The moderator, knowing of the illness of Brother Lee, asked the promotional secretary of the Georgia State Association to fill in for Brother Lee. He used as his text John 6:1-3. He did a good job.

A standing vote of thanks was given to the host church for the hospitality they had shown.

Reassembled at 1:30 p.m., with singing led by Miss Joyce Tabb. The devotional was given by Rev. J. B. Lovering.

Host church presented a program, "The Meaning of Easter."

The finance committee and treasurer's report were given. Motion made, seconded, and carried to accept these reports.

Brother Garnett gave a report of the Calvary church. Motion made, seconded, and carried to accept this as information and give him and the church praise for their hard work.

Rev. T. B. Mellette offered a resolution, his last official writing for the Midway Association, and I have it as he wrote in long hand. This was at the April session. "Be it resolved that the moderator of the Midway Association Quarterly Session be empowered to call a joint session of the executive committee and the ordaining council to consider the issues and questions of church connectionalism now before the Free Will Baptist denomination and all issues affecting our laity and local churches on local measures; and these to be presented to our next quarterly session of the association. Said joint meeting to meet at the discretion, as to time and place, of the moderator."

# Third Quarterly Session

The third quarterly session of the Midway Association convened with Zion Free Will Baptist Church, July 20, 1963, at 10:00 a.m.

Singing was led by Brother T. B. Mellette.

The devotional was given by the moderator, using as his text Romans 12:1. Prayer was also offered by the moderator.

Miss Marie Dunning and Miss Marilyn Lovering were appointed reading clerks.

There were nine ministers and 70 delegates present. They represented 20 churches.

Visitors were Rev. Mance Cason, from the State Association; Rev. and Mrs. E. C. Morris; Rev. J. E. Blanton, South Georgia Association; John Edwards and A. J. Garret, Alabama.

Motion made, seconded, and carried to recess for the noon service. The meal was wonderful.

The clerk delivered the message, "Our Heritage."

Mrs. Mary Garnett and Miss Lovering rendered special music. It was a time of rejoicing at the end of the sermon. All ministers came to the front for the fellowship by the congregation.

Reassembled at 1:30 p.m., with Brother Archie Harbin leading the singing.

Devotional was given by Rev. J. E. Blanton, using as his text 2 Timothy 4:7.

Brother Cason briefed the session on the state association work.

Reports were given by the executive committee and the ordaining council, in compliance with the resolution offered by Brother Mellette in the April session.

The meeting of the above-named committee was called by the moderator, as provided in the resolution, at Oak Grove Free Will Baptist Church, Miller County, Georgia, the last of June. The ones attending were S. F. Boyd, B. Houston, and Edd Sanders.

A. C. Williams, Alvin Day, J. W. Clower, and Martin Murkerson were absent; but by unanimous vote, Brother Martin Still was proxy for Brother Murkerson.

Ordaining council present: Revs. T. B. Mellette, J. B. Lovering, C. R. Houston, W. F. McDuffie, and S. T. Shutes.

The moderator read the Scripture and offered prayer.

Motion made, seconded, and carried that the committees entertain a discussion of the trouble that is facing our denomination.

Motion made, seconded, and carried that we stand by our original treatise, first written in 1902, and that some necessary changes be made; beginning with a motion at the session in Jakin in 1960 for the committees

to be appointed, appointed as per the motion, and names already in print in the reprinted treatise which was given out in April, 1962, at Macedonia church. Further, that we ask our churches to investigate all the evangelists and pastors, as to their doctrine and church polity, who are considered for labor among us. This motion was made by Rev. T. M. Mellette, secondde by Brother A. C. Williams. The vote was unanimous.

Motion made , seconded, and carried to adjourn.

#### MISSION BOARD

The Mission Board of the Midway Association met May 29, 1962, at 8:00 p.m., at Calvary Free Will Baptist Church. Those present were: C. R. Houston, moderator; W. F. McDuffie, assistant moderator; Martin Still, treasurer; W. J. Starr, state mission board member. Mrs. S. T. Dunning sent a letter asking clerk to appoint her a proxy; J. B. Lovering was appointed. Mr. S. F. Boyd could not attend and gave the moderator power to appoint his proxy. T. B. Mellette was appointed.

Brother Garnett brought us up to date on the property and the pending deal. Motion was made by Brother McDuffie and seconded by T. B. Mellette that the mission board of the Midway Association advance \$1,000 to Calvary church to be paid on the newly acquired lots. The motion was carried.

The moderator asked Brother McDuffie to preside. His motion was that the mission board become cosigners with the Calvary church to finish paying for the lot or church site and/or aid in the erection of a suitable church edifice. This we will do upon request from the Calvary church only. This motion was seconded by T. B. Mellette and it was carried.

Motion was made by the clerk that the mission board of the Midway Association commend the members and pastor of Calvary church for their noble and unselfish work in the swift, but stable Spiritual growth of a church that will continue to promote the Spirit of Calvary. We want you to know that this mission board will be with you. Motion was seconded by Brother McDuffie, and it was carried.

J. B. Lovering read the following report: That we, the ordaining council of the Midway Association, met with Rev. Joe Fort, and after proper examination do hereby recommend that his name be added to the list of ordained ministers. Hand of fellowship was then given. J. B. Lovering reports further: That a committee be appointed by the moderator to study the new constitution and bylaws of the National Association, and that they publish their findings to every church clerk and pastor in the Midway Association, and to anyone else to whom they might think it wise. Motion made and seconded to adopt report, but was amended to read: And that the findings be brought to the annual session. The motion was carried. The following committee was appointed: Revs. T. B. Mellette, Joe Fort, Paul Irvin, and the moderator as exofficio.

AFTERNOON SESSION

Reassembled at 1:30 p.m., with singing led by Brother Jessie Griffin.

The moderator declared the body ready for business. The moderator asked everyone to act as Christian gentlemen. Also to refrain from any discussion unless he or she were duly authorized delegates.

#### STANDING COMMITTEE REPORTS

The clerk of Travelers' Rest church and the pastor gave the Christian Education report. Motion made, seconded, and carried to adopt this report. (See report.)

The Temperance Report was given by the First church of Albany and pastor. Adopted. (See report.) The Master's Men report was given by Macedonia church and pastor. Motion made, seconded, and carried to adopt report. (See report.)

Report of the Special Committee to study the new constitution of the National Association was given by Revs. Joe Fort, T. B. Mellette, and Paul Irvin. This report was read by Brother Fort. Motion made and seconded to adopt this report. A motion was then made and seconded to table this report until 2:00 p.m. Thursday, the second day of the associational meeting at Albany. After much discussion the vote carried to table the motion.

The Nominating Committee Report was given by Rev. Paul Irvin. The complete list of names for the various offices were read and three declined; namely, Miss Jean Everson as secretary to the Sunday school rally. Motion



made, seconded, and carried that Miss Joyce McCorkle's name replace Miss Everson's on the list.

Rev. Joe Fort asked that Brother McDuffie's name be placed on the list as nominee for assistant moderator. Motion made, seconded, and carried.

Rev. J. W. Clower declined as nominee for clerk after Rev. O. B. Everson placed his name on the nominating list.

The name of the nominee for moderator, Rev. C. R. Houston, was placed before the body. Nominations were called for from the floor. J. W. Clower put Lewis Williams' name up for nomination. The vote was Williams 21 and C. R. Houston 43; therefore, Houston was elected. Brother Leron Clower made a motion that all names read by the committee for nomination be carried. It was carried. (See report.)

Motion made, seconded, and carried that we give a standing vote of thanks to this church and community. The moderator called for all who wanted the Spirit to lead in settling the dispute to please come up to the altar. A very large number responded.

The meeting was adjourned to meet Thursday in Albany.

#### MORNING SESSION

The association convened at the First Free Will Baptist Church, Albany. Motion made, seconded, and carried that we accept the program prepared by Brother Lee, with the moderator making any necessary changes.

Since Brother Lewis Williams was absent, the moderator called for the state promotional secretary to give his report. This report was read and recorded as information.

The roll call of delegates was given and the minutes of the previous meeting were read.

Motion made, seconded, and carried to adopt this report. Several churches made some changes in delegates' names. The treasurer gave the partial report. It was adopted.

Mellette, we recommend that the resolution made to withdraw from the National Association be tabled until the next annual session of the Midway Association of Georgia, giving all churches ample time to study the issues. #### REPORT OF SPECIAL COMMITTEE TO THE 1962 SESSION OF THE MIDWAY ASSOCIATION OF ORIGINAL FREE WILL BAPTISTS

Whereas, the new bylaws adopted by the National Association of Free Will Baptists in its 1962 session at Nashville, Tennessee, (Membership, Section 2), requires that "All organizations affiliated directly with the National Association shall be required to adopt the Treatise of the Faith and Practices of Free Will Baptists as adopted by the National Association"; a requirement which, if complied with by the Midway Association of Original Free Will Baptists of Georgia, would necessitate that said Midway Association repudiate its own treatise by which it has been governed since 1902; and

Whereas, the National Association of Free Will Baptists departed from its traditional position, as laid down in the Articles of Merger at the time of its establishment, by adopting the following statement in its 1962 session: "This National Association shall have the right to settle any questions of discipline, doctrine or practice that may properly come before it from any bodies composing said organization of the National Association of Free Will Baptists, or act upon any appeal that may be made by any body belonging to the National Association"; and

Whereas, the National Association, in its 1961 session at Norfolk, Virginia, violated accepted parliamentary procedure, together with the guarantee of personal freedom in a democracy which says that every accused person shall have the right of just trial; the specific act of the National Association in its 1961 session referred to herein being that of removing five officers of the National Association from the positions to which they were elected by that body, making an accusation against them without giving any of them the opportunity to explain their position or to defend themselves; more than one of these devout servants of God and loyal Free Will Baptists who were impeached without trial, being men who have rendered distinguished service in the Midway Association of Original Free Will Baptists of Georgia; THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Midway Association of Original Free Will Baptists of Georgia sever all its affiliations with the National Association of Free Will Baptists until such time that said National



Association returns in principle and in deed to the original purposes and practices adopted at the time of its establishment.




