PROCEEDINGS OF THE 93rd ANNUAL MISSOURI STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

When convened at the Clarion Hotel in Springfield, MO on June 5-7, 2006

Monday Evening June 5, 2006

Rev. Jim Williams, Moderator, Presiding.

Rev. Ken Simpson, Clerk, convened the 93rd Annual Missouri State Association of Free Will Baptists.

Rev. Gary Michener gave the welcome.

Rev. Rick Dement gave the response.

Moderator, Jim Williams recognized missionaries Jeff Cates (Texas) and Jeff Turnbough (Spain). Each missionary gave a brief greeting and report.

Rev. Greg Smith led the congregation in singing accompanied by several instrumentalists. After the evening offering was collected the men's quartet from First FWB Church of Ozark, MO sang the special music. Also, the trio, New Mercy, from Free Will Baptist Bible College in Nashville, TN sang a special song right before the evening message by Rev. Tim York.

Rev. Tim York preached a message from Luke 24:46 entitled, *Preaching In His Name*. He mentioned the scope of our preaching, the subject of our preaching and the success that comes when Christ is preached.

The Moderator appointed the Committee on Committees and then the congregation was dismissed in prayer.

Tuesday Morning, June 6, 2006

9:00a.m. CE Workshop

Rev. Greg Smith led some congregational singing and then Rev. Roger Hogan introduced the speaker for the Christian Education Seminar. Our speaker was

Rev. Glen Johnson from Chesterfield, VA. He spoke on *How to Have a Prayer Revival*.

11 a.m. Worship Service

Rev. Jerry Norris, presiding.

Rev. Glen Johnson brought an encouraging message regarding the Church's mission to reach lost people for Jesus. The service was concluded with prayer.

Tuesday Afternoon, June 6, 2006

Rev. Jim Williams, Moderator, presiding in the business session.

Assistant Moderator, Rev. Rick Dement led the delegates and visitors in singing, Victory in Jesus. Moderator, Jim Williams called on Rev. Frank Webster to open the meeting with prayer.

The moderator asked the clerk to read the credentials report. After the report was read there was a motion and second to receive the report. Motion carried and the delegates were seated.

Moderator's Devotion: Rev. Jim Williams brought a devotion from I Cor. 16:14-18. His subject was *Missions in Action*.

- 1. Find someone who has been actively involved in missions.
- Work under the leadership of those who are already involved in the work.
- 3. Follow their lead to establish more churches around the world.
- 4. Be a leader in giving and support.
- 5. If we labor together all the needs will be met.
- 6. This makes the job of those involved less stressful. (vs. 18a)
- 7. All of it must be administrative through love.

The General Board Report was read by the clerk. An item of information was first read regarding the formation of a study committee charged by the General Board to research the standards for ordination and report back to the General Board.

There was a motion to receive the report and act on it item by item. S/C.

We, the general board, recommend the following items to the State Association:

Item #1: The General Board recommends that the State Association receive the Special Missions Committee's report and discuss their recommendations. S/C.

Steve Reeves was recognized to give the report to the State Association. There was lengthy discussion on this issue.

Item #2: Recommend the Special Missions Committee's report be tabled until Wednesday. The Clerk read the present bylaws and the proposed changes to them. M/S/C.

Executive Department Report by Rev. Gary Fry (see pages 3-20 of the Digest of Reports).

- Recommend an increase to the budget to the GEM magazine. (from \$17,000 in 2006 to \$26,820 in 2007). This would provide slick paper, full color, and printing and mailing outsourced to Randall House Publication.
- Recommend that we increase the semiannual deposit of funds into the pastor's retirement account from \$500 to \$550 for those pastors whose churches are part of the cooperative plan.

Motion to receive the report and adopt the budget. S/C.

Motion to elect Melvin Moon to replace Melvin Moon term expiring 2011. S/C.

State Home Missions Board by Rev. Dale Cochran (see pages 26-31 of the Digest of Reports).

Motion to receive the report and adopt the budget. S/C.

Motion to elect Rev. Nathan Ruble replacing Rev. RE Helsley term expiring 2011. S/C.

Mr. Ken Akers brought a report from the National Master's Men Department.

Youth Ministries Board Report by Rev. Randy Rains (see pages 45-47 of the Digest of Reports).

Motion to receive the report and adopt the budget. S/C.

Motion to elect Dennis McGinley to replace Dennis McGinley term expiring 2011. S/C.

Moderator asked delegates to stand and be dismissed by prayer. Rev. Glenn Rehkop prayed.

Tuesday Evening, June 6, 2006

Dr. Doug Earls, presiding.

After a welcome from Dr. Doug Earls, a greeting was given by two missionaries, Nate Altom, missionary to Pittsburgh, PA and Matthew Turnbough, missionary to Spain.

Rev. Greg Smith led the congregation in singing followed by a prayer from Dr. Doug Earls. The Grant Avenue Mixed Quartet sang a special. After more congregational singing, Monica Reynolds sang a solo. The ushers were called to receive the evening offering, prayer was given by Rev. Dale Cochran and the FWBBC trio, New Mercy, sand during the offering. Dr. Earls introduced the speaker, Rev. Richard Atwood. Bro. Atwood delivered the message from Psalm 27:1 on Values We Need. Show Me Plan Report by Rev. Alvin Hook (see page 48 of the Digest of Reports).

Motion was made that we receive and accept the recommendations in the report. S/C.

- It was recommended that we immediately begin financial funding for Matthew and Brooke Turnbough, missionaries to Spain.
- Recommend \$1000 to help cover some of the expense incurred in going to Panama. Approx. \$580,000 is the goal for 2006.

The Resolutions Committee Report was read.

A motion was made to receive the report. S/C.

A motion was made to act on the report. S/C. Delegates stood to show their thanks to the Greater Springfield Association of FWB's for the great job they did in hosting the 2006 convention.

The Obituary Committee Report was read.

Motion to observe this motion. S/C. Delegates stood for a moment of silence and then Rev. Kenny Panduku led in prayer.

 $There \ was \ no \ Historical \ Commission \ Report \ given.$

A motion to elect Lloyd Durbin term expiring 2009, was received. S/C.

The Placement Committee Report was given by Rev. Gary Fry.

The 94th Annual Missouri State Association of FWB will convene in Troy, MO on June 4-6, 2007. M/S/C.

The Moderator asked for nominations to represent the MO State Association as elected delegates to the National Association of FWB's in Birmingham, AL.

Clerk: Ken Simpson S/C.

Asst. Clerk: Kenny Panduku S/C.

The Moderator asked the delegates to stand and be dismissed in prayer until after the morning service. Bro. Vernon Long dismissed us in prayer.

Wednesday Morning Worship

Rev. Gary Fry, presiding.

Rev. Greg Smith led the congregation in singing. John Jones brought the special music.

A video was shown regarding the challenge of global missions and highlighting our Show-Me Missionaries, State Home missionaries and National home missionaries from Missouri who potentially could be part of this new missions plan.

Bro. Gary Fry spoke briefly regarding the challenge of supporting our missionaries and the decrease of finances for the present Show-Me Plan. He briefly outlined the recommendations from the Special Missions Committee and encouraged support from everyone. He then recognized Rev. Steve Reeves and asked him to give some of the recommendations the committee came up with for the director of the new missions plan. Bro. Steve mentioned several items. 1. He would promote missions in every district. 2. Develop a statewide missions conference. 3. Develop programs to raise more money for missions. 4. He could coordinate our missions emphasis so that funds and efforts would not be duplicated. 5. He would work with state missionaries doing the following things: (a) Target cities (b) Plan missions trips to assist our works. (c). Develop resources and databases for such things as architecture, construction, landscaping, etc. 6. Develop missions awareness trips for pastors. 7. Work to broaden the interest and involvement of our young people. 8. Develop presentations and materials for the support of missions. 9. Visit various fields

to encourage our missionaries and to see the work first hand. 10. Coordinate services for our international and national missionaries. 11. Work to educate our people about their total involvement in missions at home, in our state, in our nation and around the world (Acts 1:8). 12. Work to develop the Show Me Plan to the point where we are not supporting individuals but missions. 13. Work to strengthen our financial base to be able to include missionaries from our region that do not presently fall under one of our state plans. 14. Work to create more of a 'team' concept at every level of our missions program. 15. Work to develop a plan of growth within our state and encourage church planting and evangelism in every way possible.

After Rev. Steve Reeves spoke, the Moderator called the delegates to order and continued business.

Moderator asked the clerk to read the tabled item. The Clerk read the recommendations from the Special Missions Committee to adopt the missions plan and amend bylaws #11 and #14.

A motion was received to remove from the table the Special Missions study plan and adopt the plan. S/C.

Dr. Dumond is the Director of the Pastoral Ministries Department for the General Baptists. He is also the Acting Director of the Congregational Ministries Department.

3. We have ceased, at least temporarily, adding titles to the Lending Library.

Many, if not most, of the items in the library are fragmented, outdated, damaged, etc.

4. We are the data gathering organization for National Roll Call Sunday.

This is a "Big Day Event" promoted by our National Home Missions Department. We appreciate the role that Kevin Williford has played in this endeavor. We will be making the appropriate recognitions during our report to the State Association.

5. We continue to have branches of the Missouri Bible Institute throughout the state. We currently have two branches-Kansas City and West Plains. This External Studies Program is administered by Dr. Ralph Hunter.

We acknowledge that the future may not include the type of educational program that we have been administering. Both Hillsdale and Free Will Baptist Bible College are offering online courses.

- We continue to provide scholarships to students from Missouri who attend one of our denominational schools. In recent years, scholarships have been awarded to students attending Hillsdale and FWBBC.
- 7. Board Member, Dr. Douglas Earls, continues to produce modules in conjunction with the Palmer Leadership Institute.

The first two courses were held in 2005. The first course was held on May 2, at the State Office in Lebanon. The facilitators were Dr. Douglas Earls, Rev. Gary Fry, and Rev. Nathan Ruble. Course 1 was "Renewing the Spiritual Leader." The cost is \$50.00 per course. The second course, "Developing a Healthy Church" was held October 3. The third course was held May 8, 2006. If you missed these courses you must wait until the beginning of the next series.

- 8. Dr. Alton Loveless initiated the TeamChurch concept. He spearheaded the effort to have one in Missouri. The first TeamChurch was held at the Farmington First Church on April 1, 2006, with over 100 in attendance.
- 9. A Couples Retreat will be held at the Assemblies of God Resort November 3-4. Joe Wilson, pastor of the Lebanon First Church is coordinating this event. At the time of this report, the CE Board's contribution is uncertain.

- 1. Rev. Alvin Hook called the meeting to order; Rev. Roger Hogan led in an opening prayer.
- 2. Rev. Hook pointed out that the Show-Me giving was, once again, far short of our obligation for support of our missionaries. This has continued to be the case since the inception of the Show-Me giving plan. The Committee reviewed the proposed 2007 budgets for all missionaries supported through the Show-Me Committee. Some discussion was held concerning the budgeting process for the missionaries, in which the Show-Me Committee has limited input. A motion was made and seconded that all current budget percentages remain as previously approved. Motion passed unanimously.
- 3. A motion was made and seconded to begin funding Matthew and Brooke Turnbough beginning in June 2006, vice January 2007. This will allow them to enter the field six months sooner. There was no discussion, and the motion passed unanimously.
- 4. Due to the current status of Matthew and Brooke Turnbough's fundraising it is acknowledged that they will, in essence, be in a deficit condition as soon as they enter the field. Their monthly support is being met, mostly, from the Show-Me Committee and Alabama's state missions support. Discussion was held concerning how the Show-Me Committee might possibly help this situation. It has been requested that the Turnbough's be involved in our State meeting in order to raise the awareness of the churches in Missouri concerning the Turnbough's status.
- 5. Dr. Doug Earls is preparing to lead a trip to Panama for pastors in January 2007. A motion was made and seconded to provide \$1000 toward the expenses of this trip from the Show-Me Committee. Motion passed unanimously.
- 6. Motion was made and seconded to adjourn the meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

Section 3

BY-LAWS

Missouri State Association of Free Will Baptists

(Revisions approved 6/7/2006)

NAME

1. This Association shall be called the Missouri State Association of Free Will Baptist.

PURPOSE

2. The object of this Association shall be the bringing together of the Free Will Baptists of the State of Missouri in one annual gathering that we may become better acquainted with one another, the upholding of the Free Will Baptists Churches of Missouri, and a worldwide outreach of souls.

MEMBERSHIP

- 3. The Association shall be composed of the members of the various local affiliated Associations.
- 4. Any organized District Association of Free Will Baptists may unite with this body at any regular session by a two-thirds vote of all delegates present, providing that the following procedures have been followed:
 - a. The District Association will send a letter to the State Clerk requesting membership in the State Association.
 - b. The Executive Committee will examine the District Association and make the appropriate recommendation to the State Association.

OFFICERS

- 5. The officers of this Association shall be Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, and Assistant Clerk, who shall be elected annually at the close of each session and hold their office until their successors are elected and qualified. No officer shall serve the same office more than three consecutive years.
- 6. The officers of this body shall submit, at every session, a report of the work done for this association.
- 7. The Moderator shall be the principal executive officer of the Association and he shall sign, with the clerk or any other people, officer or agent of the Association there unto authorized by the General Board, any deeds, mortgages, bonds, contracts, or other instruments which the General Board has authorized to be executed, except in cases where the signing and execution thereof shall be

expressly delegated by the General Board or by these By-Laws to some other officer or agent of the Association, or shall be required by law to be otherwise signed or executed. The duties of Moderator shall include presiding at the meetings of the State Association, the General Board, and the Executive Committee, and in general, to fulfill whatever responsibilities that may be commensurate with his office or delegated to him by the body or General Board.

- 8. In the absence of the Moderator, or in the event of his death, inability or refusal to act, the Assistant Moderator shall perform the duties of the Moderator, and when so acting, shall have all the powers of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the moderator. The Assistant Moderator shall perform such duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the Moderator or by the General Board.
- 9. The Clerk shall keep and accurate record of all business transactions, shall superintend the printing of the minutes, and shall receive an honorarium of an amount agreed upon by this body.

10. The Clerk shall:

- a. Keep the minutes of the Association and of the General Board meetings in one or more books provided for the purpose.
- b. See that all notices are given in accordance with the provisions of these by-laws or as required by law.
- c. Be custodian of the Association records and of the seal of the Association and see that the seal of the Association is affixed to all documents the execution of which on behalf of the Association under its seal is duly authorized.
- d. In general, perform all duties incident to the office of the clerk and other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the Moderator or by the General Board.
- e. In the absence of the clerk, or in the event of his death, inability, or refusal to act, the Assistant Clerk shall perform the duties of the Clerk and when so acting shall have the power of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the clerk.

The Assistant Clerk shall perform such duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the clerk or by the General Board.

11. All standing boards shall be composed of five (5) members, exclusive of the General Board and the Missouri Missions Board. A board member shall be an active member of a Free Will Baptist Church in good standing with the Missouri State Association. No one may serve as a member of a board while employed by that board. Standing Boards include the Board of Christian Education, the Home Missions Board, the Senior Adult Ministries Board, the Youth Ministries Board, the Youth Camp Board, and the General Board.

- 12. The duties of the various standing boards shall be to:
 - a. Plan and supervise both short and long-range programs of ministry.
 - b. Manage as good stewards all funds and properties entrusted to its care.
 - c. Annually submit a detailed budget for approval by the State Association. The budget shall include:
 - (1) Projected income along with expected sources of income.
 - (2) Projects planned and the cost of said projects.
 - (3) Maintenance along with its costs.
 - (4) Work in harmony with and toward the common vision of the entire State Association.
- 13. No board shall initiate any litigation in pursuit of its ministry. Neither shall any board enter into any litigation in the pursuit of its ministry except as required because suit has been initiated against the board. The only exception is that which the State Association may authorize when the State Association is not in session
- 14. The personnel of each of the foregoing, exclusive of the General Board and the Missouri Mission Board, shall be elected as follows: The first named for a term of one year, the second for a term of two years, the third for a term of three years, and thereafter each shall be elected for a term of five years. The members of the Missouri Mission Board shall be elected as follows: The first three named for a term of one year, the second three for a term of two years, the third three for a term of three years, and thereafter each year three members shall be elected to serve a term of three years.
- 15. The personnel of the General Board shall be composed of the officers of the State Association, the chairman of all standing boards, and one member from each Affiliated Association, to be elected by the State body, whose term of office shall be tow years and so constituted that the expiration date of the term of office of half of these expire one year and the other half the following year. This shall be determined by alphabetical order of the names of the affiliated Association.
- 16. No person shall fill more than one office at the same time except as he may become a member of the General Board by virtue of being chairman of the board, which he is an elected member.
- 17. Any vacancy occurring in the General Board may be filled by the affirmative vote of a majority of the remaining board members through less than a quorum of the General Board, unless otherwise provided by law.
- 18. All board members elected by fill a vacancy shall be elected for the unexpired term of his predecessor in office.

19. Any member of the standing boards of the State Association who does not put forth any interest in or function on said board for the period of one year, shall have his office declared vacant and a new member be elected by this Association to fill his unexpired term of office.

DITTIES

- 20. The general board shall have power to act in behalf of, and for the State Association from one regular session to another, and shall have power to elect such officers as may be necessary to carry out the plans and undertakings of the State Association. The General Board shall have the rights to employ an Executive Director who shall serve as treasurer of the Association except in cases where this responsibility shall be expressly delegated by the General Board or by these by-laws to some other officer, agent, or board of the Association. He shall make an annual financial report to the Association.
- 21. The General Board shall have the power to fill any irregular vacancies that may occur in its own body and shall have the power to fill any irregular vacancies that may occur in any department of work between sessions of the State Association. It shall be the duty of this Board to make written reports of all its work to each session.
- 22. An Executive Committee consisting of seven members of the General Board shall be composed of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk of the State Association, and four other member to be elected by the General Board; two members to be elected for a two year term and two members to be elected for a one year term and then two members to be elected each year thereafter, whose duty it shall be to act on all matters coming within the scope of the work of the Board when said Board is not in session. It shall also plan and execute the program for the annual sessions of the Missouri State Associations. The Executive Committee shall be the governing board of the Lebanon Bible and Book Store and shall establish policy for the operation of the Book Store Manager. The Book Store manager shall employ and supervise the other employees. The Executive Committee shall serve as the Budget Committee.
- 23. A majority of the number of the General Board members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of the General Board, but if less than such a majority is present at a meeting, a majority of the Board members present may adjourn the meeting from time to time without further notice.
- 24. An act of the majority of the Board members present at a meeting of the General Board at which action on any Association matter is taken shall be presumed to have assented to the action taken unless his dissent shall be entered in the minutes of the meeting.

- 25. A Board member of the Association who is present at a meeting of the General Board at which action on any Association matter is taken shall be presumed to have assented to the action taken unless his dissent shall be entered in the minutes of the meeting.
- 26. The General Board may authorize any officer or officers, agent or agents to enter into any contract or execute and deliver any instrument in the name of or on behalf of the Association and such authority may be general or confined to specific instances.
- 27. Any person or agent elected or appointed by the General Board may be removed by the General Board whenever in its judgment the best interest of the Association would be served thereby, but such removal shall be without prejudice to the contract rights, if any, of the persons so removed.
- 28. By resolution of the General Board, the Board members may be paid their expenses, if any, of attendance of each meeting of the General Board. No such payment shall preclude any Board member from serving the Association in any other capacity and receiving compensation therefore.
- 29. The General Board shall provide an Association seal which shall be circular in form and shall have inscribed thereon the name of the corporation and the state of incorporation and the words "Corporate Seal."

COMMITTEES

- 30. The Moderator shall appoint a committee on committees consisting of five members who shall appoint all committees with the exclusion of the Auditing Committee who shall be appointed by the General Board. The first appointed shall serve a term of one year, the second a term of two years and the third a term of three years; thereafter, each shall be appointed for a term of three years. Members of standing boards, with the exception of the General Board, are not eligible to serve on the Auditing Committee. Their duties are to audit all state books.
- 31. All resolutions and reports shall bear the name of all the members of the committee who favor them, and if the names be not a majority of all members of such committee, then the clerk shall not read the resolutions or report.

REPRESENTATION

32. The standing delegates of this Association shall be all ordained Free Will Baptist ministers and their wives, all ordained deacons, and Associational Clerks, provide they are members in good standing in a Free Will Baptist Church

that is in good standing in a recognized district association in this State Association

- 33. The number of elected delegates to the State Association shall be seven delegates from each affiliated District Association, one delegate from each church, plus one delegate fro fifty members for larger fraction thereof. Each church which represents must be a member of a District Association holding membership in this body.
- 34. This Association may correspond be messenger or otherwise with other religious bodies.

VOTING

- 35. Those entitled to vote at any annual or special meeting of this State Association shall be elected delegates and the standing delegates as defined By-Laws 33-34. and each delegate or standing delegate shall be entitled to one vote.
- 36. A majority vote shall be final upon all subjects except to amend the By-Laws, receive Quarterly Meetings or Associations, and the changing of the members of the committees appointed by the Moderator, then it shall require a two-thirds majority.

MEETINGS

- 37. The sessions of the Association shall convene on Monday evening at 7:30, following the first Sunday, in June beginning 1987.
- 38. The membership of the State Association may designate any place, either within or without the State of Missouri, for any annual meeting. Any special meeting may be called by the General Board. A wavier of notice signed by all members entitled to vote a meeting may designate any place, either within or without the State of Missouri, unless otherwise prescribed by stature, as the place for holding of such meeting. If no designation is made, or if a special meeting be otherwise called, the place of the meeting shall be the principle office of the corporation of the State of Missouri.
- 39. In the event the necessity arises from war, or pestilence, or any cause which prevents a regular meeting of the State Association, whether such a condition is of a local or general condition, then the General Board shall be privileged to call and act with full authority in all matters pertaining to the general welfare of the State Association, providing whatever transaction passed shall be by two-thirds vote of the members present, and providing that such transactions shall not

conflict with the purpose and edicts of the By-Laws of the State Association.

- 40. Special meetings of the Association for any purpose or purposes, unless otherwise prescribed by statute, may be called by the General Board, and shall be called by the Moderator at the request of not less than fifty percent of all the delegate members duly elected by District Associations affiliated with the Association.
- 41. All committees and standing boards shall be permitted to take official votes on any item of business within the scope of their work by mail or by telephone conference call, provided such action is called by a chairman of a board or committee and has been proposed by at least two members of the board or committee.
- 42. Ten or more ordained ministers or deacons from ten or more affiliated Associations belonging to the State Association shall constitute a quorum to transact business.
- 43. All business meetings shall be opened by singing, reading a portion from God's Word, and prayer, and shall be closed with prayer.
- 44. Special Meetings of the General Board or the Executive committee shall be called when necessary by the Moderator, with the written consent of three other members of the Executive Committee. Special Meetings of the Executive Committee shall also be called upon written request of a majority of its members.
- 45. Notice of any special meeting should be given at least fifteen days previously thereto be written notice delivered by the most convenient manner. Any Board member may waive notice of any meeting. The attendance of a Board member at a meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting, except where a Board member attends a meeting for the express purpose of objecting to the transaction of any business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened.
- 46. Unless otherwise provided by law, whenever any notice is required to be given to any member or Board member of the Association under the provisions of these By-Laws or under the provisions of the articles of incorporation, a waiver thereof in writing, signed by the person or persons entitled to such notice whether before or after writing, signed by the person or persons entitled to such notice whether before or after the item stated therein shall be deemed equivalent to the giving of such notice.

DISCIPLINE

47. The State Association shall not usurp any authority over the Quarterly

Meetings or Associations that shall be under its supervision, but shall be an advisory body to help them.

- 48. The fiscal year of the Association shall begin on the first day of January, and end on the 31st day of December each year.
- 49. All checks, drafts, or other orders fro the payment of money notes other evidences of indebtedness issued in the name of the Association, shall be signed by such officer or officers, agent or agents or the Association and in such manners as shall from time to time be determined by resolution of the General Board.
- 50. No loans shall be contracted, and no evidence of indebtedness shall be issued for which the State Association shall be legally or morally responsible except as approved by the Missouri State Association of Free Will Baptists while in session, or by the General Board while in session.
- 51. The General Board by a majority vote of the voting delegates of the State Association shall be authorized to create or to increase any bonded indebtedness of the Association.
- 52. The General Board of the Association shall be authorized by a majority vote of the voting delegates of the State Association, to sell, lease, exchange, mortgage, pledge, or otherwise dispose of all, of the property and the assets of the Association.
- 53. All funds of the corporation not otherwise employed shall be deposited from time to time to the credit of the Association in such banks, trust companies, or other depositories as the General Board may select.
- 54. The salaries of employees shall be fixed from time to time by the General Board.
- 55. The meetings of the State Association and the General Board shall be governed by the rules of parliamentary law as set forth in Robert's Rules of Order, except in the case of those rules which are superseded by some rule of this organization.
- 56. The Clerk or Assistant Clerk, or in their absence the senior minister in age, shall call the Association to order for business, and call the Moderator or Assistant Moderator to the chair, and if neither moderator or assistant moderator is present, the senior minister in age shall act as chairman to open the floor for nominations and carry out the election of a moderator pro-tem.
- 57. All business, except routine, shall be brought before the body by committee, but shall any committee refuse or fail to present to this body the business given it by any delegate of this Association, then such business may be presented to

- the body by any delegate, but cannot be discussed unless by a majority vote of this body.
- 58. Anyone desiring to speak shall rise and say "Brother Moderator" but shall speak no further until he or she is recognized by the Moderator.
- 59. No one shall speak more than five minutes, or more than twice, on the same subject without the consent of the Moderator.
- 60. Any delegate of this body can appeal from the decision of the Moderator of the Association, and by a majority vote thereon, the objection shall be sustained or rejected.
- 61. No one shall leave the Association when in a business session without the consent of the moderator.
- 62. The moderator shall stop all discussion when not carried on in a Christian spirit, or when he thinks it is likely to lead to discord or division.
- 63. All business coming before this Association shall be decided by secret ballot when a majority of voting delegates are in opposition to an open vote.
- 64. We believe that any form of homosexuality, lesbianism, bisexuality, bestiality, incest, fornication, adultery and pornography are sinful perversions of God's gift of sex. (Gen. 2:24; Gen 19:5; Gen 26:8-9; Lev. 18:1-30; Rom. 1:26-29; I Cor. 5:1; 6:9; I Thess. 4:1-8; Heb. 13:4). Any District Association which sanctions such conduct will not be accepted or retained as a member of the Missouri State Association of Free Will Baptists
- 65. We believe that human life begins at conception and that the unborn child is a living human being. Abortion constitutes the unjustified, unexcused taking of unborn human life. Abortion is murder. We reject any teaching that abortions of pregnancies due to rape, incest, birth defects, gender selection, birth or population control, or the mental well-being of the mother are acceptable. (Job 3:16; Psalms 51:5; 139:14-16; Isa. 44:24; 49: 1, 5; Jer. 1:5; 20:15-18; Luke 1:44) Any District Association which sanctions such conduct will not be accepted or retained as a member of the Missouri State Association of Free Baptists.

AMENDMENTS

66. These By-Laws may be amended at any regular session by a two-thirds majority vote after the proposed amendment has laid on the table one day.
