# ANNUAL ASSOCIATIONAL MEETING TABERNACLE HILL FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH October 10, 1998

The 148th session of the Mount Moriah Association met at Tabernacle Free Will Baptist Church on October 10, 1998. The opening song "When We All Get To Heaven," was led by Tim Fields with Myra Galloway at the piano. The welcome and prayer were given by host pastor, Rev. Jerry Smith. The Credentials Committee retired to examine the church letters.

The morning message was preached by Rev. Tony Latham with Philippians 2: 5-11 with his text entitled, "There's A Storm Going On". He gave scriptural facts of the moral decay of our nation. The Moderator, Bro. Terrell Jones, called the meeting to order. The Clerk gave the Roll Call of Churches, with all churches represented. The Credentials Committee read the Roll Call of Ministers. The Moderator conducted the Seating of Delegates. Since there was an ample number to fill the committees, the placing of absent delegates was omitted.

The Clerk read the following General Board Report:

The General Board met at Shiloh Church on September 19, 1998, at 2:00 p.m. Rev. Terrell Jones, Moderator, presided. Vaudine Lancaster, Clerk, took minutes. Rev. Scott Montgomery said the opening prayer. Is. The Roll Call of General Board members was given. Glen Echo, Union Hill, 1st FWB Reform and 1st FWB of Tuscaloosa were not represented. The Credentials Committee retired to examine the church letters. Ballots for upcoming offices were passed out to the General Board members. Don Martin, Tabernacle's Board Member, told of suggestion to divide the Clerk/Treasurer's job into two separate offices. He read a proposed amendment to the Rules of Decorum if it was passed at the annual meeting. The Proposed amendments to the Rules of Decorum read:

Article 1 (b) The new officers (Moderator, Assistant Moderator,

Clerk, Assistant Clerk, and Treasurer) will take office at the close of the annual session and serve through the annual session of the following year.

Article 3. (a) The Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, and Treasurer shall be chosen by ballot at each annual session of the association. A majority of votes, by delegates present, elect.

(b) The Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, and Treasurer cannot serve more than four years in succession.

Proposed amendment to the Constitution -

Article 5. The officers of the Association shall be Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk and Treasurer; who shall be chosen by ballot at each annual session by a majority of votes. The Moderator shall serve as the Assocational Representation on the General Board of the State Association. The Clerk and Treasurer shall be paid \$125.00 each, per year, plus expenses incurred in carrying out their respective duties. Each church shall send each year to the annual session, the sum of \$30.00 as associational funds.

#### Memorial to Rev. Donald Keasler

Donald Keasler, as a young husband and father, had all the things one could wish for – a wonderful wife, three children, job security, extensive

travel to other countries while in the military service, fellowship of friends – but something was missing. Then, at age 39 he found the Savior and also the true meaning of happiness and joy.

Another thing happened. Donald felt God had called him into the ministry. He agonized over this because had always been shy in speaking before a group. Sometimes he would say words and they wouldn't come out right, and school had never been taken too seriously. Could God be making a mistake.....but God's word says he makes no mistakes. Through earnest prayer to God he determined he must follow God's will.

Bro. Keasler heeded God's call and became an effective minister of His word. He learned if he applied Paul's admonition in II Timothy 2:15 God would do the rest. His stammering voice would be filled with power as God used his submissive will. Many people began to notice the change in his life. Some tried to discourage him, especially his worldly friends and would say hurtful things about him. His faith in God showed them that he was serving a God who was stronger than their criticism and was instrumental in winning some of these people to serving his God.

He served as pastor of several churches in the Mt. Moriah Association and he and his faithful companion, Arlene, won Christian friends at each pastorate. Because of many health problems he had to quit pastoring churches but continued to preach as fill-in for churches, at community ctivities or wherever he could be a witness to the Lord.

God's business was serious business to Bro. Donald as he served the Lord's Army here on earth, from which he has now received an honorable discharge. Bro. Donald is now retired to serve with God's heavenly host.

## Memorial to Rev. Raymond Tilley

Christlike, tender, a man of humility – these words were spoken over and over in describing the loss of our dear minister – Rev. Raymond Tilley. With all of these desirable traits he possessed a deep desire to be the most effective tool possible for God.

Bro. Tilley followed in his father's footsteps in heeding God's call to be his servant. Then the made a step which was relatively new for pastors our area; he decided he need to go to our Bible College to be better equipped to preach God's word. He applied this knowledge and became a very effective minister.

Bro. Raymond reached out to broader areas, always wanting to do things better for the Lord. He took an active part in our associational activities and also participated on the state and national levels of Free Will Baptists.

No one in our association has worked more diligently on keeping the associational minutes than Bro. Raymond. He served as Associational Clerk during a period when there was not enough money to pay for the minutes and the clerk's services; so he would sometimes sacrifice his work and take no money. Also, it was an era when none of the letters were typed and he had to decipher the handwriting. He did an outstanding job that few people realized the time and effort he put into the minutes. In his humble disposition he would only say he was doing his job. We pause at this time to show our deep appreciation for his years of dedication in serving as clerk.

Many of our churches were fortunate in having Bro. Tilley serve as pastor. He also served as pastor in Mississippi. Besides being a preacher, he was also gifted in music and loved to go to church singings and would sometimes surprise his congregation by playing a song on the piano. He was loved, because he showed his love to mankind.

Our association and a host of friends will have a void that can never be filled, but heaven will be a much better place at his arrival.

#### Memorial to Rev. DelbertTownsend

Faithful, kind, tenderhearted, and conscientious. All of these describe Bro. Townsend, but his most memorable trait was the dry wit and humor he inserted in his messages when he really wanted to emphasize a certain point. The true to life experiences he related were similar to Jesus's method of teaching in parables to his followers.

## ARTICLES OF FAITH

- ART. 1. We believe there is one true and living God, who is the Supreme Ruler of Heaven and earth, self-existent Creator of all things and revealed under the personal distinction of Father, Son and Holy Ghost, equal in every divine perfection, and existing in distant harmonious offices in the great work or redemption.
- ART. 2. We believe the Holy Bible was written by men divinely inspired and is a perfect treasure of heavenly instruction; that it has God for its author, truth for its matter and salvation for its end; that it reveals the principle by which all human conduct, creeds and options will be tried.
- ART. 3. We believe that man was created holy under the law of the maker, but from voluntary transgression fell from that holy state, inconsequent of which all mankind are depraved and wholly unable of their own free will and ability to recover from that fallen state in which they are by nature.
- ART. 4. We believe that God'has not fixed the future state of mankind by any absolute and unalterable decree; but salvation is offered in the Gospel free to all, and if sinners are lost forever it will be their own fault.
- Art. 5. We believe that Christ by His death and suffering, made an atonement for the sins of mankind in general, and every individual in particular; however, that none but those who believe in Him can be partakers of the divine benefits.
- ART. 6. We believe that true faith cannot proceed from the exercise of our natural facilities and powers, or from the force and operation of the free will since man in consequence of his natural corruption is incapable of either thinking or doing anything spiritually good.
- ART. 7. We believe in the general application of the Grace of God for fallen man, sufficient to enable him morally and actually to obey the requirements of the law of liberty James 1:25, this is to act saving faith; John 1:9; however, none but those who believe or acquiesce in Christ will be saved thereby; Acts 17:32; Romans 13:14; John 3:19.
- ART. 8. We believe in the free and moral agency of man, by the Grace of God, before and after conversion that he is under no invincible necessity, by his Creator, to act in a given way that if he lives after the flesh he shall die, but if he through the spirit, do mortify the deeds of the body he shall live, and therefore, man is always a proper subject of admonition and exhortation, *Hebrews 3:11,12,13; Romans 13:14; Mark 13:33; Ezekiel*

- 18:24; Revelations 2nd and 3rd chapters; Ezekiel 33:13-18; I Timothy 4:1; Hebrews 3:6; I Corinthians 10:12-22; I Peter 1:10.
- ART. 9. We believe that the visible church of Christ is a congregation of believers, associated by covenant in faith and fellowship of the Gospel observing the ordinances of Christ, governed by His laws and exercising the gifts, rights and privileges invested in them by His work; that its only proper officers are bishops, pastors and deacons, whose qualifications, claims and duties are defined in the Epistle of Timothy and Titus.
- ART. 10. We believe that Christian Baptism is immersion in water in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, and that believers are proper subjects.
- ART. 11. We believe the Lord's Supper is a perpetual obligation, by which the members of the church in the use of bread and wine, are to commemorate together the dying of Christ preceded always by solemn self-examination.
- ART. 12. We believe in the resurrection of the dead and the general judgment and joys of the righteous and the punishment of the wicked will be eternal upon principles of grace and justice.
- ART. 13. We believe in open and mixed communion and the churches of our body are authorized, through their pastors; to invite Christians of all orthodox churches, who are in good standing in their respective churches to commune with us at the Lord's table.
- ART. 14. We believe that the Holy Spirit enters the heart of the Believer at the time of conversion, and that speaking in tongues (languages) is neither an evidence of being in-filled with the Holy Spirit nor does it bring and heed the scriptural admonition, "Be filled with the Spirit." We thank God for our great Comforter, Guide, and Empowered, the precious Holy Spirit, the Third Person of the Trinity. (John 3:5-8; Romans 8:9; Ephesians 5:18; I Corinthians 14:22).

#### **RULES OF DECORUM**

- ART. 1. (a) The Association shall be called to order and officiated by the Moderator, who was elected at the last session.
- (b) The new officers (Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, and Treasurer) will take office at the close of the annual session and serve through the annual session of the following year.

- ART. 2. The Association shall be opened and closed by singing and prayer.
- ART. 3. (a) The Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, and Treasurer shall be chosen by ballot at each annual session of the Association. A majority of votes, by delegates present, elect.
- (b) The Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, and Treasurer cannot serve more than four years in succession.
- ART. 4. It shall be the duty of every church belonging to this Association to send a letter to every annual session of this Association, reporting in the letter its spiritual condition, benevolent work and its statistics. Also, that we receive the letters and seat the delegates on the strength of the Credentials Committee report and omit public reading of the letters. All letters be mailed with minutes fee to the Clerk of this Association the first week in September. The names of the delegates from the different churches shall be enrolled and called for, as necessary, during the session.
- ART. 5. A majority of the delegates shall rule in all cases except the reception of churches, all questions of doctrines, and matters pertaining to the Constitution and Rules of Decorum, then it shall be by two-thirds vote.
- ART. 6. The Moderator shall not be entitled to vote except in case of a tie, and then he shall give the deciding vote. He shall be entitled to speak on all questions after all others have spoken, provided he appoint someone to the chair while he is speaking.
- ART. 7. Only one person shall speak at a time and he shall rise and address the Moderator and after recognition by the Moderator, he shall proceed.
- ART. 8. No member shall be interrupted while speaking unless he departs from the subject under discussion or uses words of personal reflection.
- ART. 9. No person shall be allowed to speak more than twice on the same subject without leave of the Association, nor more than five (5) minutes at a time.
- ART. 10. No member shall laugh or talk while debates are going on.
- ART. 11. No member shall absent himself from the Association without leave of the Moderator.
- ART. 12. The Moderator shall have the power to call the Association together at any time he deems necessary or upon a petition of two-thirds of the churches composing the Association over which he presides.

ART. 13. That the appointment of all committees by the Moderator be confined to Ministers and Delegates composing the Association.

### **CONSTITUTION**

- ART. 1. This Association shall be known as the Mount Moriah Free Will Baptist Association of Alabama, being composed of delegates from the different churches forming the same, each being entitled to three elected delegates.
- ART. 2. The body shall be considered an Advisory Council, but have no authority over the affairs of other churches unless they depart from the Articles of Faith of the Association. In case any church departs from the Articles of Faith and supports doctrines of heresy, or allows any Minister of her body to teach doctrines not in keeping with our Articles of Faith, the same shall be dealt with by this Association as it may deem proper and right, according to the teachings of the Bible.
- ART. 3. Each church in this Association shall be considered an advisory body and shall control its own internal affairs in matters of discipline, etc., and each church reserves the right to retain ownership of their property and buildings should the church split or decide to sell. Each church should control its internal affairs concerning all property under their name. It may, however, in extreme cases, call aid from sister churches, but the Association shall rule in all matters of doctrine.
- ART. 4. All questions of doctrines and matters pertaining to the Constitution and Rules of Decorum shall be settled by a two-thirds vote of the Association; provided the same is presented in written form; presented in the morning session; and voted on in the afternoon session; and the decision shall be final.
- ART. 5. The officers of the Association shall be Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, and Treasurer, who shall be chosen by ballot at each annual session by a majority of votes. The Moderator shall serve as the Associational Representative on the General Board of the State Association. The Clerk and Treasurer shall be paid \$125.00 each, per year, plus expenses incurred in carrying out their respective duties. Each church shall send each year to the annual session, the sum of \$30.00 as associational funds.
- ART. 6. (a) This Association shall meet annually, at such time and place as may be agreed on at a previous annual session, and shall not adjourn finally until all business is transacted.

- (b) There shall be a short business session and a report from all standing committees at each quarterly meeting.
- ART. 7. Any church wishing to become a member of the Mt. Moriah Association of Free Will Baptists, or continue membership, must adopt its Articles of Faith and conform to its usage, and must openly identify in all their literature, printed matter, signage, etc., that they are a FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH. Any church that cannot do this will not be acceptable.
- ART. 8. We agree as churches of this Association to use our best influences to promote the interest of all moral and benevolent institutions, such as the Temperance Cause, Sunday Schools, Missionary Work, etc.
- ART. 9. Any minister pastoring a church or churches in the Mount Moriah Association shall be a regularly ordained minister in good standing and become affiliated with this association.
- ART. 10. All ministers and deacons shall be standing delegates in this Association.
- ART. 11. We adopt the Treatise of Faith and Practice of the Original Free Will Baptists.

# ART. 12. SECTION ONE: GENERAL BOARD

- A. COMPOSITION: The General Board shall be composed of the Moderator, Clerk, and one member from each local church that is a part of this body. Each member from a local church shall serve a two-year term with one-half of the members being elected each year.
- B. DUTIES: The General Board shall formulate all ideas of business during the annual session of the Association, act as a Nominating Committee, as well as, any other responsibility so delegated by the body. It shall not have the power to commit the Association to any cause or policy not authorized by the Mount Moriah Association, nor to reverse any action of the Mount Moriah Association;

### SECTION TWO: BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

- A. COMPOSITION: The Christian Board shall be composed of five (5) members. These are elected to serve a 5-year term with one expiring each year.
- B. DUTIES: 1. The Christian Board shall act in an advisory capacity to the youth organization of the Association. 2. The Christian Board shall work with all churches in the Association to promote the youth work and other related projects. 3. The Christian Board, along with the youth officers and host church, shall plan the program.

# ART. 13. <u>STANDING COMMITTEES</u>

### SECTION ONE: CREDENTIALS COMMITTEE

- A. The Credentials Committee shall consist of three lay brethren and two ordained ministers, elected at the annual session of the Association, each serving a five (5) year term, the senior member coming off each year. A committee member cannot serve more than one term without a year's leave.
- B. It shall be the responsibility of this committee to examine letters coming to this body from churches, ministers, and other Associations. This committee shall also examine all ministers who become a part of this body, either by ordination or by letter, and make recommendations to the Association.
- C. It shall be the duty of this committee to make an annual report to the Association as to the standing, character, and orthodoxy of the ministers and churches of this Association.

# SECTION TWO: MISSIONS AND CHURCH EXTENSION COMMITTEE

- A. The Missions and Church Extension Committee shall consist of three (3) lay brethren and two ordained ministers elected at the annual session of the Association, elected for a five-year term, the senior member coming off each year.
- B. It shall be the responsibility of this committee to take charge and promote the cause of Missions and Church Extension of this Association and to take oversight of any Mission Church so organized.

- C. The Mission Committee shall have a Secretary-Treasurer and use funds given for Mission and Church Extension work.
- D. The Mission and Church Extension Committee shall make a report to the annual session of the Association.
- ART. 14. The Moderator of the Association shall be an ex-officio member of all Boards and Committees.
- ART. 15. No person shall be allowed to serve on more than one Standing Board or Committee, with the exception of the General Board. A person may be a member of the General Board and still be eligible for a Standing Board or Committee.

## ART. 16. DEACONS

To be ordained, he must be elected by the church of which he is a member. A deacon must meet the conditions stated in the third chapter of I Timothy, verses 8-13. The term "husband of one wife" means he shall not have more than one living wife, that is, he shall not be married to one wife at the present time and there be a wife still living from a previous marriage. The same shall apply to the wife, she shall have only one living husband. The ordination council shall consist of at least one ordained minister and two deacons of the Mount Moriah Association.

# ART. 17. MINISTERS

The authority to ordain or license ministers has its source in the local church.

# 1. LICENSED MINISTERS

Must be a member of a church which belongs to the Mount Moriah Association. He must give evidence to his church that he is divinely called to preach, whereupon the local church is authorized to examine him for license. This examination should include the areas of the candidate's life, doctrine, reputation, and his convictions and abilities regarding the work of the ministry. The ministerial license shall be valid for a period of one year but is renewable annually. He must have his license renewed annually by said church and kept enforced until ordination. He is free to exercise all the privileges and responsibilities of an ordained minister with the exception of pastoring a church and officiating at the observances of the ordinances and weddings.

### 2. ORDINATION

He must follow the guidelines for licensed minister. A minister must meet the conditions stated in the third chapter of Timothy, verses 1-7. The term "husband of one wife" means he shall not have more than one living wife, that is, he shall not be married to one wife at the present time and there be a wife still living from a previous marriage. The same shall apply to the wife, she shall have only one living husband. After he has been licensed and has proven his worth to the local church, the local church has the authority to ordain or ask the Association to ordain. The place of ordination and ordination council will be selected by the candidate. The ordination council shall consist of at least three (3) ordained ministers from the Mount Moriah Association.

### 3. RULES FOR MINISTERS

- A. Ministers wishing to transfer from another Free Will Baptist Church or another Association into the Mount Moriah Association, shall present a letter of good standing from the church or Association of which he is a member, be examined by the Credentials Committee, and be approved by this Association.
- B. Ministers of other denominations who unite with our churches shall be as a member and if they wish to preach, they must follow the procedure required of our licensed ministers.
- C. Ministers of this Association, that are in good standing, shall be granted a card annually, signed by the Clerk and Moderator with the minister's name, address, and the church of which he is a member.
- D. Any minister who is on the ordained ministers list and does not attend an Association meeting in any one year or who MAKES NO CONTACTS will be dropped from the ordained ministers' list.
- E. Any minister who behaves himself unbecomingly to his calling into the ministry of the gospel shall be reported by the Credentials Committee to the Association, who shall deal with him.
- ART. 18. This Association shall be a member of the Alabama State Association of Free Will Baptists. It is expected that each church will send the necessary fee for representation in the State body.

## RULES OF DECORUM FOR CONFERENCE

The conference shall be called to order by the Pastor who is the Moderator. The clerk shall be seated in order.

- 1. Invite visiting members to seat with and aid in council.
- 2. Open the door of the church for members.
- 3. Calls for reference.
- 4. Calls for communications.
- 5. Calls for new business.
- 6. Calls for miscellaneous business.
- 7. Adjournment.
