The finance committee suggests that the Mission Board consider a request of Immanual Church regarding financial assistance.

## Temperance Report

We, the pastor and members of First Free Will Baptist Church of Albany, Georgia recommend the following report:

1. That inasmuch as we are living in a day of compromise and modernism, we as Free Will Baptists take an uncompromising stand for righteous, holy and separated living. That we walk a separated life that distinguishes us from the world; that we ababstain from all appearances of evil and that all we do shall glorify the name of Christ.

II Corinthians 6:17 "Wherefore come out from among them and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean thing; and I will receive you."

I Thessalonians 5:22 "Abstain from all appearance of evil."

I Corinthians 10:31 "Whether therefore ye eat or drink, or whatso ever ye do, do all to the glory of God."

- 2. Inasmuch as there is an alarming tendency on the part of both Ministry and Laity to become lax in our attitude of what we once considered, in the light of Scripture, to be wrong, may our attitude become *Christlike* toward the following: (1) Alcoholic beverages; (2) Dancing; (3) Card Playing; (4) Hollywood movies; (5) Tobacco; (6) Obesity; (7) Observance of the Lord's Day as a day of worship; (8) Immodest Dress; (9) Television; and (10) All things that hinder our Christian testimony.
- 3. That our churches study and observe our Church Covenant. That our members give themselves to Bible reading and prayer, faithful attendance to the house of God for all services, including Sunday night services, prayer meetings, business meetings and associational meetings, and supporting the work for a world-wide outreach of souls with their tithes and offerings.
- 4. Due to the flood of pornographic literature found on our news stands, we recommend that we as individuals, churches, association and in every capacity possible make our voices of disapproval heard.
- 5. We further recommend that our ministers and laity re-evaluate their stand or position in regard to communism, we further recomment that all Free Will Baptists consider this a Spiritual problem instead of a political problem inasmuch as they are atheistic and anti-God. Also, we recommend that each pastor and minister avail themselves of every opportunity to inform their people of the danger and evils of communism.
- 6. We recommend that each pastor inform their people of the motives, intentions and objectives of the National Council of Churches and the Ecumenical Movement.
