The Mission Board is so provided in the Midway Treaty, that the Officers rotate as the Officers are replaced, as you will find on Page 35, Provision No. 2, for this Board.

The Ordaining Council was set up in the Midway Association some 25 years past and those elected were to serve for life or during good sound Christian conduct. Bro. W. T. Wiley and Bro. T. B. Mellett thought this advisable because of some trouble that had come up by churches taking in or ordaining whom they pleased. That was not in the Treaty that this one was revised from So it was an over-sight of the Revision Committee and my minutes got burned.


