EXECUTIVE BOARD'S REPORT

To the Missouri State Association when convened at the Macedonia Church September 15-19, 1947.

September 10, 1946

On September 10, 1946 the Executive Board met as -10-

The only item of business was the discussion of the publication of the Gem.

At the close of the Association at Myrtle the Board met again and organized as follows: Rev. F. C. Zinn, Chairman; Rev. C. B. Dees, Secretary-Treaturer. The Board agreed to meet at Monett November 5th or earlier if necessary.

Motion carried to allocate 10% of the State's part of the Unified Fund to the Superannuation Board and the remaining 90% to the General Fund.

Motion carried that the members of the Board receive 10 cents a mile one way travel expense.

November 5, 1946

On November 5, 1947 the Mo. State Executive Board met at Monett, Mo. with the following members present: Rev's. F. C. Zinn, B. F. Brown, Harry Beatty, C. B. Dees, and Dea. John Bough.

Scripture reading by Rev. Harry Beatty. Prayer by Bro. John Bough.

Discussion opened relative to the opening of the Gem. Motion to adjourn for lunch; to return at 1:30.

Meeting resumed at 2:00 o'clock with prayer by Rev. F. C. Zinn.

Motion carried that the Board ask for donations and pledges to be used to pay for the present stock in the publishing house. The said stock to become the property of the Missouri State Association and the incoming Editor to be ever responsible to the Missouri State Association for the amount of the stock.

Motion carried to publish the following:

After much discussion about the possibilities of the Gem and the task of getting someone to take over after its having been idle for so long, the Board arrived at the following decision.

Motion carried that we resume the publication of the Free Will Baptist Gem with the December issue, under the auspices of the Missouri State Executive Board.

Motion carried that we adjourn until the call of the chair.

January 28, 1947

On, January 28, 1947 the Missouri State Executive Board met at the Free Will Baptist Gem Office with the following members present: Rev's. Harry Beatty, B. F. Brown, C. B. Dees and Dea. John Bough. In the absence of Rev. F. C. Zinn, Rev. O. T. Allred was seated as his proxy.

Motion carried that Rev. O. T. Allred be elected as Chairman pro tem for this meeting.

Prayer by Rev's O. T. Allred and Harry Beatty.

Letter read from Rev. Sherman Oakes of North Carolina as to being Editor of the Gem.

Motion carried to borrow money to purchase the stock of the former Editor.

Adjournment for lunch.

Business resumed by prayer by Rev. Lloyd Jeffreys.

Motion carried that money be borrowed at the bank to pay the amount of the inventory over and above the standing note to the Church Extension Fund of \$410.

Motion carried that we cancel the note for \$410. now standing against C. B. Dees, and that the Board make a new note for the said amount to the Church Extension Fund.

Inventory of the stock taken at the Gem which amounted to \$852.26. Balance due of this amount, \$442.26; \$34.-26 was paid in cash. Arrangements were made to borrow \$408.00 to satisfy the balance.

Motion' carried that Bro. Brown be appointed Acting-Editor of the Gem until the State Association or until another Editor is secured.

June 20, 1947

On June 20, 1947 the Missouri State Executive Board

met at the Free Will Baptist Gem Office in Monett, Mo.

Session opened with prayer by Rev. O. T. Allred. In the absence of Rev. Harry Beatty, Bro. Allred was seated as proxy. Bro. J. B. Jefferson was seated as proxy for Rev. C. B. Decs. Rev. Lloyd Jeffreys was seated in council.

Motion carried to accept the invitation of the Macedonia Free Will Baptist Church to entertain the Missouri State Association.

Motion carried to delegate Rev. F. C. Zinn, as Chairman of the Board, to write cards to as many Church Clerks and ministers as possible to prompt their support in defraying the cost of the entertainment of the Association.

Motion carried to make the Gem office responsible for the printing of programs and badges for the State Association.

Motion carried for Rev. O. T. Allred to work in cooperation with the Gem Office to prepare a program for the State Association.

Motion carried to make Rev. B. F. Brown responsible to have repairs made on the Gem building as funds are available and repairs necessary.

Rev. O. T. Allred by his own request disqualified himself temporarily from the Board; Rev. Lloyd Jeffreys replaced him as proxy.

Motion carried to endorse the Youth Encampment Board to borrow money, if necessary, not to exceed \$500.00 for the preparation of the Youth Camp to entertain this year's session.

Balance on and in the Church Extension Fund \$449.-24.

REPORT OF THE ACTING-EDITOR

(From December 3, 1946 to September 15, 1947) At the time of our last State Meeting, our Gem paper had no Editor, and was not being printed. But our State Executive Board, after due consideration, decided to resume the publication of our paper and Lagreed to act

as Editor until we could install a regular Editor or until the 1947 session of the Missouri State Association.

We began work at the Gem Office on the third day of December, 1946 and put out nine issues of the Gem to this date. Most of the nine issues have been eight page papers because of the lack of manuscript to make a larger paper and because there was a lack of money. The Board guaranteed my expenses and promised to cooperate and allow me up to 25 cents an hour for time worked if that much was left above expenses, and if the amount of income more than paid the expenses and 25 cents an hour for the time employed at the Gem Office, the balance should go to the incoming Editor.

Last December there were about 1,000 names on the mailing list; but near 700 of these names have expired and at least 600 of them failed to renew, leaving around 400 names on the old list. During the nine months we have received 413 subscriptions making about 800 who are getting the Gem.

No. 2. Whereas the National Foreign Mission Board has appointed Rev. Damon Dodd, Director of Foreign Missions for this State, be it, therefore, resolved that we cooperate with him in the Promoting of the Foreign Mission work.

No. 4. Be it resolved that we endorse the book written by one of our missionaries to India, Laura Belle Barnard, and urge our people throughout the State to avail themselves of this splendid book.

No. 5. Be it resolved that Free Will Baptist Foreign Missions be taught in all our Daily Vacation Bible School work.

No. 6. Inasmuch as our State Mission Director has designated the month of November as Special Mission-

ary month for Missouri, be it therefore resolved: That each church in the State take a Special Missionary offering sometime during the month. This offering is to be over and above what the church may be already giving to Foreign Missions.

1. Let us call your attention to the accepted notice of the proposed 'Constitutional change:

"We recommend that this session of the Association accept a notice of a proposed change of the Constitution in Art No. 4 to read as follows: 'The officers of this Association shall be, a Moderator, an Assistant Moderator and a Secretary-Treasurer, said officers shall be elected annually at the beginning of each session and shall hold their offices until their successors are elected and qualified: a board of trustees of five members whose term of office shall be as follows: One for one (1) year, one for two (2) years, one for three (3) years, one for four (4) years, and one for five (5) years; and at the expiration of these terms one is to be elected for a term of five years and who shall hold office until his successor is elected; and further, if any vacancies occur between sessions of the Association the Board shall fill such vacancy or vacancies until the next Association; who shall perform the following duties: First shall be the legal corporation of the Association with the corporate name of the Board of Trustees of the Missouri State Association of Free Will Baptists; to be a Board of Missions and Church Extension, to secure, hold and convey money, homes or lands for the propagation of the gospel in connection with the Free Will Baptist denomination. Second, to receive, hold, manage, use, control, or convey any property entrusted to the Association for and in accordance with the donor's purpose. Said Board of Trusees shall also compose the Home Mission Board. They may be chosen from ministers, deacons, or delegates.' Proposed change to be voted upon at the next regular session of the Association."

2 Recognizing the request of the Indian Creek and Central Western Mo. & Southeastern Kans. Associations: Be it resolved that we go on record as opposing any trend or movement toward our Bible College becoming a liberal arts or fully accredited Institution.

3. Viewing request No. 2 from the Indian Creek Association pertaining to the authorization of this State's elected member of the Treatise Revision Committee: Be it resolved that the officers of this Association, the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, and Clerk, be empower-

ed to instruct and advise the elected person on any and all doctrinal points.

4. Be it resolved that this body grant the request of the State League and Sunday School Conventions to convene at the Youth Camp.

5. After much prayer and careful consideration, we recommend that Rev. Winford Davis be elected Editor-Manager of the Free Will Baptist Gem paper with final contract to be arranged between Bro. Davis and the Executive Board.

6. Since the Gem is at a low ebb financially: Be it resolved that the delegation present at this session advise their local church of this condition and the election of the new Editor-Manager, and solicit funds to help put the work on sound operating basis.

7. Be it resolved that this body intreat all pastors within the bounds of the State to advocate and teach the need of the support of the State Unified Fund to their churches.

8. We recommend that the Executive Board be instructed to consider the need for funds to establish our National Headquarters in Nashville, Tenn.; also that they be empowered to allocate any avaible funds from the State Fund for this purpose.; further, that they have the privilege to reach the \$2,000. goal for Missouri, suggested by the National Association.

9. Inasmuch as Rev. Keithly has donated the tent for the use of the Association during this session: We recommend that he be given a standing vote of thanks for his kindness, and that our Clerk be instructed to write him a letter of appreciation with this item to be included.

10. We recommend that the officers of the Association be given a standing vote of thanks for their efficient and untiring service during this session.

11. We recommend that the Macedonia Church and Community be given a standing vote of thanks for their kind hospitality in the entertainment of this session of the State Association; also, that we declare by a vote of the body, the entertainment to be generous indeed.

CONSTITUTION

1. This Association shall be called the Missouri State Assoc-, iation of Free Will Baptists.

2. The object of this Association shall be for the bringing -32 ---

together of the Free Will Baptists of the State of Missouri in one great annual gathering, so they can get better acquainted with each other, and for the upbuilding of the Free Will Baptist churches of Missouri, and for the salvation of souls.

3. This Association shall be composed of duly elected delegates, elected by the bodies holding membership in this body.

4. The officers of this Association shall be, a Moderator, an Assistant Moderator, and a Secretary-Treasurer, said officers shall be elected annually at the beginning of each session and hold their offices until their successors are elected and qualified; a board of trustees of five members whose terms of office shall be as follows: One for one (1), year, one for two (2) years, one for three (3) years, one for four (4) years and one for five (5) years; and at the experation of these terms, one is to be elected for a term of five years who shall hold office until his successors are elected; and further if any vacancies occur between sessions of the Association, the Board shall fill such vacancy or vacancies until the next Ass'n.; who shall perform the following duties: First, shall be the legal corporation of the Association with the coporate name of the Board of Trustees of the Missouri State Association of Free Will Baptists; to be a Board of Missions and Church Extension, to secure, hold, use and convey money, homes or lands for the propagation of the gospel in connection with the Free Will Baptist denomination. Second, to receive, hold, manage, use, control or convey any property entrusted to the Association for and in accordance with the donor's purpose. Said Board of Trustees shall also compose the Home Mission Board. They may be chosen from ministers, decons or delegates.

5. This Association shall not usurp any authority over the Quarterly Meetings, Yearly Meetings, or Associations that shall be under its supervision, but shall be an advisory body to help them.

6. Seven or more ordained ministers or deacons from two or more bodies, belonging to this Association shall constitute a quorum to transact business.

7. The Clerk or Assistant Clerk, and in their absence, the senior minister in age, shall call the Association to order for business, and call the Moderator or Assistant Moderator to the chair, and if neither Moderator nor Assistant Moderator is present, then the senior minister in age shall act as moderator. On taking his chair, the Moderator shall call for the reading of

the letters from the different bodies composing this Association, and after letters are read he shall seat the delegates. After the delegates are seated, the election of officers shall be in order.

8. Any organized Quarterly Meeting, Yearly Meeting or Association of Free Will Baptists may unite with this body at any regular session, through a letter or delegates by a two-thirds vote of all members present.

9. This Constitution may be added to; amended or changed at any regular session of this body by a two-thirds vote of all members present, after written notice of the contemplated change has been published in the official paper three months previous to the session at which such change is to take place.

By-Laws

1. All business meetings shall be opened by singing, reading a portion of Ged's Word and prayer, and shall be closed with prayer.

2. All business, except routine, shall be brought before the body by committees, but should any committee refuse or fail to present to this body any business given to it by any member of this Association, then such business may be presented to the body by any member, but cannot be discussed, unless by a vote of this body.

3. No one shall speak more than five minutes or more than twice on the same subject without the consent of the Moderator.

'4. Any member' of this body can appeal from the decision of the Moderator' to the Association, and by a majority vote thereon, the objection shall be sustained or rejected.

5. No one shall leave the Association without the consent of the Moderator.

6. Anyone desiring to speak shall arise and say, "Brother Moderator, but shall not speak further until he or she is recognized by the Moderator.

7. The Moderator shall stop all discussion when not carried on in a Christian spirit, or when he thinks it is likly to lead to discord and division.

8. The officers of this body shall submit, at every annual session, a report of the work done for this Association.

9. The Secretary-Treasurer shall keep an accurate record of all business transactions; be responsible for all funds received -34 ----

and disbursed; shall superintend the printing of the Minutes and shall receive an honorium of thirty-five dollars (\$35.00) per year.

10. This Association may correspond by messenger or otherwise with other religious bodies.

`11. All officers of this Association shall be nominated from the floor and elected by standing vote unless otherwise requested or ordered by the body.

12. All resolutions and reports shall bear the names of all the members of the committee who favor them; and if the names be not a majority of all members of such committee, then the Clerk shall not read the resolution or report.

13. All committees shall be appointed by the Moderator, but any appointment may be changed by a two-thirds vote of this body.

14. All business coming before this Association shall be decided by secret ballot when there is any opposition or objection.

15. A majority of all votes shall be final upon all subjects except to amend the Constitution, receive Quarterly Meetings or associations, and the changing of the members of the committees appointed by the Moderator, then it shall require a two-thirds majority.

16. The number of delegates to the State Association shall be one delegate for the association and in addition, one delegate for every fifty resident members or major fraction thereof.

17. The standing delegates to this Association shall be all ordained ministers and their companions, provided the companion is a member in good standing in some Free Will Baptist Church belonging to this State Association; all ordained deacons; and Associational Clerks.

18. These By Laws may be amended or 'changed at any regular session of this Association.

FREE WILL BAPTIST ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. THE BIBLE — The Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God, and are our infallible rule of faith and practice.

2. GOD. — There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver, and Righteous Governor of the universe, and in the Scriptures as the Father, Son, and Holy

Ghost yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are to supremely love, adore, and obey.

3. CHRIST. — Christ is God manifest in the flesh: in His divine nature truly God; in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man. Once crucified, He is now risen and glorified and is our ever present Savior and Lord.

4. THE HOLY SPIRIT. — The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God. He is the Reprover. Comforter, Guide and Sanctifier of men.

St. John 16:7-8; Acts 2.4; Eph. 4:46.

5. THE GOVERNMENT OF GOD. — God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts of grace not otherwise provided for as the highest welfare of man requires.

6. THE SINFULNESS OF MAN. — Man was created innocent but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity, therefore, inherited a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin, and become guilty before God.

7. THE WORK OF CHRIST. — The Son of God by His incarnation, life, sufferings, death and resurrection affected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free and is the grounds of salvation by faith.

8. THE TERMS OF SALVATION. — The conditions of salvation are: 1. Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and the hearty renunciation of it. 2.
