is Our Helper.'

Clerk and assistant Moderator was needed for the evening service. Motion made, seconded that Sis. Ruth Hickman be appointed for the

evening service. Carried.

Nominations for Assistant Moderator: Rev. Elmer Turnbough was nominated. Motion made, seconded to elect Rev. Turnbough. Carried. Registration of standing delegates.

General Baptist Association. Carried.

Report of the Pulpit Committee: Afternoon devotion: Rev. Lynn Wood, pastor of the First Free Will Baptist Church, Mtn. Grove: 2:00 p. m. message: Rev. Howard Bowers, pastor of the Rock Chapel Church.

the Valley."

Solo by Bro. David Latimer, "One Day I Will See Jesus."

Message: Rev. Bud Hill, pastor of the Willow Springs Free Will Baptist Church. Scripture: I Peter 5:8 and Luke 19:10. Text: "If I were Satan." He listed the things that he would do to tear down the Church of God and the remedy to face these problems.

Altar call given as the congregation sang "Just As I Am." Prayer

of dedication by Bro. Hill.

Since Bro. Lynn Wood could not be in attendance for the afternoon session, the pulpit committee selected Rev. Gene Terry, pastor of the Kings Way Church for the 1:00 o'clock devotion.

Rev. Howard Bowers gave directions for lunch time.

Motion made, seconded that Rev. R. E. Helsley attend the General Baptist Association and that he contact the Clerk to give him a letter stating that he is our representative. Carried.

Motion made, seconded that this report be accepted. Carried.

Report of the Observance of the Sabbath Day Committee. (See reports). Motion made, seconded that this report be accepted. Carried. Report of the Sunday School Committee. (See reports). Motion

made, seconded that we accept this report. Carried,

Final report of the Credential Committee. (See reports). Motion made, seconded to receive the report and dispose of the items one by one. Carried.

Item No. 6. Motion made, seconded to accept this item and place

it in the hands of the Executive Committee. Carried.

Item No. 7. Motion made, seconded to accept this item of the report . Carried.

Report of the Examining Committee. (See reports). Motion made, seconded that we receive this report and grant the request. Carried.

Motion made, seconded that all ministers that are to be granted a card of good standing be recommended by the church of which they are a member. Any minister whose name is not on a church letter will not be granted this card of good standing. Carried.

Moderator states that it is now time for the afternoon message. Bro. B. Keith leads the congregation in singing "Draw Me Near

Blessed Lord."

Prayer by Rev. Herbert Vandivort.

Congregational singing: "More About Jesus." Special music by the Keith's as they sang "What a Beautiful Day." Sis. Keith then

sings: "The Eyes of God Are Upon You."

Rev. Howard Bowers then brings the message using as his text: II Tim. 2:2. Theme: "The Saving of the Saved." He stated that there are three things for the church member to have in order to be a witness for Christ. First: Be saved. Secondly: Be saved and know it. Thirdly: Be saved and live like it. A very inspiring message enjoyed by all.

At the end of the message the Moderator calls for the election

CONSTITUTION

PREAMBLE. From experience, we the Free Will Baptist Churches, in order to form a more perfect union and that we may affiliate ourselves with other Free Will Baptist bodies, have come together and organized into an Association.

- 1. This Association shall be called Mission Association of Free Will Baptist and shall be composed of such well regulated quarterly meetings and churches as many as may embody themselves under this constitution.
- 2. It shall be the purpose of this organization to co-operate with the Missouri State and National Associations in their efforts to combine and direct the energies of the Free Will Baptist Church, for the promotion of Home and Foreign Missions, Christian Education, Sunday School, Church Training Service and Woman's Auxiliary and for the extension of the Kingdom of God in general.
- 3. The acting members of this association shall be two delegates from each church, chosen by the members while in conference, together with all ministers, minister's wives, deacons, deacon's wives and church and associational clerks belonging to any church composing this body; also three members from each Quarterly Meeting under the Association, two to be chosen by each Quarterly Meeting, and the other shall be the clerk of the Quarterly Meeting.
- 4. The officers of this Association shall consist of a moderator, and assistant moderator, a clerk-treasurer who shall superintend the printing of the minutes) each of whom shall be elected at the closing of each regular session and shall hold their offices until their successors are elected. The clerk shall receive Forty (\$40.00) for his or her services.
- 5. An Executive Board composed of five members, consisting of three ministers and two deacons, whose duty shall be to transact the business of this Association when this Body is not in session; whose term of office shall be as follows: one for 1 year, one for 2 years, one for 3 years, one for 4 years, and one for 5 years and at the expiration of each of these terms shall be elected for a term of 5 years, who shall hold office until his successor is elected, further: if any vacancies occur between sessions of this Association the Board shall fill such vacancies until the next session of this Association. The

Moderator and Clerk shall also serve on this board, as they hold these offices in the Association.

- 6. Any regularly organized Free Will Baptist Church or Quarterly Meeting, maintaining Gospel order, agreeing with the denomination in doctrine, in favor of benevolent enterprises, such as Sunday Schools, Missions, Temperance and Education, may be received into this Association by presenting a petition asking to be received, and by a majority vote of this Association.
- 7. This Association shall have the power to discipline its churches, exclude them for disorderly conduct, if labor proves unsuccessful, ordain deacons, to license or ordain ministers, such as given evidence of being qualified and called of God, by request of the Church to which members belong; to settle questions of discipline and doctrine as the Churches or Quarterly Meetings may refer to it; to make any rules and by-laws necessary to its regulations and not inconsistent with its constitution, but in no case shall this Association reverse a decision of one of its churches or Quarterly Meetings, nor in any way interfere with its internal regulations, nor hold any ecclesiastical authority over the Churches or Quarterly Meetings composing the Association.
- 8. Each session of this Association shall convene annually beginning on Friday at 7:00 p. m., before the 2nd Sunday in August, and shall be held with only such churches as call for it by vote of the church while in conference, and this shall be decided by a majority of all votes cast.
- 9. The Moderator or Assistant Moderator shall call the Association in session, and in their absence the chairman of the Executive Board shall take charge, and in his absence any member of the Executive Board shall take charge until a Moderator is elected.
- 10. This Constitution may be amended or changed at any regular session of this body, by a two-third vote, after notice of contemplated change has been read and placed on the table one day previous to the time the vote was taken.

BY-LAWS

- 1. All business meetings shall be opened by singing, reading a portion of God's word and prayer, and shall be closed with prayer.
- 2. Seven members from three or more churches shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.
- 3. Any ruling of the moderator may be over-ruled by a majority vote of the members present.
- 4. This association may correspond by messenger or otherwise with other religious bodies.
- 5. This association shall sit with open doors except when it shall go into committee as a whole.
- 6. Any member of this body may appeal from the decision of the moderator to the association and by a majority vote therein, the objection shall be sustained or rejected.
 - 7. The moderator shall stop all discussion when not carried on in

a Christian spirit.

8. No member of this association will be allowed to speak more than ten minutes nor more than twice on the same subject without permission of the moderator.

9. Anyone desiring to speak shall rise to his feet and address the moderator by the appelation, "Brother Moderator," but shall not

speak further until recognized by the moderator.

10. All business, except routine, shall be brought before the body by committees, but should any committee refuse or fail to present to this body any business given it by any member of this association, then such business may be presented to the body by any members but cannot be discussed unless by a vote of this body.

11. All officers of this Association shall be nominated from the

floor and elected by a vote.

12. All committees shall be appointed by the moderator, but any

appointment may be changed by a majority vote of this body.

13. A majority of all votes cast shall be final upon all subjects except the Constitution and By-Laws, then it shall require a two-thirds majority.

14. Churches of the Mission Association shall not call a pastor who

does not have a yearly certificate.

- 15. Each ordained minister in good standing shall be given a yearly certificate. Each licensed minister, upon receiving a call for pastoral work or the administering of the Gospel ordinances shall upon request from the church of which he is a member, be examined for ordination.
- 16. All applicants for license or ordination shall be examined by an examining committee composed of five members, at least three of whom shall be ordained ministers, the committee to be appointed by the moderator. The examining committee shall interview all applicants in private and shall use the standard of examination formerly approved as resolution, to be printed in separate form and distributed to all ministers and churches in the association.
- 17. No member of this body shall serve on the Executive Board of both this annual meeting and the quarterly meeting at the same time.
- 18. All churches that compose this body shall prepare a statistical report in the form supplied by the clerk, who is the statistician, of the association, as soon as possible after receipt of the form at the end of June each year.
- 19. These By-Laws may be amended or changed at any regular session of this association by a two-thirds vote of the association.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. The Bible. The Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God, and are our infallible rule fo faith and practice.

2. God. There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver and Righteous Governor of the universe; and in the Scriptures as Father, Son and Holy Ghost, yet as one God, infinitely wise and good; who mall intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore and obey.

- 3. Christ. Christ is God Manifest in the flesh; in His divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified, He is now risen and glorified, and is our ever present Savior and Lord.
- 4. The Holy Spirit. The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God.
- 5. The Government of God. God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts, not otherwise provided for, as the highest welfare of men requires.
- 6. The Sinfulness of Man. Man was created innocent but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity, therefore inherit a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability sin, and become guilty before God.
- 7. The Work of Christ. The Son of God, by His incarnation, life, suffering, death and resurrection effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free and is the ground of salvation by faith.
- 8. The Terms of Salvation. The conditions of salvation are: 1. Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of it. 2. Faith or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Savior and Lord with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith and souls is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the domination of sin and becomes a child of God. 3. Continuance in faith and obedience until death.
- 9. Election. God determined from the beginning to save all who would comply with the conditions of salvations. Hence by faith in Christ, men become His elect.
- 10. Freedom of the Will. The human will is free and self-controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit or to resist them and perish.
- 11. Salvation Free . God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will may come and take of the waters of life freely.
- 12. Perseverance. All believers in Christ, who through grace perseverance holiness to the end of life, have promise of eternal salvation.
- 13. Gospel Ordinances. BAPTISM, or the immersion of believers in water, and the LORD'S SUPPER, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel; FEET WASHING an ordinance teaching humility, of universal obligation, and to be ministered to all true believers.
- 14. Tithing. God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament; Jesus Christ endorsed it in the Gospel. Matt. 23:23 and the Apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store as God hath prospered him." (1 Cor. 16:2).
- 15. The Christian Sabbath. The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employments, and amusements,

for rest, worship; holy works and activities, and for personal communion with God.

16. Resurrection, Judgment and Final Retribution. The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto to the resurrection of damnation; then the wicked will "go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."

CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ and adopted the **Word** of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in his solemn covenant.

We promise by His grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearances of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to provide things honest in the sight of all men.

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligation in references to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions and social worship; and by self-denial, faith and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ."

We will not forsake the assemblying of ourselves together for church conferences; public worship, and the observance of the ordinance
