The Ordaining Council was set up in the Midway Association some 25 years past and those elected were to serve for life or during good sound Christian conduct. Bro. W. T. Wiley and Bro. T. B. Mellett thought this advisable because of some trouble that had come up by churches taking in or ordaining whom they pleased. That was not in the Treaty that this one was revised from, So it was an over-sight of the Revision Committee and my minutes got burned.

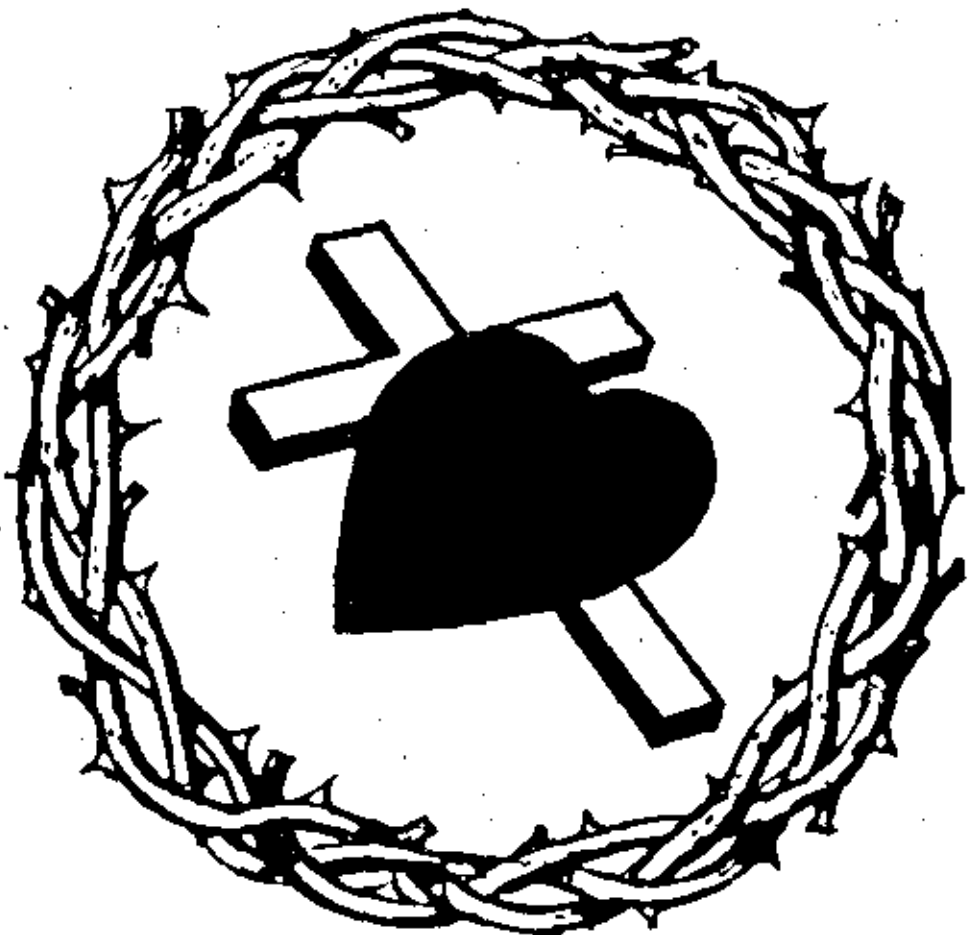
