

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CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, faith, and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ."

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel; nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society, constantly praying and toiling that the kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

MICHIGAN STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

CONSTITUTION

Preamble

The object of this organization shall be to unify and strengthen the work of Free Will Baptists of Michigan, composing the State Association and to devise and execute measures for the extension of the Kingdom of God among member associations.

Article I

Name

This organization shall be known as the Michigan State Association of Free Will Baptists.

Article II

Membership and Representation

- Section 1. The membership of this association shall consist of all subordinate associations that from time to time shall become members of this body.
- Section 2. Each subordinate association holding membership in the State Association shall be entitled to the equivalent of one delegate per 100 members or fraction thereof from each church, to be elected from the laity. The standing delegation shall consist of all active ordained ministers and their wives, deacons and their wives, the elected officers of each subordinate association and the elected officers and board members of the Michigan State Association.

Article III

Officers

- Section 1. The officers of this State Association shall consist of a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk and Treasurer, each of which shall be elected at the close of each annual session.
- Section 2. This association shall have as many boards as it deems necessary to promote its work.
- Section 3. Committees, as necessary, shall be appointed by the moderator unless otherwise provided for, and shall hold office until their work is completed or until their successors are elected.

Article IV

General Board

- Section 1. The General Board shall consist of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, Treasurer, chairman of the standing boards and the moderator of each district association.
- Section 2. The General Board shall have the power to act in behalf of and for the State Association from one regular session to another, and shall also have power to elect such officers as may be necessary for its own government and to carry out the plans and undertaking of the State Association.
- Section 3. The General Board may hire a Promotional Secretary to help carry out the business and promotional activities. The promotional secretary is directly accountable to the General Board.

Article V

Other Boards

Section 1. The following standing boards shall function in designated areas of the work, subject to the approval of the State Association: Mission Board, Christian Education Board, Youth Board and Master's Men Board.

- Section 2. Each of the above named boards shall be composed of five members. These shall be rotating boards with terms of three years expiring on the basis of two the first year, two the second year and one the third year. No board member shall serve more than two consecutive terms.
- Section 3. No officer of the association shall serve on any board of the association (except the General Board). No member shall serve on more than one board. The chairman of each standing board shall automatically be a member of the General Board.
- Section 4. Each board shall organize after the final adjournment of the annual meeting to elect a chairman and any other officers needed. A majority of each board shall constitute a quorum. Members may represent by proxy.
- Section 5. Each board shall make a written report, including financial data to each session of the General Board.
- Section 6. The Promotional Secretary shall be an ex-officio member of each board. He and the boards shall work cooperatively.
- Section 7. The Youth Board shall give general oversight to youth camp, church training service and other activities.
- Section 8. The Christian Education Board shall promote the cause of Sunday Schools, set up activities and programs whereby ministers and lay people may continue their christian education and give guidance to Free Will Baptist young people in matters of education.
- Section 9. The Mission Board shall provide general oversight to the mission work which includes a program of establishing new churches, and maintaining existing churches at home and abroad.
- Section 10. The Master's Men Board shall seek to get churches to establish Master's Men chapters as well as cooperate with the National Master's Men Board.

Article VI

Meetings

The meetings of this State Association shall be held annually beginning on Thursday evening before the third Saturday in May.

Acticle VII

Discipline

To maintain sound doctrine and proper conduct, this association shall have the right to act on any question that may properly come before it. These actions shall be handled according to the Word of God and the Treatise of the National Association of Free Will Baptists.

Article VIII

Financing

- 1. Each subordinate association represented in this body shall send no less than the sum of \$25.00 annually.
- 2. Each church shall send \$10.00 annually to the State Association through each subordinate association.

Article IX

Amendments

This constitution may be amended or altered at the regular session of this State Association by a two-thirds vote of members present, provided proposed amendment or alteration be presented in writing to this body one day in advance.

BY-LAWS

Membership

Section L Any subordinate association desiring to become a member of this State Association shall do so by presenting duly elected delegates and a petitionary letter certifying to their appointment to this association at any session and upon examination by this association, the subordinate association, if found orthodox, shall be admitted. This petitionary letter shall include the names and addresses of all ordained ministers and deacons and the officers of the subordinate association.

Standing Boards

Section 1. The General Board shall have the power to fill irregular vacancies that may occur in its own body, and shall have power to fill any irregular vacancies that may occur in any department of the work between sessions of this State Association. It shall be the duty of this board to make written reports of all its work to each session of this association.

Section 2. The General Board shall organize at its own discretion for the promotion of its work. It is understood that any executive committee consisting of seven members shall be elected by the General Board from among its membership, whose duty it shall be to act on all matters coming within the scope of the work of the Board when said General Board is not in session.

Section 3. The duties of various standing boards shall be to plan a program and supervise its operation in their respective fields. They shall organize themselves and regulate their work as may become necessary and as may be found in harmony with the principles and tenets of this State Association. It shall be the duty of each standing board to make written reports of all its work to each annual session of this association.

Discipline

Section 1. This State Association shall have the right to settle any

questions of discipline, doctrine or practice that may properly come before it from any other bodies composing said organization of the Michigan State Association of Free Will Baptists, or act on any appeal that may be made by any body belonging to the State Association. Said appeal shall have been written and properly signed by the constituent body or bodies, and its decision shall be final. Such appeals are to come before the State Association after having been appealed from the lower to next higher body.

- Section 2. All appeals coming before this association may be settled in either of the following ways:
 - 1. By this association when sitting in a committee as a whole.
 - 2. By a special committee whose report shall be voted on without discussion.

Parliamentary Authority

Section 1. All meetings of this organization shall be governed by parliamentary law as set forth in Roberts's Rules of Order (Revised).

Amendments

Section 1. These by-laws may be amended or altered at any regular session of this association by a two-thirds vote of members present, provided proposed amendments or alterations be presented in writing to the body one day in advance.

RULES OF DECORUM

- 1. The State Association, when convened, shall be opened and closed by singing and prayer.
- 2. Only one person shall speak at a time, who shall arise to his feet and address the moderator.
- 3. Each person thus speaking shall not be interrupted in speech, except by the moderator, until he gets through; nor shall the moderator interrupt him unless he breaks order.

- 4. The person speaking shall adhere to the question and shall in no wise cast reflection on any person who may have spoken before him.
- 5. No person shall speak more than three times on the same subject without leave of the association.
 - 6. No person shall laugh or whisper in time of public speech.
- 7. Members shall address each other by the appellation of brother or brethren or sisters.
- 8. No members of this association shall absent himself when the association is sitting in conference without leave of the moderator.
- 9. The names of the members of this association shall be enrolled and called as often as the association thinks it necessary.
- 10. No member shall speak longer than fifteen minutes at any one time without leave of the moderator.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. The Bible. The Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God, and are our infallible rule of faith and practice.
- 2. God. There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver, and Righteous Governor of the universe; and in the Scriptures as Father, Son, and Holy Ghost; yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore, and obey.
- 3. Christ. Christ is God manifest in the flesh; in His divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified, He is now risen and glorified, and is our ever present Saviour and Lord.
- 4. The Holy Spirit. The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God.

- 5. The Government of God. God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts, not otherwise provided for, as the highest welfare of men requires.
- 6. The Sinfulness of Man. Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity, therefore, inherit a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin and become guilty before God.
- 7. The Work of Christ. The Son of God by His incarnation, life, sufferings, death, and resurrection effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free, and is the ground of salvation by faith.
 - 8. The Terms of Salvation. The conditions of salvation are:
- 1. Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of it.

 2. Faith or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Saviour and Lord with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith, the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the dominion of sin, and becomes a child of God. 3. Continuance in faith and obedience unto death.
- 9. Election. God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ men become His elect.
- 10. Freedom of Will. The human will is free and self-controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit, or to resist them and perish.
- 11. Salvation Free. God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely.
- 12. Perseverance. All believers in Christ, who through grace persevere in holiness to the end of life, have promise of eternal salvation.
- 13. Gospel Ordinances. Baptism, or the immersion of believers in water, and the Lord's Supper, are ordinances to be perpetuated under

- the Gospel. Feet Washing, an ordinance teaching humility, is of universal obligation, and is to be ministered to all true believers.
- 14. Tithing. God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament; Jesus Christ endorsed it in the Gospel (Matt. 23:23), and the apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store, as God hath prospered him" (1 Cor. 16:2a).
- 15. The Christian Sabbath. The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employments and amusements, for rest, worship, holy works, and activities, and for personal communion with God.

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16. Resurrection, Judgment, and Final Retribution. The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation; then the wicked will "go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."

STATE ASSOCIATION REPORTS

Mission Report

Rev. Rudy Shankle presented the Missions Report. It was reported that 1992 was a good year for Home Missions, eleven new missionaries were approved and started services and as of May 23, 1993 the Tecumseh Mission became a self-supporting Free Will Baptist Church. A motion carried to receive this report as information.

Youth Board Report

Rev. Allan West presented the Youth Report reflecting on the CTS Competitive Activities, Youth Scene and FWB Youth Camp, June 20-24, 1993. A motion carried to receive this report as information.

Master's Men Report

Bro. Paul Bird presented the Master's Men Report. Master's Men now has 90 life members, 18 life commitments and 3 life friends. New chapters have been started at First FWB Church, Plymouth. State Officers: President, Paul Bird; Vice President, Roger Drennen; Secretary/Treasurer, Rudy Taylor; Board Chairman, Elmer Ferrell, Activities Chairman, Elmer Ferrell. Advisory Pastors are Rev. Rudolph Shankle, Rev. Jim Walker and Rev. David Shepherd. A motion carried to receive this report as information.

Woman's Auxiliary Report

Sister Lucille Steward presented the Woman's Auxiliary Report. The State Project funds were placed in the missionary accounts of Steve Riggs and Tom McCullough. The money for 1993 will go to the missionary accounts of Dr. Mark Paschall and Susan Bumpus. The State Meeting was held April 24 at the 13 Mile Road Chapel with around 150 ladies in attendance. Special speakers were Becky Riggs, Susan Bumpus, Patty McCullough and Kathy Paschall. The provision closet for last year was \$15,500.00. \$500.00 was sent to WNAC for a new computer and \$300.00 to Becky Riggs for a Video Camera. About \$8000 in medical supplies went to the hospital in Africa, 875 pairs of glasses to World Medical Relief, over \$3000 in medical supplies to World Medical Relief (supplies our hospital could not use), over 500 books and magazines to Veterans Hospital, and adult clothes and baby clothes to Rochester Crisis Center. Food was supplied to feed over 600 people at Freedom Mission in Detroit for Thanksgiving and Christmas and about 175 baskets of food for the needy and homeless along with christmas gifts to over 100 children. Milk and cookies were also supplied for the missions Vacation Bible School. A motion was carried to receive this report as information.

Executive Committee Report

Rev. Milton Worthington presented the Executive Committee Report. A motion was carried to receive this report as information.

NATIONAL DEPARTMENT REPORTS

After each report was given a motion was moved, seconded and carried to receive same as information. Also, a motion was seconded and carried to authorize our National Executive Office to send a letter and video to each of our state churches to inform them about the Capital Stewardship program.

A motion was moved, seconded and carried for a recess before the worship service. Rev. Stephen Riggs led in prayer.

The session reconvened with the congregation singing "Love Lifted Me" led by Rev. Milton Worthington. An offering was received.

Offertory prayer by Rev. Ollie Lafferty. Offertory piano special by Rev. Herman Hersey, "When They Ring the Golden Bells".

The speaker, Dr. Malcolm Fry, was introduced. Special music was also provided by Dr. Fry, "Fill My Cup Lord" and "He Looked Beyond My Fault and Saw My Need".
