2. We recommend since the Gem is no longer in operation that the Association have the paper farmed out to the General Baptist Press at Poplar Bluff, Missouri. We also recommend that since the editor has resigned that we employ Mrs. Eunice Edwards as editor of the Free Will Baptist Gem at a salary of \$75.00 per month.

3. Motion sustained to recommend to the body that we elect Mrs. Eunice Edwards as Secretary-Treasurer. This is done in the light of the fact that we are recommending her for editor of the Free Will Baptist Gem.

4. Motion sustained to transfer the Wanda Edwards funds from the State treasury to the National Foreign Mission Board marked for her account.

5. The motion was sustained for this body to go on record as authorizing the Executive Board to dispose of the press property according to the best interest of our Association. The money received above the mortgage be used as follows: 50%as a home mission loan fund and 50% to Gem fund.

6. Motion sustained to send a word of greeting to Rev. T. C. Ferguson, Heather, Missouri.

7. Motion sustained to propose a constitution change to wit:

Article 4, sentence 1 (which reads) . . . "Said officers shall be elected at the beginning\* of each session and hold their office until their successors are elected and qualified;"

\*To read at the end.

8. We recommend that each church tithe their income to the State Co-operative Fund which is allocated as follows:

70% to National Cooperative Fund .

12% to State General Fund

10% to State Home Mission Fund

7½% to Free Will Baptist Gem .

1/2% to State Superannuated Fund

9. That a standing vote of thanks be given to Southeast Missouri Yearly Association and churches of the Lead Belt area and to everyone who has had a part in so wonderfully entertaining this State Meeting. A special word of thanks to Bro. William Cruse who has served as head cook and also to the ladies who have assisted him.

### LOCATION COMMITTEE
