The Fiftieth Annual Session of the Midway Free Will Baptist Association of Georgia met with Travelers Rest Church, Baker County, Georgia, on November 3rd and 4th, 1948.

After song services the Moderator led the Devotional by reading a passage of scripture taken from the 34th division of Psalms, with prayer by Rev. E. C. Williams.

The meeting was recessed for preaching. In the absence of Rev. J. O. Fort, his alternate, Rev. J. N. Barnes brought the message—his subject being, "Grow in Grace and in the Knowledge of Our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ," with scripture taken from II Peter 3:18. Benediction was given by Rev. S. T. Shutes, and the meeting was recessed for the noon hour.

Wednesday Afternoon

After the noon hour of refreshments and fellowship one with the other, the body met in song service led by Rev. S. T. Shutes, followed with prayer led by Rev. W. T. Wiley.

At this time the moderator appointed a Devotions Committee composed of Rev. S. T. Shutes, I. O. Irvin, and J. R. Parker. The roll of ministers was called with eight present and four absent.

Visiting brethren were invited and those reporting were as follows: Martin Association, Rev. H. L. Roberts, Rev. C. R. Houston, Bro. W. J. Hilburn. Liberty Association of Alabama, Rev. J. B. Lovering. South Georgia Association, Rev. E. C. Morris. Union Association, Rev. L. A. Norris. Chatta-hoochee Association, Rev. J. C. King.

At this time the chair appointed the following committees:

OBITUARIES-J. F. Griffin, W. F. Norris, and Rev. C. J. Harvey.

STATE OF CHURCHES AND CHARACTER OF MINISTERS—Rev. W. T. Wiley, J. M. Etheridge and Mrs. Marjorie Hudson.

Volunteers were called for to visit the sister associations. They were as follows:

Brothers C. G. Jordan and Alvin Day to the Martin Association, and Brother W. F. Norris to the Union Association.

Rev. E. C. Morris made his report as promotional secretary, after which a collection was taken which amounted to \$79.00.

The Devotional Committee announced that there would be no preaching tonight but that Rev. E. C. Morris would preach at the eleven o'clock service Thursday morning.

The body adjourned until 10 A. M., Thursday, benediction by Rev. J. B. Lovering.

Thursday Morning

The meeting opened with singing by the congregation, scripture reading by the moderator, followed with prayer by Rev. L. A. Norris.

The moderator called the body to order and the minutes of the previous day were read, corrected, and adopted.

The Committee on Sunday Schools reported from Mt. Zion church and the report was adopted.' See report (1).

The Committee on Christian Education read their report from Macedonia, Fla., church, which was discussed and adopted. See report (2).

The body adjourned for preaching and the noon hour. The message was brought by Rev. E. C. Morris from "Paul's First Letter to the Thessalonians," his subject being, "A Working Faith." Benediction by Rev. T. B. Mellette.

Thursday Afternoon

After the noon hour the body returned to the house where the devotions were conducted by Rev. L. A. Norris, scripture from Matthew 7:15.

The call for committee reports was resumed.

The Temperance Committee read their report and it was adopted. See report (3).

The Committee on Missions from Patmos Church and pastor, read their report which was adopted. See report (4).

The Committee on Nominations recommended that the First Quarterly session meet with Patmos church, Baker County, and that Brother W. B. Griffin preach at the eleven o'clock hour with Rev. C. R. Houston as alternate. First quarter to meet on Friday before the fourth Sunday in January, 1949, and the second quarter to meet with New Light Church in Calhoun County, on Friday before the fourth Sunday in April, 1949, and that Brother William Clowers will preach at the eleven o'clock hour, with Rev. J. B. Lovering as his alternate. The third quarter to meet with Macedonia church, Miller County, on Friday before the fourth Sunday in July, 1949, with Brother O. B. Everson to preach at the eleven o'clock hour, and Rev. T. B. Mellette as his alternate. The annual sessions to meet with Oak Grove Church in Miller County, with Rev. W. T. Wiley to preach at the eleven o'clock hour and Rev. E. C. Williams as alternate. These recommendations were approved and adopted.

The Committee on State of Churches and Character of Ministers reported that all churches seem to be in good standing with the by-laws and constitution, and the standard of our ministers seems to be above reproach. They also recommended that two more ministers be received in the body—Rev. C. J. Harvey and Rev. C. R. Houston. Also, an amendment was made as to the method of receiving ministers in the association. This was to make a minister a member of the body when he joins or places his letter in a church of this association.

The Committee on Finance reported. The report was adopted. See report (6).

The Treasurers report was read and adopted. See report (7). The treasurer's report showed that there was four hundred dollars in the treasury for the League Encampment, and it was voted to give this to the State League Encampment with the provision that if it was not used within two years it was to be returned to the Midway Association.

The body appointed Brother B. Houston as a delegate to the National Association and Brother W. B. Griffin and Brother J. O. Irvin and wife to the State Association.

It was voted to have the Sunday School Convention every fifth Sunday, the first session to convene with White Plains Church on the fifth Sunday in January, 1949.

It was voted to pay the Superannuates fifteen dollars quarterly; the clerk four dollars per quarter or twelve dollars annually; the Moderator and Treasurer fifteen dollars each annually.

At this time the body took a love offering for Brother Paul Irvin, a young minister in Bible School at Nashville, Tenn.

It was voted that we retain the same officers for two more years. Since Brother Paul Irvin has entered the ministry Brother J. O. Irvin was named in his stead on the Executive Committee, and Brother B. Houston in the place of Brother O. F. Everson, who has moved into the Martin Association.

It was moved and carried that the treasurer pay the expense of the delegates to the state and national associations.

At this time the body gave Travelers Rest Church a rising vote of thanks for their great hospitality. The body adjourned to meet with Patmos Church, Baker County, on Friday before the fourth Sunday in January, 1949.

We, your Committee on Education, submit the following:
