To the Missouri State Association:

We are glad to be able to make this report to you at the close of another year's work in publishing the Free Will Baptist Gem and supplying the other services to which you are now accustomed. We have worked hard at these services. However, the Lord has been very good and supplied our physical needs for the necessary labor. We trust our labor has been fruitful and worthwhile. Herewith is a brief analysis of the financial aspect of the year's operation.

By way of analysis, total sales in Missouri amounted to \$1,768.02; while sales out of state were \$1,286.95, for a total sales of 3.054.97. This means that for approximately \$2.17 in service rendered, the present scope of operation must be further subsidized one dollar. This is not out of line in comparison to many church enterprises, but with a more suitable arrangement could possibly be scaled down appreciably.

Financial Report of State Home Mission Board: September 10, 1953 to August 15, 1954

Bus ness Committee:

We, your Business Committee, beg to make the following recommendations:

1. That the duties of the Promotional Secretary be delegated to the Moderator of each local association (and in event he cannot perform this duty he secure someone)

and that our people be well informed from time to time at out our denominational work with special emphasis being put on our cooperative plan. This work to be the responsibility of each association.

at the Missouri State Superannuation Board make a \$400.00 contribution to the National Superannuation Board to be used exclusively for superannuation purposes.

- 3. That bumper strip be supplied advertising our 1955 session of the Missouri State Association and that Rev. C. B. Dees be responsible for the printing and distributing of same.
- 4. That Section 13 of the By-Laws be changed to read: All committees shall be appointed by the moderator, with the ass stance of a committee on committees, which shall be appointed by the moderator.
- 5. That the Sunday School and League Boards be consolidated into one board of three members.
- 6. That all our preachers, churches and members of our Missouri State Association refuse to have any affiliation with the Missouri Council of Churches or the National Council of Churches or use their new revised Bible.
- 7. That Rev. Willard Day be given an appropriate letter of recommendation as an Evangelist and Bible teacher, said letter to be prepared by the associational clerk.
- 8. (a) We, the members of the Business Committee and the Publication Committee, recommend that we continue the publication of the Gem, and that the present deficit of \$200.00 be paid by the General Fund and (b) that hereafter it be financed with its regular allocation of $7\frac{1}{2}\%$ of the cooperative fund and special gifts, any deficit embarassing to the operation be cared for by securing a loan on the property or equipment.
- 9. That the allocation of the Missouri State Cooperative Fund be as follows:

70% to the National Cooperative Fund

12% to State General Fund

10% to State Home Mission Fund

71/2% to Free Will Baptist Gem

1/2% to State Superannuation Fund

10. That a standing vote of thanks be given the Jones Chapel Church and community, the Indian Creek Association and Dr. Cardwell of Stella, Missouri for their fine

CONSTITUTION

- 1. This Association shall be called the Missouri State Association of Free Will Baptists.
- 2. The object of this Association shall be for the bringing together of the Free Will Baptists of the the State of Missouri in one great annual gathering, so they can get better acquainted with each other, and for the upbuilding of the Free Will Baptist Churches of Missouri for the salvation of souls.
- 3. The Association shall be composed of duly elected delegates, elected by the bodies holding membership in this body.
- 4. The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, an Assistant Moderator, and a Secretary-Treasurer, said officers shall be elected annually at the beginning of each session and hold their office until their successors are elected and qualified; a board of trustees of five members whose terms of office shall be as follows: One for one (1) year, one for two (2) years, one for three (3) years, one for four (4) years, and one for five (5) years; and at the expiration of these terms, one is to be elected for a term of five years who shall hold office until his successors are elected; and further, if any vacancy occur between sessions of the Association, the Board shall fill such vacancy or vacancies until the next Association; who shall perform the following duties: First, shall be the legal corporation of the Association with the corporate name of the Board of Trustees of the Missouri State Association of Free Will Baptists; to be a board of Missions and Church Extension, to secure, hold, use and convey money, homes or lands for the propogation of the gospel in connection with the Free Will Baptist denomination. Second, to receive, hold, manage, use, control, or convey any property entrusted to the Association for and in accordance with the donor's purpose. Said Board of Trustees shall also compose the Home Mission Board. They may be chosen from ministers, deacons, or delegates.
- 5. This Association shall not usurp any authority over the Quarterly Meetings, or Associations that shall be under its supervision, but shall be an advisory body to help them.
- 6. Seven or more ordained ministers or deacons from two or more bodies, belonging to this Association shall constitute a quorum to transact business.

- 7. The Clerk or Assistant Clerk, and in their absence, the senior minister in age, shall call the Association to order for business, and call the Moderator or Assistant Moderator to the chair, and if neither Moderator nor Assistant Moderator is present, then the senior minister in age shall act as Moderator. On taking his chair, the Moderator shall call for the reading of the letters from the different bodies composing this Association, and after letters are read he shall seat the delegates. After the delegates are seated, the election of officers shall be in order.
- 8. Any organized Quarterly Meeting, Yearly Meeting or Association of Free Will Baptists may unite with this body at any regular session, through a letter or delegates by a two-thirds vote of all members present.
- 9. This Constitution may be added to, amended or changed at any regular session of this body by a two-thirds vote of all members present, after written notice of the contemplated change has been published in the official paper three months previous to the session at which such change is to take place.

BY-LAWS

- 1. All business meetings shall be opened by singing, reading a portion of God's Word and prayer, and shall be closed with prayer.
- 2. All business, except routine, shall be brought before the body by committees, but should any committee refuse or fail to present to this body any business given to it by any member of this Association, then such business may be presented to the body by any member, but cannot be discussed unless by a vote of this body.
- 3. No one shall speak more than five minutes or more than twice on the same subject without the consent of the Moderator.
- 4. Any member of this body can appeal from the decision of the Moderator to the Association, and by a majority vote thereon, the objection shall be sustained or rejected.
- 5. No one shall leave the Association without the consent of the Moderator.
- 6. Anyone desiring to speak shall arise and say, "Brother Moderator," but shall speak no further until he or she is recognized by the Moderator.
 - 7. The Moderator shall stop all discussion when not

carried on in a Christian spirit, or when he thinks it is likely to lead to discord and division.

- 8. The officers of this body shall submit, at every annual session, a report of the work done for this Association.
- 9. The Secretary-Treasurer shall keep an accurate record of all business transactions; be responsible for all funds received and disbursed; shall superintend the printing of the Minutes and shall receive an honorarium of one hundred twenty (120.00) dollars per year.
- 10. This Association may correspond by messenger or otherwise with other religious bodies.
- 11. All officers of this Association shall be nominated from the floor and elected by standing vote unless otherwise requested or ordered by the body.
- 12. All resolutions and reports shall bear the names of all the members of the committee who favor them; and if the names be not a majority of all members of such committee, then the Clerk shall not read the resolution or report.

13. All committees shall be appointed by the Moderator, with the assistance of a committee on committees, which shall be appointed by the moderator.

14. All business coming before this Association shall be decided by secret ballot when there is any opposition

or objection.

15. A majority of all votes shall be final upon all subjects except to amend the Constitution, receive Quarterly Meetings or Associations, and the changing of the members of the committees appointed by the Moderator, then it shall require a two-thirds majority.

16. The number of delegates to the State Association shall be one delegate for the Association and in addition, one delegate for every fifty resident members or major

fraction thereof.

17. The standing delegates to this Association shall be all ordained ministers and their companions, provided the companion is a member in good standing in some Free Will Baptist Church belonging to this State Association; all ordained deacons; and Associational Clerks.

18. The sessions of this Association shall convene on Tuesday night following the Third Sunday in August

each year.

19. These By-Laws may be amended or changed at any regular session of this Association.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. The Bible. The Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God, and are our infallable rule of faith and practice. II Timothy 3:16.
- 2. God. There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver, and Righteous Governor of the universe; and in the Scriptures as Father, Son, and Holy Ghost, yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore, and obey. I Cor. 8:6; Matt. 28:19.
- 3. Christ. Christ is God manifest in the flesh; in His divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified, He is now risen and glorified, and is our ever present Saviour and Lord. John 1:1-12.
- 4. The Holy Spirit. The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God. John 16:7,8; Acts 2:4; Eph. 4:4-6.
- 5. The Government of God. God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts, not otherwise provided for, as the highest welfare of men requires. Psalms 22:28; 97:2.
- 6. The Sinfulness of Man. Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity, therefore, inherit a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability sin, and become guilty before God. Gen. 2:17;3:19.
- 7. The Work of Christ. The Son of God by His incarnation, life, suffering, death and resurrection effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free and is the ground of salvation by faith. I John 2:2.
- 8. The Terms of Salvation. The conditions of salvation are: 1. Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of it. 2. Faith or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Saviour and Lord with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the dominion of sin and becomes a child of God. 3. Continuance in faith and obedience until death. II Cor. 7:10; Pro. 28:13.

- 9. Election. God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ men become His elect. I Tim. 2:4.
- 10. Freedom of the Will. The human will is free and self-controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit, or to resist them and perish. Joshua 24:15.
- 11. Salvation Free. God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely. Rev. 22:17.
- 12. Perseverance. All believers in Christ, who through grace persevere in holiness to the end of life, have promise of eternal salvation. John 15:6; II Peter 2:20-22.
- 13. Gospel Ordinances. Baptism, or the immersion of believers in water, and the Lord's Supper are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel; Feet Washing, an ordinance teaching humility, of universal obligation, and to be ministered to all true believers. Mark 16:15; II Cor. 4:5; John 13:14.
- 14. Tithing. God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament; Jesus Christ indorsed it in the Gospel (Matt. 23:23), and the Apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store as God hath prospered him." (I Cor. 16:2).
- 15. The Christian Sabbath. The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employment and amusements, for rest, worship, holy works and activities, and for personal communion with God. Gen. 2:3; Exod. 20:8-11.
- 16. Resurrection, Judgment and Final Retribution. The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation; then the wicked will "go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life." John 5:29; Matt. 25:46.

CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise by His grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, faith, and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ."

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences; public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of Missions, the success of Sunday schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the World. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.
