PROCEEDINGS.

Morgan, Ga., November 4, 1930.

The Thirty-second Annual Session of the Midway Original Free Will Baptist Association met with Bethlehem church on October 29, 1930.

Motion made that Bro. Willie Wiley be elected as Moderator and Bro. T. H. Bowen Clerk for the incoming year. Motion carried.

The Moderator invited all visiting brethren and sisters to seat with us in the Association. He then called for petitionary letters.

A letter was presented from Mt. Zion F. W. Baptist church, formerly a member of the Martin Association, which was accepted and they were gladly united to us by the right hand of church fellowship.

Then the Moderator called for the Devotional Committee's report. (See report.)

Motion made and accepted that the Association adjourn until 9:30 Thursday morning. A song by the congregation. Prayer of dismission by J. M. Emanuel.

WEDNESDAY NIGHT SESSION.

The Association was favored with a message from Rev. Maynard Woodlief, a student from Zion Bible School, formerly from Wake Forest, N. C.

THURSDAY MORNING.

The session was opened by song of the congregation. Then the Moderator read a passage from God's Word and made a few commentations, after which prayer was offered.

A motion was made and accepted that the Clerk read the decerum. The Moderator stressed its importance and use in the Association. The Moderator then called for the various reports.

Mission Report—Open Pond Church and Pastor. This report was made and adopted. A discussion was made on missions by Rev. K. V. Shutes and W. B. Griffin. (See report.)

Report on Sunday School and League Work was made by Oak Grove church with Pastor. The report was adopted, after which it was clearly discussed by Bros. Willie Wiley and W. H. Eley.

Then a motion was made and carried that the Association adjourn their session and give a short recess before the 11 o'clock message.

Following this period Bro. Shutes made a great plea for the As-

sociation to help Zion Bible School. A public collection was taken, the amount received being \$22.78. Then Rev. Shutes brought a great message from John 3:16, "God's Love for the World."

The service was then closed by Bro. John Barnes, who gave us a sound, inspiring as well as encouraging comment on this subject, after which we were dismissed by prayer for the noon hour.

Then we heard some very instructive remarks on "Our Duty of Giving for Missions and Minutes and for God's Cause at Large," by Bro. Willie Wiley, Moderator, Mrs. A. L. McDonald and Rev. E. A. Gordon.

Motion made and carried that the Secretary investigate and see where he can get the minutes published the cheapest.

Motion made and seconded that the Association pay Clerk \$10.00 for his service in preparing the manuscript for minutes. The motion carried.

Motion made and carried that Bro. W. H. Eley's name be placed on the list of licensed ministers. Motion made and carried that we keep our same Executive Committee.

Motion made and carried that we keep our same Treasurer.

Motion made and carried that we extend a rising vote of thanks to Bethlehem church and community for their kindness and hospitality shown to us while in this session. Motion carried.

REPORT ON SUNDAY SCHOOL AND LEAGUE WORK.

We, your committee on Sunday School and League Work, find from reports given from 15 churches a membership of 1525, with only 12 Sunday Schools having a membership of 653, and only 7 F. W. B. Leagues, having a membership of 325. We find the interest among our young folks increasing, but our adults on the decline. We ask that the pastors of each church put forth an honest effort to help the

Sunday School and League to have a study class in training for service by "Herbert Monenger" as recommended by our auxiliary convention, and also stewardship and mission in the Ladies' Aid Society. If there is not a Ladies' Aid, get a class to take the course among the membership of the church. We want cooperation from each minister of this Association, for we feel that the church will not rise above its Pastor's teachings. Now the subject for discussion, "The Value of the Auxiliary to the Church." What is the Auxiliary, or why organized? Because there had to be something to save the church. 1. The Auxiliaries are the life of the church; 2. Auxiliaries are the chief means of growth to the church through service; 3. Auxiliaries help to lead the lost to Christ.
