

ARTICLES OF FAITH

Art. 1. We believe ther eis one true and living God, who is the supreme ruler of Heaven and Earth, self existent creator of all things, and revealed under the personal distinction of Father, Son and Holy Ghost, equal in every divine perfection and existing in distant but harmonious offices in the great work of redemption.

Art. 2. We believe the Holy Bible was written by men divinely inspired and is a perfect treasure of heavenly instruction; that it has God for its author truth for its matter and salvation for its end; that it reveals the principle by which God shall judge us, and therefore is and shall remain until the end of the world the center of Christian unino, the supreme standard by which all human enduct, creeds and opinions will be tried.

Art. 3. We believe that man was created Holy under the law of his Maker but from voluntary trangression fell from that Holy state, in consequence of which all mainkind are depraved and wholly unable of their own free will and ability to recover from that fallen state in which they are by nature.

Art. 4. We believe that God had not fixed the future state of mankind by any absolute and unalterable decree but salvation is offered in the Gospel free to all and if sinners are lost forever it will be their own fault.

Art. 5. We believe that Christ by his death add suffering made an atonement for the sins of mankind in general and every individual in particular however none but those who believe in Him can be partakers of the divine benefits.

Art. 6. We believe that true faith cannot proceed from the exercise of our natural faculties and powers or from the force and opeartion of the free will since man in cnsequence of his natural corruption is incapable of either thinking or doing anything spiritually good.

Art. 7. We believe in the general application of the grace of God for fallen man sufficient to enable him morally and actually to obey the requirements of the law of liberty—James 1:25 this is to act saving faith, John 1:9 however none but those who believe or acquiesce in Christ will be saved thereby, Acts 17:32 Romans 2:9 John 3:19.

Art. 8. We believe in the free moral agency of man by the grace of God before and after conversion that he is under no invincible necessity by his Creator to act in a given way that if he lives after the flesh he shall die but if he through the spirit do mortify the dceds of the body he shall live and therefore man is always a proper subject of admonition and exhortation, Hebrews 11:12, 13, 3:5, Komans 12:14, Mark 14:12, Ezek. 18:24, 33:13, 28, 1st Tim.

4:1, 1st Cor. 10:12, 22 1st. Peter 1:10.

Art. 9. We believe that the visible church of Christ is a congregation of believers associated by covenant in faith and fellwship of the Gospel observing the ordinances of Christ governed by his laws and exercising the gifts, rights and privileges invested in them by his work that its only proper officers are bishops, pastors and deacons whose qualifications, claims and duties are defined in the Epistles of Timothy and Titus.

Art. 10. We believe that Christian Baptism is immersion in water in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Ghost and that believer are proper subjects.

Art. 11. We believe the Lord,'s Supper is a perpetual obligation by which the members of the church in the use of bread and wine are to commemorate together the dying love f Christ preceded always by slemn self-examination.

Art. 12. We believe in the resurrection of the dead and the general judgment and joys of the righteous and the punishment of the wicked will be eternal upon principles of grace and justice.

Art. 13. We believe in open and mixed communion and the of our body are authorized through their apstors to invite Christians of all orthodox churches who are in good standing in their respective to commune with us at the Lord's table.

Art. 1. The association shall be called to order by the moderator who presided at the last session the former clerk also officiating until the body is fully organized.

Art. 2 prayer.

Art. 3. The moderator and clerk shall be chosen by ballot at each session of the association by a majority of votes by delegates present elect.

Art. 4. The names of the delegates from the different churches shall be enrolled and classed for as necessary during the session.

Art. 5. A majority of the delegates shall rule in all cases except the reception of churches then it shall be unanimous.

Art. 6. The moderator shall not be entitled to vote except in case of a tie and then he shall give the deciding vote. He shall be entitled to speak on all questions after all others have spoken provided he appoints someone to the chair while he is speaking.

Art. 7. Only one person shall speak at a time and he shall rise and address the moderator and after recognition by the moderator he shall proceed.

RULES OF DECORUM

Art. 2. The association shall be opened and closed by singing and

Art. 8. No member shall be interrupted while speaking unless he departs from the subject under discussion or use words of personal reflection.

Art. 9. No person shall be allowed to speak more than twice on the same subject without leave of the association nor more than 15 minutes at a time.

Art. 10. No member shall laugh or talk while debates are goining on.

Art. 11. No member shall absent himself from the association without leave of the moderator.

Art. 12. The moderator shall have the power to call the association together at any time upon a petition of two-thirds of the churches composing the association over which he presides.

Art. 13. That the appointment of all committees by the moderator be confined to ministers and delegates composing the association.

CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God by faith in Christ and adopted the word of God as our rule of faith and practice we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant. We promise by his grace to love him and obey him in all things, to avoid all appearence of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction and the use of intoxicating beverages and to provide things honest in the sight of all men. We agree to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions and social worship and by selfdenial, faith and tood works endeaveor to grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. We will not forget the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church of its poor and its benevilent work. We agree to accept Christian abmonitian and reproof with meekness an dto watch over one another with love endeavoring to keep the unity of the spirit, the bond of peace, to be careful of one anothers business and reputation and reek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring an das far as we are able promote the success of the church and of the Gospel. We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterpries supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come and his will te dore o nearth as it is in Heaven. To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprise the suppory or missions the succes sof Sabbath Schools and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of souls and the conversion of the world and may the God of peace sanctify us wholy and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Art. 1. This association shall be known as the Mt. Moriah Free Will Baptist Association of Alabama being composed of delegates from the different churches farming the same each being entitled to three delegates.

Art. 2. The body shall be considered an advisory council but have no authority ocer the affairs of other churches unless they depart from the articles of faith of the association. In case any church departs from the articles of faith and supports doctrines of heresay or allows any minister of her body to teach doctrines not in keeping with our articles of faith the same shall be dealt with by this association as it may deem proper and right according to the teachings of the Bible.

Art. 3. Each church in this association shall be considered an advisory body and shall control its own internal affairs in matters of discipline etc. It may however in extreme cases call aid from sister churches but the association shall rule in all matters of doctrine and general interest.

Art. 4. All questions of doctrine and matters of general interest shall be settle dby a two-thirds vote of the associatio nand the decision shall be final.

Art. 5. The officers of the association shall be a moderator, clerk and treasurer who shall be chosen at each session by a majority of vote.

Art. 6. This association shall meet annually at such time and place as may be agreed at a previous annual session and shall not adjourn finally until all business is transacted.

Art. 7. Churches wishing to become members of the aspociation must adopt its articles of faith and conform to its usage.
