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MINUTES OF THE 52ND ANNUAL SESSION OF THE MISSOURI STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS When Convened with the Monett Free Will Baptist Church of Monett, Missouri August, 1965

TUESDAY NIGHT, 7:30 P.M. - AUGUST 17, 1965

The Missouri State Association of Free Will Baptists met in Monett, Missouri on August 17, 1965 at 7:30 p.m. with the host pastor, Rev. Bud Hill, presiding. The Association opened by singing with Rev. Albert McFarland directing the music and Mrs. Joan Thomas and Mrs. Albert McFarland at the piano and organ.

After the prayer and another congregational song, the State Association was welcomed to the City of Monett by Mr. E. J. Jerome, City Clerk. The Moderator of the Indian Creek Association, Rev. Ted Davis, gave the

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official welcome to the local Indian Creek Association. Rev. Davis quoted from the Book of Acts, emphasizing the importance of being in one accord and Spirit-led.

The Clerk of the Missouri State Association, Rev. Gene Norris, called the 52nd setting of the State Association into session. Romans 12:11 was read and Rev. Norris charged the delegates to exercise their voting rights and to remember the trust the Church and Association had placed in them.

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The moderator took the chair and called for the past moderator, Rev. O.T. Allred, to come forward. Rev. Dixon also called for the members of the General Board. The clerk then gave a plaque to the moderator who made official presentation to Rev. Allred for his twenty (20) years of serving the State Association as moderator.

After a word of appreciation by Bro. Allred, he presented the gavel to Bro. Dixon which was sent by the National Home Mission Director, Rev. Homer Willis.

The moderator delivered the moderator's message which was followed by a solo entitled "Satisfied with Jesus" by Mrs. Verna Malone.

An offering was then received for the General Board.

The choir of the host Monett Church then sang "The Lights of Home."

Rev. Harry Beatty was then introduced as the keynote speaker. He preached on "Yielded Unto God That Grace May Abound." Rev. Beatty used Psalms 84:11; II Cor. 8:9; Titus 2:11, 12; Romans 12:1,2; Romans 5:1; II Cor. 8:7; Hebrews 7:25; Romans 3:24, 25 during the message. The main thought was the grace of God.

Song of invitation - "Turn Your Eyes Upon Jesus."

The moderator then recognized those representing the various associations.

After final announcements by the host pastor, Rev. Marion Allsman prayed the benediction.

WEDNESDAY MORNING, AUGUST 18, 1965

Rev. Frank Giunta directed the congregation in singing "Standing on the Promises". After prayer, the congregation sang "Power in the Blood". A quick survey was taken, and 31 churches were represented.

Devotional by Rev. Grover Pingleton.

The moderator then recognized the following visitors: Rev. Rufus Coffey, Director of Conference Ministries for National Free Will Baptist Foreign Missions who gave a brief testimony; Bro. Samuel Johnson, Director of Church Training Service; Rev. Roger Reeds of the Sunday School Department; and Dr. and Mrs. Laverne Miley, missionaries to Ivory Coast, Africa.

The report of the Credentials Committee was given by the clerk.

Motion sustained that the partial report of the Credentials Committee be received.

The delegates were recognized and properly seated.

Time was given for any corresponding letters and messengers.

A partial report of the General Board was given by the clerk.

Motion sustained to receive report and lay it on the table.

A partial report of the Committee on Committees was read by Rev. Albert McFarland.

Motion sustained to receive this partial report of the Committee on Committees.

The clerk read from the By-Laws the Article which refers to the standing delegates.

WEDNESDAY EVENING, AUGUST 18, 1965

The Wednesday evening service opened with Rev. James McAllister presiding and Rev. Bud Hill directing the music. Chorus - "How Great Thou Art", and song "Showers of Blessing." Prayer by Rev. Johnnie Land.

The moderator then gave the names of the Placement Committee and the Publications Committee.

Those moving to Missouri were introduced: Rev. Grover Terry, Rev. and Mrs. Tom Malone, Rev. Don Jones.

The Director of the Sunday School Department, Rev. Roger Reeds, then gave a brief word concerning his work.

The Director of the Church Training Service, Bro. Samuel Johnson was introduced and commented regarding the work of his department.

Songs - "He Ransomed Me" and "Send The Light".

Capacity crowd this morning and over six hundred (600) in attendance tonight!

A preachers' quarter, composed of Rev. Red Davis, Rev. Albert Mc-Farland, Rev. Bud Hill and Rev. Frank Giunta, sang "The Great Redeemer."

The Monett Church Choir sang "Jesus Paid It All."

The Rev. James McAllister then presented the evening speaker, Dr. LaVerne Miley, who is the first Free Will Baptist medical missionary. Dr. Miley is a native of Missouri and is in the United States on furlough from Ivory Coast, Africa. Dr. Miley used the text, St. Matthew 28:18-20. He preached on the subject, "Yielded Unto God That God's Presence May Be Manifested." I John 1:24; Col. 1:27; I John 5:11, 12; John 17:23; II Tim. 4:17 were also used during the message.

Song of invitation - "I Surrender All".

An offering was received to be applied to the Miley account. Amount of offering – \$265.00.

The moderator asked Dr. Miley to read the letter from a convert in Africa to the Christians of America, thanking all Christians for sending their pastor to them.

Rev. Rufus Coffey then briefly addressed the Association.

The congregation sang one verse of "What A Friend."

Benediction by Rev. Roger Reeds.

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The activities of the day began with singing "At Calvary" with Rev. Jack McAllister directing the music. Prayer by Rev. Bob Jones. Song "Count Your Blessings". Devotional by Rev. Cliff Bowman from II Kings 2:9, 10.

Report of Credentials Committee. Motion sustained to receive the letters and properly seat the delegates.

Report of the statistician was given by Miss Leona Thompson.

Motion sustained to adopt this report as read.

Partial report of the General Board was given by the clerk. Motion sustained to receive the report and act on it item by item.

Item No. 1 - Adopted.

Item No. 2 - Adopted.

Item No. 3 - The Budget Committee was called to give their proposed budgets for August 1, 1965 - July 31, 1966. Rev. Ted Davis gave this report.

Motion to adopt report with these allocations designated as shown. Seconded and carried.

Report of the Youth Camp Board was given by the treasurer, Rev. William Reeves.

Motion sustained that the report be adopted.

Dr. J. D. O'Donnell, President of the Oklahoma Bible College, and Rev. Paul Inbody, member of the Bible College Board, were recognized.

Dr. O'Donnell commented on the work of the Oklahoma Bible College. Partial report of the Nominating Committee was given by Rev. Wood-

row Matthews.

Motion to receive report and act on it item by item. Seconded and carried.

Motion, seconded, carried to cease and elect Homer Smith by acclamation.

General Board members elected.

Rev. Ted Davis offered his resignation from the Youth Camp Board. Accepted.

Home Mission Board - Rev. Ted Davis elected.

Rev. Lester Jones submitted his resignation from the Home Mission Board through said Board. Accepted.

Rev. Dale Skiles elected to fill unexpired term of Rev. Lester Jones. Youth Camp Board - Rev. Tom Malone elected and Rev. Grover Pin-

gleton elected.

Superannuation Board - Rev. Jack McAllister elected and Rev. F. D. Johnson elected.

Sunday School Board - Rev. Albert McFarland elected.

Motion to declare office of Rev. Jesse Webb vacant on the Sunday School Board. Rev. Webb has accepted a pastorate out of the State of Missouri. Seconded and carried. Rev. R. B. Spurgeon elected to Sunday School Board.

Rev. James Earl Raper resigned from the Sunday School Board and this office was declared vacant. He has accepted a pastorate out of the State of Missouri.

Congregation sang one verse of "Oh, How I Love Jesus." Rev. R. B. Spurgeon and Rev. Don Jones led in prayer.

Report of the Promotional Secretary was given by Rev. Harry Beatty. Motion was made and seconded to dismiss because of the time, for the 11:00 a.m. worship hour. Bro. Beatty will return to the platform at 1:30 p.m. to finish his report.

Dr. J. D. O'Donnell dismissed with prayer.

THURSDAY MORNING, AUGUST 19, 1965 11:00 O'clock

Rev. Clarence Burton called the service to order and led in a song, "Love Lifted Me."

Rev. James Barker led in prayer.

REPORT OF THE STATE HOME MISSION BOARD

We are deeply moved with the challenge of missions in our own beloved State of Missouri, for we believe Missouri was included in the "Go ye". Missouri is part of the mission field that is "White alreadyto harvest" and we believe the Free Will Baptist constituency have a commission to "teach", "preach", "baptize", and indoctrinate even as Chirst charged all disciples to do. We believe this, therefore we believe in missions!

Your State Board of Missions believes it to be our personal responsibility to do that you have elected us to do for the Lord; that is to assist and start new churches in our State. This we have persistently endeavored to accomplish.

Since last report to the State Association, much prayer, study, work, and many miles of travel have gone into this cause of which we were glad to do for our Church. We have had some problems to encounter but also great "joy in the Holy Ghost" as we pursued the course by "faith" in God and our people. It has been rewarding!

We met August 20, 1964, at the conclusion of the Missouri State Association in Springfield, with the General Board. The Boards pledged compliance to the State work, after which we organized the Missions Board and elected officers. Rev. James McAllister was elected chairman, and Rev. Bob L. Jones, Secretary-Treasurer.

We met September 4, 1964 in Eldon, Missouri; October 27, 1964 in Springfield, Missouri; January 21, 1965 in Eldon, Missouri; and June 10, 1965 in Sedalia, Missouri. The final meeting was during this association. Through consistent efforts much has been done.

We have assisted Rev. Z. H. Tannehill and the Eldon, Missouri mission spiritually and financially. We paid rent on church building for two months and loaned the mission 30 folding chairs. The second occasion of meeting with Bro. Tannehill in Eldon marked the meeting of Rev. Mark Vandivort with the mission for the evening missionary service. Chairman James McAllister remained for the service. We met with Rev. Maynard Moore and the Northside Free Will Baptist people in Springfield, Missouri on October 27, 1965. After consultation of Board members and the State Moderator, Rev. O. T. Dixon, the Board organized the Northside Free Will Baptist Mission, 518 East Atlantic, Springfield, Missouri, with nine (9) charter members. Rev. Henry Long, Pastor of the First Free Will Baptist Church of Springfield, Missouri, was present and participated in the service. Bro. Moore was elected moderator of the mission. Rev. Mark Vandivort, Field Secretary of National Home Missions, conducted a revival for the Mission this past spring.

For some time the Marshall, Missouri church was in a desperate position; however, your Board was able to assist them whereby the work has been greatly revived. The purchase of \$2,500.00 of church bonds by your Board has blest them in the proposed erection of a new auditorium on their nice basement. The pastor, Rev. Junior Ussery, would appreciate your assistance in the purchase of bonds.

We met with the Sedalia, Missouri mission. Every possible means to revive and retain a Free Will Baptist witness has been employed. We have assisted it in every feasible way. This one particularly needs your prayers.

We have assisted the Belton, Missouri church by the purchase of \$1,000.00 of bonds. Rev. John McAllister is doing a very fine work there.

Contacts and discussions have presented the need of missions in Oak Grove (near Kansas City) and Rolla, Missouri.

All debts have been paid or satisfied with bonds during this past year. Beacon Church, Raytown, Missouri, paid their note with \$1,100.00 of bonds. Grace Church, Arnold, Missouri paid their note with \$2,000.00 worth of bonds. Neosho, Missouri church made cash payment of \$3,000. Olivet Church, Marshall, Missouri paid off with bonds. Victory Church, Avondale, Missouri finished their payments last Spring. We thank God for these Home Mission Churches! We say, "God Bless these Pastors."

As you have read in the GEM and recognized in our treasurer's report, we have launched a project for Cape Girardeau, Missouri, Rev. Don Jones of Guymon, Oklahoma, and pastor of the First Free Will Baptist Church, Guymon, Oklahoma, has accepted the missionary position with our State Association. Bro. Jones is a graduate of the Free Will Baptist Bible College in Nashville, Tennessee. Let's pray for him as he enters this work in October. St. Francois County and Madison County Quarterly Meetings have already responded with \$500.00 each to be matched by the State Board for the purchase of land for this project, Rev. Hellard and Rev. Jones made contact with two families in the Cape area. Two of these people are teachers in the Cape State College. Anyone knowing of prospects in this city should send their name to Rev. Bob Jones, 103 West Murta St., Fredericktown, Missouri, or relate them to any board member.

In the way of finance: We need a substantial increase in cooperative

receipts and individual church giving. We would like to see twentyor more churches and individuals contribute at least \$10.00 monthly. Some will probably meet the challenge of even greater gifts. Let God speak to your heart! Why do we need to respond liberally? The field of Rolla, Missouri is wide open to the establishment of a church along with Cape and possibly other places you are conscious of. The first fact of a Godcalled mission is seeing the need.

We believe missions to be the heart of the Gospel and the only means of the growth of the kingdom. Note the growth and support of Home Mission churches across the State. Herein is the greatest infusion of strength Missouri has known in recent years. Who started these churches? The other churches of the State started them. Thank God for those who have responded in the past. We trust you will encourage the work of this State with "person, "purse", and "prayer". We can and will do great things for the Lord if each will set his or her mind and heart to it. We can triple or more than triple our giving to Christ's cause in 10 years or less if we practice missions!

It has been a pleasure serving you on the Home Mission Board. We covet your continual praying for us.

RECOMMENDATION: The Missouri State Home Mission Board recommends the adoption of the proposed budget and the suggested increase to 20% cooperative receipts for 1965-66.

1. a. That the Missouri State Home Mission Board, in conjunction with the State Promotional Secretary, coordinate all itineraries in behalf of our National Mission Boards and Bible College;

b. And that this Board be responsible to obtain a representative elected by each Quarterly Meeting to assist in arranging itineraries among their churches;

c. And that each Church try to arrange for itineraries or conferences this coming associational year.

2. a. That each of our pastors approach their church business meetings and individual members with the challenge of at least \$10.00 regular monthly support to Missouri State Home Missions;

b. And that each church or interested individual respond to this challenge.

3. a. Whereas the cost of transportation to and from the mission field is increasingly high; and this cost must be met by the missionaries account; and Dr. Miley is a native of this State; we recommend that the Missouri State Association of Free Will Baptists raise \$1200.00 to be applied to the expense of the Miley's return to Africa.

b. We further recommend that allocations be made for each affiliated association, by the General Board, and that all monies received for this purpose be sent to the Missouri State Treasurer before April 15, 1966.

Be it further resolved that the General Board appoint a committee of five (5) to examine the feasibility of having a Bible centered Liberal Arts Junior College in the State of Missouri.

7. BY-LAWS

Name

1. This Association shall be called the Missouri State Association of Free Will Baptists.

Purpose

2. The object of this Association shall be for the bringing together of the Free Will Baptists of the State of Missouri in one annual gathering, that we may become better acquainted with one another, the upholding of the Free Will Baptist Churches of Missouri, and a world-wide outreach for souls.

Membership

3. The Association shall be composed of the members of the various local affiliated Associations.

4. Any organized Quarterly Meeting, Yearly Meeting or Association of Free Will Baptists, may unite with this body at any regular session, through a letter or delegates by a two-thirds vote of all delegates present.

Officers

5. The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, and Clerk, who shall be elected annually at the close of each session and hold their office until their successors are elected and qualified.

6. The officers of this body shall submit, at every annual session, a report of the work done for this Association.

7. The Moderator shall be the principal executive officer of the Association and he shall sign, with the Clerk or any other proper officer or agent of the Association thereunto authorized by the General Board, any deeds, mortgages, bonds, contracts, or other instruments which the General Board has authorized to be executed, except in cases where the signing and execution thereof shall be expressly delegated by the General Board or by these By-Laws to some other officer or agent of the Association, or shall be required by law to be otherwise signed or executed; and in general, shall perform all duties incident to the office of Moderator and such other duties as may be prescribed by the General Board from time to time.

8. In the absence of the Moderator, or in the event of his death, inability or refusal to act, the Assistant Moderator shall perform the duties of the Moderator, and when so acting, shall have all the powers of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the Moderator. The Assistant Moderator shall perform such duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the Moderator or by the General Board.

9. The Clerk shall keep an accurate record of all business transactions; shall superintend the printing of the Minutes and shall receive an honorarium of an amount agreed upon by this body.

10. The Clerk shall: (a) keep the Minutes of the Association and of the General Board meetings in one or more books provided for the purpose; (b) see that all notices are duly given in accordance with the provisions of these By-Laws or as required by law; (c) be custodian of the Association records and of the seal of the Association and see that the seal of the Association is affixed to all documents the execution of which on behalf of the Association under its seal is duly authorized; (d) have general charge of the books of the Association; and (e) in general, perform all duties incident to the office of Clerk and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the Moderator or by the General Board.

11. No officer shall serve the same office more than three consecutive years.

Boards

12. All standing boards shall be composed of five members, exclusive of the General Board. Standing Boards include the Home Missions Board, the Sunday School and Church Training Service Board, the Youth Board, the Superannuation Board, and the General Board.

13. The duties of the various standing boards shall be to plan a program and supervise its operation in their respective fields, and to receive, hold, manage use or convey any funds and property entrusted to said Boards.

Election

14. The personnel of each of the foregoing, exclusive of the General Board, shall be elected as follows: The first named for a term of one year, the second for a term of two years, the third for a term of three years, the fourth for a term of four years, and the fifth for a term of five years, and thereafter each shall be elected for a term of five years.

15. The personnel of the General Board shall be composed of the officers of the State Association; the chairman of all standing Boards and one member from each affiliated Association to be elected by the State Body whose term of office shall be two years and so constituted that the expiration date of the term of office of half of these, shall expire one year and the other half the following year. This shall be determined by alphabetical order of the name of the affiliated Association.

16. No person shall fill more than one office at the same time except as he may become a member of the General Board by virtue of his office. No person shall serve on more than one standing board at the same time, except as he may become a member of the General Board by virtue of being Chairman of the Board of which he is an elected member.

17. Any vacancy occurring in the General Board may be filled by the affirmative vote of a majority of the remaining Board members though less than a quorum of the General Board, unless otherwise provided by law.

18. All Board members elected to fill a vacancy shall be elected for the unexpired term of his predecessor in office.

Duties

19. The General Board shall have power to act in behalf of, and for the State Association from one regular session to another, and shall have power to elect such officers as may be necessary to carry out the plans and undertakings of the State Association. The General Board shall have the right to employ a Promotional Secretary who shall serve as Treasurer of the Association and be responsible for handling all monies of the Association. He shall be bonded for an amount in excess of the monies he shall be handling. In addition, the Promotional Secretary shall manage the Association's Book Store and in general promote the work of the Association and the Cause of Christ. He shall make an annual financial report to the Association.

20. The General Board shall have power to fill irregular vacancies that may occur in its own body and shall also have power to fill any irregular vacancies that may occur in any department of work between sessions of the State Association. It shall be the duty of this Board to make written reports of all its works to each annual session of the Association.

21. An Executive Committee consisting of seven members shall be elected by the General Board from among its membership, whose duty it shall be to act on all matters coming within the scope of the work of the Board when said Board is not in session. It shall also plan and execute the program for the annual sessions of the Missouri State Association. 22. A majority of the number of General Board members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of the General Board, but if less than such majority is present at a meeting, a majority of the Board members present may adjourn the meeting from time to time without further notice.

23. An act of the majority of the Board members present at a meeting at which a quorum is present, shall be an act of the General Board.

24. A Board member of the Association who is present at a meeting of the General Board at which action on any Association matter is taken, shall be presumed to have assented to the action taken unless his dissent shall be entered in the Minutes of the meeting.

25. The General Board may authorize any officer or officers, agent or agents, to enter into any contract or execute and deliver any instrument in the name of and on behalf of the Association, and such authority may be general or confined to specific instances.

26. Any person or agent elected or appointed by the General Board may be removed by the General Board whenever in its judgment the best interests of the Association would be served thereby, but such removal shall be without prejudice to the contract rights, if any, of the person so removed.

27. By resolution of the General Board the Board members may be paid their expenses, if any, of attendance at each meeting of the General Board. No such payment shall preclude any Board member from serving the Association in any other capacity and receiving compensation therefor.

28. The General Board shall provide an Association seal which shall be circular in form and shall have inscribed thereon the name of the corporation and the state of incorporation and the words, "Corporate Seal".

Committees

29. The Moderator shall appoint a committee on committees consisting of five members who shall appoint all committees.

30. All resolutions and reports shall bear the names of all the members of the committee who favor them; and if the names be not a majority of all members of such committee, then the clerk shall not read the resolutions or report.

Representation

31. The standing delegates of this Association shall be all ordained Free Will Baptist ministers and their companions, all ordained deacons, and Associational Clerks, provided they are members in good standing in some Free Will Baptist church belonging to this State Association.

32. The number of elected delegates to the State Association shall be seven delegates from each affiliated local association or yearly meeting; one delegate from each church plus one delegate for each fifty members or larger fraction thereof. Each church which represents must be a member of a local association or yearly meeting holding membership in this body. 33. This Association may correspond by messenger or otherwise with other religious bodies.

Voting

34. Those entitled to vote at any annual or special meeting of this State Association, shall be the elected delegates and standing delegates as defined in By-Laws 31 and 32, and each elected delegate or standing delegate shall be entitled to one vote.

35. A majority vote shall be final upon all subjects except to amend the By-Laws, receive Quarterly Meetings or Associations, and the changing of the members of the committees appointed by the Moderator, then it shall require a two-thirds majority.

Meetings

36. The sessions of this Association shall convene on Tuesday evening at 7:30 P.M. following the third Sunday in August each year.

37. The membership of the State Association may designate any place, either within or without the State of Missouri for any annual meeting. Any special meeting may be called by the General Board. A waiver of notice signed by all members entitled to vote at a meeting may designate any place, either within or without the State of Missouri, unless otherwise prescribed by statute, as the place for the holding of such meeting. If no designation is made, or if a special meeting be otherwise called, the place of meeting shall be the principal office of the corporation in the State of Missouri.

38. In the event the necessity arises from war, or pestilence, or any cause which prevents a regular meeting of the State Association, whether such a condition is of a local or general condition, then the General Board shall be privileged to call and act with full authority in all matters pertaining to the general welfare of the State Association, providing whatever transaction passed shall be by two-thirds vote of the members present, and providing that such transactions shall not conflict with the purpose and edicts of the By-Laws of the State Association.

39. Special meetings of the Association, for any purpose or purposes, unless otherwise prescribed by statute, may be called by the General Board, and shall be called by the Moderator at the request of not less than fifty percent of all the delegate members duly elected by local Associations, Quarterly Meetings and local churches affiliated with the Association.

40. Seven or more ordained ministers or deacons from two or more affiliated Associations belonging to the State Association, shall constitute a quorum to transact business.

41. All business meetings shall be opened by singing, reading a portion from God's Word, and prayer, and shall be closed with prayer.

42. Special meetings of the General Board may be called by or at the request of the Moderator or any two Board members. The person or persons

authorized to call special meetings of the General Board may fix the place for holding any special meeting of the General Board called by them.

43. Notice of any special meeting shall be given at least fifteen days previously thereto by written notice delivered personally or mailed to each Board member at his business address, or by telegram. If mailed, such notice shall be deemed to be delivered when deposited in the United States mail so addressed, with postage thereon prepaid. If notice be given by telegram, such notice shall be deemed to be delivered when the telegram is delivered to the telegraph company. Any Board member may waive notice of any meeting. The attendance of a Board member at a meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting, except where a Board member attends a meeting for the express purpose of objecting to the transaction of any business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened.

44. Unless otherwise provided by law, whenever any notice is required to be given to any member or Board member of the Association under the provisions of these By-Laws or under the provisions of the articles of incorporation, a waiver thereof in writing, signed by the person or persons entitled to such notice whether before or after the time stated therein, shall be deemed equivalent to the giving of such notice.

Discipline

45. The State Association shall not usurp any authority over the Quarterly Meetings, or Associations that shall be under its supervision, but shall be an advisory body to help them.

Fiscal Policy

46. The fiscal year of the Association shall begin on the first (1st) day of August and end on the thirty-first (31st) day of July in each year.

47. All checks, drafts or other orders for the payment of money, notes or other evidences of indebtedness issued in the name of the Association, shall be signed by such officer or officers, agent or agents, of the Association and in such manner as shall from time to time be determined by resolution of the General Board.

48. No loans shall be contracted on behalf of the Association and no evidences of indebtedness shall be issued in its name unless authorized by a resolution.

49. The General Board by a majority vote of the voting delegates of the State Association, shall be authorized to create or to increase any bonded indebtedness of the Association.

50. The General Board of the Association shall be authorized by a majority vote of the voting delegates of the State Association, to sell, lease, exchange, mortgage, pledge or otherwise dispose of all, or substantially all, of the property and assets of the Association.

51. All funds of the corporation not otherwise employed shall be deposited from time to time to the credit of the Association in such banks, trust companies or other depositories as the General Board may select.

52. The salaries of employees shall be fixed from time to time by the General Board.

Standing Rules

53. The meetings of the State Association and General Board shall be governed by the rules of parliamentary law as set forth in Robert's Rules of Order, except in the case of those rules which are superceded by some rule of this organization.

54. The Clerk, and in his absence the senior minister in age, shall call the Association to order for business, and call the Moderator or Assistant Moderator to the chair, and if neither Moderator not Assistant Moderator is present, then the senior minister in age shall act as chairman to open the floor for nominations and carry out the election of a Moderator Pro Tem.

55. All business, except routine, shall be brought before the body by committee, but should any committee refuse or fail to present to this body, any business given it by any delegate of this Association, then such business may be presented to the body by any delegate, but cannot be discussed unless by a majority vote of this body.

56. Anyone desiring to speak shall arise and say "Brother Moderator", but shall speak no further until he or she is recognized by the Moderator.

57. No one shall speak more than five minutes, or more than twice, on the same subject without the consent of the Moderator.

58. Any delegate of this body can appeal from the decision of the Moderator of the Association, and by a majority vote thereon, the objection shall be sustained or rejected.

59. No one shall leave the Association when in a business session without the consent of the Moderator.

60. The Moderator shall stop all discussions when not carried on in a Christian spirit, or when he thinks it is likely to lead to discord or division.

61. All business coming before this Association shall be decided by secret ballot when there is any opposition or objection to open vote.

Amendments

62. These By-Laws may be amended at any regular session by a two-thirds majority vote after the proposed amendment has laid on the table one day.
