Motion properly sustained that Bro. Jas. Cheshire and Rev. W. T. Wiley represent the Midway Association at the General Conference.

Motion sustained that the General Conference be invited to hold its 1933 session at Open Pond Church, Jakin, Ga.

Announcement was made that Bro. Maynard Woodlief would be ordained

at the union meeting on Friday before the fifth Sunday in November 1931, with Rev. W. T. Wiley, Rev. J. M. Emanuel, and Rev. T. B. Mellette of-ficiating in this service.

Motion properly sustained that Bros. Cooper Fort and Luther Norris be allowed to draw on the loan fund as Rev. Joe Fort pays it into the Treasury.

# Report of Committee on Christian Education

## Report of Committee on Mission's

We, your committee on Missions, submit the following report: find that there has been a great neglect in regard to Home and Foreign Missionary activities. Jesus said, "Go ye, therefore, and teach all nations," but we have not taught a nation. We believe that this has been a sin of negligence. There are a great many states and hundreds of counties that know us only through history. Therefore, we say it is time for us to become interested in Home and Foreign Missionary work. We endorse the work of the General Conference in regards to putting native missionaries on the field under the General Missionary Society, in the name of the Free Will Baptist Denomination; and we wish to pledge our support each year to this drive. We do not know a better use for, at least, a part of our mission money that to put it in Zion Bible School and its students in helping them to carry on this missionary work in both town and rural districts. Brethren, the towns are calling us as well as the rural districts. Will we hear the "Macedonian call?" Then, "Come over and help us." The lack of Missionary zeal was the burst up of the first church, and we know that the lack of zeal for mission work has hampered the progress of our church. We recommend the election of a Mission Board to keep the work before the people of our Association.

# REPORT FROM AUXILIARY CONVENTION

The second session of the Woman's Auxiliary Convention was held at Oak Grove Church on October 3rd. A goodly number of delegates were

present. The following subjects were well presented to the edification of those present: 1. "Woman's Influence." 2. "Prayer." 3. "Stewardship of Influence." The music and a special number by a Sunday School Class, contributed to the theme of the day's program—"Influencing by Daily Doing of the Master's Service."

The Business Meeting was begun by discussion of our Field Work, Co-operation of Ministers, Ministerial Loan Fund, and Zion Bible School.

The five churches reporting gave the following totals from their auxiliaries. Enrollment 334. Average attendance, 213; Collections, \$398.64; Paid out: \$358.67. Contributions to convention \$17.00, \$15.00 of which was sent to Blakely on their building fund. \$73.25 was given by F. W. B. Leagues to supplement the Ministerial Loan Fund to Bro. Joe Fort. Most of the remainder of the \$398.64 went for educational purposes and literature. \$1.00 was pledged to be paid on the first of each month by the auxiliaries of Damascus, Zion, Open Pond, and Oak Grove Churches to Zion Bible School. Other churches in this Association are urged to comply with the plan thus providing \$19.00 each month. Please send the money to Mrs. H. G. Hudson, Jakin, Ga.

#### REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON SUN. SCHOOL AND LEAGUE WORK.

We your committee on Sunday School and League Work submit the following report: We find that from reports given from 17 churches with a membership of 1704, there are only thirteen Sunday Schools with a membership of 677, nine F. W. B. L's. with 403 members and five Ladies Aid Societies with a membership of 65.

There is a supreme need of more interest in Sunday Schools, and to meet this need, we recommend that this body petition our Sunday School Secretary to get out a manual on Sunday School work.
