MINUTES OF THE 50TH ANNUAL SESSION OF THE MISSOURI STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTIST When Convened with the First Free Will Baptist Church of Kirksville, Missouri August, 1963

TUESDAY NIGHT, 7:30 P.M. - AUGUST 20, 1963

Rev. E. Hellard, pastor of the First Free Will Baptist Church of Farmington, led the congregation in singing, "Tis So Sweet To Trust In Jesus" and "Blessed Assurance". Rev. O. T. Allred, the pastor of the Granby Free Will Baptist Church led the Association in prayer. The congregation then sang, "He's A Wonderful Saviour To Me". The clerk of the Association, Rev. Bud Hill, called the 50th session of the Missouri State Association to order by reading from the 133rd Division of Psalms. Rev. Lester Jones, pastor of the Host Church, extended greetings from the City of Kirksville and the Church. Rev. Woodrow Matthews, pastor of the Beacon Free Will Baptist Church of Kansas City gave the response. The Moderator, Rev. O. T. Allred, then spoke a few words concerning this year's Association. The Moderator then appointed the Committee on Committees. This committee is: Rev. Glen Rehkop, Rev. W. H. Bostic, Rev. J. E. Raper, Rev. H. E. Hill and Rev. Cletus Nichols.

The speaker of the evening, Rev. William J. Hill, pastor of the Hazel Park Free Will Baptist Church, Hazel Park, Michigan, was introduced. Rev. Hill used as his scripture reading, Isaiah 1:2-5b and Isaiah 6, entire chapter. He spoke on these four points: Confession of Sin, Cleansing of Sin, Compassion for the Lost and Commission to go to the Lost. He stressed the matter of our duty to God and what kind of person that we are. He stated what the three persons that are in each of us. The

one I think I am; the one others think I am; and the one that $\operatorname{\mathsf{God}}$ knows that I am.

The benediction of the service is by Rev. John Mark Vandivort of the National Home Mission Department.

WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 21, 1963 - 9:00 A.M.

The convention began the activities of the morning by the congregation singing, "I Am Thine O Lord" and "Love Lifted Me" with Rev. C. H. Burton, pastor of the First Free Will Baptist Church of Fredericktown, leading and Rev. James McAllister at the piano. Bro. Edwin Wade, a member of the First Free Will Baptist Church of Mt. Grove, brought to us a devotional from Psalms 77:28. He pointed out to each of us that we as Christians need to draw near to God and if we do, we can see the plight of those round about us. Then because of this we will be willing to take them the message of salvation. Bro. Wade led the congregation in prayer at the close of his devotion.

Report of the General Board concerning the letters from the various Associations. These letters were examined and found to be in order.

Motion made, seconded, and carried that the letters be accepted and the delegates from the Associations be received and seated.

The telegram from Rev. Homer E. Willis, Promotional Secretary of the National Home Mission Department, was read. It stated, "Greetings to your State Association. Regret I cannot attend. My prayers are with you." Homer E. Willis.

Motion made, seconded and carried that the reading of the By-Laws of the State Association be omitted.

The service was then turned over to Rev. John Mark Vandivort, the Field Director of our National Home Mission Department, who spoke concerning our work as a whole. He used as his scripture Acts 1:8. He said that we as Free Will Baptist should be witnesses of the precious Gospel of Our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ. He then proceeded to tell of the work in Hawaii and the plan for buying land. He related to us also concerning the various other fields of labor, such as, Washington D.C., Denver and Alaska. He challenged us with an article from the book, "Triumph of Missions In The Local Church" which was an example of what our churches could do if we got under the burden of missions.

The report of the Committee on Committees was read.

Motion made, seconded and carried that we receive the letter from the South East Missouri Association and seat the delegates.

Motion made, seconded and carried that we adjourn until the call of the Chair.

WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 21, 1963 - 7:30 P.M.

The congregation was led in singing by Rev. C. H. Burton and Sis. Gene Rogers at the piano, singing, "I Am Thine O Lord". Rev. R. B. Spurgeon, pastor of the Trinity Free Will Baptist Church in Bridgeton,

Missouri, led in prayer. The congregation then sang "Leaning On The Everlasting Arm" and "When The Roll Is Called Up Yonder".

Bro. Gordan Beatty than sang a solo, "Let Me Be Worthy".

The announcements were then made by the Moderator, Rev. O. T. All-red.

Rev. James McAllister, pastor of the Central Free Will Baptist Church of Kansas City, Missouri, brought the devotional thought from Acts 2:42-47; Romans 12:4-5 and I Corinthians 10:17. He stated that the Free Will Baptists need to have a greater unified front. United in three ways: First, in Principle; secondly, in Financial Matters and thirdly, in Fundamental Doctrines of the Bible.

The service was turned over to the speaker of the evening, Rev. A. L. McFarland, pastor of the Southside Free Will Baptist Church of St. Louis, Missouri. He used as his scripture Jeremiah 30:23-24 and Jeremiah 31:1-7. His text was Jeremiah 31:7, "O Lord, save thy people." He spoke concerning things hindering the church. These are as follows: Worldly conformity, spiritual apathy, sordid selfishness, sectarian divisions, and becoming confused in what they believe. He said that we need to have an earnest longing for revival.

At the conclusion of the message an invitation was given. Invitational song, "I Can Hear My Saviour Calling". Two fine young ministers responded to the invitation for greater consecration.

The two young men at the end of an altar prayer gave their personal

testimonv.

The service was dismissed in prayer by Rev. O. T. Dixon, pastor of Grant Avenue Free Will Baptist Church in Springfield, Missouri.

THURSDAY, AUGUST 22, 1963 - 9:00 A.M.

The service was opened with the singing of the hymn, "Love Lifted Me" led by Rev. C. H. Burton. The Moderator, Rev. O. T. Allred, presided over the meeting and then turned the services over to Rev. Robert Wilfong, pastor of the Leadington Free Will Baptist Church, Leadington, Missouri, who led us in our devotional thought. He spoke from the book of Kings. He said that we need to be men and live for the Lord Jesus Christ and be the witness that we should. We need to have a greater burden for the lost. He then led in prayer.

The Moderator then called for corresponding messengers. The letter from the National Foreign Mission Department was read. (See Reports)

Motion made, seconded and carried that acknowledgement be made of this letter and greetings from both Boards, Foreign and Home.

There was no report from the committee concerning the changing of the dates of the State Association, therefore the committee was dissolved.

Report of the Statistician was read.

Motion made, seconded and carried that we receive this report. (See Reports)

The complete report of the General Board was read. (See Reports)

Motion made, seconded and carried that we receive this report and to
consider the report item by item.

Item No. 1 - Motion made, seconded and carried to amend by adding, "in 1964". Item No. 1 then was adopted.

Item No. 2 - Motion made, seconded and carried to adopt.

Due to the fact that the report of the allocations from the General Board were not ready, time was given to Rev. H. Harrison of the National Sunday School Department to present us with information concerning the Department.

Item No. 3 - Motion made, seconded and carried to adopt. Rev. R. B. Spurgeon was asked to give a brief explanation of said budget.

Time was given to Rev. Carl Johnson, Missionary appointee to Alaska, to speak to us concerning his work.

Report of the Youth Camp Board. (See Reports)

Motion made, seconded and carried to adopt report.

Report of the State Treasurer and State Promotional Secretary called for. Rev. Harry Beatty gave a report that he was not ready. The report was put off until afternoon session.

The Publication's Committee report was read. (See Reports)
Motion made, seconded and carried to adopt the report as read.

Motion made, second and carried to adjourn until the call of the Chair at 1:30 P.M. in the afternoon.

Dismissed in prayer by Rev. Harry Asher, pastor of the Overland Free Will Baptist Church of Overland, Missouri.

THURSDAY, AUGUST 22, 1963 - 11:00 A.M.

Worship service was opened with the congregation standing and singing, "O How I Love Jesus" led by Rev. C. H. Burton and Rev. Jim McAllister at the piano. Rev. Max Courtney, pastor of the Fourth Free Will Baptist Church of St. Louis, Missouri, led in prayer. The congregation, led by Rev. Burton then sang, "Amazing Grace". Special song was then rendered by Sis. White who sang, "What A Day That Will Be" and then another special number was given by Rev. A. L. McFarland, "God Leads Us Along".

Rev. Gene Rogers, pastor of the First Free Will Baptist Church of Mt. Grove, Missouri, was the morning speaker and he used as his scripture I Chronicles 12:32. He spoke to us about some of the facts concerning the second coming of Jesus. He asked if we are really looking and expecting it. People are saying by their actions that Jesus is not coming and that the Gospel has failed. He also said that many are running the Christian race without a vital, real relationship with Christ. The report of the Mission Committee was read. (See Reports)

Motion made, seconded and carried that we adopt the report.

Report of the Placement Committee called for and read. (See Reports)
Motion made, seconded and carried that we adopt the report.

The Resolution Committee's report was read. (See Reports)

Motion made, seconded and carried to receive the report for consideration and that we dispose of said report item by item.

The congregation is then led in song by Rev. O. T. Dixon. The song used is "When The Roll Is Called Up Yonder."

Item No. 10 - Motion made and seconded that we adopt this time and thank the committee for their fine work on this report. Adopted.

The resignation of Rev. Dale Jones from the Superannuation Board was read. Motion made, seconded and carried that we accept the resignation.

Rev. O. T. Dixon gave a talk concerning the convening of next year's Session.

The report of the State Home Mission Board was given. Motion made, seconded and carried that we receive the report for consideration. The request to incorporate was made by this Board, with the report. The reason why this was needed was asked and answered. Motion made, seconded and carried that their request be granted.

The Sunday School and League Board gave a report concerning their work. This was given by Rev. A. L. McFarland. An urge for each Church to respond with an annual report to this Board was made. Motion made, seconded and carried to accept report. (See Reports)

An oral report was given by Rev. Bud Hill, Editor, about the State paper, "The Free Will Baptist Gem." The churches of the state were urged

to go on the Church Family Plan and the single issue price was raised from one dollar and twenty-five cents to one dollar and fifty cents beginning October, 1963. Be sure to have material in the "Gem" office in St. Louis by the 24th of each month. Bro. Hill then announced that Sis. Peggy Dayis would be the Woman's Auxiliary Editor for the coming year.

Motion made, seconded and carried to recive the oral report.

Two questions were asked concerning the matter of the subscription rate of the "Gem". The first was, How many families are required for a church to come under the heading of the Church Family Plan? The answer was that there is no certain number. However there must be more than one.

Second question, Why the raise in the single subscription? The price was lowered because of a special during our fifty year of State Associa-

tion. This was lowered for one year.

A report was given by Rev. O. T. Dixon concerning a study commission

on the program arrangement of the State Association.

Motion made, seconded and carried to elect a five man study commission to work with the Executive Board of the Woman's Auxiliary and the Sunday School and League Board concerning the program arrangement of the State Association.

Nominations were called for. Those nominated were: Rev. James E. Barker, Sis. Lucille Beatty, Rev. A. L. McFarland, declined, State Association Moderator, Rev. R. B. Spurgeon, declined, Rev. C. Nichols, declined, Rev. Frank Giunta and Sis. Vivian Burton. Since there were only five names left, the motion was made, seconded and carried that these five be elected.

Report of the Nominating Committee was read. (See Reports)

Motion made, seconded and carried to receive the report and to dispose of the items one by one. All the officers recommended by this committee were elected as read.

Motion made, seconded and carried to retain the same Statistician for

the coming year. This is Sis. Leona Thompson.

The Delegates to the National Association that is to meet in Kansas City, Missouri in July of 1964 were elected. They are: Margret Dixon, Lucille Beatty, Gene Williams, Hubert Harrell and John Filkins.

Motion made, seconded and carried that we welcome into our state the following new ministers: Rev. E. Hellard, pastor of the First Free Will Baptist Church of Farmington, Rev. Gene Rogers, pastor of the First Free Will Baptist Church of Mt. Grove, Rev. Leland Horton, pastor of the First Free Will Baptist Church of Kirksville and Rev. Gene Norris, pastor of the First Free Will Baptist Church of Flat River.

Motion made, seconded and carried to omit the reading of the minutes.

Motion made, seconded and carried to adjourn.

Prayer of benediction was led by Rev. O. T. Dixon.

Greetings from the Foreign Missions Department of the National Association of Free Will Baptists. Through the years, the Free Will Baptists of Missouri have shared with us in our Foreign Missionary ministry. You have given to us your sons, daughters, prayers and money.

There is the staggering number of more than a billion souls who have not heard the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ. The unreached fields are a challenge and demands the courage and consecration of men and women to make Christ known to these multitudes.

There have been twelve new missionaries appointed to foreign service

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE SECRETARY

"Our God, our help in ages past, Our hope for years to come, Be thou our guide while life shall last, and our eternal home."

With rejoicing and thanksgiving to God, we bring this report to the Fiftieth session of our Missouri State Association.

PROMOTION: Again this year, many miles have been traveled in the interest of Missouri denominational work. In addition to preaching and promoting the work within sixty various churches, I also attended eleven district quarterly meetings, six yearly meetings, the Missouri State Association and the National Association of Free Will Baptists. I also operated our Free Will Baptist Book Store, and set up book stands at these various district meetings attended.

I worked with the Missouri Home Mission Board and co-operated with them in the establishment of three new church organizations. I helped in three other church dedication, services, and held two revivals.

Of the one hundred and forty churches affiliated with the Missouri State Association, approximately 45%, or sixty three churches, as listed in the annual report submitted to this session, participated in the Missouri Cooperative Plan of giving, with contributions given through the Missouri State Headquarters. Approximately 13 1/2%, or nineteen churches, gave through the Missouri Co-operative Plan for the first time this year. The total co-operative receipts were about the same as last year, however, these participating churches set a good pattern for the remainder of our churches to follow.

CONSTITUTION

- This Association shall be called the Missouri State Association of Free Will Baptists.
- The object of this Association shall be for the bringing together of the Free Will Baptists of the State of Missouri in one great annual gathering, so they can get better acquainted with each other, and for the upholding of the Free Will Baptist Churches of Missouri and for the salvation of souls.
- 3. The Association shall be composed of duly elected delegates elected by the bodies holding membership in this body.

4. Section 1. OFFICERS:

The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Secretary and Treasurer, who shall be elected annually at the close of each session and hold their office until their successors are elected.

Section 2. BOARDS:

- A. All standing boards shall be composed of five members, exclusive of the General Board. Standing Boards include the Home Missions Board, The Sunday School and League Board, The Youth Camp Board, The Superannuation Board and the General Board.
- B. The personnel of each of the foregoing, exclusive of the General Board shall be elected as follows: The first named for a term of one year, the second for a term of two years, the third for a term of three years, the fourth for a term of four years, and the fifth for a term of five years.
- C. The personnel of the General Board shall be composed of the general officers of the State Association and the Chairman of all standing boards. They shall be elected by the State body, one member from each affiliated association whose term of office shall be two years and so constituted that the expiration date of the term of office of half of these shall expire one year and the other half the following year. This shall be determined by alphabetical order.
- D. The General Board shall have power to act in behalf of, and for the State Association from one regular session to another, and shall have power to elect such officers as may be necessary to carry out the plans and undertakings of the State Association.
- E. The General Board shall have power to fill irregular vacancies that may occur in its own body and shall also have power to fill any irregular vacancies that may occur in any department of work between sessions of the State Association. It shall be the duty of this

Board to make written reports of all its works to each annual session of the Association.

- F. An Executive Committee consisting of seven members shall be elected by the General Board from among it's membership, whose duty it shall be to act on all matters coming within the scope of the work of the Board when said General Board is not in session. It shall also plan and execute the program for the Missouri State Association.
- gram and superivse its operation in their respective fields, and to receive, hold, manage, use or convey any funds and property entrusted to said Boards.

 Each standing board shall prepare a budget of its proposed financial expenditures at the beginning of each Associational year (August 1 July 31) and present the same for approval by the State Association.

G. The duties of the various standing boards shall be to plan a pro-

- H. No person shall fill more than one office at the same time except as he may become a member of the General Board by virtue of his office. No person shall serve on more than one standing board at the same time, except as he may become a member of the General Board by virtue of being Chairman of the Board of which he is an elected member.
- 5. This Association shall not usurp any authority over the Quarterly Meetings, or Association that shall be under its supervision, but shall be an advisory body to help them.
- 6. Seven or more ordained ministers or deacons from two or more bodies, belonging to this Association shall constitute a quorum to transact business.
- 7. The Clerk or Assistant Clerk, and in their absence the senior minister in age, shall call the Association to order for business, and call the Moderator or Assistant Moderator to the chair, and if neither Moderator or Assistant Moderator is present, then the senior minister in age shall act as Moderator. On taking his chair, the Moderator shall call for the reading of the letters from the different bodies composing this Association, and after the letters are read he shall seat the delegates.
- 8. Any organized Quarterly Meeting, Yearly Meeting or Association of Free Will Baptists may unite with this body at any regular session, through a letter or delegates by a two-thirds vote of all members present.
- 9. This Constitution may be amended at any regular body by a twothirds majority vote of all the members present, after the proposed amendment has laid on the table for one day.

- 1. This Association shall be called the Missouri State Association of Free Will Baptists.
- \ 2. The object of this Association shall be for the bringing together of the Free Will Baptists of the State of Missouri in one annual gathering, that we may become better acquainted with one another, the upholding of the Free Will Baptist Churches of Missouri, and a world wide outreach for souls.
- 3. The Association shall be composed of the members of the various local affiliated Associations.
- V4. The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator and Clerk, who shall be elected annually at the close of each session and hold their office until their successors are elected.
- V 5. All standing boards shall be composed of five members, exclusive of the General Board. Standing Boards include the Home Missions Board, the Sunday School and League Board, the Youth Camp Board, the Superannuation Board and the General Board.
- V 6. The personnel of each of the foregoing, exclusive of the General Board, shall be elected as follows: The first named for a term of one year, the second for a term of two years, the third for a term of three years, the fourth for a term of four years, and the fifth for a term of five years, and thereafter each shall be elected for a term of five years.
- **Y** 7. The personnel of the General Board shall be composed of the officers of the State Association; the chairman of all standing Boards and one member from each affiliated Association to be elected by the State Body whose term of office shall be two years and so constituted that the expiration date of the term of office of half of these, shall expire one year and the other half the following year. This shall be determined by alphabetical order of the name of the affiliated Association.
- V 8. The General Board shall have power to act in behalf of, and for the State Association from one regular session to another, and shall have power to elect such officers as may be necessary to carry out the plans and undertakings of the State Association. The General Board shall have the right to employ a Promotional Secretary who shall serve as Treasurer of the Association and be responsible for handling all monies of the Association. He shall be bonded for an amount in excess of the monies he shall be handling. In addition, the Promotional Secretary shall manage the Association's Book Store and in general promote the work of the Association and the Cause of Christ. He shall make an annual financial report to the Association.
- 9. The General Board shall have power to fill irregular vacancies that may occur in its own body and shall also have power to fill any irregular

vacancies that may occur in any department of work between sessions of the State Association. It shall be the duty of this Board to make written reports of all its works to each annual session of the Association.

- v 10. An Executive Committee consisting of seven members shall be elected by the General Board from among its membership, whose duty it shall be to act on all matters coming within the scope of the work of the Board when said Board is not in session. It shall also plan and execute the program for the Missouri State Association.
- 11. The duties of the various standing boards shall be to plan a program and supervise its operation in their respective fields, and to receive, hold, manage, use or convey any funds and property entrusted to said Boards.

Each standing board shall prepare a budget of its proposed financial expenditures at the beginning of each Associational year (August 1 - July 31) and present the same for approval by the State Association.

- √ 12. No person shall fill more than one office at the same time except as he may become a member of the General Board by virtue of his office. No person shall serve on more than one standing board at the same time, except as he may become a member of the General Board by virtue of being Chairman of the Board of which he is an elected member.
- V 13. The State Association shall not usurp any authority over the Quarterly Meetings, or Associations that shall be under its supervision, but shall be an advisory body to help them.
- V14. Seven or more ordained ministers or deacons from two or more affiliated Associations belonging to the State Association, shall constitute a quorum to transact business.
- 15. The Clerk or Assistant Clerk, and in their absence the senior minister in age, shall call the Association to order for business, and call the Moderator or Assistant Moderator to the chair, and if neither Moderator nor Assistant Moderator is present, then the senior minister in age shall act as Moderator.
- 16. Any organized Quarterly Meeting, Yearly Meeting or Association of Free Will Baptists, may unite with this body at any regular session, through a letter or delegates by a two-thirds vote of all delegates present.
- ➤ 17. These By-Laws may be amended at any regular body by a twothirds majority vote of all the delegates present, after the proposed amendment has laid on the table one day.
- V18. All business meetings shall be opened by singing, reading a portion from God's Word and prayer, and shall be closed with prayer.
- 19. All business, except routine, shall be brought before the body by committee, but should any committee refuse or fail to present to this body,

- any business given it by any delegate of this Association, then such business may be presented to the body by any delegate, but cannot be discussed unless by a majority vote of this body.
- 1 20. No one shall speak more than five minutes or more than twice, on the same subject without the consent of the Moderator.
- 21. Any delegate of this body can appeal from the decision of the Moderator to the Association, and by a majority vote thereon, the objection shall be sustained or rejected.
- ¹ 22. No one shall leave the Association when in a business session without the consent of the Moderator.
- 23. Anyone desiring to speak shall arise and say "Brother Moderator," but shall speak no further until he or she is recognized by the Moderator.
- J 24. The Moderator shall stop all discussions when not carried on in a Christian spirit, or when he thinks it is liekly to lead to discord or division.
- v 25. The officers of this body shall submit, at every annual session, a report of the work done for this Association.
- → 26. The Clerk shall keep an accurate record of all business transactions; shall superintend the printing of the minutes and shall receive an honorarium of an amount agreed upon by this body.
- 27. This Association may correspond by messenger or otherwise with other religious bodies.
- √ 28. All resolutions and reports shall bear the names of all the members of the committee who favor them; and if the names by not a majority of all members of such committee, then the clerk shall not read the resolutions or report.
- v 29. The Moderator shall appoint a committee on committees consisting of five members who shall appoint all Committees.
- \30. Those entitled to vote at any annual or special meeting of this State Association, shall be the elected delegates and standing delegates as defined in Sections 33 and 341 and each elected delegate or standing delegate shall be entitled to one vote.
- y 31. All business coming before this Association shall be decided by secret ballot when there is any opposition or objection to open vote.
- J 32. A majority vote shall be final upon all subjects except to amend the By-Laws, receive Quarterly Meeting or Associations, and the changing of the members of the committees appointed by the Moderator, then it shall require a two-thirds majority.

- 33. The number of elected delegates to the State Association shall be five delegates from each affiliated local association or yearly meeting; one delegate from each church plus one delegate for each fifty members or larger fraction thereof. Each church which represents must be a member of a local association or yearly meeting holding membership in this body.
- V 34. The standing delegates to this Association shall be all ordained ministers and their companions, provided the companion is a member in good standing in some Free Will Baptist Church belonging to this State Association, all ordained deacons; and Associational Clerks.
- v 35. The membership of the State Association may designate any place, either within or without the State of meeting for any annual meeting. Any special meeting may be called by the General Board. A waiver of notice signed by all members entitled to vote at a meeting may designate any place, either within or without the State of Missouri, unless otherwise prescribed by statute, as the place for the holding of such meeting. If no designation is made, or if a special meeting be otherwise called, the place of meeting shall be the principal office of the corporation in the State of Missouri.
- 36. Special meetings of the Association, for any purpose or purposes, unless otherwise prescribed by Statute, may be called by the General Board, and shall be called by the Moderator at the request of not less than fifty percent of all the delegate members duly elected by local Associations, Quarterly Meetings and local Churches affiliated with the Association.
 - 37. Special meetings of the General Board may be called by or at the request of the Moderator or any two Board Members. The person or persons authorized to call special meetings of the General Board may fix the place for holding any special meeting of the General Board called by them.
- J 38. Notice of any special meeting shall be given at least fifteen days previously thereto by written notice delivered personally or mailed to each Board member at his business address, or by telegram. If mailed, such notice shall be deemed to be delivered when deposited in the United States mail so addressed, with postage thereon prepaid. If notice be given by telegram, such notice shall be deemed to be delivered when the telegram is delivered to the telegraph company. Any Board member may waive notice of any meeting. The attendance of a Board member at a meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting, except where a Board member attends a meeting for the express purpose of objecting to the transaction of any business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened.
 - 39. A majority of the number of General Board members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of the General Board, but if less than such majority is present at a meeting, a majority of the Board members present may adjourn the meeting from time to time without further notice.

- V40. The act of the majority of the Board members present at a meeting at which a quorum is present, shall be the act of the General Board.
- \dagger{11.} Any vacancy occurring in the General Board may be filled by the affirmative vote of a majority of the remaining Board members though less than a quorum of the General Board, unless otherwise provided by law.
- V 42. All Board members elected to fill a vacancy shall be elected for the unexpired term of his predecessor in office.
- V 43. By resolution of the General Board the Board members may be paid their expenses, if any, of attendance at each meeting of the General Board. No such payment shall preclude any Board member from serving the Association in any other capacity and receiving compensation therefor.
- V 44. A Board member of the Association who is present at a meeting of the General Board at which action on any Association matter is taken, shall be presumed to have assented to the action taken unless his dissent shall be entered in the minutes of the meeting.
- V45. Any person or agent elected or appointed by the General Board may be removed by the General Board whenever in its judgment the best interests of the Association would be served thereby, but such removal shall be without prejudice to the contract rights, if any, of the person so removed.
- Jack the Moderator shall be the principal executive officer of the Association and he shall sign, with the Clerk or any other proper officer or agent of the Association thereunto authorized by the General Board, any deeds, mortgages, bonds, contracts, or other instruments which the General Board has authorized to be executed, except in cases where the signing and execution thereof shall be expressly delegated by the General Board or by these By-Laws to some other officer or agent of the Association, or shall be required by law to be otherwise signed or executed; and in general, shall perform all duties incident to the office of Moderator and such other duties as may be prescribed by the General Board from time to time.
- √ 47. In the absence of the Moderator or in the event of his death, inability or refusal to act, the Assistant Moderator shall perform the duties of the Moderator, and when so acting, shall have all the powers of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the Moderator. The Assistant Moderator shall perform such duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the Moderator or by the General Board.
- f 48. The Clerk shall: (a) keep the minutes of the Association and of the General Board meetings in one or more books provided for the purpose; (b) see that all notices are duly given in accordance with the provisions of these By-Laws or as required by law; (c) be custodian of the Association records and of the seal of the Association and see that the seal of the Association is affixed to all documents the execution of which on behalf of the Association under its seal is duly authorized; (d) have general charge

of the books of the Association; and (e) in general, perform all duties incident to the office of Clerk and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the Moderator or by the General Board.

- 49. The salaries of employees shall be fixed from time to time by the General Board.
- 50. The General Board may authorize any officer or officers, agent or agents, to enter into any contract or execute and deliver any instrument in the name of and on behalf of the Association, and such authority may be general or confined to specific instances.
- ${\sf V}$ 51. No loans shall be contracted on behalf of the Association and movevidences of indebtedness shall be issued in its name unless authorized by a resolution.
- V 52. All checks, drafts or other orders for the payment of money, notes or other evidences of indebtedness issued in the name of the Association, shall be signed by such officer, or officers, agent or agents, of the Association and in such manner as shall from time to time be determined by resolution of the General Board.
- 53. All funds of the corporation not otherwise employed shall be deposited from time to time to the credit of the Association in such banks, trust companies or other depositories as the General Board may select.
- 754. The fiscal year of the Association shall begin on the first (1st) day of August and end on the thirty-first (31st) day of July in each year.
- √ 55. The General Board shall provide an Association seal which shall
 be circular in form and shall have inscribed thereon the name of the corporation and the state of incorporation and the words, "Corporate Seal."
- V 56. Unless otherwise provided by law, whenever any notice is required to be given to any member or Board member of the Association under the provisions of these By-Laws or under the provisions of the articles of incorporation, a waiver thereof in writing, signed by the person or persons entitled to such notice whether before or after the time stated therein, shall be deemed equivalent to the giving of such notice.
- 7 57. The meetings of the State Association and General Board shall be governed by the rules of parliamentary law as set forth in Robert's Rules of Order, except in the case of those rules which are superceded by some rule of this organization.
- √ 58. In the event the necessity arises from war, or pestilence, or any cause which prevents a regular meeting of the State Association, whether such a condition is of a local or general condition, then the General Board shall be privileged to call and act with full authority in all matters pertaining to the general welfare of the State Association, providing whatever transaction passed shall be by two-thirds vote of the members present, and

providing that such transactions shall not conflict with the purpose and edicts of the by-laws of the State Association.

- 7 59. No officer shall serve the same office more than three consecutive years. However, this does not apply to the presently elected officers.
- 760. The General Board of the Association shall be authorized by a majority vote of the voting delegates of the State Association, to sell, lease, exchange, mortgage, pledge or otherwise dispose of all, or substantially all of the property and assets of the Association.
- 61. The General Board by a majority vote of the voting delegates of the State Association, shall be authorized to create or to increase any bonded indebtedness of the Association.
- 162. The sessions of this Association shall convene on Tuesday evening at 7:30 P.M. following the third Sunday in August each year.

REPORT OF THE MISSOURI STATE HOME MISSION BOARD TO THE MISSOURI STATE ASSOCIATION CONVENED AT KIRKSVILLE, MISSOURI - AUGUST 20-22, 1963

Your State Home Mission Board met five times during the past year to transact business necessary to the operation of the Board.

Three of the meetings were in connection with the organization of new churches.

On January 10, 1963, the Olivet Church was organized in Marshall, Mo. with sixteen members. Brother James D. Elmore is presently the pastor. With a loan of \$1,000.00 from the State Home Mission Board, the church is in a building program and expect to hold services in their own building this next Sunday, August 24. This church adopted the State Association Co-operative plan of support.

On May 3, 1963 the organizational service of the First Church of Jefferson City, Mo. was held. Brother Earl Irish was elected as pastor, ten members were listed that night, and the Constitution and By-Laws adopted by the church included the State Co-operative Program.

The Central Church of Kansas City was organized on May 23, 1963. This church is supporting our State Co-operative Program. Brother James MacAllister is the tull time pastor. They are purchasing a church building and growing rapidly.
