

CONSTITUTION of the Maryland State Association of Free Will Baptists

PREAMBLE

We, the members of the Free Will Baptist Denomination, being baptized upon the profession of our faith in Christ and realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us as a state association, and to preserve and maintain correspondence and coordination among us, do therefore adopt this Constitution for the purpose of better denominational government and to the glory of God.

ARTICLE I - NAME AND AFFILIATION

This yearly meeting shall be called the "Maryland State Association of Free Will Baptists."

This Association shall voluntarily affiliate with the National Association of Free Wil Baptists according to the provisions in its treatise.

ARTICLE II - MEMBERSHIP AND REPRESENTATION

The membership of this Association shall be composed of properly organized Free W Baptist Quarterly Meetings. Each shall be composed of churches conforming to the usage and adopting the Doctrines and the Treatise of the National Association of Fre Will Baptists, and the Constitution and By-Laws of the Maryland State Association. Any Quarterly Conference desiring membership in this Association may at any time, upon application and by majority vote of this Association, become a member thereof.

The business of this Association shall be conducted by the ordained ministers, deacor clerks who are members of a Quarterly Meeting within this Association, and elected delegates. Each Quarterly Meeting is entitled to three delegates from each church in addition to the standing delegates.

No minister or deacon will be recognized as a standing delegate who does not confort to all the qualifications of I Timothy 3 and Titus 1, including if he or his wife has a living companion from a previous marriage.

It shall be the duty of each Quarterly Meeting belonging to this Association to send a letter to each annual meeting of this Association reporting in the same its statistics a benevolent work.

This Association shall have authority to discipline the Quarterly Meetings of which composed, and to exclude them for practices contrary to the Constitution and By-La of this Association. Any Quarterly meeting belonging to this Association may be dismissed from the Association by a two-thirds vote of all members present.

ARTICLE III- OFFICERS, BOARDS, AND COMMITTEES

The officers of this Association shall consist of Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clean Secretary, Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer, and all boards and committees as elected the body. These shall be elected for a term of three years, except for the Moderator at the Assistant Moderator which shall be elected annually at the close of the meeting of the Association.

A. Duties of Officers:

Moderator - It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside at all meetings of to preside at all meetings of the Association, General Board, and Executive Committee, and to perform all other duties incumbent to this office. He shall be Chairman of the Executive Committee and the General Board. He shall be an exofficio member of all boards and committees.

Assistant Moderator - It shall be the duty of the Assistant Moderator to assist the Moderator when-ever called upon, and assume the chair in the absence of the Moderator.

Clerk - It shall be the duty of the Clerk to record and maintain all minutes and records pertaining to this Association.

Secretary - It shall be the duty of the Secretary to be responsible for recording the minutes of the Association and to keep complete records of all business transactions. It shall further be the duty of the Secretary to assist the Clerk in the printing of the minutes of each Annual Association.

It shall be the duty of the Secretary to provide means to enroll the ordained personnel and delegates to this Association who shall sign the register upon arrival with name, address, and Quarterly meeting represented.

Treasurer - It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive, deposit, and disperse all funds at the discretion of this Association.

The Treasurer shall provide a quarterly report to the Moderator and Promotional Secretary, and shall give an annual report to the this Association in session.

Assistant Treasurer - It shall be the duty of the Assistant Treasurer to assist the Treasurer in the duties incumbent upon the office. In the absence of the Treasurer the signature of the Assistant Treasurer shall be valid.

B. General Board:

- 1. The General Board of this Association shall meet at 7:00 p.m. on Thursday before the regular annual session convenes on Friday Morning, and shall consist of the following: Moderator, Clerk, Executive Committee, two members-at-large from each Quarterly Meeting, the Chairman of all boards and committees, and all ordained ministers.
- It shall be the duty of all members of this board to be present at the time appointed for each meeting. Proxy representation will be accepted upon presentation of a statement signed by the member.
- All meetings of this board shall convene with open doors except when
 resolved into a committee of the whole. Any person not a member of this
 board may be allowed to take part in the discussion by obtaining permission
 from the Moderator.
- 4. It shall be the responsibility of this board to make written reports of all its work to each annual session of this Association.
- 5. Should necessity arise between the annual sessions of the state association, this board shall be called into special session with the privilege to act with finauthority in all matters pertaining to the general welfare of this Association providing whatever transactions passed shall be by a two-thirds majority votion of the members present.
- This board shall review the annual reports and budgets of all boards and committees before these reports are presented to this Association.

C. Executive Committee:

- This Committee shall consist of the Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, and five (5 members elected by this Association to three (3) year terms.
- This Committee shall provide written reports of its work to the General Boa It shall not have power to commit this Association to any course of action o policy not authorized by this Association.
- 3. This Committee shall have the responsibility of planning the program for the annual meetings of this Association.
- This Committee shall have authority to disburse funds as approved in the Association budget.
- This Committee shall act on behalf of this Association between annual sessions and make recommendation to the General Board.

D. State Home Mission Board:

- This board shall consist of five (5) members elected by this Association to three (3) year terms, and shall be responsible for carrying out the desires of this Association in establishing and supporting mission churches in areas under the direction of the Maryland State Association. It shall report annually to this Association.
- This board shall have authority to make decisions on location, personnel, and finance. Upon approval of this Association or the General Board, it shall be authorized to sign for loans of up to 80% of the bank value of the real estate property.
- 3. This board shall elect one of its members as the Home Missions Treasurer.

 He shall receive and disburse all Home Missions monies and shall keep proper records.

E. Youth Committee:

- This Committee shall consist of five (5) members elected annual to three (3) terms as needed.
 This Committee shall elect its officers which shall consist of the following:
 - 2. This Committee shall elect its officers which shall consist of the following: Chairman, Secretary, Coordinator, and Treasurer.
- 3. The purpose of this committee shall be three-fold:
 - a. To plan and promote the youth activity for each State Association Meeting;
 - b. To plan and promote the CTS youth competition among the local churches;
 - To plan and promote one state youth activity for each fall and spring session.
 - 4. This Committee will meet at the following times:
 - During each State Association Meeting to elect its officers and to set the exact date for the next meeting.
 - During Youth Camp to make plans for a state youth activity in November;
 - c. During the State youth activity in November to finalize plans and to prepare a report for the planning session of the Executive Committee concerning the youth activity at State Association. The report will include the following:
 - 1. Friday activity
 - 2. Competition Schedule
 - 3. Friday Night's Activity Schedule
 - d. During January to plan a state youth activity for the spring.

ARTICLE IV - General Session

The general session of this Association shall convene on Friday Morning at 9 o'cloc before the fourth Sunday in June and shall be empowered to conduct business in compliance with the Constitution and By-Laws of the Maryland State Association o Free Will Baptists.

Each session shall be opened by Scripture reading and prayer and shall be closed wi Prayer.

This Association shall sit with open doors except when it shall go into a committee the whole.

ARTICLE V - AMENDMENT

The Constitution and By-Laws of this Association may be altered or amended at any regular session by a two-thirds vote of the members present providing the change have been submitted in writing and tabled from one previous session.

ARTICLE VI - DISSOLUTION

In the event of the dissolution of the Maryland State Association of Free Will Baptis any assets of this organization then remaining shall be conveyed to such organization then existent dedicated to similar objectives to those of this organization, selected by the General Board at the time of dissolution, which organization must be exempt unsection 501c3 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 as amended or under successor provisions of the code as may be in effect at the time of dissolution.

BY-LAWS

- The Clerk, or in his absence, the senior minister in years, shall call the
 Association to order if a quorum is present. The Moderator (or in his absence the
 Assistant Moderator) shall take charge. If neither is present, a Moderator ProTeam shall be elected.
- 2. By a two-thirds vote of all members present, a ruling of the Moderator shall be overruled.
- The Moderator shall have the same privileges to speak as any other person provided the chair is properly filled.
- This Association may correspond by letter or other wise with other religious bodies.
- Any person not a member of this Association may be allowed to take part in discussion by obtaining permission from the Moderator and properly identifying themselves.
- Anyone desiring to speak shall stand and address the Moderator by the appellation "Brother Moderator," but shall not speak further until recognized by the Moderator.
- 7. It shall be the duty of each member of the Association to be present at the time appointed for each meeting. Anyone wishing to retire should first obtain permission from the Moderator
- 8. The Moderator and the Assistant Moderator must be an ordained ministers.
- 9. Or when, in his judgment, discord or division will be caused.
- No person shall be allowed to nominate more than one member of any board or committee.
- It shall be the duty of the Moderator to seat delegates in a designated section at the beginning of each session.
- A majority of the Quarterly Meetings comprising this body, represented by letter and delegates, shall comprise a quorum.
- This Association shall follow Parliamentary procedure governed by "Robert's Rules of Order."

They came walking, carrying lanterns and some even arrived in the back of pick-up trucks to be in the service where local boy Lester Horton was scheduled to testify at the little Methodist Church located in Edison, Tennessee.
