



Rev. T. B. Mellette made a motion that the letters be adopted and the delegates be seated. An intermission of 10 minutes was given before preaching. On returning to the house Rev. W. T. Wiley brought us a message from Luke 5:4. "Launch out into the deep and let down your net for a draught" which was greatly enjoyed by all.

Benediction by Rev. T. B. Mellette for the noon hour.

WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

After enjoying the refreshments of the noon hour, the body was called to order by the Moderator. Three songs were sung after which Rev. E. C. Williams led the prayer. The moderator appointed the various committees:

Nominations-J. F. Griffin, Alton Mercer, H. J. Cosby.

Obituaries-Rev. A. G. Ott. Rev. Luther Norris, W. P. Richardson.

Disbursements-Rev. T. B. Mellette, E. A. Reed, J. M. Etheridge.

The Moderator invited all visiting preachers to seats with us. Rev. Floyd Cherry from the State Line Association, Rev. H. L. Catrett, W. O. Smith, W. E. Lane and wife from the Martin Association responded to the invitation and were seated in the body.

Called for reports from our delegates who visited other Associations. Rev. T. B. Mellette reported his visit to the State Line and South Georgia Associations saying that they both seemed to be in harmony and in a progressive mood.

Rev. W. F. McDuffie visited the Chatahoochee Association saying they are also in harmony and seem to be doing some constructive work. Rev. Luther Norris reported his visit to the General Association, and in his talk he tried to show to the Association the possibilities that lie before them.

Motion to adjourn was carried, to meet at 9:00 o'clock A. M. Thursday.

THURSDAY A. M. SESSION

The body was called to order by the moderator, Rev. W. T. Wiley. Devotional by Rev. J. B. Lovering. Called for reading of the minutes of previous day. After reading and correcting of minutes they were adopted.

Called for reports of various committees. The committees on Missions from Patmos Church reported which was received, discussed and adopted (see report).

Called for report on Temperance. The Committee reported and it was adopted without discussion (see report).

Called for report on Christian Education. The report was received, discussed and adopted as read (see report).

Called for report on Sunday School and League. The report was received discussed by several and then adopted as read (see report).

Called for report on character of ministers and state of Churches. The report was received and adopted without discussion as read (see report).

Motion and second that the body be recessed for preaching and noon hour untill 1:15 o'clock. Rev. Floyd Cherry filled the stand at the 11:00 o'clock hour and brought a message from St. John 6. His subject being, The Connecting Link, referring to Christ as that link:

THURSDAY P. M. SESSION.

The body was called to order as per adjournment. Two songs were sung by the congregation and prayer was offered by Bro. Willie Wiley. A motion and second that the report on State of Churches and character of ministers be reopened. After much discussion it was voted to let the original report stand:

The moderator called for a report of the nominating committee. They report that the Association convene with Pine View Church, Miller County, Ga. and that Rev. W. F. McDuffie preach the Introductory sermon, and Rev. Luther Norris be his alternate. Also that the names of W. P. Richardson, W. B. Griffin, A. D. Ivey, William C. Houston, E. A. Reed, C. G. Jordan, J. S. Anderson be appointed as Executive Committee, with J. F. Griffin as chairman. The report was received and adopted.

Motion and second that a public collection be taken to balance the budget. This collection amounted to \$7.50.

Called for report on obituaries: The report was received and after some comment the body was led in prayer by the moderator in memory and respect of our deceased brethren since our last Association (see report).

Called for report on Disbursements. The report was heard and was adopted as read (see report).

Called for Treasurer's report. The report was adopted as read (see report).

Motion and Second that the minute fund be abolished and that the minutes be paid for out of the general funds.

Motion and second that Bro. W. P. Richardson be appointed as delegate to the General Association, and that he appoint his alternate.

Motion and second that the body receive Rev. M. B. Woodlief as an ordained minister in this body in view of the fact that he is to place his church membership in some church of this association.

Motion and second that Rev. T. B. Mellette, J. S. Anderson and Rev. S. T. Shutes be appointed as a committee to lay plans for Rev. J. N. Barnes to do Sunday School and League work.

Motion and second that the body appoint officers for the next year. Rev. T. B. Mellette was appointed Moderator, W. B. Griffin, Clerk, and A. D. Ivey, Treasurer.

Motion and second that the Association take over the mission point between Arlington and Blakely.

Motion and second that the Association give Live Oak Church and community a standing vote of thanks for their hospitality shown them.

Christian - Education -- Education is something the world is going mad over today, and is lacking very little in knowledge; but the chief thing is what kind is this knowledge we have today. Parents have made the great mistake to give every care to educate their boys and girls that they might know how to sustain the physical body which shall last but a span, and very little to the preserving of the soul, which last forever and ever. They seemingly are living and letting live under the stumbling block that this is a Christian nation in which we are living, and that we are nothing but Christians. How deceived? Christian Education should begin at home. Most parents would be as it were, the blind leading the blind. There isn't any training that the child gets at school or college that has more bearing upon the child than that it gets from its father and mother. One mother was asked when she should start training her child. The answer was you should have begun twenty years before the child's birth. The next place should be that of public schools. The average child is in the school room more than it is ever in the presence of its parents. As it receives little or no Christian training in the public schools how parents should strive to encourage and build up Christian colleges. As there are so few Socalled Christian schools, and only half that number really Christian, parents should fall upon their knees and repent that they have not supported such schools as Zion Bible School. Fathers and mothers wake up, it isn't too late, but it is very late.

SUNDAY SCHOOL REPORT.

We your S. S. Committee submit the following: After a careful survey of S. S. Activities we find 1,780 members in the various churches, 597 are enrolled in Sunday School with an average attendance of 378, leaving 1,183 church members not receiving any teaching in the Sunday Schools at all. When we have the average attendance of 378 in Sunday School on Sunday, sometime of the day that leaves us 1,412 failing to help themselves grow in the knowledge of God's word. Brethren if we believe that the Sunday School is the teaching force of the church, and it is, why not put some Sunday School workers on the field to organize a Sunday School in each church, then when we meet in 1938 we will have a Sunday School from each church.
