RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE REPORT

1. Be it resolved that the Constitution of the MississippiState Association of Free Will Baptists be amended with an addition to Article VI, Section 3, under B. Policy Number (3), as recommended by the Mississippi State Home Mission Board. The addition is as follows:

"The following dissolution clause shall be inserted into the property deeds of mission churches, where the Mississippi State Association through the State Home Mission Board has paid for the purchase of property and/or buildings:

"All business, property and assets shall be turned over to the Home Mission Board of the Mississippi State Association in event of one or more of the following circumstances:

- 1. The dissolution of the mission or church
- 2.If the mission church refuses to or ceases to affiliate with the Mississippi State Association of Free Will Baptists.
- 3. If the mission or church shall cease to carry out the objects and purposes of a Free Will Baptist Church as set forth in the Treatise of the Faith and Practices of the Original Free Will Baptists.

"This does not give the Mississippi State Association through its Home Mission Board any authority in the internal affairs or business of any mission or church."

Resolution passed.

- 2. Be it resolved that the state Clerk have the minutes of the state meeting to the printer by the end of December following the state meeting each year. Passed.
- 3. Be it resolved that we, the body of the State Association, give a rising vote of thanks to the First Free Will Baptist Church of Pearl for their tremendous effort put forth in hosting the state session. Passed.
- 4. Whereas, the State Associational meeting of 1988 will convene in the South Mississippi Association, be it resolved that we meet with the Lee's Chapel Free Will Baptist Church in Wayne County. Passed.

REPORT OF BOARD OF CONFERENCE AND ITINERANT MINISTRIES: October 1987

Over 150 people gathered at the Community Free Will Baptist Church in Corinth, Mississippi, on Friday evening, February 27, for the 1987 Mississippi Pastors & Workers Conference. This year's theme was, "Evidences of Being Spirit-Filled." It featured Rev. Leroy Forlines, Bible College professor and chairman of the Commission on Theological Integrity of the National Association of Free Will Baptists. Also featured on the program was Rev. Hughes Ellis, evangelist, former home missionary and pastor with over 26 years experience.

During the Friday evening services, Bro. Forlines clarified the meaning and differences between the baptism of the Holy Ghost and being filled with the Holy Ghost. Bro. Ellis finished the services by explaining about the misconceptions of the charismatic movement.

The Saturday morning session brought a house full of folks with eager anticipation for the messages. Bro. Forlines continued his explanation of the meaning of being Spirit-filled. Bro. Ellis presented the problems, purposes, principles, and practices of spiritual gifts. The conference concluded with an informative, informal question and answer session.

Special music was provided throughout the conference by local churches. Evaluation questionnaires were distributed and received to be used for planning future conferences.

The Board began planning for this year's fall state-wide Missionary Conference, at the close of the state association meeting last year at Columbus. It was determined and agreed upon by the pastors around the state that the conference should be held November 1-14, 1987. Arrangements were made with the National Home Missions and Foreign Missions Departments to reserve these dates in order to assist with the scheduling of missionaries to be in this conference.

On Monday, June 1, the board chairman met with the Department representatives in Nashville to coordinate an appropriate schedule that would include 35 churches in the state. In August, correspondence was sent out to the various participating churches to inform about the schedule and encourage planning.

An orientation week was held on Tuesday, September 29 in Tupelo for the pastors from the Northeast and Little Brown Creek Associations. Continual contact was made with pastors and churches of the Delta-Central and South Mississippi Associations. Conference brochures and missionary materials have been distributed to those churches involved in this year's conference. The success of this first annual state-wide Missionary Conference now depends upon the promotion by local pastors and churches.

It is essential that conference report forms be returned so as to evaluate and make appropriate plans for next year's conference.

Finally, the Board would like to express its appreciation to those churches which have faithfully supported the efforts of this Board by contributions. The Board still holds the belief that it exists to serve the interests of the Free Will Baptists in the state of Mississippi. Your input is encouraged and welcome.

CONSTITUTION OF THE MISSISSIPPI STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

Article 1 - Name

This body shall be known henceforth as the Mississippi State Association of Free Will Baptists.

Article II - Purpose

The object of this organization shall be to more thoroughly unify the work of the various Associations and Churches of Mississippi and to devise and execute measures for the extension of Christ's Kingdom in connection with the various Associations and Churches comprising this organization.

Article III - Treatise of Faith and Practice

This body adopts the Treatise of Faith and Practice of the National Association of Free Will Baptists.

Article IV - Membership

Section 1. The membership of this Association shall consist of all Associations and Churches that from time to time, upon approval of the State Association, shall become members of this body.

Section 2. Representation: Each district association holding membership in the state association shall be entitled to five (5) representatives elected from the laity upon the receipt of a letter and upon the payment of the representative fee of fifty (\$50.00) dollars, plus ten (\$10.00) dollars per member church in the district association. All ordained ministers and deacons of qualified district associations shall be entitled to membership in this body. All missionaries under the auspices of the State Mission Board shall be entitled to membership in this body upon request by the State Mission Board.

Section 3. Any local Free Will Baptist Church may represent with one (1) lay delegate and the ordained ministers and deacons of that church upon receipt of a letter and the payment of the representative fee of fifty (\$50.00) dollars. Each local church holding membership in a qualified district association shall be entitled to one (1) lay delegate upon receipt of a letter and upon the payment of the representative fee of fifty (\$50.00) dollars.

Section 4. It is understood that the Mississippi State

Association of Free Will Baptists and the area associations comprising its memberships have no judicial authority over any local church.

Section 5. The Mississippi State Association of Free Will Baptists, the yearly associations comprising its membership and their local churches do not grant any judicial authority to any representative body to which they may belong.

Article V - Officers

The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, an Assistant Moderator, a Clerk, an Assistant Clerk, and a Treasurer, each of whom shall be nominated and elected by a standing vote from the floor at each regular meeting.

Election shall be determined by a majority vote of those present and voting. Officers thus elected shall hold their positions until their successors are elected and installed.

Article VI - Board and Committees

Section 1. The Executive Committee is a standing committee, composed of Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, and Treasurer.

Section 2. This Association shall elect whatever boards and committees it deems necessary for its operation and shall state whether they are standing or temporary.

Section 3. Board of Missions and Church Extension:

A. The Board of Missions and Church Extension is a standing Board composed of five (5) members with terms up to five (5) years, with a board member going off each year.

B. Policy:

- (1) This board will have the authority to approve:
 - (a) The organization of a Missions into a church.
 - (b) Purchase date, location, and price of property purchased by the church or mission until all financial support be terminated.
- (2) This Board will have the right and authority for five (5) years after financial support has terminated, in the event the work fails, or the church disbands or ceases to function, to recover any equity from the work in the form of property, securities, cash or any other assets, and such recovered equity is to be used in future mission projects at the discretion of the Board. However, this

does not mean that the Board will assume any liabilities of the church or any direct indebtedness at any time.

(3) This Board shall have the authority to select its Treasurer from among its members.

The following dissolution clause shall be inserted into the property deeds of mission churches, where the Mississippi State Association through the State Home Mission Board has paid for the purchase of property and/or buildings:

"All business, property and assets shall be turned over to the Home Mission Board of the Mississippi State Association in event of one or more of the following circumstances:

- 1. The dissolution of the mission or church.
- 2. If the mission or church refuses to or ceases to affiliate with the Mississippi State Association of Free Will Baptists.
- 3. If the mission or church shall cease to carry out the objects and purposes of a Free Will Baptist Church as set forth in the Treatise of the Faith and Practices of the Original Free Will Baptists.

This does not give the Mississippi State Association through its Home Mission Board any authority in the internal affairs or business of any mission or church."

Section 4. The Board of Christian Education is a standing board composed of four (4) members with terms up to four (4) years, with a member going off each year. The Board of Christian Education is to be composed of a member from each of the district associations.

Section 5. The Board of Conference and Itinerate Ministries is a standing board composed of three (3) members with terms up to three (3) years, with a member going off each year.

Section 6. The Auditing Committee is a standing committee composed of three (3) members with terms up to three (3) years, with a member going off each year. It shall be the duty of this Board to meet with the treasurer for the purpose of auditing treasurer's books prior to the State Association and give annual report to the State Association.

Article VII - Meeting

This Association shall hold its regular meetings annually at a time and place fixed by the last regular session and made known before adjournment. Special meetings may be called by the Executive Committee when extreme necessity demands, providing that the Clerk of the Association has been properly notified at least fifteen (15) days before the date set for the

meeting. Fifteen (15) legal representatives shall constitute a quorum for any special meetings of this Association.

Article VIII - Amendments

The Constitution of the Mississippi State Association of Free Will Baptists may be altered or amended at any yearly session of the association by two-thirds visible vote of the members present, provided that the change is recommended, in writing, to the delegates, at the yearly session and tabled until the next year.

In the first of the second of

BY-LAWS OF THE MISSISSIPPI ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

- 1. The Moderator or the Assistant Moderator shall call the Association to order at the hour designated by the program committee. When neither the Moderator or the Assistant Moderator is present, the Executive Committee shall elect a Moderator pro-tem, who shall call the association to order.
- 2. (a) It shall be the duty of the clerk to record and have have printed annually the minutes of the Association.
 - (b) To enroll delegates to this Association who shall present themselves with the proper evidence of their rights to seats therein, and those enrolled by the Clerk shall compose the Association. In case of questionable representation, however, the case under question shall be referred to a credential committee.
 - (c) The Clerk shall be given one hundred dollars (\$100.00) per year for his time, effort, and personal expenses in preparation of the state Minutes.
- 3. (a) It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to hold all Associational funds and disburse same as authorized by the Association.
 - (b) The Treasurer shall be paid one hundred dollars (\$100.00) per year to cover his time, effort, and personal expenses in preparing monthly and yearly reports.
- 4. The Executive Committee shall act on behalf of the Association when the Association is not in session. Any action taken by this committee shall be submitted in report to the Association.
- 5. Board of Missions and Church Extension. It shall be the duty of this Board to:
 - (a) Receive and disburse money allocated them by the State and other money.
 - (b) To promote the organization of new churches.
 - (c) To give complete report of all funds received, disbursements and progress made to the Association.
- 6. Board of Conference and Intinerate Ministries. It shall be the duty of the Board to:
 - (a) Work in conjunction with our National Departments in planning Itinerates and Conference speakers for the benefit of the local churches.
 - (b) To plan programs for Bible Conference on a state level.
- 7. Board of Christian Education. It shall be the duty of this

Board to:

- (a) Promote all phases of educational work in the State Association.
- (b) To be a link from the local church to the National level.
- (c) Promote teaching materials and personnel for educational programs in the church.
- (d) Plan and promote Sunday School and CTS Rallies on the State level. Expenses of promotional literature, such as correspondence, special promotions, etc. to be paid out of General Fund.
- 8. Travel shall be paid by this Association at the rate of "the same as or not to exceed the current rate set by the I.R.S." plus compensation for food and lodging for all members of standing boards while transacting business authorized by, or in behalf of, the Association, or promotional work over the state. The Treasurer shall pay such expenses when written claim is presented by each individual involved.
- 9. The Moderator, when serving this Association in promotional services, shall be paid fifteen dollars (\$15.00) for each service conducted in addition to mileage.
- 10. The Moderator shall appoint a committee on committees which shall present to the body nominations for such committees as necessary.
- 11. That we receive the letters and seat the delegates on the strength of the Credentials Committee report and omit public reading of the letters; all letters to be mailed with the representative fee to the State Association Clerk by the first of the month in which meetings are to be held.
- 12. A Parliamentarian shall be appointed by the Moderator if he deems it necessary, and any questions as to parliamentary procedure, Robert's Rules of Order shall be final authority on the subject.
- 13. The Editor of the MISSISSIPPI MESSENGER shall be paid one hundred dollars (\$100.00) per issue for his labor and personal expenses in preparing the MESSENGER.
- 14. These By-Laws may be amended at any regular session of the State Association by a two-thirds vote of the members present, provided the change is recommended in writing and tabled in the morning session and voted on during the afternoon session.
- 15. The Mississippi State Associational Year will begin on October 1 and end on September 30.
