The clerk called the roll of ordained ministers with eight present.

The invitation was extended to visiting ministers, Rev. H. L. Knighton, Rev. P. E. Knighton from the Chattahoochee Association; Rev. D. Floyd, Rev. H. L. Catrett, C. A. Gilbert from the Martin Association; Rev. C. J. Harvey from the Union Association; Edd Jones, J C.. Howell, A. J. Granger from the State Line Association. They were given a hand of welcome by the Moderator.

The body voted to recess for preaching and noon hour. Rev. T. B. Mellette brought the message from the third chapter of Revelations, his subject being "The Open Door," which had reference to our opportunities for our services for the Master.

WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON

After the noon hour refreshments and fellowship one with another the Moderator called the body to order. The Devotion was conducted by Rev. H. L. Knighton.

By the request of Enterprise and Mt. Zion Churches, Brother Van Clements and Brother W. H. Swords were ordained as Deacons from their respective churches. The Ordaining Council consisted of Rev. S. T. Shutes, Rev. W. T. Wiley and Rev. J. N. Barnes.

After the Ordination the Moderator called for Petitionary letters. There were none.

The Moderator called for a report from the delegates that visited other associations. Rev. J. N. Barnes, Rev. J. L. Tedder visited the State Line Association. Rev. E. C. Williams visited the Martin Association. Rev. T. B. Mellette visited the South Eastern Association of Alabama. Brother A. D. Ivey visited the National Association. They all reported some progress.

At this time the Committee on Devotion reported that Rev. H. L. Knighton from the Chattahoochee Association would preach on Thursday at eleven o'clock. Rev. P. E. Knighton from the Chattahoochee Association to lead the morning devotion and Brother J. F. Griffin to lead the afternoon devotion.

There being no other business the body adjourned to meet Thursday A. M., at ten o'clock.

THURSDAY A. M.—November 1, 1945

The body was called to order with song services. In the absence of Rev. P. E. Knighton, Rev. J. N. Barnes led the devotional services.

At this time the Clerk read the minutes of the previous day. After they were corrected they were adopted. The Moderator read a letter from Rev.

C. C. White who is in Florida at this time and was unable to attend the association and he was excused.

The Moderator called for a report from the Temperance Committee. The report was read and discussed by Rev. S. T. Shutes, Rev. J. N. Barnes, Rev. W. T. Wiley, Rev. H. L. Knighton and others and was adopted. (See report).

The Committee on Missions reported by Macedonia Church and Pastor. The report was read and tabled to be worked out with the Planning Board.

The motion was made and carried the body recess for the worship service and noon hour. Rev. H. L. Knighton of the Chattahoochee Association brought the message from the Book of Joshua—"A Successful Church."

THURSDAY AFTERNOON

The body was called to order by the Moderator. Rev Rufus Hyman conducted the devotion services. The Moderator recognized a visitor, Brother A. G. Sellers from Bainbridge Methodist Church.

At this time the Moderator asked the Assistant Moderator to take the chair while the Moderator take an offering for the new church at Drifton, Fla. This collection amounted to \$70.50.

The Moderator called for other Committee reports.

The Committee on Obituaries reported which showed the number of dead to be 17 throughout the Association.

The report of the Nominating Committee recommended (and the recommendation was adopted) that the first session of the Association meet with Oak Grove Church on Friday before the fourth Sunday in January with Rev. T. B. Mellette to preach the Introductory Sermon with Rev. J. N. Barnes his alternate. The Second Quarter to meet with Patmos Church on Friday before the fourth Sunday in April with Rev. J. L. Tedder to preach with Rev. W. F. McDuffee as his alternate. The Third Quarter to meet with Cedar Springs on Friday before the fourth Sunday in July with Rev. W. T. Wiley to preach and Rev. P. E. Knighton as his alternate. The annual Session to convene with Pine View Church on Wednesday and Thursday before the first Sunday in November, 1946, Rev. J. N. Barnes to preach with Rev. S. T. Shutes to be his alternate.

The report on Christian Education was read and adopted. (See report).

The Treasurer made his report which was adopted. (See report).

The report of the Planning Committee was received, amended and adopted. (See report).

McDuffee to the State Line, next session to meet with Cedar Grove Church, three miles east of Bascom, Fla., on Thursday and Friday before the second Sunday in October, 1946; Rev. J. N. Barnes, Rev. S. T. Shutes to the Salem of Florida, next session to convene with Salem Church, near Alford, Fla., on Thursday before the first Sunday in October, 1946; A. D. Ivey,

R. B. Pyle to the Chattahoochee, next session to meet with New Prospect Church, Turner County, on Thursday night before the first Sunday in October, 1946; Rev. J. L. Tedder, Rev. W. T. Wiley, F. E. Richardson to the Martin Association, next session to meet with New Home No. 2, twelve miles north-east of Bainbridge, Ga., on Friday and Saturday before the fourth Sunday in October, 1946.

Rev. H. L. Knighton from the Chattahoochee Association, as a committee on the State Mission Board, addressed the body and asked the body for a donation. There was a collection taken that amounted to \$35.20 to be sent to Rev. J. C. Harvey, Treasurer of the State Mission Board, Camilla, Ga.

PLANNING BOARD

1. We recommend that \$64.00 be set aside for Superannuation to be divided by the National Program—25 percent to the National Superannuation Board and the remaining 75 percent to be divided equally between the four superannuates per quarter.

2. We recommend that \$12.00 per quarter be given to Orphanages, said Orphanages to be designated by the Association.

3. We recommend that we pay our Clerk \$4.00 per quarter.

4. We recommend that the balance be divided as follows: 60 per cent to the State Association and 40 per cent to be retained in the Treasury for all other necessary expenses.

5. We further recommend that the Association meet one day on Friday before the fourth Sunday in January, April, July, and on Wednesday and Thursday before the first Sunday in November each year.

6. We recommend that the Association appoint a Board of Missions and

also a Board of Education of four members each, one member from each Board to become a member of the State Boards, two members to be elected every two years, also one more member be appointed on the Superannuation Board.

7. We recommend that we have the attached Associational letter printed in the back of our Minutes and ask all churches to use this letter.

We further recommend a donation be given to the Drifton Church, also that we pay delegate to the National Association \$15.00, Dues to the National Association \$5.00, Dues to the State Association \$15.00.
