PROCEEDINGS

The body was recessed until 1:30 o'clock for preaching and noon hour. Rev. C. H. Chandler brought a message from Ezekial 37:1-6. The message asked each one a question, "Am I a dry bone or a soldier for God?"

WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON

The body met as per adjournment. Brother Laney Harbin leading the singing, while Rev. W. T. Wiley brought a timely devotional message on sacrifice.

The committee on Devotions reported. They reported that brother Floyd Cherry was to bring the message tonight and Rev. W. T. Wiley tomorrow. This report was adopted.

The committee on State of churches and character of ministers reported. It was moved, seconded, and carried that this report be tabled until Thursday afternoon.

The body adjourned in order until 9:00 Thursday morning. Benediction by Rev. W. J. Harbin.

THURSDAY MORNING

The services were resumed by the congregation singing two songs. The devotions were led by Rev. J. B. Lovering. The Moderator called the body to order and the minutes of the previous day were read, corrected and adopted. The Moderator invited visiting ministers to seats with us. Brother C. Houston from the Missionary Baptist church was received. He was made welcome by the Moderator.

The call was resumed for reports from committees; Oak Grove church and pastor, Rev. C. H. Chandler made their report on Missions. This report was adopted without discussion. See Report.

At this time the Moderator recognized brother J. L. Stokes and wife from the Southeastern Association from Alabama.

The committee on Sunday School and F. W. B. L. reported. This report was adopted without any discussion.

The report on Christian Education was presented by Patmos church and pastor, Rev. W. F. McDuffie. Brothers T. B. Mellete, J. B. Lovering, and Floyd Cherry discussed this report. It was then adopted. See report.

At this time the body recessed until 1:30 o'clock for noon.

Brother W. T. Wiley brought us a message fresh from the throne of God. Benediction by Rev. E. C. Williams.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON

The body was called together by congregational singing. The devotions was conducted by Rev. Joe Fort.

First, the moderator called for the report that was tabled yesterday, and asked that this report be turned to the committee for further investigation. Rev. H. G. Harvey asks that the moderator appoint a committee of five to serve with the church and pas-

tor. The following committee of five to serve with the church and pastor.

The following committee was appointed by the chair: J. S. Pyle, Wallace Sheffield, Tommie Jenkins, Will Norris, and Lewis Sheffield.

The Committee on obituaries read their report. After some corrections the report was adopted. See report.

The disbursement committee tendered their report. It was adopted without discussion. See report.

The Treasurer made his report. The report was read and adopted. See report.

The committee on State of churches made their report. This report was adopted by a standing vote of seventeen to seven. See report.

Miscellaneous business was then called for. On suggestion of brother Fort a motion was made and it was duly carried that this association correspond with the Southeastern of Alabama. At this time a public offering was taken to be applied on the school property in Dothan, Alabama. The amount of the collection was \$15.00.

The moderator announced that it was time to elect officers for the coming year. A motion was made that Brother T. B. Mellete be retained as Moderator and that Bro. Joe Fort be elected Asst. Moderator. Also that Bro. W. B. Griffin be retained as clerk and that Bro. R. B. Pyle be elected as assistant clerk, also that Brother A. D. Ivey be retained as treasurer. After some discussion this motion was carried.

It was moved, seconded and carried that the same executive committee be elected and that Brother H. J. Cosby was to take Brother J. S. Andersons (deceased) place.

It was moved, seconded, and carried that Rev. C. H. Chandler be given authority to do Mission work in this association.

It was moved, seconded, and carried that the committee on State of Churches and character of ministers be appointed at each session of the association.

The Moderator appointed the following committees:

Missions—Traveler's Rest and Pastor.

Temperance—White Plains and Pastor.

Christian Education—Zion church and Pastor.

Sunday School and F.W.B.L.—Open church and pastor.

It was moved, seconded and carried that this body have an ordaining council to be composed of three ordained ministers and two laymen as follows: Rev. W. T. Wiley, Rev. J. M. Emanuel, Rev. T. B. Mellete and W. B. Griffin, and O. B. Everson.

It was carried that the clerk order one dozen each of the following blanks: License blanks, and Ordination blanks.

The committee on nominations reported that the next session of the association conven ewith Blakely church on Wednesday and Thursday before the first Sunday in November. This report was approved. They also reported that Rev. J. M. Emanuel was to preach the introductory sermon with Rev. Joe Fort as alternate. This was approved.

At this time the body gave White Plains church and community a rising vote of thanks for their generous hospitality shown us while in session.

It was moved, seconded, and carried to pay the cleark \$10.00 for his services.

Moved and carried to adjourn to meet with Blakely church in 1941.
