PROCEEDINGS OF THE MISSOURI STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS When convened with the Waynesville Free Will Baptist Church of Waynesville, Missouri, August 1971

TUESDAY, 7:30 P.M. AUGUST 17, 1971

The fifty-eighth session of Missouri State Association of Free Will Baptists convened on Tuesday night at 7:30 p.m., August 17, 1971, at the Waynesville High School Auditorium in Waynesville, Missouri. The service opened by the congregation's singing "To God Be The Glory" led by Brother Andy Lay. Brother Ken Goff then led in prayer followed by another congregational number, "Amazing Grace".

The session was officially convened by the clerk, Brother Bill Evans. The host pastor, Brother Vergel Maness, gave the welcome and Brother O. T. Allred gave the response.

The Moderator, Brother Clarence Burton, then brought the moderator's message. Following his message he presented a plaque from the State Association to Brother Woodrow Matthews for his past service to our state as moderator. Brother Glenn Murray, chairman of the Youth Camp Board, then presented plaques of appreciation to Mrs. Freeda Sells and Rev. and Mrs. William (Bill) Reeves for their faithful service to our State Camp.

The Faith Singers of Conway, Missouri, were then introduced and sang three special numbers.

An offering in the amount of \$74.76 was received for convention expenses.

The clerk reread the report of the Committee on Committees.

The report of the Credentials Committee was read. M/S/C to receive this as a partial report.

The clerk read the Statistical Report, M/S/C to receive this report.

The Moderator introduced Rev. Milton Crowson to give the report of the National Executive Secretary's Office. M/S/C to receive this report as information.

Rev. Bert Tippett was introduced to give the report of Free Will Baptist Bible College, M/S/C to receive this report as information.

The report of the National Church Training Service was given by Mr. Fred Green. He presented a birthday gift from the National CTS Department to Brother Harry Beatty. M/S/C to receive this report as information.

The report of the General Board was read. M/S/C that this report be received and tabled to be adopted item by item later.

Rev. Roger Reeds was recognized to give the report of the National Sunday School Board. M/S/C to receive this report as information.

The moderator then recessed the business session until 1:30 p.m.

WEDNESDAY, 11:00 A.M. AUGUST 18, 1971

Congregational singing was led by Brother George Bryant. Brother Woodrow Matthews led in prayer. Two specials were given by the Jones Family of Lebanon. Brother Lawrence Thompson who was presiding then introduced Brother Henry Long,

who brought the message, "Building God's Church in The 20th Century - The Master Builder".

The service was dismissed in prayer.

WEDNESDAY, 1:30 P.M. AUGUST 18, 1971

Brother Joe Fulkerson led the congregation in singing. Brother Archie Cooper was introduced to bring the devotion. He spoke from II Kings 13:14.

M/S/C to take the report of the General Board from the table and discuss it item by item. M/S/C to adopt recommendation No. 1. M/S/C to adopt item No. 2. M/S/C to adopt section A of recommendation No. 3. M/S/C to adopt section B of No. 3. M/S/C to adopt section C of No. 3. M/S/C to adopt section D of No. 3. M/S/C to adopt section E of No. 3 after some discussion and M/S/C of the previous question. M/S/C to adopt section F of No. 3. M/S/C to receive recommendation No. 4 and lay it on the table. M/S/C to adopt recommendation No. 5.

The State Promotional Secretary gave his report. M/S/C to receive this report and give commendation to Brother Beatty for his work.

The report of the National Home Mission Board was given by Rev. Roy Thomas. M/S/C to receive this report as information.

Brother Lawrence Thompson gave the report of the State Home Mission Board M/S/C to receive this report.

Rev. J. Reford Wilson presented a report of the Foreign Mission Department. M/S/C to receive this report as information.

Brother Glenn Murray presented the report of the Youth Camp Board. M/S/C to adopt this report.

Mr. James G. Eads, representing the Christian Civic Foundation of Missouri, gave us a report. M/S/C to receive his report for information.

A partial report was made by the Resolution Committee. M/S/C to receive this report and place it on the table.

WEDNESDAY, 7:30 P.M. AUGUST 18, 1971

The service was opened by singing "We've A Story To Tell" directed by Brother Frank Giunta. Brother Johnny Land led in prayer and the congregation sang "At The Cross". Brother Jim Mc Allister who was presiding, introduced Brother Cliff Bowman who presented plaques to Brother Lawrence Thompson, pastor of the Victory Church in Kansas City, for the greatest financial support of State Home Missions and to Brother Vergel Maness, pastor of the Waynesville Church for the highest per capita giving to State Home Missions during the past year.

Brother Giunta expressed his appreciation to the State for its support and requested prayer for their plans for revival and the purchase of a bus.

The Mc Allister family sang "He Did It All For Me" followed by the congregation singing "The Solid Rock".

Rev. Wesley Calvery was introduced and brought the evening message, "Building God's Church In The 20th Century - The Design Of The Church". An offering in the amount of \$185.41 was received for the Calvery's account.

Brother Andy Lay gave his Trustees report for Hillsdale College. M/S/C to receive this report and commend Brother Lay.

M/S/C to take from the table the report of the Resolution Committee and dispose of n, it item by item, Item No. 1 was reread, M/S/C to table this recommendation for one ng/s

year. Item No. 2 was reread. M/S/C to adopt item No. 2. Item No. 3 was reread. M/S/C to adopt item No. 3. M/S to table this item and refer it to the General Board for further study concerning the section reading "any interest in our function on said Board for the period of one year". The motion failed. M/S to refer this recommendation to the Resolution Committee to clarify "any interest in or function on said Board for the period of one year". The motion failed. Following the loss of the motions to table and refer the previous question was M/S/C. M/S to reconsider item No. 3 as to its position in the By-Laws. The motion was withdrawn by Brother Donovan Maxwell, who had placed it before the body.

An omission from the General Board's report was read. M/S/C to adopt this recommendation as amended. M/S/C to amend by striking out the words "Home Mission Board".

The report of the Obituary Committee was read. M/S/C to adopt this report.

M/S/C to place the name, age and address of all our ministers who pass away during the year in our printed minutes.

The report of the Placement Committee was read. M/S/C to receive this report and adopt it item by item. M/S/C to adopt item No. 1. M/S/C to adopt item No. 2.

Brother Jim Bundy read the report of the Sunday School and Church Training Service Board, M/S/C to adopt this report.

M/S/C to take from the table the amendment to By-Law No. 10. M/S/C to adopt this amendment,

The report of the Registration Committee was read. M/S/C to receive this report.

The final report of the Resolution Committee was read. M/S/C that this report be received and adopted item by item. M/S/C to adopt item No. 1. M/S/C to adopt item No. 2.

M/S/C to send a letter of appreciation to the Waynesville School Board for the use of their facilities.

The moderator appointed the committee to establish a unified bookkeeping system: James Mc Allister, chairman, Millard Sasser and Roger Harwell.

The Nominating Committee's report was read. M/S/C to receive this report and adopt it after the floor was opened to nominations for each office. Brother Billy Walker declined the nomination to the Superannuation Board. Brother Millard Sasser was nominated and a M/S/C to elect by acclamation. Brother James Barker resigned from the Superannuation Board. Brother A. B. Brown was nominated to fill his unexpired term of four years. M/S/C to elect by acclamation. No other nomination was made for any office. M/S/C that we declare this slate of nominees offered by the Committee be elected by acclamation and that the officers of this session be given a standing vote of thanks.

The report of the Superannuation Board was given by Brother C. B. Dees. M/S/C to receive this report as an outline of work for the coming year.

M/S/C that the Moderator be empowered to appoint delegates to the National Association next year. Appointments are to be made no later than June 1, 1972.

M/S/C to adjourn the session.

THURSDAY, 11:00 A.M. AUGUST 19, 1971

Service was opened with Brother Andy Lay leading the congregation in singing, "Work For The Night Is Coming". Rev. Jerry Pinkerton missionary appointee to Ivory Coast, led in prayer, after which a special number was given by Vergel Maness and Charlene Keesling. The congregation then sang "Victory In Jesus". Brother A. B. Brown who was presiding then introduced Brother Jim Bundy who brought the final message of the Association, "Building God's Church In The 20th Century - Durability of the Church."

The moderator, Brother Burton, asked Rev. Pinkerton to give a word of greeting to the Association after which the service was dismissed in prayer.

GENERAL BOARD REPORT

The General Board of the Missouri State Association of Free Will Baptist met three times during the past year: August 20, 1970 at Bridgeton, Mo.; November 17, 1970 at St. Louis; and August 16-17 at Waynesville, Mo. A quorum was present at each meeting. The following business was transacted by the Board:

- 1) Renewed the contract with Brother Beatty as our State Promotional Secretary.
- 2) Hired Brother Eddie Altis as editor of the GEM.
- 3) Arranged for the audit of the records of the treasurers of all the State Boards as well as the State Treasurer.
- 4) Instructed the Promotional Secretary and clerk to compile a written form containing the details of the Promotional Secretary's contract.
- Accepted the invitation of the Laclede County Association to host the 1971 session of the State Association in the First FWB Church of Waynesville, Mo.
- 6) Appointed a three man committee, (Cliff Bowman, Roger Harwell and Wayne Wagner) to assist the Youth Camp Board for the coming year.
- 7) Appointed a committee to suggest changes and clarification of the By-Laws regarding the duties of the clerk.
- Appointed a committee to look into the cost of printing the GEM within the state.

9) Heard the reports of all Boards and the Promotional Secretary and forwarded their financial reports and proposed budgets for your approval.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The General Board recommends the following items to the State Association for adoption:

- 1) Whereas: There is a large Negro Free Will Baptist Denomination in Missouri with like doctrinal beliefs, and
 - Whereas: It does not seem right that two denominations with the same basic doctrine in the same state should remain such strangers to each other.

We recommend that this Association appoint Brother Andy Lay, and one other Minister chosen by Brother Lay, to meet with the Negro Free Will Baptist brethern, and attempt to work out some kind of acceptable fellowship with them, and report same to the fall meeting of the General Board.

- 2) Whereas: It has often been the experience of the General Board to face incorrect and confused financial reports from different boards and accounts, and
 - Whereas: The treasurers in charge of these reports are frequently changed, thereby changing the method of bookkeeping,

We recommend that a three man committee be appointed by the moderator to prepare a unified bookkeeping system for all departments, boards and accounts of the Missouri State Association of FWB. We further recommend that each board or treasurer be directed to make all necessary information and records available to this committee, and that this proposal be presented at the November meeting of the General Board. Travel and miscellaneous expenses of this committee to be paid out of the General Fund Account.

- 3) Whereas: The State Association has voted to move the Missouri State Headquarters and Bookstore from St. Louis to Lebanon as soon as the present building is sold; and
 - Whereas: Shackled with the Bookstore, the Promotional Department is rapidly becoming a project greater than a Promotional Secretary can handle; and
 - Whereas: The Sunday School Department of the National Association of Free Will Baptist has offered to allow our Bookstore to sell their literature to our Missouri Churches, producing an additional income for the Bookstore; and
 - Whereas: It is our opinion that a bookstore could prosper in Lebanon and could be a real ministry to Missouri FWB Churches, as well as a financial asset to our State Association; and
 - Whereas: Other FWB State Association such as Arkansas, Oklahoma and North Carolina now have prosperous bookstores that are paying their own way;

We therefore submit the following recommendations:

A) That the Bookstore be separated from the Promotional Dept.; and that the Promotional Secretary continue carrying a portable bookstore, the proceeds from which would go into the Promotional Department for expenses. The Promotional Secretary will purchase his supplies through the Bookstore.

- B) That the Bookstore be moved to Lebanon into a rented store building in the business section of town and opened for business on or before January 2, 1972 with a big emphasis on VBS material for all Missouri FWB Churches, and local churches of other denominations; and a special emphasis being placed on the sale of Sunday School literature. The General Board, through the ministry of the Promotional Secretary and other means will make a special effort to urge all our Missouri churches to purchase all their Sunday School and VBS supplies from our State Bookstore.
- C) That the Executive Committee of the Missouri State Association manage the bookstore; hire necessary employees; set up a supply of books, music, and Bibles that will sell; and manage the facilities housing the bookstore. They will report to the General Board each time said Board meets and shall present a yearly financial report for auditing.
- D) That all items now owned by the bookstore, including all furniture and supplies not necessary to the efficient operation of the Promotional Department, become the property of the bookstore in Lebanon.
- E) That the General Board of the Missouri State Association of Free Will Baptist proceed with its attempts to sell the existing Headquarters building for an amount sufficient to pay off the existing indebtedness, which would be approximately \$8,200.00 as of December 1, 1971 (for a larger sum if possible).
- F) That the Missouri State Association, via the bookstore, enter into a contract with the National Sunday School Department to sell Sunday School literature and supplies.
- 4) That By-Law number 10 be amended by deletion of section (d), and relettering present section (e) as (d) and section (f) as (e).
- 5) That the following budget for the State Cooperative Fund be adopted:

That we pay off the bond program on the Headquarters Building December 1, 1971 for \$9,370.00 by borrowing \$4,000.00 from some source and taking the remainder from the balance of all accounts on hand. These loans would be charged against the Headquarters Account to be paid off when the building is sold and until such a time to repay the outside loan at the present rate of \$175.50 per month.

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SUPERANNUATION BOARD REPORT

We the Superannuation Board would like to make the following recommendations:

In order to have a closer coordination of the work of the clergy and other Christian workers, we feel it fitting to have this organization, for fellowship, assistance, and help in the work of the Lord.

All ministers, Christian workers and employees of the Free Will Baptist Church are eligible for membership, who will pay the annual membership dues and any other requirements that may be made from time to time.

The Associated Ministers United shall have complete control of its membership, rules and plan of work. But shall have as their advisory and council a Board of Trustees to consist of five (5) members to be elected by the State Association.

The officers shall be a president, vice-president and secretary-treasurer, who shall be elected by the organization and shall hold office at the direction of the group.

There shall be an initial five dollar (\$5,00) membership fee which shall be paid in advance and a one dollar (\$1,00) monthly dues for continued participation.

The plan of work, programs, projects and business of the organization shall be directed by a vote of the whole membership, and a simple majority vote shall be the rule.

The name of the Superannuation Board be changed to FREE WILL BAPTIST ASSOCIATED MINISTERS UNITED.

- 1. The organization shall be a non-profit organization for Free Will Baptist ministers and Christian workers.
- The purpose of this organization shall be to assist members in the cost of hospital and medical cost.
 - a. Provided said member has some type of reliable hospital and medical insurance.
 - b. Assistance not to exceed an amount determined by the organizations officers and trustees.
- 3. To provide monthly assistance to retired ministers and Christians workers, provided said person has been active in the Lord's work.

The Board of Superannuation shall be the first Board of Trustees whose term of office shall expire as the present Superannuation Board term expires.

The Board of Trustees shall be responsible for the election of the first years officers of this organization.

We recommend that the churches of our state be encouraged to contribute all or part of their employees membership fee and dues.

As the pastors can't very well present and be responsible for this going through, we recommend that the promotional secretary along with the president of the organization promote this throughout our state.

REPORT OF HILLSDALE FWB COLLEGE TO THE MISSOURI STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS Convening at Waynesville, August 16-19, 1971 By Missouri's Representative on The Trustee Board: Andy Lay

Things are HAPPENING AT HILLSDALE. As you have already noticed, we have changed our name since last year, from Oklahoma Bible College, to Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College. "Oklahoma" was removed from the name because the Oklahoma State Association voted to make Hillsdale a regional school, rather than a state school. The board of trustees is now composed of representatives of Arkansas, Colorado, Kansas, Missouri, New Mexico, and Texas as well as Oklahoma. The words "Bible College" were removed from the name because Hillsdale is committed to a Christian liberal arts approach to education, rather than the Bible College approach. Of course, Hillsdale is no less Christian, and no less Bible-centered than before. We are simply attempting to fill the Christian education gap that exists in our denomination by providing a place where our young people can get accredited liberal arts training in a Free Will Baptist institution standing firmly upon Bible standards.

Speaking of accreditation, that's another thing that is HAPPENING AT HILLSDALE. This past April Hillsdale College was granted accreditation status by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education. That means that credits received by a student at Hillsdale can be transferred to other colleges and universities in the Oklahoma State System of Higher Education, with full academic respect.

HAPPENING? Recent personnel changes give us both regret and anticipation. Long time friends of the school noted with regret the resignation of Dr. J. D. O'Donnell from the presidency of Hillsdale, though we, in the state of Missouri, can rejoice in that his leaving Hillsdale brought him to our state, as pastor of the Grant Avenue Free Will Baptist Church in Springfield. We view with eager anticipation, however, the future of Hillsdale under the leadership of the newly elected president, Mr. Bill Jones, a 10 year veteran of missionary service in Ivory Coast, Africa.

But all of these things that are HAPPENING AT HILLSDALE are but shadows compared to what is HAPPENING in the lives of the students who attend there. Knowledge gained...skills attained...spiritual lives deepened...bodies disciplined...social lives developed...all for the express purpose of enabling Christian young people to carry out the Great Commission more effectively. Some as occupational Christian workers. Some as laymen and laywomen. All as ambassadors of Jesus Christ, "approved unto God", alert, eager, effective. That's the best thing that's HAPPENING AT HILLSDALE.

Oh yes, we have statistics. Out of a gift income of approximately \$80,000 last fiscal year, \$3,281.24 of it came from Missouri, \$1730.80 of that came through the cooperative plan, and \$1,550.44 came directly from individuals and churches. Churches regularly supporting Hillsdale, directly to the school, either through their church treasuries or from individuals within the churches are: Cabool, Grant Avenue in Springfield, Hazel Creek, Joplin, Monett, Mountain Grove, and Lebanon. Other churches in the state have supported to a lesser extent, Six members of the student body totaling 79, recorded a home address in Missouri.

HAPPENING? Things are HAPPENING AT HILLSDALE. But the things that happen don't just happen. Some one makes them happen. One wise man said 75% of the people do not know anything is happening. 20% of the people observe what is happening, but 5% of the people make things happen. We hope you will be among the 5% to help make things continue to HAPPEN AT HILLSDALE. We need your prayers, your financial support, and your students, so we can keep on saying: "Things are HAPPENING AT HILLSDALE".

In just 15 years we have seen our work grow from a deficit account of \$6,000 and no missionaries to a budget of \$221,450 and a good group of fine missionaries. Although we have not yet sent missionaries to every state, there is no state where we have churches that our Board has not helped in some way.

I urge you to pray for laborers. There are ten states and 24 capital cities that do not have a Free Will Baptist church. There are 17 other states that are not strong enough to fully support a missionary. May God give us men with a pioneer spirit who will go out and start new churches.

Brother E. B. Ledlow has just begun his work with us. I believe he will prove to be a great asset in helping our present missionaries as well as assisting in opening up new churches.

Four new couples have just been appointed. Reverend Jesse Dunn and family will begin a new church in Boise, Idaho. Reverend and Mrs. Bob Duncan have already started services in Oklahoma City. Charles Francen and family will go to Puerto Rico this summer and Reverend Sunny Wenning and family will go to the Virgin Islands. We desire your prayers and support for each of these missionaries.

We are keenly conscious of the need for more churches in your state and stand ready to help in any way we can. More of our states are finding it helpful to start churches within their state as a joint project with the National Home Mission Board. In every state where we have worked in this way the project has been successful.

I want to express thanks for the part you have in home missions. Last year you gave \$12,714.45 missing your quota \$2,285.55. So far this year you have given, as of July 19, \$7,385.64-leaving a balance to reach your quota of \$9,614.45. Name

1.) This Association shall be called the Missouri State Association for Free Will Baptists.

Purpose

2.) The Object of this Association shall be the bringing together of the Free Will Baptists of the State of Missouri in one annual gathering that we may become better acquainted with one another, the upholding of the Free Will Baptists Churches of Missouri, and a world-wide outreach of souls.

Membership

3.) The Association shall be composed of the members of the various local affiliated Associations.

4.) Any organized Quarterly Meeting, Yearly Meeting, or Ass. of Free Will Baptists, may unite with this body at any regular session, through a letter or delegates by a two-thirds vote of all delegates present.

Officers

5.) The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, and Assistant Clerk, who shall be elected annually at the close of each session and hold their office until their successors are elected and gualified.

6.) The officers of this body shall submit, at every session, a report of the work done for this Association.

7.) The moderator shall be the principal executive officer of the Association and he shall sign, with the Clerk or any other people officer or agent of the Association thereunto authorized by the General Board, any deeds, mortgages, bonds, contracts, or other instruments which the General Board has authorized to be executed, except in cases where the signing and execution thereof shall be expressly delegated by the General Board or by these by-laws to some other officer or agent of the Association, or shall be required by law to be otherwise signed or executed. The duties of the moderator shall include presiding at the meetings of the State Association, the General Board or Executive Committee; to call special meetings of the General Board or Executive Committee when the conditions of by-law 43 are fulfilled; to appoint such committees as are created without provision for their selection; to set the time and place for the meetings of the General Board and Executive Committee; and in general, to fulfill whatever responsibilities may be commensurate with his office or delegated to him by the body or General Board.

8.) In the absence of the Moderator, or in the event of his death, inability, or refusal to act, the Assistant Moderator shall perform the duties of the Moderator, and when so acting, shall have all the powers of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the Moderator. The Assistant Moderator shall perform such duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the Moderator or by the General Board.

9.) The Clerk shall keep an accurate record of all business transactions; shall superintend the printing of the Minutes and shall receive an honorarium of an amount agreed upon by this body.

10.) The Clerk shall: (a) keep the Minutes of the Association and of the General Board meetings in one or more books provided for the purpose; (b) see that all notices are given in accordance with the provisions of these By-Laws or as required by law; (c) be custodian of the Association records and of the seal of the Association and see that the seal of the Association is affixed to all documents the execution of which on behalf of the Association under its seal is duly authorized; (d) in general, perform all duties incident to the office of Clerk and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the Moderator or by the General Board; and (e) in the absence of the Clerk, or in the event of his death, inability, or refusal to act, the Assistant Clerk shall perform the duties of the Clerk and

when so acting, shall have all the power of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the Clerk. The Assistant Clerk shall perform such duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the Clerk or by the General Board.

11.) No officer shall serve the same office more than three consecutive years.

Boards

12.) All standing boards shall be composed of five members, exclusive of the General Board. Standing Boards include the Home Missions Board, the Sunday School and Church Training Service Board, the Youth Camp Board, the Superannuation Board, and the General Board.

13.) The duties of the various standing boards shall be to plan a program and supervise its operation in their respective fields, and to receive, hold, manage, use or convey.and funds and property entrusted to said Boards.

Election

14.) The personnel of each of the foregoing, exclusive of the General Board, shall be elected as follows: The first named for a term of one year, the second for a term of two years, and third for a term of three years, the fourth for a term of four years, and the fifth for a term of five years, and thereafter each shall be elected for a term of five years.

15.) The personnel of the General Board shall be composed of the officers of the State Association; the chairmen of all standing boards and one member from each affiliated Association to be elected by the State Body whose term of office shall be two years and so constituted that the expiration date of the term of office of half of these shall expire one year and the other half the following year. This shall be determined by alphabetical order of the name of the affiliated Association.

16.) No person shall fill more than one office at the same time except as he may become a member of the General Board by virtue of being Chairman of the Board of which he is an elected member.

17.) Any vacancy occuring in the General Board may be filled by the affirmative vote of a majority of the remaining Board members though less than a quorum of the General Board, unless otherwise provided by law.

18.) All Board members elected to fill a vacancy shall be elected for the unexpired term of his predecessor in office.

19.) Any member of the standing board of the State Association who does not put forth any interest in or function on said board for the period of one year, shall have his office declared vacant and a new member be elected by this Association to fill his unexpired term of office.

Duties

20.) The General Board shall have power to act in behalf of, and for the State Association from one regular session to another, and shall have power to elect such officers as may be necessary to cary out the plans and undertakings of the State Association. The General Board shall have the right to employ a Promotional Secretary who shall serve as Treasurer of the Association and be responsible for handling all monies of the Association. He shall be bonded for an amount in excess of the monies he shall be handling. The Promotional Secretary shall in general promote the denominational and Associational enterprises and the cause of Christ. He shall make an annual financial report to the Association.

21.) The General Board shall have power to fill any irregular vacancies that may occur in its own body and shall also have power to fill any irregular vacancies that may occur in any department of work between sessions of the State Association. It shall be the duty of this Board to make written reports of all its work to each session.

22.) An Executive Committee, consisting of seven members of the General Board, shall be composed of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk of the State Association, and four other members to be elected annually by the General Board, whose duty it shall be to act on all matters coming within the scope of the

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work of the Board when said Board is not in session. It shall also plan and execute the program for the annual sessions of the Missouri State Association.

23.) A majority of the number of the General Board members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of the General Board, but if less than such majority is present at a meeting, a majority of the Board members present may adjourn the meeting from time to time without further notice.

24.) An act of the majority of the Board members present at a meeting at which a quorum is present, shall be an act of the General Board.

25.) A Board member of the Association who is present at a meeting of the General Board at which action on any Association matter is taken shall be presumed to have assented to the action taken unless his dissent shall be entered in the Minutes of the meeting.

26.) The General Board may authorize any officer of officers, Agent or Agents to enter into any contract or execute and deliver any instrument in the name of and on behalf of the Association, and such authority may be general or confined to specific instances.

27.) Any person or agent elected or appointed by the General Board may be removed by the General Board whenever in its judgement the best interests of the Association would be served thereby, but such removal shall be without prejudice to the contract rights, if any, of the persons so removed.

28.) By resolution of the General Board the Board members may be paid their expenses, if any, of attendance of each meeting of the General Board. No such payment shall preclude any Board member from serving the Association in any other capacity and receiving compensation therefore.

29.) The General Board shall provide an Association seal which shall be circular in form and shall have inscribed thereon the name of the corporation and the state of incorporation and the words, "Corporate Seal."

Committees

30.) The Moderator shall appoint a committee on committees consisting of five members who shall appoint all committees.

31.) All resolutions and reports shall bear the name of all the members of the committee who favor them; and if the names be not a majority of all members of such committee, than the clerk shall not read the resolutions or report.

Representation

32.) The standing delegates of this Association shall be all ordained Free Will Baptist ministers and their companions, all ordained deacons, and Associational Clerks, provided they are members in good standing in some Free Will Baptist Church belonging to this State Association.

33.) The number of elected delegates to the State Association shall be seven delegates from each affiliated local association or yearly meeting; one delegate from each church, plus one delegate for each fifty members or larger fraction thereof. Each church which represents must be a member of a local association or yearly meeting holding membership in this body.

34.) This Association may correspond by messenger or otherwise with other religious bodies.

Voting

35.) Those entitled to vote at any annual or special meeting of this State Association, shall be the elected delegates and the standing delegates as defined in By-Law 32 and 33, and each elected delegate or standing delegate shall be entitled to one vote.

36.) A majority vote shall be final upon all subjects except to amend the By-Laws receive Quarterly Meetings or Associations, and the changing of the members of the committees appointed by the Moderator, then it shall require a two-thirds majority.

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Meetings

37.) The sessions of the Association shall convene on Tuesday evening at 7:30 P.M. following the third Sunday in August each year.

38.) The membership of the State Association may designate any place, either within or without the State of Missouri for any annual meeting. Any special meeting may be called by the General Board. A waiver of notice signed by all members entitled to vote at a meeting may designate any place, either within or without the State of Missouri, unless otherwise prescribed by statue, as the place for the holding of such meeting. If no designation is made, or if a special meeting be otherwise called, the place of the meeting shall be the principal office of the corporation in the State of Missouri.

39.) In the event the necessity arises from war, or pestilence, or any cause which prevents a regular meeting of the State Association, whether such a condition is of a local or general condition, then the General Board shall be privileged to call and act with full authority in all matters pertaining to the general welfare of the State Association, providing whatever transaction passed shall be by two-thirds vote of the members present, and providing that such transactions shall not conflict with the purpose and edicts of the By-Laws of the State Association.

40.) Special meetings of the Association, for any purpose or purposes, unless otherwise prescribed by statue, may be called by the General Board, and shall be called by the Moderator at the request of not less than fifty percent of all the delegate members duly elected by local Associations, Quarterly Meeting, and local churches affiliated with the Association.

41.) Seven or more ordained ministers or deacons from two or more affiliated associations belonging to the State Association, shall constitute a quorum to transact business.

42.) All business meetings shall be opened by singing, reading a portion from God's Word, and prayer, and shall be closed with prayer.

43.) Special meetings of the General Board or the Executive Committee shall be called when necessary by the Moderator, with the written consent of three other members of the Executive Committee. Special meetings of the General Board shall also be called upon the written request of one-fourth of its members. Special meetings of the Executive Committee shall also be called upon the written request of a majority of its members.

44.) Notice of any special meeting shall be given at least fifteen days previously thereto by written notice delivered personally or mailed to each Board member at his business address, or by telegram. If mailed, such notice shall be deemed to be delivered when deposited in the United States mail so addressed, with postage thereon prepaid. If notice be given by telegram, such notice shall be deemed to be delivered when the telegram is delivered to the telegraph company. Any Board member may waive notice of any meeting. The attendance of a Board member at a meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting, except where a Board member attends a meeting for the express purpose of objecting to the transaction of any business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened.

45.) Unless otherwise provided by law, whenever any notice is required to be given to any member of Board member of the Association under the provisions of these By-Laws or under the provisions of the articles of incorporation, a waiver thereof in writing, signed by the person or persons entitled to such notice whether before or after writing, signed by the person or persons entitled to such notice whether before or after the time stated therein, shall be deemed equivalent to the giving of such notice.

Discipline

46.) The State Association shall not usurp any authority over the Quarterly Meetings or Associations that shall be under its supervision, but shall be an advisory body to help them.

Fiscal Policy

47.) The fiscal year of the Association shall begin on the first day of August and end on the thirty-first day of July in each year.

48.) All checks, drafts, or other orders for the payment of money notes or other evidences of indebtedness issued in the name of the Association, shall be signed by such officer or officers, agent or agents of the Association and in such manner as shall from time to time be determined by resolution of the General Board.

49.) No loans shall be contracted on behalf of the Association and no evidences of indebtedness shall be issued in its name unless authorized by a resolution.

50.) The General Board by a majority vote of the voting delegates of the State Association, shall be authorized to create or to increase any bonded indebtedness of the Association.

51.) The General Board of the Association shall be authorized by a majority vote of the voting delegates of the State Association, to sell, lease, exchange, mortgage, pledge, or otherwise dispose of all, or substantially all, of the property and the assets of the Association.

52.) All funds of the corporation not otherwise employed shall be deposited from time to time to the credit of the Association in such banks, trust companies, or other depositories as the General Board may select.

53.) The salaries of employees shall be fixed from time to time by the General Board.

Standing Rules

54.) The meetings of the State Association and General Board shall be governed by the rules of parlimentary law as set forth in Robert's Rules of Order, except in the case of those rules which are superseded by some rule of this organization.

55.) The Clerk or Assistant Clerk, or in their absence, the senior minister in age shall call the Association to order for business, and call the Moderator or Assistant Moderator to the chair, and if neither Moderator or Assistant Moderator is present, then the senior minister in age shall act as Chairman to open the floor for nominations and carry out the election of a Moderator Pro-Tem.

56.) All business, except routine, shall be brought before the body by committee, but shall any committee refuse or fail to present to this body the business given it by any delegate of this Association, then such business may be presented to the body by any delegate, but cannot be discussed unless by a majority vote of this body.

57.) Anyone desiring to speak shall rise and say "Brother Moderator" but shall speak no further until he or she is recognized by the Moderator.

58.) No one shall speak more than five minutes, or more than twice, on the same subject without the consent of the Moderator.

59.) Any delegate of this body can appeal from the decision of the Moderator of the Association, and by a majority vote thereon, the objection shall be sustained or rejected.

60.) No one shall leave the Association when in a business session without the consent of the Moderator.

61.) The Moderator shall stop all discussions when not carried on in a Christian spirit, or when he thinks it is likely to lead to discord or division.

62.) All business coming before this Association shall be decided by secret ballot when there is any opposition or objection to open vote.

Amendments

63.) These By-Laws may be amended at any regular session by a two-thirds majority vote after the proposed amendment had laid on the table one day.
