

Church Covenant

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions and social worship; and by selfdenial, faith, and good works endeavor to "Grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ."

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel; nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society, constantly praying and toiling that the kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday Schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Michigan State Association of Free Will Baptists

Constitution

Preamble

The object of this organization shall be to unify and strengthen the work of Free Will Baptists of Michigan, composing the State Association and to devise and execute measures for the extension of the Kingdom of God among member associations.

Article I

Name

This organization shall be known as the Michigan State Association of Free Will Baptists.

Article II

Membership and Representation

Section 1. The membership of this association shall consist of all subordinate associations that from time to time shall become members of this body.

Section 2. Each subordinate association holding membership in the State Association shall be entitled to the equivalent of one delegate per 100 members or fraction thereof from each church, to be elected from the laity. The standing delegation shall consist of all active ordained ministers and their wives, licensed ministers and their wives, ministers in active standing and their wives, deacons and their wives, the elected officers of each subordinate association and the elected officers and board members of the Michigan State Association.

Article III

Officers

- Section 1. The officers of this State Association shall consist of a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk and Treasurer, each of which shall be elected at the close of each annual session.
- Section 2. This association shall have as many boards as it deems necessary to promote its work.
- Section 3. Committees, as necessary, shall be appointed by the moderator unless otherwise provided for, and shall hold office until their work is completed or until their successors are elected.

Article IV

General Board

- Section 1. The General Board shall consist of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, Treasurer, chairman of the standing boards and the moderator of each district association.
- Section 2. The General Board shall have the power to act in behalf of and for the State Association from one regular session to another, and shall also have power to elect such officers as may be necessary for its own government and to carry out the plans and undertaking of the State Association.
- Section 3. The General Board may hire a Promotional Secretary to help carry out the business and promotional activities. The promotional secretary is directly accountable to the General Board.

Article V

Other Boards

- Section 1. The following standing boards shall function in designated areas of the work, subject to the approval of the State Association; Mission Board, Christian Education Board, Youth Board and Master's Men Board.
- Section 2. Each of the above named boards shall be composed of five members. These shall be rotating boards with terms of three years expiring on the basis of two the first year, two the second year and one the third year. No board member shall serve more that two consecutive terms.
- Section 3. No officer of the association shall serve on any board of the association (except the General Board). No member shall serve on more than one board. The chairman of each standing board shall automatically be a member of the General Board.
- Section 4. Each board shall organize after the final adjournment of the annual meeting to elect a chairman and any other officers needed. A majority of each board shall constitute a quorum. Members may represent by proxy.
- Section 5. Each board shall make a written report, including financial data to each session of the General Board.
- Section 6. The Promotional Secretary shall be an ex-officio member of each board. He and the boards shall work cooperatively.

The Promotional Secretary shall work with the chairman of each standing board and moderator, or specified promotional director, of each district association to promote the work of the Lord and Free Will Baptists in the state of Michigan. He will also work cooperatively with the Michigan Woman's Auxiliary Convention and the Michigan Ministerial Fellowship.

The Promotional Secretary shall edit, publish and mail a monthly paper, and mail a packet to each church for distribution.

Section 7. The Youth Board shall give general oversight to youth camp, church training service and other activities.

This shall be done by the appointment of a director of youth camp, director of church training service, director of Teen Scene, as well as any other youth activity within the realm of this Board's responsibility.

The director of Youth Camp, or coordinator, will negotiate a camp site each year, meet necessary criteria of the state of Michigan, appoint general directors, suggest sufficient fees, distribute worker's and camper's application forms to each church, and use every available means to promote youth camp.

The director of Church Training Service will work with coordinators, or directors, from each district association to promote the Church Training Service program; and plan, conduct and supervise the CTS competitive activities.

The director of Teen Scene will plan periodic Teen Scene events which will include inspiration, social and athletic opportunities.

These directors will plan their respective events with the approval of the Youth Board and within the budget adopted by the Michigan State Association of Free Will Baptists. Each event will be self-funded as nearly as possible.

Section 8. The Christian Education Board shall promote the cause of Sunday Schools, set up activities and programs whereby ministers and lay people may continue their Christian education and give guidance to Free Will Baptist young people in matters of education.

This board is responsible for promoting an annual Sunday school enlargement campaign in conjunction with the spring or fall campaign promoted by the National Board of Sunday School and CTS. Results will be published in the state paper.

This Board will conduct seminars such as "Marriage and the Family," "Church Growth Principles," "Finances and the Local Church," etc.; as well as college level courses for credit or audit offered by Free Will Baptist Bible College. Such seminars will be held at a neutral site as much as possible with an occasional retreat.

Section 9. The Mission Board shall provide general oversight to the mission work which includes a program of establishing new churches, and maintaining existing churches at home and abroad.

This board shall work in conjunction with the Home Missions and Foreign Missions Boards of the National Association of Free Will Baptists in promoting the cause of missions.

An annual Missions Conference, home and foreign, shall be promoted each year involving as many churches as possible. Mission candidates will be placed in churches, regardless of size, throughout the year as opportunities arise.

The following procedures will be followed in establishment of a mission:

- 1. Select the city or area where the new church will be located.
- 2. Select a missionary with the personality, temperament, and organizational skills suited for that area. The Missions Board chairman will contact the General Director of the National Home Missions Board to enter into a "Joint Project" agreement. Such things as salary, benefits, revival and convention arrangements shall be reported to the Michigan General Board.
- 3. Plan the itinerary for the missionary.
- 4. Sponsor the missionary to at least one church planting seminar. This seminar(s) chosen by the Board and the missionary.
- 5. Agree on the date and location of services.
- 6. Maintain complete control of the mission until a church is properly organized, such as...
 - A. Receive a weekly financial update, and a complete monthly financial report from the mission;
 - B. Receive a monthly report from the missionary. This monthly update will report attendance figures, personal gifts of money received from mission attenders, number of contacts made, conversions, baptisms, etc.
 - C. Appoint another missionary to succeeding founding missionary in the event of a resignation or release.
- 7. Any properties purchased will be in the name of the Missions Board of the Michigan State Association of Free Will Baptists. At the time of official organization, said properties will be deeded to the church with the stipulation that in the event the church

- ceases to exist as a Free Will Baptist congregation the church property will revert to the Mission Board of the Michigan State Association of Free Will Baptist.
- 8. The Mission Board will make an annual evaluation of the missionary's work and ministry, and provide the opportunity for improvement in ministry, i.e. church growth seminars, preaching seminars, management seminars, etc.
- 9. The mission shall be constituted as a church at such time as...
 - A. The Missions Board and the missionary feel the mission is emotionally and financially stable enough to become selfsupporting and self-governing, or
 - B. The mission is no longer willing to submit to the rigid control of the Missions Board. In this event the Missions Board would continue to assist the mission, in a non-financial manner, in constituting as a church, becoming a member of a district association, and making the transition from a Missions Board controlled mission to a self-governing church as smoothly and as amicably as possible.
- 10. The Missions Board will then repeat the process in another area.

Section 10. The Master's Men Board shall seek to get churches to establish Master's Men chapters as well as cooperate with the National Master's Men Board.

Article VI

Meetings

The meetings of this State Association shall be held annually beginning on Friday evening before the third Saturday in May.

Article VII

Discipline

To maintain sound doctrine and proper conduct, this association shall have the right to act on any question that may properly come before it. These actions shall be handled according to the Word of God and the Treatise of the National Association of Free Will Baptists.

Article VIII

Financing

- 1. Each subordinate association represented in this body shall send no less than the sum of \$50.00 annually.
- 2. Each church shall send \$50.00 annually to the State Association through each subordinate association.

Article IX

Amendments

This constitution may be amended or altered at the regular session of this State Association by a two-thirds vote of members present, provided proposed amendment or alteration be presented in writing to this body one day in advance.

BY-LAWS

Membership

Section 1. Any subordinate association desiring to become a member of this State Association shall do so by presenting duly elected delegates and a petitionary letter certifying to their appointment to this association at any session and upon examination by this association, the subordinate association, if found orthodox, shall be admitted. This petitionary letter shall include the names and addresses of all ordained ministers and deacons and the officers of the subordinate association.

Standing Boards

- Section 1. The General Board shall have the power to fill irregular vacancies that may occur in its own body, and shall have power to fill any irregular vacancies that may occur in any department of the work between sessions of this State Association. It shall be the duty of this board to make written reports of all its work to each session of the association.
- Section 2. The General Board shall organize at its own discretion for the promotion of its work. It is understood that any executive committee consisting of seven members shall be elected by the General Board from among its membership, whose duty it shall be to act on all matters coming within the scope of the work of the Board when said General Board is not in session.
- Section 3. The duties of various standing boards shall be to plan a program and supervise its operation in their respective fields. They shall organize themselves and regulate their work as many become necessary and as may be found in harmony with the principles and tenets of the State Association. It shall be the duty of each standing board to make written reports of all its work to each annual session of this association.

Discipline

Section 1. This State Association shall have the right to settle any questions of discipline, doctrine or practice that may properly come before it from any other bodies composing said organization of the Michigan State Association of Free Will Baptists, or act on any appeal that may be made by any body belonging to the State Association. Said appeal shall have been written and properly signed by the constituent body or bodies, and its decision shall be final. Such appeals are to come before the State Association after having been appealed from the lower to next higher body.

Section 2. All appeals coming before this association may be settled in either of the following ways:

- 1. By this association when sitting in a committee as a whole.
- 2. By a special committee whose report shall be voted on without discussion.

Parliamentary Authority

Section 1. All meetings of this organization shall be governed by parliamentary law as set forth in Robert's Rules of Order (Revised).

Amendments

Section 1. These by-laws may be amended or altered at any regular session of this association by a two-thirds vote of members present, provided proposed amendments or alterations be presented in writing to the body one day in advance.

Rules of Decorum

- 1. The State Association, when convened, shall be opened and closed by singing and prayer.
- 2. Only one person shall speak at a time, who shall arise to his feet and address the moderator.

- 3. Each person thus speaking shall not be interrupted in speech, except by the moderator, until he gets through; nor shall the moderator interrupt him unless he breaks order.
- 4. The person speaking shall adhere to the question and shall in no wise cast reflection on any person who may have spoken before him.
- 5. No person shall speak more than three times on the same subject without leave of the association.
- 6. No person shall laugh or whisper in time of public speech.
- 7. Members shall address each other by the appellation of brother or brethren or sisters.
- 8. No members of this association shall absent himself when the association is sitting in conference without leave of the moderator.
- 9. The names of the members of this association shall be enrolled and called as often as the association thinks it necessary.
- 10. No member shall speak longer than fifteen minutes at any one time without leave of the moderator.

Articles of Faith

- 1. The Bible. The Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God, and are our infallible rule of faith and practice.
- 2. God. There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver, and Righteous Governor of the universe; and in the Scriptures as Father, Son, and Holy Ghost; yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore, and obey.

- 3. Christ. Christ is God manifest in the flesh; in His divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified, He is now risen and glorified, and is our ever present Saviour and Lord.
- 4. The Holy Spirit. The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God.
- 5. The Government of God. God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts, not otherwise provided for, as the highest welfare of men requires.
- 6. The Sinfulness of Man. Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity, therefore, inherit a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin and become guilty before God.
- 7. The Work of Christ. The Son of God by His incarnation, life, sufferings, death, and resurrection effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free, and is the ground of salvation by faith.
- 8. The Terms of Salvation. The conditions of salvation are:
- 1. Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of it.
- 2. Faith or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Saviour and Lord with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith, the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the dominion of sin, and becomes a child of God. 3. Continuance in faith and obedience unto death.
- 9. *Election*. God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ men become His elect.
- 10. Freedom of Will. The human will is free and self-controlled, and having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit, or to resist them and perish.

- 11. Salvation Free. God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely.
- 12. Perseverance. All believers in Christ, who through grace persevere in holiness to the end of life, have promise of eternal salvation.
- 13. Gospel Ordinances. Baptism, or the immersion of believers in water, and the Lord's Supper, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel. Feet Washing, an ordinance teaching humility, is of universal obligation, and is to be ministered to all true believers.
- 14 *Tithing*. God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament; Jesus Christ endorsed it in the Gospel (Matt. 23:23), and the apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store, as God has prospered him" (1 Cor. 16:2a).
- 15. The Christian Sabbath. The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employments and amusements, for rest, worship, holy works, and activities, and for personal communion with God.
- 16. Resurrection, Judgment, and Final Retribution. The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation; then the wicked will "go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."

Women's Auxiliary

Our Michigan State Women's Auxiliary met at Central Free Will Baptist Church on April 17. We had 186 present. Our theme was "Who's At My Front Door" and our speaker was Margaret Lloyd, home missionary to Madison, Wisconsin. Scripture found in Luke 10:29. Margaret told about the Lord's blessing on their ministry with the Hmong people. The Devotion was given by Mattie Riley. Reports were given by Elsie Anderson and Mary Johnson on Verlin & Debbie Anderson and Tim & Kristi Johnson. Missionary Becky Riggs brought us up-to-date on their family and there work in France. We voted to continue our hundred dollars per auxiliary for the WNAC Convention in 2001. Our provision closet was \$17,400 which was down from the year before by \$2,300. We sent over 500 eyeglasses to Russia and to flood victims in South America. Also clothing and cleaning supplies were sent. Supplies are still being sent to our hospital in Africa. With the help of our churches we supplied food for about 150 baskets of food for Thanksgiving and Christmas at the

Freedom Mission in Detroit. Over a hundred children were given stockings at Christmas and clothing at a cost of over \$2,000. We also supplied cookies and milk for the Inter City Vacation Bible School.

General Board Member/Promotional Secretary

This has been an unusual year. There have been many victories, but also some setbacks. It was my privilege to represent the state of Michigan at the National Association of Free Will Baptist when convened in Tulsa, Oklahoma. As Michigan's General Board member and as a member of the Executive Committee, I attended the Executive Committee meeting on Saturday before the meeting of the National Association. The General Board meeting was on Monday.

My health was attached the first part of September, 1998. One doctor diagnosed it as a pinched nerve, and another as a case of arthritis. It was impossible to do anything without severe pain. Brother Charles Cooper said I was then preaching from a new position – I had to sit on a stool to preach. This kept me from attending the Minister's Luncheons in September and October.

My plans were to visit the mission fields in Brazil the last of October and the first of November. This seemed in jeopardy, but the Lord intervened and I was able to make the trip. It was also very difficult to get a passport because there is no proof that I was born. My birth records burned in the doctor's office before he filed them at the County courthouse. Finally, I was granted a temporary passport.

I attended the Leadership Conference in Nashville, TN, in December, 1998. The Executive Committee meeting was at the Maxwell House Hotel following the Leadership Conference. We heard the various reports of the Executive Office, and planned the program for the 1999 National Convention.

Pastor Ron Helms and I attended the North American Strategy Forum in Nashville, TN, in January, 1999. We discussed the reasons why we are

not growing as much as we should, as well as ways to overcome these hindrances. Mr. Trymon Messer is giving very capable leadership to the National Home Mission Department. A detailed report was printed in the Menorah.

As chairman of the Missions Support Task Force, we met to plan a program that will adequately fund the missionaries from Michigan, as well as support missions in general. This report is available at this setting of the Michigan State Association.

My primary responsibility is publishing the monthly paper, the Menorah. We are presently having 1,000 copies printed per month. Most of these are mailed in bundles to churches for distribution. I have visited the district conferences, and been a resource person for churches and individuals.

Plans for 1999 – 2000 will include the things mentioned above, with the exception of the Brazil trip. We will try to have a retreat specifically for preachers this fall, and a winter men's retreat. There will be attention given to the principles of church growth rather than methods that may not always work everywhere and for everyone.

Churches are encouraged to send funds through the district or state treasurer. Missions giving through the state treasurer last year totaled \$120,193.20 to foreign missions and \$85,026.79 to home missions. However, the report from the National Executive Office shows our missions' giving as follows: \$205,917.65 to foreign missions and \$165,246.67 to home missions. There is a need to support the *Michigan Together Way. Plan.*

Included in my report are two e-mail letters I received from Verlin Anderson and Tim Johnson. Please continue to support these two families with your prayers and finances.

Dear Michigan Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

Nearly half of our French language in Quebec is complete. When we arrived in the last days of December, we struggled for every word. We are grateful now to be able to simply communicate at church, in stores,

and with neighbors in the community. It is still a kindness that others understand us and take the time to listen to our French, but we are making progress.

These are intense but exciting day for us. We praise the Lord for allowing our children to adjust well and for providing our cost-effective housing until January of next year. We still expect to arrive in Cote d'Ivoire the summer of 2000 after tropical medicine training.

Thank you for your faithful prayers and support. Throughout medical problems, hundreds of hours of study, and witnessing opportunities, we have sensed the Lord's guidance and His provision. Thank you for being a principal part of our support team. During 1998, Michigan churches provided 33.6% of our financial support and much of our prayer support. Through the first three months of 1999, you have given \$2,749.83 or 18% of our received support. Thank you for helping make this work of the Lord's possible.

Continue praying for us as we learn the language, meet new people and try to equip our churches here to be witnesses and a blessing to others. Again we say thanks. Without your ministry to us, we wouldn't be here. May God bless each of you.
