The one hundred forty-second session of the Mount Moriah Association convened with Union Hill Church in Pickens County on Saturday, October 12. He gave scriptural examples of things to take time for such as: Listen to others and to God, learn by studying God's word, Laugh - a merry heart doeth good like a medicine, Live - make your life the best it can be, and Love - for God is love.

ne meeting was called to order by the Moderator, Rev. Terrell Jones. The roll call of churches as given by the Clerk, followed by the reading of the minutes of the General Board meeting:

GENERAL BOARD MEETING

The General Board Meeting was held at Shiloh Church on Septem ber 21, 1991 at 2:00 p.m. All churches were represented except First FWB of Reform. Opening prayer was given by Bro. Roy Plymon. The Moderator, Rev. Terrell Jones, opened the business session. Forms to write recommendations for offices to be filled were passed out to the General Board members by the Clerk.

The first item was to mention the Eastside had requested the next annual meeting and they had not had a meeting. This was made into a motion, seconded and carried that we go to Eastside in October 1992. The entire list of recommendations were:

The Credentials Committee examined the letters and found them to be in order. The Clerk inquired about the procedure for the \$200 approved at the July Quarterly meeting, to be given to the youth participants attending the National Youth Convention. A MSC that a check would be made to the Board of Christian EDucation and they would distribute the money to the appropriate youth.

The Moderator, by request of the Home Mission Committee at the July Quarterly meeting, asked for the response of the General Board about how their church felt about the format of the April Church Outreach meeting. The responses were favorable and they offered no changes.

Raiford Shepherd stated he was asked to get the feeling of the people about meeting only 1/2 day for the January and July session of the Quarterly Meeting. Several spoke in favor of keeping the same schedule, that this was only four days out of 365, and that we should emphasize the importance of attending each meeting. Also, more preaching and a more consecrated effort of ministers to be faithful in attendance was stressed.

Another item brought up by Board M ember, Milford McAdams, was to make sure all committee members were notified when committee meetings are held.

The last item of business was to suggest a name change for Home Missions. Since forming this committee the Home Missions Committee has expanded to a larger realm. It now includes Home and Foreign missions, the Bible College and Church Extension projects.

A motion was made, seconded and carried to change the title to Missions and Church Extension Committee; and change the wording on page 42 to read:

SECTION TWO: MISSIONS AND CHURCH EXTENSION

COMMITTEE

A. The Missions and Church Extension Committee shall consist of three lay brethren and two ordained ministers elected at the annual session of the Association, elected for a five-year term, the senior member coming off each year.

B. It shall be the responsibility of this comm ittee to take charge of the missions work and church extension work of this

Association, to promote the cause of Missions and Church Exten-

sion work and to take oversight of any mission church so organized.

C. The Missions and Church Extension Committee shall make a report to the annual session of the Association.

5.1-13.

The General Board meeting ended with Rev. Scott Montgomery giving the closing prayer.

The suggested change of wording for paragraph B. is to read:

It shall be the responsibility of this committee to take charge and promote the cause of Missions and Church Extension of this Association and to take oversight of any Mission Church so organized.

This is offered as an amendment to the General Board's report.

Forms with this information were passed out to the voting delegates. Rev. Roger Lucas offered an amendment which would shorten the original amendment made at the General Board Meeting.

There was a motion, second and carried to accept this version and it would be voted on during the afternoon business session. All officers were elected as was presented on the ballot sheet. Committees were elected and substitutes places where needed.

A report was given on Alabama State Missions. Bro. Lucas, a member of this board, stated that a restructuring on how missionary needs are met is in the making and will be presented at the State meeting. Also, a man is ready for a new State mission work, but low finances prevent beginning this work. He said the Madison work is growing, but expressed grave concern that many have stopped giving since the church has been built. He asked for continued prayer for the Hendrix family and for Rev. Mike Rogers who needs eye surgery and because of previous eye problems has had his insurance coverage on his eyes cancelled. He requested that we show our love in helping Bro. Rogers in this critical time. Bro. Jackie Adçox suggested that a "Love Sunday" be designated at our churches to help Bro. Rogers in this needful time.

Rev. Mike Mounts led in prayer, followed by an intermission. After singing "Heavenly Sunlight" the Moderator asked for those who would be attending the State Association. The following delegates were taken from this group - James South, Barbara Sudduth, Lottie Sudduth, Bill Sudduth, Ethel McJenkins, Helen Sanford, Lillie Mae Carpenter, Vaudine Lancaster. It was stated that on November 24 will be Home Missions Sunday to help with deficit accounts. More information will be received in the mail.

The Finance Committee assisted in the General Offering with prayer by Dennis Atchenson. Special music was rendered by Steve

McAdams, Leon McAdams and Mr. and Mrs. Waymon Fields who sang "O What A Savior."

After rendering a special song "The Greatest Love Story," the second sermon was preached by Rev. Tony Latham using 1st Peter 4:17. He expressed his thanks for his upbringing and that his daddy was present today. Dry hide hypocrites, dead weight, and begging church mem bers to attend church are some reasons our churches can't move forward. If we are truly saved we will use our talents and do God's will, forsaking not the assembling of ourselves at God's house.

"Just As I Am" was sung as the invitational hymn, followed by a special altar prayer. The blessing for the food was given and information concerning the noon meal. After a delicious meal served outside under a beautiful blue sky, we gathered for the afternoon session. The song "Glory To His Name" was sung. Rev. Jerry Montgomery gave the devotional on "Falling Away" - II Thessalonians 2. He stated our churches are developing a form of worldliness, showing a decline in spirituality in the pulpit, disloyalty to the service of Christ, a denial of sound doctrine, and we are living far below God's standards. Amid all this, there is hope for the believer if we hold on to the end, we will be victorious.

A motion was made to adjourn. "God Be With You Til We Meet Again" was sung with Rev. Ben Logan giving the closing prayer.

PHILLIPS CHAPEL CHURCH

APRIL 13-14, 1991

The April 13-14 session of the Quarterly meeting convened on Friday night at Phillips Chapel Church. Rev. Fred Warner, Rev. Jimmy Aldridge and some of the students from the Free Will Baptist College were our guests. Threatening tornado weather prevented some from attending this special meeting, several times the electricity was out, and finally the service was concluded with candlelight. Also, during the service some from Shiloh were called away because a tornado had touched down at Marlin Burkhalter's residence. Amid these losses and inconveniences the Lord greatly blessed in sparing our lives and permitting us to be blessed with our special guests.

The opening song "When We All Get To Heaven" was lead by Milford McAdams with Helen Sanford at the piano. Prayer was lead by visiting minister, Rev. James Walden.

A special treat was students singing "Jesus Loves Me" in English, Spanish, Japanese and French. Each of the students gave their personal testimony. They urged each person to take the opportunity they have to witness. One commented, "If you don't witness here, what makes you think you'll do it somewhere else?"

The students and youth assembled downstairs for youth related service. The congregation sang "Bringing In The Sheaves." Rev. Fred Warner brought his sermon to the adults. His scripture was taken from Genesis 49:22. He told of walls that rise up between the saved and the sinner (as in the case of the Samaritan woman). They were 1. Racial wall, 2. Social wall, and 3. moral law or wall. Only through Jesus can we get over the wall

of obstacles in the heart of people. Jesus never let himself get in a state of isolation from sinners.

After an intermission the song "Where The Soul Never Dies" was sung. An offering was received following by the song "Count Your Blessings."

Rev. Jimmy Aldridge who has 31 years of pastoring and missions delivered the next sermon. He prefaced the sermon by telling how excited the people were in Cuba and stated that there had been 302 conversions reported in Cuba in 1990. Also the Advance project helped to promote and build the chapel called Willey Chapel (named in memory of missionary to Cuba, Rev. Tom Willey. Tom Willey, Jr. accompanied Bro. Aldridge to Cuba.

His sermon was based on "Things That Must BE Present If A Church Is Going To Grow," adding that conversion is the easy part . . . disciplining is the hard part. 1. Grace - Putting life of the Church ahead of individual member. 2. Place in church for weak believers (help them) 3. Loving consideration for the unsaved or new converts. 4. Demonstrate love in our worship, and show joy.

The song "Power In the Blood" was sung by the congregation. The 12:00 sermon was preached by Rev. Warner using scripture from John 1:40; 6:8-9; and 12:20. He used the story of Andrew's desire in "Getting someone to Jesus Christ." He noted that Andrew...1. Did not forget his own, 2. Did not bypass the youth (loaves and fishes) 3. Did not give up on the hard cases. He emphasized that we can live without great preachers, singers, teachers, ... but not without soul winners.

We were dismissed for lunch by Rev. Arlie Lynn. After a time of fellowship and food we met again for the business session. A congregational song "Just Over In The Gloryland" was sung, followed by prayer by Rev. Milton Fields.

The roll call of churches was given by the Clerk. All churches were represented except Sardis. The roll call of ministers was given by Leon McAdams. ARTICLES OF FAITH

- ART. 1 We believe there is one true and living God, who is the Supreme Ruler of Heaven and earth, self existent Creator of all things and revealed under the personal distinction of Father, Son and Holy Ghost, equal in every divine perfection, and existing in distant but harmonious offices in the great work or redemption.
- ART. 2 We believe the Holy Bible was written by men divinely inspired and is a perfect treasure of heavenly instruction; that it has God for its author, truth for its matter and salvation for its end; that it reveals the principle by which all human conduct, creeds and opinions will be tried.
- ART. 3 We believe that man was created holy under the law of the maker, but from voluntary transgression fell from that holy state, in consequence of which all mankind are depraved and wholly unable of their own free will and ability to recover from that fallen state in which they are by nature.
- ART. 4 We believe that God has not fixed the future state of mankind by any absolute and unalterable decree; but salvation is offered in the Gospel free to all, and if sinners are lost forever it will be their own fault.
- ART. 5 We believe that Christ by His death and suffering, made an atonement for the sins of mankind in general, and every individual in particular; however, that none but those who believe in Him can be partakers of the divine benefits.
- ART. 6 We believe that true faith cannot proceed from the exercise of our natural facilities and powers, or from the force and operation of the free will since man in consequence of his natural corruption is incapable of either thinking or doing anything spiritually good.
- ART. 7 We believe in the general application of the Grace of God for fallen man, sufficient to enable him morally and actually to obey the requirements of the law of liberty James 1:25, this is to act saving faith; John 1:9 however, none but those who believe or acquiesce in Christ will be saved thereby; Acts 17:32; Romans 2:9; John 3:19.
- ART. 8 We believe in the free and moral agency of man, by the Grace of God, before and after conversion that he is under no invincible necessity, by his Creator, to act in a given way that if he lives after the flesh he shall die, but if he through the spirit, do mortify the deeds of the body he shall live, and therefore, man is always a proper subject of admonition and exhortation, Heb. 3:11-12-13; Rom. 13:14; Mark 13:33; Eze. 18:24; Rev. 2nd & 3rd chapters; Eze. 33:13-18; I Tim. 4:1; Heb. 3:6; I Cor. 10:12-22; I Peter 1:10.
- ART. 9 We believe that the visible church of Christ is a congregation of believers, associated by covenant in faith and fellowship of the Gospel observing the ordinances of Christ, governed by His laws and exercising the gifts, rights and privileges invested in them by His work; That its only proper officers are bishops, pastors and deacons, whose qualifications, claims and duties are defined in the Epistle of Timothy and Titus.

- ART. 10 We believe that Christian Batism is im mersion in water in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, and that believers are proper subjects.
- ART. 11 We believe the Lord's Supper is a perpetual obligation, by which the members of the church in the use of bread and wine, are to commemorate together the dying of Christ preceded always by solemn self-examination.
- ART. 12 We believe in the resurrection of the dead and the general judgement and joys of the righteous and the punishment of the wicked will be eternal upon principles of grace and justice.
- ART. 13 We believe in open and mixed comm union and the churches of our body are authorized, through their pastors, to invite Christians of all orthodox churches, who are in good standing in their respective churches who are in good standing in their respective churches to commune with us at the Lord's table.
- ART. 14 We believe that the Holy Spirit enters the heart of the Believer at the time of conversion, and that speaking in tongues (languages) is neither an evidence of being infilled with the Holy Spirit nor does it bring about sanctification. We teach and preach the fullness of the Holy Spirit and heed the scriptural admonition, "Be filled with the Spirit." We thank God for our great Comforter, Guide, and Empowerer, the precious Holy Spirit, the Third Person of the Trinity. (John 3:5-8; Romans 8:9; Ephesians 5:18; I Corinthians 14:22).

RULES OF DECORUM

- ART. 1. (a) The Association shall be called to order and officiated by the Moderator, who was elected at the last session.
- (b) The new officers (Moderator and Clerk) will take office at the close of the annual session and serve through the annual session of the following year.
- ART. 2 The Association shall be opened and closed by singing and prayer.
- ART. 3. (a) The Moderator and Clerk shall be chosen by ballot at each session of the Association. A majority of votes, by delegates present, elect.
- (b) The Moderator and Clerk cannot serve more than four years in succession.
- ART 4. It shall be the duty of every church belonging to this Association to send a letter to every annual session of this Association, reporting in the letter its spiritual condition, benevolent work and its statistics. Also, that we receive the letters and seat the delegates on the strength of the Credentials Committee report and omit public reading of the letters. All letters be mailed with minutes fee to the Clerk of this Association two (2) weeks prior to the annual session of the Association. The names of the delegates from the different churches shall be enrolled and called for, as necessary, during the session.
- ART. 5. A majority of the delegates shall rule in all cases except the reception of churches, all questions of doctrines, and matters pertaining to the Constitution and Rules of Decorum, then it shall be by two-thirds vote.

- ART. 6. The Moderator shall not be entitled to vote except in case of a tie, and then he shall give the deciding vote. He shall be entitled to speak on all questions after all others have spoken, provided he appoint someone to the chair while he is speaking.
- ART. 7. Only one person shall speak at a time and he shall rise and address the Moderator and after recognition by the Moderator, he shall proceed.
- ART. 8. No member shall be interrupted while speaking unless he departs from the subject under discussion or uses words of personal reflection.
- ART. 9. No person shall be allowed to speak more than twice on the same subject without leave of the Association, nor more than five (5) minutes at a time.
- ART. 10. No member shall laugh or talk while debates are going on.
- ART. 11. No mem ber shall absent himself from the Association without leave of the Moderator.
- ART. 12. The Moderator shall have the pwoer to call the Association together at any time he deems necessary or upon a petition of two-thirds of the churches composing the Association over which he presides.
- ART. 13. That the appointment of all committees by the Moderator be confined to Ministers and Delegates composing the Association.

CONSTITUTION

- ART. 1. This Association shall be known as the Mount Moriah Free Will Baptist Association of Alabama, being composed of delegates from the different churches forming the same, each being entitled to three elected delegates.
- ART. 2. The body shall be considered an Advisory Council, but have no authority over the affairs of other churches unless they depart from the Articles of Faith of the Association. In case any church departs from the Articles of Faith and supports doctrines of heresy, or allows any Minister of her body to teach doctrines not in keeping with our Articles of Faith, the same shall be dealt with by this Association as it may deem proper and right, according to the teachings of the Bible.
- ART. 3. Each church in this Association shall be considered an advisory body and shall control its own internal affairs in matters of discipline, etc., and each church reserves the right to retain ownership of their property and buildings should the church split or decide to sell. Each church should control its internal affairs concerning all property under their name. It may however, in extreme cases, call aid from sister churches, but the Association shall rule in all matters of doctrine.
- ART. 4. All questions of doctrines and matters pertaining to the Constitution and Rules of Decorum shall be settled by a two-thirds vote of the Association; provided the same is presented in written form; presented in the morning session; and voted on in the afternoon session; and the decision shall be final.

- ART. 5. The officers of the Association shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk-Treasurer, and Assistant Clerk-Treasurer, who shall be chosen by ballot at each annual session by a majority of votes. The Moderator shall serve as the Association's representative on the General Board of the State Association. The Clerk shall be paid \$125.00 per year, plus expenses incurred in carrying out his duties. Each church send each year to the annual session the sum of \$25.00 as associational funds.
- ART. 6. (a) This Association shall meet annually, at such time and place as may be agreed on at a previous annual session, and shall not adjourn finally until all business is transacted.
- (b) There shall be a short business session and a report from all standing committees at each quarterly meeting.
- ART. 7. Churches wishing to become members of the Association must adopt its Articles of Faith and conform to its usage.
- ART. 8. We agree as churches of this Association to use our best influences to promote the interest of all moral and benevolent institutions, such as the temperance cause, Sunday Schools, Missionary Work, etc.
- ART. 9. Any minister pastoring a church or churches in the Mount Moriah Association shall be a regularly ordained minister in good standing and become affiliated with this association.
- ART. 10. All ministers and deacons shall be standing delegates in this Association.
- ART. 11. We adopt the Treatise of Faith and Practice of the Original Free Will Baptist.

ART. 12. SECTION ONE: GENERAL BOARD

- A. COMPOSITION: The General Board shall be composed of the Moderator, Clerk, and one member from each local church that is a part of this body. Each member from a local church shall serve a two-year-term with one-half of the members being elected each year.
- B. DUTIES: The General Board shall formulate all ideas of business during the annual session of the Association, act as a Nominating Committee, as well as any other responsibility so delegated by the body. It shall not have the power to comm it the Association to any cause or policy not authorized by the Mount Moriah Association, nor to reverse any action of the Mount Moriah Association;

SECTION TWO: BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

- A. COMPOSITION: The Christian Board shall be composed of five (5) mem bers. These are elected to serve a 5-year-term with one expiring each year.
- B. DUTIES: 1. The Christian Board shall act in an advisory capacity to the youth organization of the Association.
- The Christian Board shall work with all churches in the Association to promote the youth work and other related projects.
 - 3. The Christian Board, along with the youth officers

and host church, shall plan the program.

ART. 13. STANDING COMMITTEES

SECTION ONE: CREDENTIALS COMMITTEE

- A. The Credentials Committee shall consist of three lay brethren and two ordained ministers, elected at the annual session of the Association, each serving a five (5) year term, the senior member coming off each year. A committee member cannot serve more than one term without a years' leave.
- B. It shall be the responsibility of this comm ittee to examine letters coming to this body from churches, m inisters, and other Associations. This committee shall also examine all ministers who become a part of this body, either by ordination or by letter, and make recommendations to the Association.
- C. It shall be the duty of this comm ittee to make an annual report to the Association as to the standing, character, and orthodoxy of the ministers and churches of this Association.

SECTION TWO: MISSIONS AND CHURCH EXTENSION COMMITTEE

- A. The Missions and Church Extension Committee shall consist of three (3) lay brethren and two ordained ministers elected at the annual session of the Association, elected for a five-year-term, the senior member coming off each year.
- B. It shall be the responsibility of this committee to take charge and promote the cause of Missions and Church Extension of this Association and to take oversight of any Mission Church so organized.
- C. The Mission Committee shall have a Secretary-Treasurer and use funds given for Missions and Church Extension work.
- D. The Mission and Church Extension Com mittee shall make a report to the annual session of the Association.
- ART. 14. The Moderator of the Association shall be an ex-officio member of all Boards and Committees.
- ART. 15. No person shall be allowed to serve on more than one Standing Board or Committee, with the exception of the General Board. A person may be a member of the General Board and still be eligible for a Standing Board or Committee.

ART. 16. DEACONS

To be ordained, he must be elected by the church of which he is a member. A deacon must meet the conditions stated in the third chapter of I Timothy, verses 8-13. The term "husband of one wife" means he shall not have more than one living wife, that is, he shall not be married to one wife at the present time and there be a wife still living from a previous marriage. The same shall apply to the wife, she shall have only one living husband. The ordination council shall consist of at least one ordained minister and two deacons of the Mount Moriah Association.

ART. 17. MINISTERS

The authority to ordain or license ministers has its source in the local church.

1. LICENSED MINISTERS

Must be a member of a church which belongs to the Mount Moriah Association. He must give evidence to his church that he is divinely called to preach, whereupon the local church is authorized to examine him for license. This examination should include the areas of the candidate's life, doctrine, reputation, and his convictions and abilities regarding the work of the ministry. The ministerial license shall be valid for a period of one year but is renewable annually. He must have his license renewed annually by said church and kept enforced until ordination. He is free to exercise all the privileges and responsibilities of an ordained minister with the exception of pastoring a church and officiating at the observances of the ordinances and weddings.

2. ORDINATION

He must follow the guidelines for licensed m inisters. A minister must meet the conditions stated in the third chapter of I Tim othy, verses 1-7. The term, "husband of one wife" means he shall not have more than one living wife, at the present time and there be a wife still living from a previous marriage. The same shall apply to the wife, she shall have only one living husband. After he has been licensed and has proven his worth to the local church, the local church has the authority to ordain or ask the Association to ordain. The place of ordination and ordination council will be selected by the candidate. The ordination council shall consist of at least three (3) ordained ministers from the Mount Moriah Association.

3. RULES FOR MINISTERS

- A. Ministers wishing to transfer from another Free Will Baptist Church or another Association into the Mount M oriah Association, shall present a letter of good standing from the church or Association of which he is a member, be examined by the Credentials Comm ittee, and be approved by this Association.
- B. Ministers of other denominations who unite with our churches shall be as a member and if they wish to preach, they must follow the procedure required of our licensed ministers.
- C. Ministers of this Association, that are in good standing, shall be granted a card annually, signed by the Clerk and Moderator with the minister's name, address, and the church of which he is a member.
- D. Any minister who is on the ordained ministers list and does not attend an Associational meeting in any one year or who MAKES NO CONTACTS will be dropped from the ordained ministers' list.
- E. Any minister who behaves himself unbecomingly to his calling into the ministry of the gospel shall be reported by the Credentials Committee to the Association, who shall deal with him.

ART. 18. This Association shall be a member of the Alabama State Association of Free Will Baptists. It is expected that each church will send the necessary fee for representation in the State body.

RULES OF DECORUM FOR CONFERENCE

The conference shall be called to order by the Pastor who is the Moderator. The clerk shall be seated in order.

- 4. Calls for communications.
- 5. Calls for new business.
- Calls for miscellaneous business
- Adjournment.

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise, by His grace, to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, faith, and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ."

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel; nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace. To be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold christian principle sacred and christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society, constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come and His will be done on earth as it is in Heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday Schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.
