ANNUAL ASSOCIATIONAL MEETING **MT. MORIAH FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH October 7, 2000**

One hundred fifty years ago the Mt. Moriah Association held its first meeting. Today we celebrate the 150th session of the Mount Moriah Association held at Mt. Moriah Church. The opening song "Where The Soul Never Dies" was sung by the congregation with Milford McAdams leading the singing and Myree Galloway at the piano. Prayer was led by Rev. Fred Graham.

Host pastor, Rev. Roy Plymon, gave the welcome using a comparison of Lincoln's Gettysburg Address as follows:

Seven score and ten years ago our fathers decided that all Baptists were not alike. We all have inalienable rights... to believe the Word, trust in Christ and be saved...

- A right to understand that we are lost apart from God's salvation and we are unable to help ourselves.

- A right to trust in the finished works of Christ on Calvary's tree sufficient for our sin debt.

Some have said Eternally Secure (can't lose your faith, apostasy does not exist); while others said Predestined (you have no control over destinies, God chooses heaven's citizenship). To those who would go to the left or the right, our fathers said, "Heresy". They lifted some eyebrows.

Apostasy is a possibility and YES we do control our destiny – and YES we do practice open communion at the Lord's table and any Christian is welcomed. And YES we are old fashioned and conservative in believing that the Bible is the word of God, infallible, inerrant, and whole. And YES we believe Jesus is coming again. Every eye will see him. And YES we believe the dead will rise and we who are alive will join them to meet the Lord in the air.

Our fathers believed this strong enough to form our Association 150 years ago, and it is still alive today. WELCOME TO THE 150th YEAR CELEBRATION!

Rev. Jerry Smith, Moderator, gave the response. He related the history of a church standing for God for 150 years. He asked all those who had church history and memorabilia to display them. He also recognized some that had worn old-fashioned clothes in keeping with the day.

The Moderator asked the Credentials Committee to retire to update the business on hand.

A welcome from Jaimie, Tammy, Jonathan, and John William Lancaster (missionaries from Mt. Moriah Church serving in Uruguay, South America) was read by Tim Brasher. The letter read:

Greetings from Uruguay,

Through the eyes of history the Mt. Moriah Association has seen many things. Its members have seen 30 Presidents, from Filmore to Clinton. Its people have been involved in at least 6 wars. They have also seen the invention of the light bulb, zippers, hot dogs, internal combustion engines, radio, television, satellites, space walks and the Internet.

Though the eyes of the Gospel, the churches of the Mt. Moriah Association have seen only one thing. For 150 years the eyes of its people have been focused on Christ and have been faithfully proclaiming the unchanging Gospel of Jesus Christ to an ever changing world.

Congratulations on the completion of 150 years working together. The unity of purpose in our Association speaks volumes on the desires and wishes of the individual churches. This small group of churches is affecting lives in all corners of the world because of the faithfulness and steadfastness of those who have blazed the trail before us.

We can not afford to rest on our previous accomplishments, however. "We must be proud of our heritage but must constantly remember the command of our Savior who instructed us to teach and make disciples of all nations, as we are going from day to day. Our task is to minister to people who have a different mindset than those we ministered to even 20 years ago. There are many that deny the existence of absolute truth. While this is a recent phenomenon in the States, we are currently ministering to people in Uruguay who adopted this position 80 years ago. The loss of absolute truth ultimately leads to absolute despair.

The faithfulness to the propagation of the Gospel has kept the Mt. Moriah Association going for 150 years and the continuance will carry us for the next 150 years or until the Lord returns.

I am proud to be a part of this group of believers and appreciate your love and support for our family as we minister here in Uruguay.

Once again, congratulations on 150 year of faithful service in bringing people into the Kingdom.

A time was given for those who had history regarding our 150 years as an Association. It was suggested that this history be made available to the National Archives. A history of Rev. Ellis Gore, the founder of Mt. Moriah Church, the first Free Will Baptist church in Alabama, was read by Waymon Fields. It read as follows:

THE REVEREND ELLIS GORE

Ellis Clementine Gore was born in Chester District, South Carolina on October 3, 1800. His parents, Thomas Tindal and Nancy Sanders Gore, sold their home in 1817 and made the year long journey to Alabama in covered wagons. They arrived in this area before Alabama received statehood in 1819 and settled south of McShan. There were Choctaw Indians in this area until the Treaty of Dancing Rabbit Creek of 1830.

On November 6, 1838 Elder Ellis Gore helped to organized a Baptist Church named Mount Moriah about four miles north of McShan, with Elder Samuel McGowan as pastor. Rev. Ellis Gore was elected pastor in September 1841 at this church. He preached the doctrine of free salvation and open communion. In November 1845 charges were made against Rev. Gore for preaching this doctrine. Rev. Gore and a majority of the members seceded from the Baptist Church, called themselves Free Will Baptists, and continued meeting at the Mount Moriah Church. In 1846 Rev. Ellis Gore rode his horse from McShan to Fayetteville, North Carolina, joined the Free Will Baptists, was ordained a Free Will Baptist minister, and returned with the treatise to organize a Free Will Baptist Church at the Mount Moriah Church. Due to continued difficulty there, he began preaching at a school house near his home, two miles west of McShan. He and his followers built a church near the school and called it Mount Moriah Free Will Baptist Church, the first Free Will Baptist Church in Alabama. He pastored Mount Moriah Church until September 1883, a total of forty-two years. It was said that he "never knew when to quit" while preaching. He baptized eighteen people five days before his death.

Rev. Gore also organized Macedonia and New Salem Free Will Baptist Churches. On November 8, 1850 delegates from Macedonia and New Salem met at Mount Moriah and organized the Mount Moriah Free Will Baptist Association. Rev. Gore was elected moderator of the association and William C. Easterwood, clerk. In an 1874 minute we find that Rev. Gore was still moderator. He later helped organize Shiloh, Tabernacle and Holly Springs Free Will Baptist Churches. Currently eighteen churches comprise the Mount Moriah Free Will Baptist Association.

Rev. Gore married Dorcas B. Thomas in 1823. Dorcas was born January 7, 1804 in North Carolina and died August 4, 1866. Rev. Ellis and Dorcas Gore had twelve children: George W., Martha H., Upton Asberry, Elizabeth A., Ezekiel S., Rachel Ann, Lucy Minerva, Thomas B., Horace, Mary F., Robert Fleming, and James Austin. (Robert Fleming Gore died in service at Camp Manassas, Virginia. Rev. Gore rode his horse to Camp Manassas at the age of sixty to take clothes, shoes and medicine to Robert when he became ill. When he died, Rev. Gore returned to the camp in a horse and wagon to bring his son's body home for burial.)

Rev. Gore married Anna Mae Burdine Smith on January 8, 1867. Anna was the daughter of James Tarrant and Mary Martin Burdine. Rev. Ellis and Anna Mae Gore had nine children: Ellis Burdine, Sudie Ann, Clark Clementine, Cherry Fannie, Alice N., and four babies who died at birth. Rev. Gore died October 5, 1883, and Anna Mae died June 29, 1896. Ellis, Dorcas, and Anna Mae are buried in the Gore Family Cemetery near their home.

He then read some of the important happenings in the history of the Mt. Moriah Association. It read:

THE MOUNT MORIAH ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

On November 8, 1850 delegates from Macedonia, Mount Moriah and New Salem Churches met at Mount Moriah and organized the Mount Moriah Free Will Baptist Association. All three churches had been organized by Elder Ellis Gore. Rev. Gore was elected moderator of the association, and William C. Eqsterwood was elected clerk. Rev. Gore remained moderator of the association until his death in 1883, a total of thirty-three years.

In 1874 the association was comprised of nineteen churches with a total member- ship of 702. Those churches were Bethlehem, Corinth, Free Hope, Free Liberty, Macedonia, Mount Moriah, Mount Pleasant, Mount Springs, Pilgrim's Chapel, Pilgrim's Rest, Shiloh, Springfield, Union Grove, Vernon and Zion in Alabama; and Bethlehem, Detroit, Shiloh and Union Chapel in Mississippi. Five of these churches were received into the association at this three day meeting held at Macedonia Church. The business was conducted on Saturday and Monday with preaching on Sunday. Brother J. M. I. Guyton was elected clerk and Brother Joseph Woods was re-elected treasurer.

The fiftieth annual session of the Mount Moriah Association was held at Antioch Church in Fayette County on October 13-15, 1900. Elder William E. Hardin was re-elected moderator, and Thomas Alexander was elected clerk. Membership totaled 726 and was comprised of nine churches at this time: Antioch, Holly Springs, Macedonia, Mount Hermon, Mount Moriah, Phillips Chapel, Shiloh, Tabernacle and Union. Ordained ministers in the association in 1900 were Elders C. J. Blake, J. A. Brown, James D. Byars, W. J. Coward, George W. Gillreath, W. J. Harden, T. K. Harrison, John S. Hinton, W. R. Latham, J. E. Mathis, W. H. McGee, Woods Springfield, J. E. Strickland and S. W. Williams.

The one hundredth annual session of the association was held at Mount moriah Church on October 7-9, 1950. Rev. Mert Montgomery was reelected moderator and Rev. Leander McAdams was re-elected clerk. Membership totaled 1,848 and seventeen churches were members at this time: Arbor Springs, Espy Springs, First F.W.B. of Aliceville, First F.W.B. of Northport, Glen Echo, Hattie's Chapel, Macedonia, Mary's Chapel, Mbunt Moriah, Mount Zion, Phillips Chapel, Pleasant Hill, Sardis, Shiloh, Tabernacle, Union and Union Hill: Ordained ministers in the association in 1950 were Rev. Linwood Fields, Edgar Jonès, J. L. Lavender, S. R. Lee, J. L. Lynn, W. L. Lynn, Leander McAdams, Mert Montgomery, N. M. Sanford, J. M. Spencer, T. A. Spring-field, R. L. Taylor, J. E. Tilley, J. H. Tilley, Raymond E. Tilley and T. L. Walker.

Those who have served as moderator of the association have included Rev. W. B. Montgomery, J. E. Mathis, Woods Springfield, T. L. Walker, W. E. Harbin, J. D. Byars, J. E. Tilley, J. L. Lavender, J. H. Tilley, Roy Gene Plymon, Dewey Thomas, William E. Atkinson, Tony Latham, Larry Reynolds, Terrell Jones, Milton Fields, and Jerry Smith.

Those who have served as clerk-of the association have included J. A. Boswell, J. S. Stokes, J. H. Harless, O. L. Stokes, S. V. Powell, W. E. Dean, B. Montgomery, S. H. Lindsay, W. L. Burkhalter, Leander McAdams, Raymond E. Tilley, James South, Roy Gene Plymon, Marion P. Gore, Vaudine Lancaster, Sue Plymon and Tammy Lancaster.

Two of the three churches which organized this association are still members - Macedonia and Mount Moriah. Many churches have joined through the years, and today this association is comprised of eighteen churches with a membership of almost 1700.

An old 1944 minute with pictures of all the ministers of the association was shown by Vaudine Lancaster. The association was held at her home church, Glen Echo.

Rev. Roy Plymon discussed some old minutes and emphasized that today's doctrine is the same as in the 1800s. He gave a challenge to continue to press forward in working for the Lord.

Rev. Jerry Smith asked that we give a hand of praise for the work of our forefathers and gave a report on some history dating back to the 1800s.

The prayer to open this session was given by Rev. Roy Plymon. The Roll Call of Churches was given by the Clerk. All churches were represented. Rev. Jerry Montgomery, Credentials Committee, gave the Roll Call of Ministers. As their name was called the Moderator gave each pastor an Original Treatise of Free Will Baptists, October 1912, and revised in 1933. Standing delegates and elected delegates were seated. Visitors were welcomed. A delegation from Lawley Free Will Baptist was welcomed. Rev. Hank Hollis, formerly from the Mt. Moriah Association, was also recognized. He showed a rare book about Free Will Baptists entitled "Free Baptist Cyclopaedia - Historical and Biographical" by Rev. G. A. Burgess, A.M. and Rev. J. T. Ward, A.M., copyrighted by the Free Baptist Cyclopaedia Co., 1886 and 1889. This book was given to him by his uncle, Rev. M.L. Hollis, who was a well known Free Will Baptist.

The Credentials Committee gave a partial report.

The Clerk read the following General Board report -

The General Board met at Shiloh Church on September 23 at 2:00 p.m. After prayer the Roll Call of Churches was given by the Clerk. All churches were represented except Union Hill. The Credentials Committee retired to examine the church letters.

Rev. Jerry Smith discussed a training seminar that would be beneficial to the leaders of our churches. It will be conducted by Elmer Towns and Stan Toler at the Civic Center in Northport on October 28.

A report from the Credentials Committee showed that all church letters were in order. The Clerk praised the Church Clerks for the prompt manner they send the church letters and the funds requested.

The Moderator made mention that today's nominations were only recommendations for the delegated body; and that nominations can be made and voted on at the annual meeting.

In the business Milford McAdams asked in reporting church membership which was correct — the active or total. It was the consensus of the body that the total membership was the correct one to report.

Another question was how to list the pastor's salary – the total salary or the total package salary. It was requested to submit the total salary package and encouraged all churches to do this. It was stated that each church is independent and can conform to the rules of their individual church.

Also, the question was asked if we have printed forms that has the necessary information requested by the state and national. The answer was "yes" and they can be obtained from the national office.

Rev. Jerry Montgomery made a motion that on the standing committees, that no more than one (1) person from the same church shall serve on the same standing committee (Credentials, Board of Christian Education, Missions and Church Extension). If passed this could be placed as Article 14 under the Rules of Decorum.

The Clerk stated that since Missions is undergoing a transition and in reporting donations it is difficult to know which category to list it under - the Home Missions, Foreign Missions, ACTS 1:8. Land Fund, etc. The most important thing is the money was given and will be accounted for.

The state meeting will be at First Free Will Baptist Church in Florence on November 9 and 10, 2000.

James South distributed the Treasurer's Report in the absence of the Treasurer, Jewell South, who was sick.

A discussion on the upcoming the 150th anniversary annual meeting followed. The Moderator suggested bringing old church history records and making this a very special day. The host pastor, Rev. Roy Plymon, gave everyone a special invitation to attend.

For the upcoming Missions Conference, if you would like to make changes in the number of days held, the one-day or the Sunday-Wednesday format, you need to get in touch with Rev. Danny Williams.

A motion was made to adjourn, seconded and Rev. Jerry Montgomery gave the closing prayer.

After the reading of the General Board meeting the Clerk was asked to read the proposal. It was moved and seconded to table this until the business session. Rev. Jerry Montgomery also entertained a move in Article 12 of the Constitution to the correct place - "Move Article 12, Section Two, which is the Board of Christian Education, to become Article 13, Section Three."

Jewell South, Treasurer, gave the annual Treasurer's Report and passed out

forms to all delegates.

A committee was appointed to draw up guidelines for new churches that wish to affiliate with the Mt. Moriah Association. The five who will serve on this committee are: Rev. Kevin Taylor, Rev. Terrell Jones, Rev. Ken Bozeman, James South and Stanley Sanford.

Committees were assigned and will prepare reports during the lunch hour. They will proceed for lunch first in line so they will have ample time for their reports.

Rev. Ken Bozeman, Assistant Moderator, gave instructions for voting and passed out voting ballots.

Delegates for the State Association were appointed. The following were appointed: Jewell South, Myree Galloway, Arlene Keasler, Lottie Sudduth, Miford and Sue McAdams, Betty Miller, Betty Youngblood, Jeff Smith and Brenda Smith.

Searcy Mullenix dismissed the congregation for break time of donuts and coffee. We reconvened with the singing of "Standing On The Promises."

Special music was rendered by Mt. Moriah members – Sue Plymon, Landy Plymon, Tim and Karen Brasher. They sang "Rainbow of Love" and Sue gave a humorous inspirational rendition on "Get Thee Behind Me Satan".

Rev. Ken Bozeman introduced the morning speaker, Rev. Jerry Smith. His message was from Revelation 3: -"Behold I have set before thee and open door." Although this was speaking of the church at Philadelphia, a door is open to all God's people today. People are still a hungry and thirsty for God's righteousness. He used scripture to show this truth – Acts 2:17 "I will pour out my Spirit on all flesh" John 4:35, "Lift up your eyes on the fields" and Col. 4:3, "Pray for them that God would open a door of utterance to speak the mystery of the gospel. And Acts 4:20, "We can but speak the things we have seen and heard Preaching and witnessing should be as if it was your last message or last chance to the lost world.

Rev. Roy Plymon gave directions for the noon meal. Plans for having "dinner on the ground" at the outdoor table were changed because of the cold weather. He gave the blessing for the meal.

Mrs. Cecil Jones from Union Church asked for a few minutes to share her

testimony. She is 94 and attends all the church meetings she has an opportunity to. Her main source of enjoyment is telling how good the Lord has been to her. She gave a remarkable, lengthy narrative she had learned when she was a child about two trains – the devil's train and the glory bound train.

A delicious meal, along with Christian fellowship was enjoyed. The congregation assembled for the afternoon session.

PM SESSION

"I Would Not Be Denied" was sung, followed by prayer by Lewis Montgomery. Special music, "A Beautiful Life" was sung by the group from Mt. Moriah. In keeping with the "old fashioned" tone of the day a group sang the shaped notes to the music of "Old Time Power." This

"Leaning on the Everlasting Arms" was the opening congregation song led by Milford McAdams with Myree Galloway at the piano, followed by prayer by Rev.Larry Colburn. Rev. Jerry Smith, Moderator and pastor of the host church, gave the welcome

Rev. Doug Tilley preached the first sermon stating that God is the supplier of every need. His topic, "Thus saith the Lord – What We Must Do", gave several "must" commands taken from John 3. ARTICLES OF FAITH

ART. 1. We believe there is one true and living God, who is the Supreme Ruler of Heaven and earth, self-existent Creator of all things and revealed under the personal distinction of Father, Son and Holy Ghost, equal in every divine perfection, and existing in distant harmonious offices in the great work or redemption.

ART. 2. We believe the Holy Bible was written by men divinely inspired and is a perfect treasure of heavenly instruction; that it has God for its author, truth for its matter and salvation for its end; that it reveals the principle by which all human conduct, creeds and options will be tried.

ART. 3. We believe that man was created holy under the law of the maker, but from voluntary transgression fell from that holy state, inconsequent of which all mankind are depraved and wholly unable of their own free will and ability to recover from that fallen state in which they are by nature.

ART. 4. We believe that God has not fixed the future state of mankind by any absolute and unalterable decree; but salvation is offered in the Gospel free to all, and if sinners are lost forever it will be their own fault.

ART. 5. We believe that Christ by His death and suffering, made an atonement for the sins of mankind in general, and every individual in particular; however, that none but those who believe in Him can be partakers of the divine benefits.

ART. 6. We believe that true faith cannot proceed from the exercise of our natural facilities and powers, or from the force and operation of the free will since man in consequence of his natural corruption is incapable of either thinking or doing anything spiritually good.

ART. 7. We believe in the general application of the Grace of God for fallen man, sufficient to enable him morally and actually to obey the requirements of the law of liberty - *James 1:25*, this is to act saving faith; *John 1:9*; however, none but those who believe or acquiesce in Christ will be saved thereby; *Acts 17:32; Romans 13:14; John 3:19*.

ART. 8. We believe in the free and moral agency of man, by the Grace of God, before and after conversion that he is under no invincible necessity, by his Creator, to act in a given way that if he lives after the flesh he shall die, but if he through the spirit, do mortify the deeds of the body he shall live, and therefore, man is always a proper subject of admonition and exhortation, *Hebrews 3:11,12,13; Romans 13:14; Mark 13:33; Ezekiel 18:24; Revelations*

2nd and 3rd chapters; Ezekiel 33:13-18; I Timothy 4:1; Hebrews 3:6; I Corinthians 10:12-22; I Peter 1:10.

ART. 9. We believe that the visible church of Christ is a congregation of believers, associated by covenant in faith and fellowship of the Gospel observing the ordinances of Christ, governed by His laws and exercising the gifts, rights and privileges invested in them by His work; that its only proper officers are bishops, pastors and deacons, whose qualifications, claims and duties are defined in the Epistle of Timothy and Titus.

ART. 10. We believe that Christian Baptism is immersion in water in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, and that believers are proper subjects.

ART. 11. We believe the Lord's Supper is a perpetual obligation, by which the members of the church in the use of bread and wine, are to commemorate together the dying of Christ preceded always by solemn self-examination.

ART. 12. We believe in the resurrection of the dead and the general judgment and joys of the righteous and the punishment of the wicked will be eternal upon principles of grace and justice.

ART. 13. We believe in open and mixed communion and the churches of our body are authorized, through their pastors, to invite Christians of all orthodox churches, who are in good standing in their respective churches to commune with us at the Lord's table.

ART. 14. We believe that the Holy Spirit enters the heart of the Believer at the time of conversion, and that speaking in tongues (languages) is neither an evidence of being in-filled with the Holy Spirit nor does it bring and heed the scriptural admonition, "*Be filled with the Spirit*." We thank God for our great Comforter, Guide, and Empowered, the precious Holy Spirit, the Third Person of the Trinity. (John 3:5-8; Romans 8:9; Ephesians 5:18; I Corinthians 14:22).

RULES OF DECORUM

ART. 1. (a) The Association shall be called to order and officiated by the Moderator, who was elected at the last session.

(b) The new officers (Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, and Treasurer) will take office at the close of the annual session and serve through the annual session of the following year.

ART. 2. The Association shall be opened and closed by singing and prayer.

ART. 3 (a) The Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, and Treasurer shall be chosen by ballot at each annual session of the Association. A majority of votes, by delegates present, elect.

(b) The Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, and Treasurer cannot serve more than four years in succession.

ART. 4. It shall be the duty of every church belonging to this Association to send a letter to every annual session of this Association, reporting in the letter its spiritual condition, benevolent work and its statistics. Also, that we receive the letters and seat the delegates on the strength of the Credentials Committee report and omit public reading of the letters. All letters be mailed with minutes fee to the Clerk of this Association the first week in September. The names of the delegates from the different churches shall be enrolled and called for, as necessary, during the session.

ART. 5. A majority of the delegates shall rule in all cases except the reception of churches, all questions of doctrines, and matters pertaining to the Constitution and Rules of Decorum, then it shall be by two-thirds vote.

ART. 6. The Moderator shall not be entitled to vote except in case of a tie, and then he shall give the deciding vote. He shall be entitled to speak on all questions after all others have spoken, provided he appoint someone to the chair while he is speaking.

ART. 7. Only one person shall speak at a time and he shall rise and address the Moderator and after recognition by the Moderator, he shall proceed.

ART. 8. No member shall be interrupted while speaking unless he departs from the subject under discussion or uses words of personal reflection.

ART. 9. No person shall be allowed to speak more than twice on the same subject without leave of the Association, nor more than five (5) minutes at a time.

ART. 10. No member shall laugh or talk while debates are going on.

ART. 11. No member shall absent himself from the Association without leave of the Moderator.

ART. 12. The Moderator shall have the power to call the Association together at any time he deems necessary or upon a petition of two-thirds of the churches composing the Association over which he presides. ART. 13. That the appointment of all committees by the Moderator be confined to Ministers and Delegates composing the Association.

ART. 14. No more than one (1) person from the same church shall serve on the same standing committee (Credentials, Board of Christian Education, Missions and Church Extension).

CONSTITUTION

ART. 1. This Association shall be known as the Mount Moriah Free Will Baptist Association of Alabama, being composed of delegates from the different churches forming the same, each being entitled to three elected delegates.

ART. 2. The body shall be considered an Advisory Council, but have no authority over the affairs of other churches unless they depart from the Articles of Faith of the Association. In case any church departs from the Articles of Faith and supports doctrines of heresy, or allows any Minister of her body to teach doctrines not in keeping with our Articles of Faith, the same shall be dealt with by this Association as it may deem proper and right, according to the teachings of the Bible.

ART. 3. Each church in this Association shall be considered an advisory body and shall control its own internal affairs in matters of discipline, etc., and each church reserves the right to retain ownership of their property and buildings should the church split or decide to sell. Each church should control its internal affairs concerning all property under their name. It may, however, in extreme cases, call aid from sister churches, but the Association shall rule in all matters of doctrine.

ART. 4. All questions of doctrines and matters pertaining to the Constitution and Rules of Decorum shall be settled by a two-thirds vote of the Association; provided the same is presented in written form; presented in the morning session; and voted on in the afternoon session; and the decision shall be final.

ART. 5. The officers of the Association shall be Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, and Treasurer, who shall be chosen by ballot at each annual session by a majority of votes. The Moderator shall serve as the Associational Representative on the General Board of the State Association. The Clerk and Treasurer shall be paid \$125.00 each, per year, plus expenses incurred in carrying out their respective duties. Each church shall send each year to the annual session the sum of \$30.00 as associational funds.

ART. 6. (a) This Association shall meet annually, at such time and place as may be agreed on at a previous annual session, and shall not adjourn finally until all business is transacted.

(b) There shall be a short business session and a report from all standing committees at each quarterly meeting.

ART. 7. Any church wishing to become a member of the Mt. Moriah Association of Free Will Baptists, or continue membership, must adopt its Articles of Faith and conform to its usage, and must openly identify in all their literature, printed matter, signage, etc., that they are a FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH. Any church that cannot do this will not be acceptable.

ART. 8. We agree as churches of this Association to use our best influences to promote the interest of all moral and benevolent institutions, such as the Temperance Cause, Sunday Schools, Missionary Work, etc.

ART. 9. Any minister pastoring a church or churches in the Mount Moriah Association shall be a regularly ordained minister in good standing and become affiliated with this association.

ART. 10. All ministers and deacons shall be standing delegates in this Association.

ART. 11. We adopt the Treatise of Faith and Practice of the Original Free Will Baptists.

ART. 12. <u>SECTION ONE: GENERAL BOARD</u>

A. COMPOSITION: The General Board shall be composed of the Moderator, Clerk, and one member from each local church that is a part of this body. Each member from a local church shall serve a two-year term with one-half of the members being elected each year.

B. DUTIES: The General Board shall formulate all ideas of business during the annual session of the Association, act as a Nominating Committee, as well as, any other responsibility so delegated by the body. It shall not have the power to commit the Association to any cause or policy not authorized by the Mount Moriah Association, nor to reverse any action of the Mount Moriah Association.

C. MEETING DATE: The regular meeting date for the General Board will be two weeks prior to the annual Association meeting (the Saturday before second Sunday in October) and remain the same each year.

A. COMPOSITION: The Christian Board shall be composed of five (5) members. These are elected to serve a 5-year term with one expiring each year.

B. DUTIES: 1. The Christian Board shall act in an advisory capacity to the youth organization of the Association. 2. The Christian Board shall work with all churches in the Association to promote the youth work and other related projects. 3. The Christian Board, along with the youth officers and host church, shall plan the program.

ART. 13. STANDING COMMITTEES

SECTION ONE: CREDENTIALS COMMITTEE

A. The Credentials Committee shall consist of three lay brethren and two ordained ministers, elected at the annual session of the Association, each serving a five (5) year term, the senior member coming off each year. A committee member cannot serve more than one term without a year's leave.

B. It shall be the responsibility of this committee to examine letters coming to this body from churches, ministers, and other Associations. This committee shall also examine all ministers who become a part of this body, either by ordination or by letter, and make recommendations to the Association.

C. It shall be the duty of this committee to make an annual report to the Association as to the standing, character, and orthodoxy of the ministers and churches of this Association.

SECTION TWO: MISSIONS AND CHURCH EXTENSION COMMITTEE

A. The Missions and Church Extension Committee shall consist of three (3) lay brethren and two ordained ministers elected at the annual session of the Association, elected for a five-year term, the senior member coming off each year.

B. It shall be the responsibility of this committee to take charge and promote the cause of Missions and Church Extension of this Association and to take oversight of any Mission Church so organized.

C. The Mission Committee shall have a Secretary - Treasurer and use funds given for Mission and Church Extension work.

D. The Mission and Church Extension Committee shall make a report to the annual session of the Association.

ART. 14. The Moderator of the Association shall be an ex-officio member of all Boards and Committees.

ART. 15. No person shall be allowed to serve on more than one Standing Board or Committee, with the exception of the General Board. A person may be a member of the General Board and still be eligible for a Standing Board or Committee.

SECTION THREE: BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

ART. 16. <u>DEACONS</u>

To be ordained, he must be elected by the church of which he is a member. A deacon must meet the conditions stated in the third chapter of I Timothy, verses 8-13. The term "husband of one wife" means he shall not have more than one living wife, that is, he shall not be married to one wife at the present time and there be a wife still living from a previous marriage. The same shall apply to the wife, she shall have only one living husband. The ordination council shall consist of at least one ordained minister and two deacons of the Mount Moriah Association.

ART. 17. MINISTERS

The authority to ordain or license ministers has its source in the local church.

1. <u>LICENSED MINISTERS</u>

Must be a member of a church which belongs to the Mount Moriah Association. He must give evidence to his church that he is divinely called to preach, whereupon the local church is authorized to examine him for license. This examination should include the areas of the candidate's life, doctrine, reputation, and his convictions and abilities regarding the work of the ministry. The ministerial license shall be valid for a period of one year but is renewable annually. He must have his license renewed annually by said church and kept enforced until ordination. He is free to exercise all the privileges and responsibilities of an ordained minister with the exception of pastoring a church and officiating at the observances of the ordinances and weddings.

2. ORDINATION

He must follow the guidelines for licensed minister. A minister must meet the conditions stated in the *third chapter of Timothy, verses 1-7*. The term "husband of one wife" means he shall not have more than one living wife, that is, he shall not be married to one wife at the present time and there be a wife still living from a previous marriage. The same shall apply to the wife, she shall have only one living husband. After he has been licensed and has proven his worth to the local church, the local church has the authority to ordain or ask the Association to ordain. The place of ordination and ordination council will be selected by the candidate. The ordination council shall consist of at least three (3) ordained ministers from the Mount Moriah Association.

3. <u>RULES FOR MINISTERS</u>

A. Ministers wishing to transfer from another Free Will Baptist Church or another Association into the Mount Moriah Association, shall present a letter of good standing from the church or Association of which he is a member, be examined by the Credentials Committee, and be approved by this Association.

B. Ministers of other denominations who unite with our churches shall be a member and if they wish to preach, they must follow the procedure required of our licensed ministers.

C. Ministers of this Association, that are in good standing, shall be granted a card annually, signed by the Clerk and Moderator with the minister's name, address, and the church of which he is a member.

D. Any minister who is on the ordained ministers list and does not attend an Association meeting in any one year or who MAKES NO CONTACTS will be dropped from the ordained ministers' list.

E. Any minister who behaves himself unbecomingly to his calling into the ministry of the gospel shall be reported by the Credentials Committee to the Association, who shall deal with him.

ART. 18. This Association shall be a member of the Alabama State Association of Free Will Baptists. It is expected that each church will send the necessary fee for representation in the State body.

RULES OF DECORUM FOR CONFERENCE

The conference shall be called to order by the Pastor who is the Moderator. The clerk shall be seated in order.

- 1. Invite visiting members to seat with and aid in council.
- 2. Open the door of the church for members.
- 3. Calls for reference.
- 4. Calls for communications.
- 5. Calls for new business.
- 6. Calls for miscellaneous business.
- 7. Adjournment.
