### CONSTITUTION, BY-LAWS AND STANDING RULES MICHIGAN STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

#### **PREAMBLE**

The object of this organization shall be to unify and strengthen the work of Free Will Baptists of Michigan, composing the State Association and to devise and execute measures for the extension of the Kingdom of God among member associations.

#### **ARTICLE I**

NAME: This organization shall be known as the Michigan State Association of Free Will Baptists.

#### **ARTICLE II**

MEMBERSHIP AND REPRESENTATION:

<u>Section 1.</u> The membership of this association shall consist of all subordinate associations that from time to time shall become members of this body.

Section 2. Each subordinate association holding membership in the State Association shall be entitled to the equivalent of 1 delegate per 100 members of fraction thereof from each Church, to be elected from the laity. The standing delegation shall consist of all active ordained ministers and their wives and deacons and their wives, and the elected officers of each subordinate association. It is understood that all representatives, elected and standing, shall be members in good standing of a member subordinate association.

#### THE REPORT OF A SECURITY OF ARTICLE III MAD A SECOND CONTRACTOR OF A

#### OFFICERS: A PETER TO A DESCRIPTION OF THE RESERVE AND A SECRET CONTRACTOR OF THE PETERS OF THE PETER

<u>Section 1</u>. The officers of this State Association shall consist of a Moderator, and Assistant Moderator, a Clerk, an Assistant Clerk and a Treasurer, each of which shall be elected at the close of each annual session.

Section 2. This association shall have as many Boards as it deems necessary to promote its work.

Section 3. Committees, as necessary, shall be appointed by the Moderator unless otherwise provided for, and shall hold office until their work is completed, or until their successors are elected.

### ARTICLE IV

#### GENERAL BOARD:

Section 1. The General Board shall consist of the Moderator, Assistant

Moderator, Clerk, Asistant Clerk, Treasurer and the Chairman of each board of this Association.

<u>Section 2.</u> The General Board shall have the power to act in behalf of and for the State Association from one regular session to another, and shall also have power to elect such officers as may be necessary for its own government and to carry out the plans and undertaking of the State Association.

#### ARTICLE V

#### **MEETINGS:**

The meetings of this State Association shall be held annually beginning on Friday night before the third Sunday in June.

#### **ARTICLE VI**

#### **DISCIPLINE:**

To maintain sound doctrine and proper conduct this association shall have the right to act on any question that may properly come before it. These actions shall be handled according to the Word of God and the Treatise of the National Association of Free Will Baptists.

#### ARTICLE VII

### FINANCING:

(1) Each subordinate association representing in this body shall send no less than the sum of \$25.00 annually. (2) That each church send \$15.00 to the state association through each subordinate association.

AMENDMENTS: This constitution may be amended or altered at the regular session of this State Association by a two-thirds vote of members present, provided proposed amendment or alteration be presented in writing to this body one day in advance.

#### **MEMBERSHIPS:**

Section 1. Any subordinate association desiring to become a member of this State Association shall do so by presenting duly elected delegates and a petitionary letter certifying to their appointment to this association at any session and upon examination by this association, the subordinate association, if found orthodox, shall be admitted. This petitionary letter shall include the names and addresses of all ordained ministers and deacons and the officers of the subordinate association.

#### **STANDING BOARDS:**

Section 2. The General Board shall have the power to fill irregular vacancies that may occur in its own body, and shall have power to fill

any irregular vacancies that may occur in any department of the work between sessions of this State Association. It shall be the duty of this Board to make written reports of all its work to each session of this association.

Section 3. The General Board shall organize at its own discretion for the promotion of its work. It is understood that an Executive Committee consisting of seven members shall be elected by the General Board from among its membership, whose duty it shall be to act on all matters coming within the scope of the work of the Board when said General Board is not in session.

Section 4. The duties of various standing Boards shall be to plan a program and supervise its operation in their respective fields. They shall organize themselves and regulate their work as may become necessary, and as may be found in harmony with the principles and tenets of this State Association. It shall be the duty of each standing Board to make written reports of all its work to each annual session of this Association.

#### **DISCIPLINE:**

Section 5. This State Association shall have the right to settle any questions of discipline, doctrine or practice that may properly come before it from any other bodies composing said organization of the Michigan State Association of Free Will Baptists, or act on any appeal that may be made by any body belonging to the State Association. Said appeal shall have been written and properly signed by the constituent body or bodies, and its decision shall be final. Such appeals are to come before the State Association after having been appealed from the lower to next higher body.

Section 6. All appeals coming before this association may be settled in either of the following ways: (1) By this association when sitting in a committee as a whole; (2) By a special committee whose report shall be voted on without discussion.

#### PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY:

Section 6. All meetings of this organization shall be governed by parliamentary law as set forth in Roberts' Rules of Order (Revised).

#### **AMENDMENTS:**

Section 8. These By-Laws may be amended or altered at any regular session of this Association by a two-thirds vote of members present, provided proposed amendments or alterations be presented in writing to the body one day in advance.

### RULES OF DECORUM

1. The Association, when convened, shall be opened and closed by singing and prayer.

- 2. Only one person shall speak at a time, who shall arise to his feet and address the moderator.
- 3. Each person thus speaking shall not be interrupted in speech, except by the moderator, until he gets through; nor shall the moderator interrupt him unless he breaks order.
- 4. The person speaking shall adhere to the question and shall in no wise cast reflections on any person who may have spoken before him.
- 5. No person shall speak more than three times on the same subject without leave of the Association.
  - 6. No person shall laugh or whisper in time of public speech.
- 7. Members shall address each other by the appellation of brother or brethren, or sisters.
- 8. No members of this Association shall absent himself when the association is sitting in conference without leave of the moderator.
- 9. The names of the members of this association shall be enrolled and called as often as the association thinks it necessary.
- 10. No member shall speak longer than fifteen minutes at any one time without leave of the moderator.

#### **ARTICLES OF FAITH**

- 1. THE BIBLE. The Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God, and are our infallible rule of faith and practice.
- 2. GOD. There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver, and Righteous Governor of the universe; and in the Scriptures as Father, Son, and Holy Ghost; yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore and obey.
- 3. CHRIST. Christ is God manifest in the flesh; in His divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified, He is now risen and glorified, and is our ever present Saviour and Lord.
- 4. THE HOLY SPIRIT. The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God.
- 5. THE GOVERNMENT OF GOD. God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the

constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts, not otherwise provided for, as the highest welfare of men requires.

- 6. THE SINFULLNESS OF MAN. Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity, therefore, inherit a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin and become guilty before God.
- 7. THE WORK OF CHRIST. The Son of God by His incarnation, life, sufferings, death, and resurrection effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free, and is the ground of salvation by faith.

- 8. THE TERMS OF SALVATION. The conditions of salvation are:
  1. Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of it.
  2. Faith or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Saviour and Lord with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith, the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the dominion of sin, and becomes a child of God. 3. Continuance in faith and obedience until death.
- 9. ELECTION. God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of Salvation. Hence by faith in Christ men become His elect.
- 10. FREEDOM OF THE WILL. The human will is free and self-controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit, or to resist them and perish.

- 11. SALVATION FREE. God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely.
- 12. PERSEVERANCE. All believers in Christ, who through grace persevere in holiness to the end of life, have promise of eternal salvation.

13. GOSPEL ORDINANCES. BAPTISM, or the immersion of believers in water, and the LORD'S SUPPER, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel. FEETWASHING, an ordinance teaching humility, is of universal obligation, and is to be ministered to all true believers.

- 14. TITHING. God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament; Jesus Christ endorsed it in the Gospel (Matt. 23:23), and the apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store, as God hath prospered him" (1 Cor. 16:2a).
- 15. THE CHRISTIAN SABBATH. The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employments and amusements, for rest, worship, holy works, and activities, and for personal communion with God.

16. RESURRECTION, JUDGMENT, AND FINAL RETRIBUTION. The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation; then the wicked will "go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."

Session was opened with a song time conducted by Rev. Letcher Bush leading "Stand Up For Jesus" and the chorus of "How Great Thou Art".

A warm welcome was given by Rev. Charles Cooper, host pastor, after which the Clerk, Rev. Milton Worthington, called the Michigan State Association to order. The Clerk introduced the State Moderator, Rev. J. B. Varney, who read the scriptures 2 Timothy 4:1-8. Standing and church delegates were seated.

Item No. 1, concerning a constitutional change, and Item No. 2, concerning a proposed state mission board, were read to give the body time for consideration before acting on them before Saturday.

Motion carried to adjourn the business session and enter into the worship time.

The Liberty Association Ministers Quartet ministered in singing two songs followed by Rev. Bush leading the congregation in "Power In The Blood".

The offering was received followed with prayer by Rev. Bob Trimble.

Dr. Melvin Worthington, the speaker of the hour, was introduced. He gave a tremendous challenge from I Timothy 1:12-17 entitled "Model Minister".

The worship service was dismissed in prayer and business session adjourned until 9:30 A.M. Saturday, June 20th.

#### SATURDAY MORNING, JUNE 20, 1981

The Saturday morning session was opened with the singing of "I Will Sing The Wonderous Story" led by Rev. Letch Bush.

Bro. Larry Hampton shared a devotional thought on the subject of "Lesser Known Characters" from 2 Timothy 4, Philippians 4, and 3 John. Special emphasis was given to Stephanas (I Corinthians 1:16).

The Business Committee gave their report, which would be acted on after lunch. The morning offering was received. Session was dismissed for lunch.

The afternoon session was opened with a song time conducted by Rev. Letcher Bush leading "Standing on the Promises" and a chorus of "How Great Thou Art".

Rev. Paul Ketteman brought a devotional thought from Amos 4:12 entitled "The Burden of Amos".

The Business Committee report was given by Russell Lowe. Motion carried to receive their report and act on it item by item.

- Item No. 1: Motion carried that we give \$100 to the Russell Lowe account, Missionary to Idaho.
- Item No. 2: Motion carried that we give \$100 to the Ernie Ross account, Missionary to Minnesota.
- Item No. 3: Motion carried that we give \$500 to the FWB Co-op plan, which will be disbursed between all National departments.
- Item No. 4: Whereas; the Michigan State Association of Free Will Baptists meets in session only one time each year, and whereas; it is evident that the work of our denomination as a State Association was never intended to be limited in its operation and transaction of state business to a one time a year annual session, whereas; we believe the constitution and By-laws was written in a manner to allow the Association to be operational with the power and authority to transact business for the benefit of carrying on God's business as a state work on a regular basis,

and whereas; there seems to be a lack of clarification of the manner in which our Constitution and By-Laws sets forth responsibility and authority to do this business of advancing the cause of Christ, and promoting the denominational enterprise on a state level, and whereas; we believe article IV section 2 of the Constitution to state that this power be given to the General Board, and whereas; that under the heading of STAND-ING BOARDS of the By-Laws in section 3, that the General Board shall be operational at any time, and whereas; section 4 of the By-Laws makes clear that all standing boards are to be operational, and that they are to be Supervisors of their operation in the program they plan; and that each board, according to section 2 and 4 of the By-Laws shall make a written report of its work to the Association when in session; and whereas; we believe that lack of clarification of these rules has caused us / to fear to act on items of importance in our state work, and therefore limit the work of our state association.

WE THEREFORE REQUEST the Association to confirm this understanding of the Constitution and By-Laws of our Association at this setting so it may go on record in our Minutes that this had been clarified by the body of delegates this day, so that our State Association may be more effective in its operation. This item was so clarified.

Item No. 5: Motion carried that our Home Mission Department of the Michigan State Association be enlarged from one man to a "Home Mission Board" and a "Director of Home Missions". This board will consist of one member from each Association (using the same procedure we use in selecting our Youth Camp Board and Co-ordinator). The duty of the Board shall be to promote the work of FWB in the state of Michigan and shall function under normal guidelines as a Mission Board, with the power to operate according to our Constitution and By-Laws. The Director shall be elected by the State Association when in session. He shall have the responsibility to chair the Board, and direct the operation of Home Missions in the state according to the policy set forth by the Board.

Item No. 6: Motion carried that we recommend to each of the four Associations to elect a Youth Director over their Association and that the four Association Youth Directors in joint co-operation with the State Youth Director and his Assistant Director, form a committee to work with the preparations and promotions of the State Teenspiration and all other youth oriented state functions.

- Item No. 7: Motion carried with a standing vote to express our appreciation for the Troy FWB Church hosting the State Association.
- Item No. 8: Motion carried that we as the State Association of Free Will Baptists of Michigan hereby let it be known that we stand against abortion, pornography, and legalized gambling being introduced into Detroit and the cities of the State of Michigan.

A copy of this resolution will be sent to the office of the Governor of the State of Michigan and to the office of the Mayor of Detroit.

The Nominating Committee report was given by Rev. Letcher Bush. Motion carried to receive and act on position by position.
