This has been a good year of progress in the program of our camp. We have made considerable improvements on the grounds and buildings. We have also secured a caretaker (temporarily) part time to care for and look after our camp property.

We have a nice supply of kitchen, dining hall and play ground equipment; a number of mattresses; piano; songbooks, and about eighty folding chairs. Also tools, etc.

We have just closed a wonderful Youth session of an enrollment of 61 students besides visitors, help and the faculty. The Camp was crowned with the salvation of nine souls and a number of our boys and girls dedicating their lives to the Lord for special service.

In the Board meeting at the close of the session, it was voted to invite the next setting of the State Associa-

tion to convene at the Youth Camp.

We solicit the help and prayers of the State Association and the people of the State to help make our year's program and plans of improvements a reality to the hearts and hopes of our Youth.

# EXECUTIVE BOARD'S REPORT-

The Missouri State Executive Board met at Sublette, Mo., Sept. 17, 1948 and organized the Board. Rev. F. C. Zinn elected chairman and Rev. Harry Beatty elected Secretary-Treasurer. Motion carried that members of the Board receive the rate of 10 cents per mile one way when called to service. The prospect of organizing a church in Kansas City was discussed. Members present were: Rev's. F. C. Zinn, Harry Beatty, LaVerne Miley, Paul

Williams, and Dea. John Bough. Adjourned.

October 5, 1948. Members F. C. Zinn, Harry Beatty and John Bough with Bro. and Sis. Ottis Martin proxying for absent board members met in Kansas City, Mo., at 43rd and Garfield Streets. Bro. Zinn opened the service with congregational singing, prayer and two special songs. Gospel message by Bro. Beatty. Scripture, II Peter 1:1-6; Text, Isa. 54:2. Following the message, Bro. Zinn gave order of organization and called for members. Eleven responded, received the charge and accepted the Free Will Baptist Church Covenant. Prayer of consecration led by Sis. Dickey and Sis. Lowell Martin. Right hand of fellowship given with a great spirit of unity prevailing. Election of officers: Rev. Alice Dickey, Pastor; Bessie Welch, Secretary-Treasurer; Deacons selected were Bro's. Warren Moffett, Raymond Dickey and Weaver Welch. Each of them stood willingly accepting responsibility. With this splendid organization perfected, the five hundred dollars pledged by Missouri State Association was forwarded to help purchase church property.

December 14, 1948. Three members of the Executive Board (Rev's. F. C. Zinn, Paul Williams, Harry Beatty) and Rev's. Mark Lewis and O. T. Allred substituting for absent members, met at the Mt. Valley Church at the invitation of the delegation there. We met and aided them in the organization of the Mission Association.

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When this organization was perfected, the Mission Association voted unanimously to petition the State Association through the Executive Board. The petition was accepted.

#### REPORT OF GEM PRINTING OFFICE-

In spite of the universal slump in business the past six or eight months, and the usual summer slump always felt at the Gem Office, yet the Gem can report another successful year. In addition to putting out the Gem magazine each month we have done a large amount of other work both religious ad commercial. Most of our job work has been of a religious nature, yet we have done several hundred dollars worth of commercial work. It is the desire of the Gem management to do nothing but religious printing, but when religious sources fail to supply sufficient work to keep the Gem establishment moving we must resort to the business world for work.

We have handled over \$8,000 during the past year. However, operating expenses have been high and it has taken nearly all of this amount to keep moving.

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Item 4. We recommend that steps be taken to promote a three-day teacher's training course here at the camp. (Adopted)

Item 5. We further recommend our Sunday Schools support our Youth Camp through systematic giving. (Adopted)

Motion carried that the promotional worker work with the Executive Committee in arranging the three-day

teacher's training course.

The Business Committee's report read and adopted as a whole.

Item 1. To have our minutes printed with State Associational minutes, paying our proportionate part.

Item 2. That due to the uncertainty of the time of the next Youth Encampment, the time and place of the next State S. S. Convention be designated by the Executive Committee of the State Sunday School Convention.

Item 3. That Rev. LaVerne Miley be appointed as delegate-in-chief to the National Sunday School Convention with power to appoint any other that may be present to the limit of our appointed number.

Motion carried to adopt the proposed change of Article No. 7 of Constitution (recommended by Business Committee in 1948 session). It reads, "This Constitution may be amended by a two-thirds majority vote of the members present at any regular meeting.

Item 4. (Business Committee) That we give a love offering of \$25.00 to Rev. and Mrs. Robert Wilfong to aid

them in their passage to Cuba. (Adopted)

Financial report read and received.

Minutes of present session read and approved.

Motion carried to adjourn.

#### CONSTITUTION

- 1. This Association shall be called the Missouri State Association of Free Will Baptists.
- 2. The object of this Association shall be for the bringing together of the Free Will Baptists of the State of Missouri in one great annual gathering, so they can get better acquainted with each other, and for the upbuilding of the Free Will Baptist Churches of Missouri for the salvation of souls.
- 3. The Association shall be composed of duly elected delegates, elected by the bodies holding membership in this body.
- 4. The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, an Assistant Moderator, and a Secretary-Treasurer, said officers shall be elected annually at the beginning of each session and hold their office until their successors are elected and qualified; a board of trustees of five members whose terms of office shall be as follows: One for one (1) year, one for two (2) years, one for three (3) years, one for four (4) years, and one for five (5) years; and at the expiration of these terms, one is to be elected for a term of five years who shall hold office until his successors are elected; and further, if any vacancies occur between sessions of the Association, the Board shall fill such vacancy or vacancies until the next Association; who shall perform the following duties: First, shall be the legal corporation of the Association with the corporate name of the Board of Trustees of the Missouri State Association of Free Will Baptists: to be a Board of Missions and Church Extension, to secure, hold, use and convey money, homes or lands for the propagation of the gospel in connection with the Free Will Baptist denomination. Second, to receive, hold, manage, use, control, or convey any property entrusted to the Association for and in accordance with the donor's purpose. Said Board of Trustees shall also compose the Home Mission Board. They may be chosen from ministers, deacons, or delegates.
- 5. This Association shall not usurp any authority over the Quarterly Meetings, or Associations that shall be under its supervision, but shall be an advisory body to help them.

6. Seven or more ordained ministers or deacons from two or more bodies, belonging to this Association shall

constitute a quorum to transact business.

7. The Clerk or Assistant Clerk, and in their absence, the senior minister in age, shall call the Association to order for business, and call the Moderator or Assistant Moderator to the chair, and if neither Moderator nor Assistant Moderator is present, then the senior minister in age shall act as Moderator. On taking his chair, the Moderator shall call for the reading of the letters from the different bodies composing this Association, and after letters are read he shall seat the delegates. After the delegates are seated, the election of officers shall be in order.

8. Any organized Quarterly Meeting, Yearly Meeting or Association of Free Will Baptists may unite with this body at any regular session, through a letter or delegates

by a two-thirds vote of all members persent.

9. This Constitution may be added to amended or changed at any regular session of this body by a two-thirds vote of all members present, after written notice of the contemplated change has been published in the official paper three months previous to the session at which such change is to take place.

#### BY-LAWS

1. All business meetings shall be opened by singing, reading a portion of God's Word and prayer, and shall

be closed with prayer.

2. All business, except routine, shall be brought before the body by committees, but should any committee refuse or fail to present to this body any business given to it by any member of this Association, then such business may be presented to the body by any member, but cannot be discussed unless by a vote of this body.

3. No one shall speak more than five minutes or more than twice on the same subject without the consent of

the Moderator.

4. Any member of this body can appeal from the decision of the Moderator to the Association, and by a majority vote thereon, the objection shall be sustained or rejected.

5. No one shall leave the Association without the

consent of the Moderator.

6. Anyone desiring to speak shall arise and say, "Brother Moderator," but shall not speak further until

carried on in a Christian spirit, or when he thinks it is likely to lead to discord and division.

- 7. The Moderator shall stop all discussion when not he or she is recognized by the Moderator.
- 8. The officers of this body shall submit, at every annual session, a report of the work done for this Association
- 9. The Secretary-Treasurer shall keep an accurate record of all business transactions; be responsible for all funds received and disbursed; shall superintend the printing of the Minutes and shall receive an honorarium of thirty-five dollars (\$35.00) per year.
- 10. This Association may correspond by messenger or otherwise with other religious bodies.
- 11. All officers of this Association shall be nominated from the floor and elected by standing vote unless otherwise requested or ordered by the body.
- 12. All resolutions and reports shall bear the names of all the members of the committee who favor them; and if the names be not a majority of all members of such committee, then the Clerk shall not read the resolution or report.
- 13. All committees shall be appointed by the Moderator, but any appointment may be changed by a twothirds vote of this body.

14. All business coming before this Association shall be decided by secret ballot when there is any opposition or objection.

15. A majority of all votes shall be final upon all subjects except to amend the Constitution, receive Quarterly Meetings or Associations, and the changing of the members of the committees appointed by the Moderator, then it shall require a two-thirds majority.

16. The number of delegates to the State Association shall be one delegate for the Association and in addition, one delegate for every fifty resident members or major

fraction thereof.

17. The standing delegates to this Association shall be all ordained ministers and their companions, provided the companion is a member in good standing in some Free Will Baptist Church belonging to this State Association; all ordained deacons; and Associational Clerks.

18. These By-Laws may be amended or changed at

any regular session of this Association.

#### ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. THE BIBLE—The Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God, and are our infallible rule of faith and practice. II Timothy 3:16.
- 2. GOD—There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver, and Righteous Governor of the universe; and in the Scriptures as Father, Son, and Holy Ghost, yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore, and obey. I Cor. 8:6; Matt. 28:19.
- 3. CHRIST—Christ is God manifest in the flesh; in His divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified, He is now risen and glorified, and is our ever present Saviour and Lord. St. John 1:1-12.
- 4. THE HOLY SPIRIT—The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God. St. John 16:7, 8; Acts 2:4; Eph. 4:4-6.
- 5. THE GOVERNMENT OF GOD—God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts, not otherwise provided for, as the highest welfare of men require. Psalms 22:28; 97:2.
- 6. THE SINFULNESS OF MAN—Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity, therefore, inherit a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability sin, and become guilty before God. Gen. 2:17; 3:19.
- 7. THE WORK OF CHRIST—The Son of God by His incarnation, life, sufferings, death and resurrection effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free and is the ground of salvation by faith: I John 2:2.
- 8. THE TERMS OF SALVATION—The conditions of salvation are: 1. Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of it. 2. Faith or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Saviour and Lord with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the dominion of sin and becomes a child of God. 3. Continuance in faith and obedience until death. II Cor. 7:10; Pro. 28:13.

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- 9. ELECTION—God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ men become His elect. I Tim. 2:4.
- 10. FREEDOM OF THE WILL—The human will is free and self-controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit, or to resist them and perish. Joshua 24:15.
- 11. SALVATION FREE—God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely. Rev. 22:17.
  - 12. PERSEVERANCE—All believers in Christ, who through grace persevere in holiness to the end of life, have promise of eternal salvation. St. John 15:6; II Peter 2:20-22.
  - 13. GOSPEL ORDINANCES—Baptism, or the immersion of believers in water, and the Lord's Supper, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel; Feet Washing, an ordinance teaching humility of universal obligation, and to be ministered to all true believers. Mark 16:15; II Cor. 4:5; St. John 13:14.
  - 14. TITHING—God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament; Jesus Christ indorsed it in the Gospel (Matt. 23:23), and the apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store as God hath prospered him" (I Cor. 16:2).
  - 15. THE CHRISTIAN SABBATH—The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employments and amusements, for rest, worship, holy works and activities, and for personal communion with God. Gen. 2:3; Exod. 20:8-11.
  - 16. RESURRECTION, JUDGMENT AND FINAL RETRIBUTION—The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation; then the wicked will "go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life." John 5:29; Matt. 52:46.

#### FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise by His grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, faith, and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ."

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of Missions, the success of Sunday Schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the World. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.
