Prayer was offered by Brother Coy Watson, the charge to the candidate by Brother Dowdney, presentation of the Bible by Brother Houston, and the charge to the church by Brother Knighton. All ministers present were asked to assemble for the consecration prayer offered by Brother E. C. Morris. Then the hand of fellowship was given to Brother Loyless and the moderator presented him the certificate of ordination.

A standing vote of thanks was given by the association to Cedar Springs Church and community for the fine hospitality shown the association at this time.

The association voted to have 500 minutes printed.

The finance and budget committee gave its report. A motion was made to amend the report, changing the figure \$20.00 to \$10.00. The report was then adopted. (See report.)

Motion carried that Brother Harvey succeed himself on the mission board. Motion carried that Brother Mellette succeed himself on the camp board.

Motion carried that Brother W. B. Griffin succeed himself on the board of trustees.

Motion carried that Brother O. B. Everson be placed on the superannuation board in place of Brother R. B. Pyle, deceased.
