Introductory sermon was preached by Rev J. H. Tilley. Scripture reading St. John 4th. chapter from 13th. through 30th verse. Text 23rd.

After which one and one half hours was given for refreshments.

At the appointed time the body was called to order by the former Moderator, Rev. J. L Lavender. After reading the first chapter of James and prayer by Sister Graham and song by Bro Montgomery the body was fully organized, after which the following business was transacted.

Rev. N. M. Sanford preached at 9:30. Scripture reading, St. John 21st. chapter beginning at 3rd. verse reading rest of chapter. Text: Feel my sheep. Rev. R. E. Tilley preached at 11:00. Scripture reading, Romans 6th. chapter. Text 23rd. verse. T. A. Springfield preached at 2:30. Scripture, St. John 3rd. chapter from 13 through 21st. verse. Text: 17th. verse. A collection was taken for Rev. W. J. Harbin amounting to \$65.00.

After one song by Bro. R. F. Thomas and prayer by Rev. R. L. Taylor and reading the 16th. chapter of St. Luke by Moderator and prayer by Moberator Rev. M. Montgomery.

The Moderator declared the 98th. session of the Association open for business. After reading the rules of decorum by Moderator the committee not being ready to report, a move was made and seconded that we have a 30 minutes recess. ARTICLES OF FAITH

Art. 1. We believe there is one true and living God, who is the supreme ruler of Heaven and earth, self existent Creator of all things, and revealed under the personal distinction of Father, Son and Holy Ghost, equal in every divine perfection, and existing in distant but hormonious offices in the great work of redemption.

Art. 2. We believe the Holy Bible was written by men divinely inspired and is a perfect treasure of heavenly instruction; that it has God for its author, truth for its matter and salvation for its end; that it reveals the principle by which God shall judge us, and therefore is and shall remain until the end of the world, the center of Christian union, the supreme standard by which all human conduct, creeds and opinions will be tried.

Art 3. We believe that man was created holy under the law of the Maker, but from voluntary transgression fell from that holy state, in consequence of which all mankind are depraved and wholly unable of their own free will and ability to recover from that fallen state in which they are by nature.

Art. 4. We believe that God has not fixed the future state of mankind by any absolute and unalterable decree; but salvation is offered in the Gospel free to all, and if sinners are lost forever it will he their own fault.

Art. 5. We believe that Christ by His death and suffering made an atonement for the sins of mankind in general, and every individual in particular; however, that none but those who believe in Him can be partakers of the divine benefits.

Art. 6. We believe that true faith cannot proceed from the exercise of our natural faculties and power, or from the force and operation of the free will since man in consequence of his natural corruption is incapable of either thinking of doing anything spiritually good.

Art. 7. We believe in the general application of the Grace of God for fallen man sufficient to enable nim morally and actually to obey the requirements of the law of liberty-James 1:25, this is to act saving faith; John 1:9, however, none but those who believe or acqueisce in Christ will be saved thereby; Acts 17:32, Romans 2:9; John 3:19.

Art. 8. We believe in the free and moral agency of man, by the grace of God, before and after conversion; that he is under no invincible recessity, by his Creator, to act in a given way, that if he lives after the flesh ne shall die but if he through the splrit, do mortify the deeds of the body he shall live, and therefore, man is always a proper subject of admonition and exhortation. Hebrews 11:12:13; Romans 12:14; Mark 14:12; Ezek. 18;24: Rev. 2:3; Ezek. 33:13, and 28: 1st. Tim. 4;1; Heb. 3:5; 1st. Cor. 10:12, and 22; 1st. Peter 1:10.

Art. 9. We believe that the visible church of Christ is a congregation of believers, associated by covenant in faith and fellowship of the Gospel observing the ordinances of Christ, governed by His laws and exercising the gifts, rights and privileges invested in them by His works; that its only proper officers are bishops, pastors, and deacons, whose qualifications, claims and duties are defined in the Epistles of Timothy and Titus.

Art. 10. We believe that Christian baptism is immersion in water in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, and that believers are proper subjects.

Art. 11. We believe the Lord's Supper is a perpetual obligation, by which the members of the church in the use of bread and wine, are to commemorate together the dying love of Christ, preceded always by solemn self-examination.

Art. 15. We believe in the resurrection of the dead and a general judgment and joys of the righteous, and the punishment of the wicked will be eternal upon principles of grace and justice.

Art. 13. We believe in open and mixed communion and the churches of our body are authorized, through their pastors, to invite Christians of all orthodox churches, who are in good standing in their respective churches, to commune with us at the Lord's table.

RULES OF DECORUM

Art. 1 The Association shall be called to order by the Moderator who presided at the last session, the former clerk also officiating until the body is fully organized.

Art. 2. The Association shall be opened and closed by singing and prayer.

Art. 3. The Moderator and Clerk shall be chosen by ballot at each session of the Association. A majority of votes by delegates present elect.

Art. 4. The names of the delegates from the different churches shall be enrolled and called for as necessary during the session.

Art. 5. A majority of delegates shall rule in all cases except the reception of churches, then it shall be unanimous.

Art. 6. The Moderator fhall not be entitled to vote except in cases of a tie, and then he shall give the deciding vote. He shall be entitled to speak on all questions after all others have spoken, provided he appoints some one to the chair while he is speaking.

Art. 7. Only one person shall speak at a time and he ssall rise and address the Moderator and after recognition by the Moderator he shall proceed.

Art. 8. No member shall be interrupted whlle sepaking unless he departs from the subject under discussion or uses words of personal reflection.

Art. 9. No person shall be allowed to speak more than twice on the same subject without leave of the Association, nor more than 15 minutes at a time.

Art. 10. No member shall laugh or talk while debates are going on.

Art. 11. No member shall absent himself from the Association without leave of the Moderator.

Art. 12. The Moderator shall have power to call the Association together at any time upon petition of two-thirds of the churches composing the Association over which he presides.

Art. 13. That the appointment of all commttees by the Moderator be confined to minisrers and delegates composing the Association.

CONSTITUTION

Art. 1. The Association shall be known as the Mount Moriah Free Will Baptist Association of Alabama, being composed of delegates from the differrent churches forming the same, each being entitled to three delegates.

Art. 2. The body shall be considered an Advisory Council, but have no authority over the affairs of other churches, unless they depart from the articles of faith of the Association. In case any church departs from the articles of faith and support doctrines of heresy, or allows any minister of her body to te .ch dictrines not in keeping with our articles of faith, the same shall be dealt with by this Association as it may deem proper and right, according to the teachings of the Bible.

Art. 5. The officers of the Association shall be a Modertor, Clerk and Treasurer, who shall be chosen at each session by a majority of votes.

Art. 8. We agree as churches of this Association to use our best influence

to promote the interest of all moral and benevolent institutions, such as the temperate cause, Sabbath Schools, Missionary work, etc.

Art. 3. Each church in this Association shall be considered an advisory body, and shall control its own internal affairs in matters of dicipline, etc. It may, however, in extreme cases, call aid from sister churches, but the Association shall rule in all matters of doctrine and general interest.

Art. 4. All questions of doctrine and matters of general interest shall be settled by a two-thirds vote of the Association and the decision shall be final.

Art. 6. This Association shall meet annually, at such time and place as may be agreed at a previous annual session, and shall not adjourn finally until all business is transacted.

Art. 7. Churches wishing to become members of this Association must adopt Articles of Faith and conform to its usage.
