#### **OBITUARY.**

Brother S. Eley was born in 1855 somewhere in South Georgia. We are sorry that we cannot give this information.

He was married to Miss Elizabeth Perry in May 1875, and two years later joined the church at Open Pond, in Early County, Georgia, after which he became an active member in the church, and four years later, in 1882, he became a minister of the Gospel, and for over forty years preached the Gospel through all South Georgia and also in Florida and Alabama, doing good everywhere, building up churches and establishing the faith.

He had many friends and comrades in all parts of these states, although there were many who did not altogether agree with his firm stand and views of the Gospel, for all of these years he proved his faith by his works.

His manner of life proved his stand that he had taken for his God, church and country.

One who drove through the cold, the heat and the rain to carry the glad tidings, his life, like all other preachers was a sacrifice.

For the last several years he made his home in Decatur County, near Brinson, Ga., (now Seminole County), where there were six children born to him, namely: S. H. Eley, Alda Roberson, Ellie Eley (dead), W. H. Eley, Belle Godby, J. H. Eley, and his wife, Mrs. S. Eley, who is yet at the old home, who for many years held the home together while the good man of God went with the bread of life, and it may be said of her too, that she preached the silent message, that will be read in golden letters in the Heaven of rest.

May God's richest blessings rest on this good wife and children. The many prayers that have gone on from the lips of this good man may live in the hearts and home of all his posterity.
