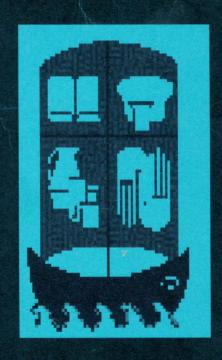
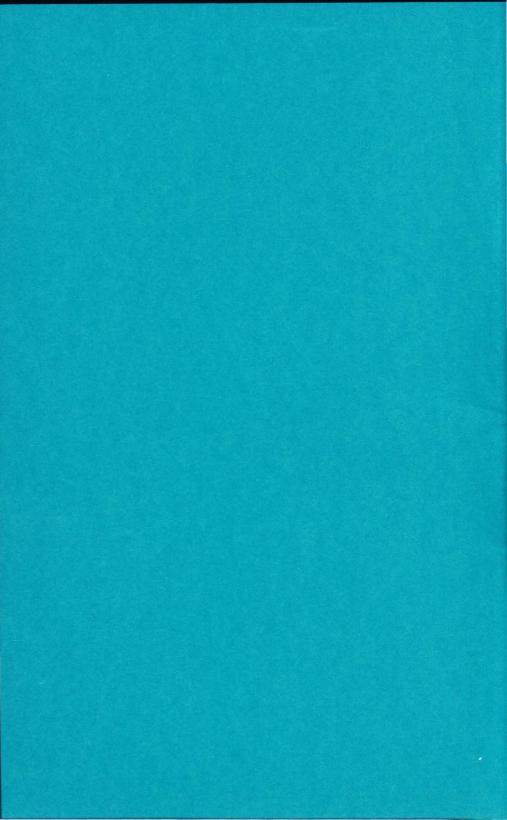

Constitution of the Midway District Association Of Original Free Will Baptist of the State of Georgia

PREAMBLE

We, the Midway District Association of Original Free Will Baptist of the State Of Georgia, do ordain this constitution for the purpose of advance in, promoting and increasing all phase of the cause of Christ.

Article I NAME:

The organization shall be known as the Midway District Association of Original Free Will Baptist of the State of Georgia.

Article II MEMBERSHIP:

This association shall be composed of such Free Will Baptist Churches as shall adopt this compact and agree to this constitution.

Article III REPRESENTATION:

- **Section 1:** The standing delegates of this session shall consist of all ordained ministers, ordained deacons, and officers of this association.
- Section 2: Voting privileges shall extend to all standing delegates and to those duly elected delegates representing churches of this association.
- Section 3: Each Church shall be entitled to two (2) delegates for the first fifty (50) members or fractional part thereof and one delegate for each additional twenty-five (25) members.

Article IV OFFICERS:

- Section 1: The general officers of this association shall be Moderator, Vice- Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer. These officers shall be elected on even years for the term of two years.
- Section 2: There shall be a General Board composed of the officers of the Association and the Chairman of the various boards which shall serve as the association out of session.
- **Section 3:** The standing boards of this association shall be the Missions Board, Ordaining Board, budget and Finance, and the Camp Board.

Article V MEETINGS:

The meetings of this association shall be the Saturdays before the fourth Sunday in January, 9 o'clock thru 12 o'clock noon; April, 9 o'clock thru 12 o'clock noon; October, 9 o'clock thru 12 o'clock noon, and the Saturday after the fourth Sunday in July, 9 o'clock thru 12 o'clock noon, followed with lunch by the host church

Article VI AMENDMENTS:

This Constitution may be amended or altered at any regular session of the association by a two- thirds vote of the delegates present provided that the proposed amendment or alteration is presented in writing during one session, placed on the table and voted on in the next session. Further it shall be understood that the proposed amendment or alteration be furnished in writing to each church at least thirty (30) days prior to the session during which the vote is taken.



BY –LAWS of the Midway District Association Of Original Free Will Baptists of the State of Georgia

Article I MEMBERSHIP:

- **Section 1:** All churches affiliated with this association shall be required to adopt the Treatise of the Faith and Practices of the Original Free Will Baptists as adopted by the National Association of Free Will Baptists. Applications for membership must contain a statement to this effect.
- Section 2; Churches desiring to affiliate themselves with this body must make application by letter and representation to this association while in session.

Article II REPRESENTATION:

Each church shall be required to pay a minimum fee per member of 75 cents per quarterly session and 75 cents per member each annual session.

Article III FUNCTIONS OF THE OFFICERS:

- **Section 1;** The duties of the Moderator shall be to preside at all meetings of the association. He shall be empowered with the authority to appoint any committees not otherwise provided for the constitution.
- Section 2: The duties of the Vice-Moderator shall be to preside at the request or absence of the Moderator and assist him in such ways, as we are necessary and advisable.
- **Section 3:** The duties of the Clerk shall be to keep accurate minutes of the association, to compile the minutes of the boards and the auxiliaries, to prepare them and to publish them. It shall further be the duty of the Clerk to take care of all necessary correspondence.

- Section 4: The duties of the Assistant Clerk shall be to function at the request of the clerk and to assist him in any way necessary.
- **Section 5:** The duties of the Treasurer shall be to receive all association funds and to disburse them as directed by the association.
- **Section 6:** The duties of the Assistant Treasurer shall be to function at the request of or in the absence of the Treasurer and to assist him in any way necessary.

Article IV FUNCTION OF THE BOARDS:

- **Section 1:** The Mission Board shall be composed of five (5) members whose terms of office shall be two (2) years and who shall be reelected or replaced on even years. The function of this board shall be:
 - (a) To supervise any and all mission' programs of this association and to coordinate their efforts with our State and National Agencies.
 - (b) To be vested with the power of trusteeship; to hold and convey titles of any property coming under the jurisdiction of Mission Board through the Midway Association or as dealing with any or all the property requiring trusteeship of the Midway Association
 - (c) To formulate and promote a live missionary program by aiding of weak churches, the establishment of new churches and by ear nest effort to keep the spirit of revival ever presents within our association. It shall not be the function of this board to hold join ownership of any church.
- Section 2: The Ordaining Board shall be composed of five (5) members who are members of our association in of standing. Board members shall be elected on even years for a term of two (2) years. The functions of this board shall be:
 - (a) To examine all applicants for ordination to the ministry and all previously ordained ministers seeking membership in our association.
 - (b) To ordain or assist in ordination of deacons and ministers when requested to do so by the church of the candidate.
 - (i) That all Ministers wishing to become members of this Midway Association be recommended from the church of which they are members.
 - (ii) That all examines be called upon to present their credentials for examination and answer satisfactorily such questions as may be asked them.
 - (iii) That a person who is presented for ordination or to be recog nized as ordained must be pasturing, involved in a

Pastoral ministry, or be in a state or retirement due to age or health or have a justifiable cause preventing his pasturing.

- (i) That ministers desiring to be ordained must have been licensed for a period of one (1) year and have pastured or been involved in a pastoral ministry for at least six (6) months prior to ordination, six (6) months pasturing, or pastoral ministry during the one year tenure of licensing will be accepted as a prerequisite for ordaining.
- **Section 3:** The Budget and Finance Board shall be composed of three (3) members, one of whom shall be the treasurer, and who shall serve as its Chairman. These members shall be elected on even years for the period of two (2) years. It shall be their duty to:
 - a. Receive and disburse all association moneys at the request of association.
 - b. To receive all pleas for help and suggestions for disbursements of moneys.
 - c. To recommend to the association the disbursements of moneys received.
 - d. To keep a general oversight of the financial work of the association and to keep the association informed at all times of its conditions.
- **Section 4:** The Camp Board shall be composed of five (5) members. Lay members shall be at least two of the five members. The Chairman of the Board shall be the Camp Director, or the board may appoint a Director and a Co-Director. This board shall be elected or re-elected yearly. It shall be their duties to:
 - 1. Plan and promote the Youth Camp over the District
 - 2. Set time for the Midway Camp.
 - Set fees for the camp in accordance with the State Camp Board.
 - 4. Secure volunteer or hire sufficient help and supervision for the camp session.

Article V COMMITTEES:

Section 1: The Nominating Committee shall be composed of three members whose terms of office shall be two years, and who shall be elected or re-elected on even re-elected on even years.

Section 2: All committees not provided for by either the constitution or its by-laws may be appointed by the Moderator as deemed necessary.

Article VI

Section 1: Each church is requested to mail its report to the Clerk fifteen (15) days before each session.

Section 2: Each Auxiliary of the Association shall give a report to the Association meeting which meets in October for the Annual Meeting. It is requested that this report be mailed to the Clerk fifteen (15) days before the Annual Session.

Article VII MISCELLANEOUS

Section 1: After payments to the Moderator, the Clerk, and the Superannuates, forty percent (40%) of Association fees/dues and offerings will go to Missions.

Section 2: Each Minister who is a member of the Midway Association shall be expected to attend at least one session yearly unless providently hindered.

Section 3: The name, date of birth, date of death, age and church affiliation of any member taken over by death, each year shall be included in that year's minutes, and such information is given to the Clerk by the various Clerks of the Churches.

Section 4: At the death of a minister, a page in that year's minutes shall be draped in black in his memory, giving all pertinent information concerning him and his ministry.

Section 5: The General Officers of the Association shall be elected on even years for the term of two (2) years.

Section 6: No person may be elected to more than one (1) office in the Midway Association at the same time. No General Officer (top six officers) may succeed himself or herself more than once.

Section 7: The Constitution and the by-laws with any amendments and alterations shall be printed each year in the minutes.

Section 8: A quorum shall consist of a majority of any board or committee.

Article VIII SUPPANNUATION:

Section 1: Retired ministers who have served the Midway Association for a period of at least five (5) years, are members of the association, and are in good standing with the Association will be given quarterly supplement of money (the amount depending upon the financial status of the association at the time) when they shall have attained their age of sixty-five (65) years; provided the income of said ministers is inadequate for their needs.

Section 2: Any qualified minister of this association who, by accident or sickness, has been rendered permanently unable to continue as a minister of the Gospel, upon recommendation of his church and the approval of the association, be given the same supplement.

Section 3: At the minister's death, the same quarterly supplement shall be continued to his widow as long as she shall live or remain a widow, provided she meets qualifications as set forth for the ministers.

Section 4: The above sections do not prevent the Association from taking "love offerings" or making a "love gift" to any minister or any layman at anytime the association so desires.

Section 5: The Budget and Finance Board shall examine each applicant at each annual association meeting to see if they are still in compliance with these by-laws.

Article IX AMENDMENTS

Theses by-laws may be amended or altered at any regular session of the association by two-thirds majority vote of the membership present provided that the proposed amendment is presented in writing during one session, place on the table and voted on in the new session. The proposed amendment or alteration shall be furnished in writing to each church at least thirty (30) days prior to the session during which the vote is to be taken.



Minutes of The Midway District Women Active for Christ

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS for the MIDWAY DISTRICT WOMEN ACTIVE For CHRIST CONVENTION

ARTICLE I

Name:

The name of this organization shall be the Midway District Women Active For Christ. (MDWAC)

ARTICLE II

Purpose:

The purpose of this organization shall be:

(1) To assist women of the Midway District Women Active for Christ Convention of Free Will Baptists in providing opportunities for them to understand and fulfill their places in the Great Commission through their responsibilities in the family, the church, the community, and around the world, and

(2) To bring women in the local churches together for fellowship, for sharing information, and for encouraging one another.

ARTICLE III

Officers and Executive Committee:

<u>Section 1.</u> Officers and Chairpersons must be members of churches in The Midway Association of Free Will Baptists and members of local WACs.

Each officer shall perform the duties set forth for that office in the current WAC Manual.

Section 2. Midway District Women Active for Christ officers shall be a
(1) President, (2) Vice President, (3) Secretary, (4) Treasurer, (5) Field Worker,

(6) Study Chairperson, (7) Missions Chairperson, (8) Prayer Chairperson, and

(9) Service Chairperson. These officers shall constitute the Executive Committee, Five (5) of whom shall be a quorum for transacting business.

ARTICLE IV

Membership

<u>Section 1</u>: This Convention shall be composed of the officers of the MDWAC Together with the local Presidents and five (5) delegates from each local WAC in the MDWAC that has paid in full its required membership fees.

Section 2: Any WAC group wishing to become a member of the MDWAC shall present a petitionary letter signed by the officers of the local group, along with a report of its work, and its proportionate dues to the MDWAC Secretary who shall in turn present this to the Credentials Committee. The Convention shall then vote on the recommendation of the Credentials Committee.

ARTICLE V

Meetings:

<u>Section 1</u>. The ANNUAL Business Meeting shall be held each year on the FIRST SATURDAY in MARCH, OR AT SUCH TIME AS MAY BE DETERMINED BY THE Executive Committee.

<u>Section 2</u>. A FALL EVENT shall be held each year on the LAST SATURDAY in SEPTEMBER, or at such time as may be determined by the Executive Committee.

Section 3. Other meetings may be held at the discretion of the Convention.

Section 4. The CONVENTION and the FALL EVENT shall convene with the WAC Groups in the Midway District according to alphabetical order. If a local group is unable to serve as host, the Executive Committee must be notified by the group.

ARTICLE VI

Amendments:

This Constitution may be amended at any Annual Meeting of the Convention by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members present.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I

Duties of Officers:

Section 1. President - The President shall preside over all meetings and serve as Chairperson of the Executive Committee, appoint such committees as may be needed, call meetings of the Executive Committee when necessary, be an exofficio member of all committees (with the exception of the Nominating Committee), see that reports are made promptly by the MDWAC Secretary and Treasurer to the State and perform any duties pertaining to the office of President.

Section 2. Vice President - The Vice President shall preside in the absence of the President or by her request. She shall be available to assist the President in the general overall convention tasks. The Vice President shall chair the Credentials Committee. She shall encourage local WACs to present a Special Enlistment program during MAY (WNAC Emphasis Month) and to send an offering for WNAC Office Expenses.

Secretary - The Secretary shall keep an accurate record of all proceedings of the Convention, the Executive Committee Meetings and the "Spring Event". She shall preserve all valuable papers and turn them over to her successor. Immediately after the MDWAC Convention, she shall compile a list of the Local WAC Officers, their addresses, their phone numbers, and their e-mail addresses and send a copy to every District Officer and Chairperson as well as to the GWAC President and Secretary.

She shall be prompt in sending the proper reports to the GWAC Secretary.

The Secretary is also responsible for sending a copy of the minutes, the Treasurer's annual report, the Resolutions Report, etc. to the Midway Associational Clerk to be published in the Midway Associational Minutes.

<u>Section 4.</u> Treasurer - The Treasurer shall have charge of all funds belonging to this Convention and shall disburse monies only when authorized by the Convention and/or the Executive Committee.

She shall keep an accurate account and shall give a written report of all funds received and disbursed at each Convention, a copy of which shall be included with the MDWAC Secretary's report in the Midway Associational Minutes every year. She shall be prompt in sending to the GWAC treasurer the monthly report along with the gifts and offerings as well as the annual report with the per member dues designated by the GWAC and the WNAC.

The Treasurer serves as Chairman of the Finance Committee.

The Treasurer shall encourage support of Missions through the WNAC Gift Plan as well as the support of The Dot Harvey Loan Fund.

<u>Section 5.</u> Field Worker - The Field Worker shall have charge of all field work pertaining to the promotion of WAC in the Midway District helping in any way she can to organize new groups as well as encouraging established WAC groups.

She shall be responsible for the MDWAC Newsletter.

Section 6. Study Chairperson - The Study Chairperson shall work with the Local Study Chairpersons to encourage and promote regular studies that encourage Christian growth such as Missions, Christian Living, Prayer, Special Ministries, etc. and the WAC Manual.

She shall be available to help train local officers for their duties and leadership responsibilities when needed.

The Study Chairperson along with the Executive Committee shall plan the annual Spring Event and she shall be in charge of its activities.

Section 7. Prayer Chairperson - The Prayer Chairperson shall encourage Local Prayer Chairpersons to promote family altars, prayer hot lines, special Seasons of Prayer, Prayer Retreats, Prayer Fellowships, etc.

She shall receive and forward prayer suggestions for special Missionary Requests and other special needs.

Section 8. Service Chairperson - The Service Chairperson shall promote MDWAC projects for Missionaries; sick/aged/retired Ministers; the Free Will Baptist Children's Home in Eldridge, AL; Special Community Needs; and the promotion of other Christian Organizations.

Section 9. Missions Chairperson - The Missions Chairperson shall encourage the local WAC groups to make regular contributions through the WNAC Gift Plan to the Dot Harvey Loan Fund (A revolving loan fund for Georgia students who are attending FWBBC); the GWAC Project; the WNAC Provision Closet, etc. She shall encourage the local Missions Chairpersons to help their members to learn our missionaries and their families' names and addresses and correspond with them. (Encourage the children of the church to communicate with the missionaries' children.)

She shall promote Local, State, National, and International Missions among our women in any way she can.

ARTICLE II

Elections:

The general officers and four (4) Chairpersons shall be nominated by a Nominating Committee and elected every two (2) years by acclamation, unless there are other nominations from the floor. In the event of more than one nominee for any office, a vote will be taken on each one..

All elections shall be held at the closing business session of the Annual Convention. Election of officers will be held on all uneven years.

ARTICLE III

Committees:

Section 1. Executive Committee - The Executive Committee shall hold annual meetings to maintain an over-all view of the work at large; to plan programs for the annual convention and the Spring Event; and to transact any necessary convention business.

The Executive Committee has the authority to call extra meetings when needed; act for the convention when the convention is not in session; and fill vacancies of officers occurring between elections.

<u>Section 2.</u> Credentials Committee - The Vice-President shall serve as Chairperson of the Credentials Committee. Two (2) other members shall be appointed by the President to serve with her.

This committee shall examine the local WAC reports to make sure reports are in order and fees are paid.

The Petitionary report of a local WAC group desiring membership in the MDWAC is examined by this committee. If approved the petition for membership is presented by the Credentials Committee to the Convention to be voted on and the new member's delegates seated.

This committee shall serve for two years.

Section 3. Registration Committee - The Registration Committee consists of three (3) members who are appointed by the President.

This committee's responsibilities are to register those in attendance and give its report to the convention.

This committee serves for one (1) year.

<u>Section 4.</u> Finance Committee - The Finance Committee is composed of the Treasurer and four (4) members appointed by the President.

It is their duty to audit the financial records for the year and report on same to the Convention.

The Committee makes financial recommendations to the Convention for its approval.

This committee shall serve for one (1) year.

Section 5. Resolutions Committee - The Resolutions Committee shall consist of five (5) members appointed by the President.

This committee shall review all the resolutions received and shall compile the ones deemed proper and profitable into the Resolution Report which will be presented to the Convention for its approval.

This committee shall serve for two (2) years.

<u>Section 6.</u> Nominating Committee - The Nominating Committee shall be composed of five (5) members who are delegates.

Candidates for this committee are nominated from the floor and elected by the body at its annual convention on even years.

This committee shall serve for two (2) years.

They shall present a slate of officers to be voted on at the convention on the uneven years.

ARTICLE IV

Fees and Reports

<u>Section 1.</u> Membership fees per member of this convention includes Midway District, Georgia State and National dues.

ARTICLE V

Gifts

The desired financial programs for members of MWAC include Missions Offerings following each of the Special Season of Prayer, Regular Co-Laborer Offerings, the GWAC Project, annual gifts to the WNAC General Fund, regular support of the Dot Harvey Loan Fund, and other funds or gifts designated by the convention.

ARTICLE VI

Rules:

Section 1. Minutes of each annual convention shall be read and approved at the conclusion of that business session.

Section 2: These By-Laws may be amended at any Annual Meeting of the Convention by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of members present.
