Minutes of the 55th Annual Session of the MISSOURI STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS When convened with the First Free Will Baptist Church of Joplin, Missouri, August, 1968

TUESDAY NIGHT, 7;30 p.m. AUGUST 20, 1968

The 55th Annual Session of the Missouri State Association of Free Will Baptists met at the First Free Will Baptist Church of Joplin, Missouri, August 20, 1968; at 7:30 p.m.

The Session was opened by singing: "There Is A Fountain" led by Jack Stallings. Bro. James Franklin led in prayer. Bro. Stallings then led in the singing of "My Savior's Love" and "Am I a Soldier of The Cross."

The clerk, Bro. Andy Lay, then called the session to order.

Bro. Stallings led: "It is Well With My Soul."

Bro. Lay recognized the representatives of the various District Associations in the state and the visitors from outside the state.

Bro. Alton Loveless, the host pastor, welcomed the Association to the Church. He introduced Mr. Robert Metsinger, the Joplin City Manager, who welcomed us to the city.

Mr. Howard Filkins voiced the response of the Association.

Bro. Lay then introduced the officers of the State Association, Bro. Alton Loveless, Assistant Clerk; Tom Malone, Assistant Moderator; and Bro. Woodrow Matthews, the Moderator; who then delivered the Moderator's Message. He used I Corinthians 15:58 as his text; admonished us from three words of the text: "brethren," "abounding," and "labor."

Following the Message, Bro. Matthews presented a plaque of appreciation to former Moderator Bro. O. T. Dixon.

Bro. Stallings led us in singing: "When the Roll Is Called Up Yonder."

An offering of \$64.70 was then received for Associational expenses.

The Joplin Church Choir sang: "Make Me a Blessing" before Bro. Dale Jones delivered the keynote message: "We Believe the Bible." He took his text from Amos 8:11. Following the message, Bro. Stallings led us in "Near the Cross" and an invitation was given.

The report of the Committee on Committees was read by the Clerk. The service was concluded in prayer led by Bro. Tom Malone.

WEDNESDAY MORNING, AUGUST 21, 1968

The morning session was opened by the congregation singing: "To God Be the Glory", Then "Victory In Jesus" was led by Bro. Andy Lay. Prayer was led by Bro. George Bryant.

Bro. Dale Skiles read Hebrews 11:5, and gave a devotional thought, and led in prayer.

The Moderator reminded the body of the agenda. We adopted the printed program with the privilege of the Moderator and Assistant Moderator to make necessary changes.

The Clerk read the Credentials Committee's report. A motion was m/s/c to receive the report, adopt item 1, and seat the delegates.

A petitionary letter was read from the newly organized Greater Kansas City District Association and the letter from the Central Western Association recommending the churches of the newly formed Association to us. A motion was m/s/c to adopt item 2 of the Credentials Committee's report and receive the Greater Kansas City District Association into membership in the State Association.

The Moderator charged the delegates with their voting privileges and responsibilities.

A letter from missionaries Jim and Olena McLain was read.

Corresponding messengers were recognized from the following National Departments: Sunday School, CTS, Executive, Home Missions, Foreign Missions, and Bible College. Representatives from Oklahoma Bible College and the Free Will Baptist Children's Home in Greenville, Tennessee were also recognized.

The report of the Committee on Committees was re-read.

Mrs. Don Ellis gave us greetings from the Free Will Baptist Children's Home in Greenville, Tennessee.

The Statician's Report was read by the Clerk. A motion was m/s/c to receive the Statistical Report.

Bro. Roger Reeds gave us greetings from the National Sunday School Department, and informed us of the progress of that Department.

Bro. Harry Beatty gave the Promotional Secretary's report. He closed with a prayer of thanksgiving. A motion was m/s/c to receive the report with typographical corrections and express thanks to Bro. Beatty for his service. A motion was m/s/c to amend the motion to give Bro. Beatty a standing vote of thanks.

Bro. Jack Paramore was then recognized to give us greetings from Free Will Baptist Bible College and share with us the progress and needs of the School.

The meeting was recessed in prayer by Bro. Matthews.

11:00 A.M. WORSHIP SERVICE

The morning worship service was opened by singing "Glory to His Name," which was directed by Rev. Glenn Rehkop.

Prayer was offered by Bro. Bill Evans, Pastor of South Side Church of St. Louis. We then were led in singing: "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms".

We were called into a quiet time of meditation and prayer by Rev. R. B. Spurgeon, presiding. Rev. Spurgeon led in prayer.

Special music in song was given by a duet from the Joplin Church. Mrs. Shirley Hunter and Miss Elaine Buehler rendered this special, accompanied by Mr. Dennis Campbell, "He Cared For Me".

Rev. Spurgeon introduced Dr. J. D. O'Donnell, President of the Oklahoma Bible College. Dr. O'Donnell spoke to us on the subject: "We Believe in the Holy Trinity." He used for his text I John 5:1-7.

We were dismissed by singing "Amazing Grace."

WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON, AUGUST 21, 1968

Bro. Alton Loveless opened the service by leading the congregation in

singing: "Revive Us Again." Prayer followed by Bro. Jim McAllister. The congregation then sang "All Hail the Power."

Bro. Eugene Davis led us in a devotional thought from Isaiah 55:89.

The Clerk read letters from the Springfield First Church and the Niangua Church recommending church delegates to the body. A motion was m/s/c to seat these delegates.

It was called to the attention of the body that Bro. Eugene Davis be recognized as a minister. (This was not done on the printed program.)

The report of the General Board was read by the Clerk.

A motion was m/s/c to receive the General Board's report and dispose of it item by item.

Item No. 1 was read. A motion was m/s/c to adopt item No. 1. (NOTE: A standing vote was taken.)

Item No. 2 was read in its entirety. A motion was m/s/c to adopt item No. 2 in its entirety. Bro. R. B. Spurgeon, a member of the General Board, explained reasons for this recommendation before the vote was taken.

A motion was m/s/c that by-laws No. 36 and No. 46 be changed to conform to Item No. 1 of the General Board report.

A motion was m/s/c that the item be tabled.

Item No. 3 was read. A motion was m/s/c to adopt item No. 3. A motion was m/s/lost to offer a substitute motion that these representatives be elected from the floor. The Moderator called us to prayer before the standing vote was taken. A motion was m/s/c to move the previous question. A motion was m/s/c to move the previous question.

A motion was m/s/c that item No. 4 be tabled until we hear the reports of the Boards.

The congregation sang: "Amazing Grace."

Bro. Reford Wilson gave us greetings from the Foreign Missions Department and our missionary representatives around the world. He shared with us several missionary prayer requests and commended the state for its missionary support.

Bro. Dale Skiles gave the report of the State Home Mission Board. A motion was m/s/c to adopt the report and note corrections on the printed reports.

Dr. J. D. O'Donnell gave greetings from Oklahoma Bible College. He expressed the thanks of the School for Missouri's support.

Bro. William Reeves gave the report of the Youth Camp Board. A motion was m/s/c to receive the report. A motion was m/s/c to amend that this be received as a partial report.

The Book Store proposed budget was read by the Clerk. A motion was m/s/c to receive this proposed budget.

The General Fund proposed budget was read by the Clerk. A motion was m/s/c to adopt this proposed budget.

The Promotional Department's proposed budget was read by the Clerk. A motion was m/s/c to receive and to adopt this proposed budget.

The Placement Committee's report was read by the Clerk. A motion was m/s/c to adopt the Placement Committee's report and go to the Leadington Church for the State Association next year.

Mr. Fred Green of the National C.T.S. Department gave a report of that National Department.

A motion was m/s/c to adjourn business until 9:00 A.M. Thursday morning. We were dismissed in prayer by Bro. Alton Loveless.

WEDNESDAY EVENING, AUGUST 21, 1968

The service was opened by singing: "Jesus Saves" led by Bro. Don Jones. Bro. Jack Paramore then led in prayer. The congregation sang: "Send the Light" after which Leonard Tallent, a young man from the Berkeley Free Will Baptist Church, gave his testimony. Bro. Rufus Coffey, the National Executive Secretary, gave greetings from the National Association and spoke in behalf of the Co-operative Program, our nation magazine, *Contact* and Randall Book Store.

Bro. Don Jones again led the congregation in singing: "He Lives".

Bro. Bob Shockey, of the National Home Missions Department, gave us greetings and thanks for Missouri's support of Home Missions.

Bro. Dale Skiles of the Missouri State Home Mission Board, introduced Bro. Mark Vandivort, Bro. Cliff Bowman, Bro. Don Jones, and Mrs. Ted Davis: all State Home Missionaries. Bro. Skiles presented plaques to Bro. James McAllister, pastor of Central Free Will Baptist Church in Kansas City and to Bro. Charles Hoover of Hannan Free Will Baptist Church, in special recognition for the largest amount given and the largest amount of per-capita giving respectfully, to State Home Missions.

Bro. Jack Stallings sang: "How Great Thou Art" before Bro. Reford Wilson, Director of National Foreign Missions Department, brought the message of the evening: "We Believe in the Great Commission."

The report of the Superannuation Board was read by Bro. Cecil Campbell. The Superannuation Board's Financial Report was read by the Clerk. A motion was m/s/c to adopt the recommendations in the report. A motion was m/s/c to amend to adopt report item by item. Item No. 1 was read. Motion m/s/c to adopt item No. 1. Item No. 2 was read. A motion was m/s/c to adopt item No. 2. Item No. 3 was read. A motion was m/s to adopt item No. 3. A motion was m/s/c to table this item until item No. 4 from the General Board (the Budget) comes to the floor. Item No. 4 of the Superannuation Board was read. A motion was m/s/c to adopt item No. 5 was read. A motion was m/s/c to adopt item No. 5. Item No. 6 was read: motion was m/s/c to adopt item No. 6.

A motion was m/s/c to adopt the Financial report and accept the resignation of Bro. Nichols from the Board.

The report of the Missions Committee was read. A motion was m/s/c to adopt the report in its entirety.

Rev. Mark Vandivort, our new Home Missionary to Columbia, spoke to the session regarding the new field, before the vote was taken.

A motion was m/s/c to amend item No. 1: to include the Church in Jefferson City.

The report of the Obituary Committee was read. A motion was m/s/c to adopt the report. Bro. Cecil Campbell led us in prayer.

The report of the Temperance Committee was read. A motion was m/s/c to adopt the report.

The report of the Publications Committee was read. Motion was m/s/c to adopt the report.

The report of the S.S. and C.T.S. Board was read by Bro. Bill Evans. A motion was m/s/c to adopt the report.

The GEM report with the proposed budget and resignation of the Editor was read by the Clerk. A motion was m/s/c to adopt the report with commendation to the Editor.

The Registration Committee's report was read by the Clerk. A motion was m/s/c to receive the report.

The Youth Camp Board's proposed budget was read by Bro. Burton. Miss Mary Nutting gave a report of the past year's camp from a camper's point of view. A motion was m/s/c to adopt the Youth Camp Board's Report and proposed budget.

A motion was m/s/c to take Item No. 4 of the General Board's report off the table. Item No. 4 (Budget of the Co-operative Fund) was read. A motion was m/s that the budget be adopted. A substitute motion was m/s/lost to refer budget to the General Board to be reconsidered to include at least 1% to State Superannuation Board and re-evaluate the 3% offered to Oklahoma Bible College. A motion was m/s/c to move the previous question.

A substitute motion was m/s/c that 52% of the co-operative money be sent to the National and 48% remain in the State of Missouri; with the following break-down:

14% – Promotional Department

16% – State Home Missions

8½% – General Fund

3¾% – GEM

4% - State Youth Camp

1% – State S.S. and C.T.S. Board

1% – State Superannuation Board

A motion was m/s/c to move the previous question.

A motion was m/s/c that Missouri State Association reaffirm our appreciation and interest in the ministry of Oklahoma Bible College, as a Christian School; complimenting our National Bible College. We encourage the promotion of Oklahoma Bible College in the state of Missouri.

 \overline{A} motion was m/s/c to bring to the table the by-law revision.

A motion was m/s/c to amend By-law No. 36 to read: "The session of this Association shall convene on Tuesday Evening at 7:30 P.M. following the third Sunday in June each year."

A motion was m/s/c to table the motion until next year.

Nominations were opened for delegates to the National Association. Nominated were: Lee Sherrill, Ray Burdget, Bill Knap, Vernon Long, Russell Wiseman. A motion was m/s/c to close nominations and elect the above by acclamation.

A motion was m/s/c to take iten No. 3 of the Superannuation Board's report off the table.

A motion was m/s/c to adopt item No. 3.

A motion was m/s/c that the Moderator of the State Association be empowered to appoint alternate delegates to the National Association.

The Nominating Committee's nominations for General Board members were read. A motion was m/s/c to cease nominations and to elect by acclamation.

The remainder of the Nominating Committee's report was read. A motion was m/s/c to receive this report to be disposed of item by item.

For Home Missions Board there were no other nominations. A motion was m/s/c to elect the nominee by acclamation.

For Youth Camp Board, no other nominations. A motion was m/s/c to elect by acclamation.

For S.S. and C.T.S. Board no other nominations. A motion was m/s/c to elect the nominee by acclamation.

For the Superannuation Board, no other nomination. A motion was m/s/c to elect by acclamation.

For Statistician, no other nomination. A motion was m/s/c to elect by acclamation.

For Assistant Clerk, no other nominations, A motion was m/s/c to elect by acclamation. For Clerk, no other nominations. Nominations declared ceased. The nominee was elected by acclamation.

A motion was m/s/c to adjourn.

REPORT OF THE GENERAL BOARD

The General Board of the Missouri State Association of Free Will Baptists met November 27, 1967 at the Headquarters Building in St. Louis, and August 19 and 20, 1968 in Joplin, Missouri, with a quorum present at each meeting.

The Board replaced two of its members who had moved out of the Associations they had represented. Rev. Milan Rubble was elected to replace Rev. Glenn Jones of the Laclede County Association, and Rev. Glen Murray was elected to replace Rev. Glenn Rehkop of the Central Western Association.

During the year committees were appointed to work on the following items of business:

1) To meet with the Oklahoma Bible College Board of Trustees when considering the ministry of Oklahoma Bible College to Free Will Baptist young people in the mid-west.

2) To plan a Ministers' Retreat for the Ministers of the State.

3) To work with the Superannuation Board about developing a group insurance program for the ministers of the State.

4) To work with the S.S. and C. T. S. Board in planning an annual State S.S.-C.T.S. Convention.

5) To work with the GEM editor and Litho Printers about upgrading the quality of the GEM.

6) To look into the possibility of selling the present Headquarters Building in St. Louis and relocating the State Headquarters and Book Store nearer the geographical center of the State.

7) To plan the program and work out the arrangements for the present State Meeting.

The Board authorized the sending of \$1,000 to Free Will Baptist Bible College as recommended by the body at the State Association last year.

At the August 19 and 20 meeting, the Board heard reports of the State Promotional Secretary, and all State Boards and Committees, and referred their budgets to the Budget Committee.

The General Board makes the following recommendations to the State Association:

1) That the date for the State Association Meeting be changed to the third week in June; to suggest that the Local Associations meet in September, December, March, and June, the June meeting to be the yearly meeting; thus, making the Associational year June 1 - May 31. This change to take place over a two-year transition period.

2) Regarding the relocation of the State Headquarters:

a) That we sell the present Headquarters Building in St. Louis and relocate it in Lebanon, Missouri.

b) That the State Headquarters remain at 3100 Mt. Pleasant Street, St. Louis, until the sale of that property.

c) That we rent a residence for our Executive Secretary in Lebanon, Missouri, preferrably one with a two-car garage and basement to accomodate the Book Store, Headquarters, and GEM office for the present.

d) That the General Board appoint a committee of five men, including two Free Will Baptist business men, preferrably within a 50-mile radius of Lebanon, and three members of the General Board to guide in the locating of a property, work with the Promotional Secretary in setting up the Book Store displays, and check on the feasibility and best time of moving the Book Store into a store building in Lebanon.

e) That the Book Store cater to all evangelical Book Store business.f) That we name the Book Store: "Lebanon Bible and Book Store," but include the words, "Owned and operated by Free Will Baptists" on the property.

3) That we send Brother Andy Lay and Brother O. T. Allred as official representatives to the National Association's Study Commission to revise chapter 13 (Perservance) and chapter 18, Section 3 (Feet Washing) of the National Treatise, and that we pay the expenses they incur in going.

4) That the following co-operative fund budget be adopted:

BY-LAWS

Name

1. This Association shall be called the Missouri State Association for Free Will Baptists.

Purpose

2. The Object of this Association shall be for the bringing together of the Free Will Baptists of the State of Missouri in one annual gathering that we may become better acquainted with one another, the upholding of the Free Will Baptists Churches of Missouri, and a world-wide outreach for souls.

Membership

3. The Association shall be composed of the members of the various local affiliated Associations.

4. Any organized Quarterly Meeting, Yearly Meeting, or Association of Free Will Baptists, may unite with this body at any regular session, through a letter or delegates by a two-thirds vote of all delegates present.

Officers

5. The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, and Assistant Clerk, who shall be elected annually at the close of each session and hold their office until their successors are elected and qualified.

6. The officers of this body shall submit, at every session, a report of the work done for this Association.

7. The Moderator shall be the principal executive officer of the Association and he shall sign, with the Clerk or any other proper officer or agent of the Association thereunto authorized by the General Board, any deeds, mortgages, bonds, contracts, or other instruments which the General Board has authorized to be executed, except in cases where the signing and execution thereof shall be expressly delegated by the General Board or by

these By-Laws to some other officer or agent of the Association, or shall be required by law to be otherwise signed or executed; and in general, shall perform all duties incident to the office of Moderator and such other duties as may be prescribed by the General Board from time to time.

8. In the absence of the Moderator, or in the event of his death, inability, or refusal to act, the Assistant Moderator shall perform the duties of the Moderator, and when so acting, shall have all the powers of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the Moderator. The Assistant Moderator shall perform such duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the Moderator or by the General Board.

9. The Clerk shall keep an accurate record of all business transactions; shall superintend the printing of the Minutes and shall receive an honorarium of an amount agreed upon by this body.

10. The Clerk shall: (a) keep the Minutes of the Association and of the General Board meetings in one or more books provided for the purpose; (b) see that all notices are given in accordance with the provisions of these By-Laws or as required by law; (c) be custodian of the Association records and of the seal of the Association and see that the seal of the Association is affixed to all documents the execution of which on behalf of the Association under its seal is duly authorized; (d) have general charge of the books of the Association; (e) in general, perform all duties incident to the office of Clerk and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the Moderator or by the General Board; and (f) in the absence of the Clerk, or in the event of his death, inability, or refusal to act, the Assistant Clerk shall perform the duties of the Clerk and, when so acting, shall have all the power of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the Clerk. The Assistant Clerk shall perform such duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the Clerk of by the General Board.

11. No officer shall serve the same office more than three consecutive years.

Boards

12. All standing boards shall be composed of five members, exclusive of the General Board. Standing Boards include the Home Missions Board, the Sunday School and Church Training Service Board, the Youth Camp Board, the Superannuation Board, and the General Board.

13. The duties of the various standing boards shall be to plan a program and supervise its operation in their respective fields, and to receive, hold, manage, use or convey and funds and property entrusted to said Boards.

Election

14. The personnel of each of the foregoing, exclusive of the General Board, shall be elected as follows: The first named for a term of one year, the second for a term of two years, and third for a term of three years, the fourth for a term of four years, and the fifth for a term of five years, and thereafter each shall be elected for a term of five years.

15. The personnel of the General Board shall be composed of the officers of the State Association; the chairmen of all standing boards and one member from each affiliated Association to be elected by the State Body whose term of office shall be two years and so constituted that the expiration date of the term of office of half of these shall expire one year and the other half the following year. This shall be determined by alphabetical order of the name of the affiliated Association.

16. No person shall fill more than one office at the same time except as he may become a member of the General Board by virtue of being Chairman of the Board of which he is an elected member.

17. Any vacancy occuring in the General Board may be filled by the affirmative vote of a majority of the remaining Board members though less than a quorum of the General Board, unless otherwise provided by law.

18. All Board members elected to fill a vacancy shall be elected for the unexpired term of his predecessor in office.

Duties

19. The General Board shall have power to act in behalf of, and for the State Association from one regular session to another, and shall have power to elect such officers as may be necessary to carry out the plans and undertakings of the State Association. The General Board shall have the right to employ a Promotional Secretary who shall serve as Treasurer of the Association and be responsible for handling all monies of the Association. He shall be bonded for an amount in excess of the monies he shall be handling. In addition, the Promotional Secretary shall manage the Association's Book Store and in general promote the work of the Association and the Cause of Christ. He shall make an annual financial report to the Association.

20. The General Board shall have power to fill any irregular vacancies that may occur in its own body and shall also have power to fill any irregular vacancies that may occur in any department of work between sessions of the State Association. It shall be the duty of this Board to make written reports of all its work to each session of the Association.

21. An Executive Committee consisting of seven members shall be elected by the General Board from among its membership, whose duty it shall be to act on all matters coming within the scope of the work of the Board when said Board is not in session. It shall also plan and execute the program for the annual sessions of the Missouri State Association.

22. A majority of the number of the General Board members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of the General Board, but if less than such majority is present at a meeting, a majority of the Board members present may adjourn the meeting from time to time without further notice.

23. An act of the majority of the Board members present at a meeting at which a quorum is present, shall be an act of the General Board.

24. A Board member of the Association who is present at a meeting of the General Board at which action on any Association matter is taken shall be presumed to have assented to the action taken unless his dissent shall be entered in the Minutes of the meeting.

25. The General Board may authorize any officer or officers, Agent or Agents to enter into any contract or execute and deliver any instrument in the name of and on behalf of the Association, and such authority may be general or confined to specific instances. 26. Any person or agent elected or appointed by the General Board may be removed by the General Board whenever in its judgement the best interests of the Association would be served thereby, but such removal shall be without prejudice to the contract rights, if any, of the persons so removed.

27. By resolution of the General Board the Board members may be paid their expenses, if any, of attendance of each meeting of the General Board. No such payment shall preclude any Board member from serving the Association in any other capacity and receiving compensation therefore.

28. The General Board shall provide an Association seal which shall be circular in form and shall have inscribed thereon the name of the corporation and the state of incorporation and the words, "Corporate Seal."

Committees

29. The Moderator shall appoint a committee on committees consisting of five members who shall appoint all committees.

30. All resolutions and reports shall bear the name of all the members of the committee who favor them; and if the names be not a majority of all members of such committee, than the clerk shall not read the resolutions or report.

Representation

31. The standing delegates of this Association shall be all ordained Free Will Baptist ministers and their companions, all ordained deacons, and Associational Clerks, provided they are members in good standing in some Free Will Baptist church belonging to this State Association.

32. The number of elected delegates to the State Association shall be seven delegates from each affiliated local association or yearly meeting; one delegate from each church, plus one delegate for each fifty members or larger fraction thereof. Each church which represents must be a member of a local association or yearly meeting holding membership in this body.

33. This Association may correspond by messenger or otherwise with other religious bodies.

Voting

34. Those entitled to vote at any annual or special meeting of this State Association, shall be the elected delegates and the standing delegates as defined in By-Law 31 and 32, and each elected delegate or standing delegate shall be entitled to one vote.

35. A majority vote shall be final upon all subjects except to amend the By-Laws receive Quarterly Meetings or Associations, and the changing of the members of the committees appointed by the Moderator, then it shall require a two-thirds majority.

Meetings

36. The sessions of this Association shall convene on Tuesday evening at 7:30 p.m. following the third Sunday in August each year.

37. The membership of the State Association may designate any place, either within or without the State of Missouri for any annual meeting. Any special meeting may be called by the General Board. A waiver of notice

signed by all members entitled to vote at a meeting may designate any place, either within or without the State of Missouri, unless otherwise prescribed by statue, as the place for the holding of such meeting. If no designation is made, or if a special meeting be otherwise called, the place of the meeting shall be the principal office of the corporation in the State of Missouri.

38. In the event the necessity arises from war, or pestilence, or any cause which prevents a regular meeting of the State Association, whether such a condition is of a local or general condition, then the General Board shall be privileged to call and act with full authority in all matters pertaining to the general welfare of the State Association, providing whatever transaction passed shall be by two-thirds vote of the members present, and providing that such transactions shall not conflict with the purpose and edicts of the By-Laws of the State Association,

39. Special meetings of the Association, for any purpose or purposes, unless otherwise prescribed by statue, may be called by the General Board, and shall be called by the Moderator at the request of not less than fifty percent of all the delegate members duly elected by local Associations, Quarterly Meeting, and local churches affiliated with the Association.

40. Seven or more ordained ministers or deacons from two or more affiliated associations belonging to the State Association, shall constitute a quorum to transact business.

41. All business meetings shall be opened by singing, reading a portion from God's Word, and prayer, and shall be closed with prayer.

42. Special meetings of the General Board may be called by or at the request of the Moderator or any two Board members. The person or persons authorized to call special meetings of the General Board may fix the place for holding any special meeting of the General Board called by them.

43. Notice of any special meeting shall be given at least fifteen days previously thereto by written notice delivered personally or mailed to each Board member at his business address, or by telegram. If mailed, such notice shall be deemed to be delivered when deposited in the United States mail so addressed, with postage thereon prepaid. If notice be given by telegram, such notice shall be deemed to be delivered when the telegram is delivered to the telegraph company. Any Board member may waive notice of any meeting. The attendance of a Board member at a meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting, except where a Board member attends a meeting for the express purpose of objecting to the transaction of any business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened.

44. Unless otherwise provided by law, whenever any notice is required to be given to any member of Board member of the Association under the provisions of these By-Laws or under the provisions of the articles of incorporation, a waiver thereof in writing, signed by the person or persons entitled to such notice whether before of after writing, signed by the person or persons entitled to such notice whether before or after the time stated therin, shall be deemed equivalent to the giving of such notice.

Discipline

45. The State Association shall not usurp any authority over the Quarterly

Meetings or Associations that shall be under its supervision, but shall be an advisory body to help them.

Fiscal Policy

46. The fiscal year of the Association shall begin on the first day of August and end on the thirty-first day of July in each year.

47. All checks, drafts, or other orders for the payment of moneynotes or other evidences of indebtedness issued in the name of the Association, shall be signed by such officer or officers, agent or agents of the Association and in such manner as shall from time to time be determined by resolution of the General Board.

48. No loans shall be contracted on behalf of the Association and no evidences of indebtedness shall be issued in its name unless authorized by a resolution.

49. The General Board by a majority vote of the voting delegates of the State Association, shall be authorized to create or to increase any bonded indebtedness of the Association.

50. The General Board of the Association shall be authorized by a majority vote of the voting delegates of the State Association, to sell, lease, exchange, mortgage, pledge, or otherwise dispose of all, or substantially all, of the property and the assets of the Association.

51. All funds of the corporation not otherwise employed shall be deposited from time to time to the credit of the Association in such banks, trust companies, or other depositories as the General Board may select.

52. The salaries of employees shall be fixed from time to time by the General Board.

Standing Rules

53. The meetings of the State Association and General Board shall be governed by the rules of parlimentary law as set forth in Robert's Rules of Order, except in the case of those rules which are superseded by some rule of this organization.

54. The Clerk or Assistant Clerk, or in their absence, the senior minister in age shall call the Association to order for business, and call the Moderator or Assistant Moderator to the chair, and if neither Moderator or Assistant Moderator is present, then the senior minister in age shall act as chairman to open the floor for nominations and carry out the election of a Moderator Pro-Tem.

55. All business, except routine, shall be brought before the body by committee, but shall any committee refuse or fail to present to this body by business given it by any delegate of this Association, then such business may be presented to the body by any delegate, but cannot be discussed unless by a majority vote of this body.

56. Anyone desiring to speak shall rise and say "Brother Moderator" but shall speak no further until he or she is recognized by the Moderator.

57. No one shall speak more than five minutes, or more than twice, on the same subject without the consent of the Moderator.

58. Any delegate of this body can appeal from the decision of the Moderator of the Association, and by a majority vote thereon, the objection

shall be sustained or rejected.

59. No one shall leave the Association when in a business session without the consent of the Moderator.

60. The Moderator shall stop all discussions when not carried on in a Christian spirit, or when he thinks it is likely to lead to discord or division.

61. All business coming before this Association shall be decided by secret ballot when there is any opposition or objection to open vote.

Amendments

62. These By-Laws may be amended at any regular session by a two-thirds majority vote after the proposed amendment had laid on the table one day.
