

Greetings from our Director, Mike Corley, and the staff and children of the FWB Children's Home in Eldridge, AL. We are very thankful for your faithful prayers and support of this ministry. Without people like you and churches like yours, we could not fulfill the task God has given us.

Since 1947 we have cared for approximately 900 children; over 35 the last year. Presently we have 21 children on campus (11 girls & 10 boys). This means we have room for others, so please pray that God will put us in contact with those we can help. If you know someone in need, please refer them to us. We want to impact the lives of as many children as we can.

We are very thankful for our faithful supporters. Because of them we were able to finish 2013 solidly in the black in our operating fund. However, the first nine months of this year our income is down by nearly \$60,000. Please pray about the situation and help us however God leads you.

We thank the Lord that over the summer months, six of our teens made a salvation decision. Please pray for our kids and their spiritual lives. There are several others who need to settle the salvation issue and some who need a spiritual victory.

The Home recently purchased a small two-bedroom house on a lot adjacent to our property. It will be used to provide a place for our house parents to stay on their off days. The purchase was funded with the designated monies given in an estate gift received in 2012.

The fall Harvest Drive has been an annual event for the Home since the 1960's. Over the years, churches, businesses, organizations, and individuals have donated tons of food, cleaning, and paper products. The drive is a major element in stocking our pantry and reducing our expenses.

The Friendship Stateline Free Will Baptist Church will be hosting the 10th Annual Benefit Singing for the Children's Home on Saturday, October 18 at 7:00 pm. The church is located at 13363 Stateline Road, Taft, TN (corner of Stateline and Old Railroad Bed Road). James, one of our teen boys, has been accepted for 2015 E-Team Panama. This is a three week missions program for highs school students sponsored by FWB International Missions. If you would like to help him with the expenses of his trip, you may send a donation to FWBCH, earmarked "Summer Missions."

Rev. Wesley Robertson led a prayer. Mrs. Vaudine Lancaster read the following memorial for Rev. Dewey Thomas.

A pleasant appearance, an outgoing personality, and a gift of speaking; these were qualities of this successful car salesman. But God had in mind a greater job for this man. Then at an Associational meeting at Mt. Zion Free Will Baptist Church he was asked to preach and it was clear that God would use this young man as his salesman – to try to reach them to become followers of Christ. He had a zeal for the lost and very soon in his ministry he started a building program in east Tuscaloosa resulting in a thriving church, Eastside Free Will Baptist. About six years later in 1970 he felt led to start a church north of Tuscaloosa. Another beautiful brick structure, Carolwood Church, was completed under his leadership and the help of friends and donations. Both projects were done without the assistance of Home Missions.

There was gentleness about Bro. Dewey Thomas that immediately let you know he was your friend and was ready to help you. He also had the Mt. Moriah Association at heart and took an active role in its affairs. It is no surprise Bro. Thomas answered the call as pastor, since several of his relatives before him had paved the way – Reverends Lonnie, Lawrence, and Arlie Lynn. Presently, two of his cousins, Reverends Elmer and Randall Lynn, are serving in the ministry in this association.

Carolwood Church continued to grow and prosper as he reached out to those who needed the Savior. In this imperfect world things were happening in Bro. Thomas' life. The sudden death of his son was devastating, plus severe health problems for him and his wife to cope with. It was evident he would need someone to work with him and the Lord blessed him with a qualified helper, Rev. Jerry Montgomery, who continues in the pulpit as pastor.

When Bro. Thomas' health caused him to be unable to stand and preach he would sit in a chair to proclaim God's word. Sometime during this episode of illness God smiled on him and through His healing hand and expert medical treatment Bro. Thomas was again able to walk, stand in the pulpit and preach for a period of time. He openly shared this and expressed his gratefulness.

Eventually his pain returned and he and his wife were almost housebound, unable to continue normal activities. His faith and trust in God got him through the greatest loss in his life, his wife of 67 years. When his death came in December 2013, he was still a faithful servant of God. What a legacy he and his wife leave to his family, his church, his friends, and most of all, to his God.

An excerpt from his obituary so beautifully expresses his testimony that reads:

"Once in a life time we meet someone that points us to Jesus, and our lives are changed forever. This someone was Bro. Dewey Thomas, a man after God's own heart. Preaching the gospel, winning lost souls for Christ was his passion. No greater love hath any man than one that would lay down his life for his friends, family, neighbors and also the stranger he met. Because of his great love for mankind, thousands have been touched by his life.

This man stood in the gap, by the spirit was lead. In his heart he had a plan and with God as his witness this vow he did make to win souls to Jesus whatever it takes. He sacrificed to build several churches where people can worship to this day. He has put on the armor of faithfulness,

he has fought many battles, and he has stood the test. And until the war was won, he would not rest. Till his death Lord, he stood for You!

The Clerk gave the roll call of the churches with all present except Eastside, First Reform, Liberty, and Union Hill. Rev. Randall Lynn gave the roll call of ministers with 13 present. He gave the roll call of the standing committees with four absent.

Our Moderator seated the standing and elected delegates. Danny and Karen Williams were recognized as visitors from the Children's Home.

Following the congregational "Little Is Much When God Is In It," Rev. Gary Mullenix presented the first message. He spoke on Things We Cannot Compromise and began in Hebrews 13:8 reminding us that Jesus never changes. We cannot compromise the truth of creation; the devil attacks God's word with the theory of evolution. We must hold marriage as between one man and one woman for life. The devil is attacking God's plan with homosexuality, divorce and "living together" as acceptable alternatives. Finally, we cannot give in to the devil's lie that we must be tolerant and accept all gods as the same. We must continue to share the truth that Jesus is the only way.

Danny Williams gave a brief update on the work at the Children's Home. He asked that we continue to support them financially and in our prayers. He reported that giving has been down compared to this time last year. However, he reported that the Home is making a lasting impact in the lives of children. He related several stories from a reunion held June 21, 2014 where former residents returned and shared stories of the positive impact the Home had made on their lives.

After enjoying delicious refreshments and a time of fellowship, we gathered to the singing of "I Will Sing the Wondrous Story."

Tim Fulgham prayed then the offering was taken while we sang "Praise Him, Praise Him."

Rev. Wesley Robertson gave our second sermon asking "When Christ returns, who will be able to abide?" He used Malachi 4:1-6 as the main text. He reminded us that only God knows when Christ will return; we know the time is getting close. When Jesus returns, He will judge. His judgment is final. As in the time of Noah, people are refusing to listen to the warnings and continue to reject the truth. Those that accept Christ and do God's will shall live but all others will perish. We were encouraged to remain in God's will and continue to share the truth with others before it is too late.

Board of Christian Education- given by Bart Tilley

ARTICLES OF FAITH

- ART 1. We believe there is one true and living God, who is the Supreme Ruler of Heaven and earth, self-existent Creator of all things and revealed under the personal distinction of Father, Son, and Holy Ghost, equal in every divine perfection, and existing in distinct harmonious offices in the great work of redemption.
- ART 2. We believe the Holy Bible was written by men divinely inspired and is a perfect treasure of heavenly instruction; that it has God for its author, truth for its matter, and salvation for its end; that it reveals the principle by which all human conduct, creeds, and options will be tried.
- ART 3. We believe that man was created holy under the law of the maker, but from voluntary transgression fell from that holy state, inconsequent of which all mankind are depraved and wholly unable of their own free will and ability to recover from the fallen state in which they are by nature.
- ART 4. We believe that God has not fixed the future state of mankind by any absolute and unalterable decree; but salvation is offered in the Gospel free to all, and if sinners are lost forever it will be their own fault.
- ART 5. We believe that Christ by His death and suffering, made an atonement for the sins of mankind in general, and every individual in

- particular; however, that none but those who believe in Him can be partakers of the divine benefits.
- ART 6. We believe that true faith cannot proceed from the exercise of our natural facilities and powers, or from the force and operation of the free will since man in consequence of his natural corruption is incapable of either thinking or doing anything spiritually good.
- ART 7. We believe in the general application of the Grace of God for fallen man, sufficient to enable him to morally and actually obey the requirements of the law of liberty-*James 1:25*, this is to act saving faith; *John 1:9*; however, none but those who believe or acquiesce in Christ will be saved thereby; *Acts 17:32*; *Romans 13:14*; *John 3:19*.
- ART 8. We believe in the free and moral agency of man, by the Grace of God, before and after conversion that he is under no invincible necessity, by his Creator, to act in a given way that if he lives after the flesh he shall die, but if he through the spirit, do mortify the deeds of the body he shall live, and therefore, man is always a proper subject of admonition and exhortation, *Hebrews 3:11, 12, 13; Romans 13:14; Mark 13:33; Ezekiel 18:24; Revelation 2nd and 3rd chapters; Ezekiel 33:13-18; I Timothy 4:1; Hebrews 3:6; 1 Corinthians 10:12-22; 1 Peter 1:10.*
- ART 9. We believe that the visible church of Christ is a congregation of believers, associated by covenant in faith and fellowship of the Gospel observing the ordinances of Christ, governed by His laws and exercising the gifts, rights, and privileges invested in them by His work; that its only proper officers are bishops, pastors, and deacons, whose qualifications, claims, and duties are defined in the Epistle of Timothy and Titus.
- ART 10. We believe that Christian baptism is immersion in water in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Ghost, and that believers are proper subjects.
- ART 11. We believe the Lord's Supper is a perpetual obligation, by which the members of the church in use of bread and wine are to commemorate together the dying of Christ preceded always by solemn self-examination.

- ART 12. We believe in the resurrection of the dead and the general judgment and joys of the righteous and the punishment of the wicked will be eternal upon principles of grace and justice.
- ART 13. We believe in open and mixed communion and the churches of our body are authorized, through their pastors, to invite Christians of all orthodox churches, who are in good standing in their respective churches to commune with us at the Lord's Table.
- ART 14. We believe that the Holy Spirit enters the heart of the Believer at the time of conversion, and that speaking in tongues (languages) is neither an evidence of being in-filled with the Holy Spirit nor does it bring and heed the scriptural admonition, "Be filled with the Spirit." We thank God for our great Comforter, Guide, and Empowered, the precious Holy Spirit, the Third Person of the Trinity. (John 3:5-8; Romans 8:9; Ephesians 5:18; 1 Corinthians 14:22)

RULES OF DECORUM

- ART 1. (a) The Association shall be called to order and officiated by the Moderator, who was elected at the last session.
 - (b) The new officers (Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, Treasurer, and Assistant Treasurer) will take office at the close of the annual session and serve through the annual session of the following year.
- ART 2. The Association shall be opened and closed by singing and prayer.
- ART 3. (a) The Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, Treasurer, and Assistant Treasurer shall be chosen. by ballot at each annual session of the Association. A majority of votes, by delegates present elect.
 - (b) The Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, Treasurer, and Assistant Treasurer cannot serve more than four years in succession.
- ART 4. It shall be the duty of every Church belonging to this Association to send a letter to every annual session of this Association,

reporting in the letter its spiritual condition, benevolent work, and its statistics. Also, that we receive the letters and seat the delegates on the strength of the Credentials Committee report and omit the public reading of the letters. All letters be mailed with minutes fee to the Clerk of this Association the first week in September. The names of the delegates from the different churches be enrolled and called for, as necessary, during the session.

- ART 5. A majority of the delegates shall rule in all cases except in the reception of churches, all questions of doctrines, and matters pertaining to the Constitution and Rules of Decorum, then it shall be by two-thirds vote.
- ART 6. The Moderator shall not be entitled to vote except in case of a tie, and then he shall give the deciding vote. He shall be entitled to speak on all questions after all others have spoken, provided he appoints someone to the chair while he is speaking.
- ART 7. Only one person shall speak at a time and he shall rise and address the Moderator and after recognition by the Moderator, he shall proceed.
- ART 8. No member shall be interrupted while speaking unless he departs from the subject under discussion or uses words of personal reflection.
- ART 9. No person shall be allowed to speak more than twice on the same subject without leave of the Association, nor more than five (5) minutes at a time.
- ART 10. No member shall laugh or talk while debates are going on.
- ART 11. No member shall absent himself from the Association without leave of the Moderator.
- ART 12. The Moderator shall have the power to call the Association together at any time he deems necessary or upon a petition of two-thirds of the churches composing the Association over which he presides.
- ART 13. That the appointment of all committees by the Moderator be confined to Ministers and Delegates composing the Association.
- ART 14. No more than one (1) person from the same church shall

serve on the same standing committee (Credentials, Board of Christian Education, Missions and Church Extension).

CONSTITUTION

- ART 1. This Association shall be known as the Mount Moriah Free Will Baptist Association, being composed of delegates from the different churches forming the same, each being entitled to three delegates.
- ART 2. The body shall be considered an Advisory Council, but have no authority over the affairs of other churches unless they depart from the Articles of Faith of the Association. In case any church departs from the Articles of Faith and supports doctrines of heresy, or allows any Minister of her body to teach doctrines not in keeping with our Articles of Faith, the same shall be dealt with by this Association as it may deem proper and right, according to the teachings of the Bible.
- ART 3. Each church in this Association shall be considered an advisory body and shall control its own internal affairs in matters of discipline, etc., and each reserves the right to retain ownership of their property and buildings should the church split or decide to sell. Each church should control its internal affairs concerning all property under their name. It may, however, in extreme cases, call aid from sister churches, but the Association shall rule in all matters of doctrine.
- ART 4. All questions of doctrines and matters pertaining to the Constitution and Rules of Decorum shall be settled by two-thirds vote of the Association; provided the same is presented in written form; presented in the morning session; and voted on it the afternoon session; and the decision shall be final.
- ART 5. The officers of the Association shall be Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, Treasurer, and Assistant Treasurer who shall be chosen by ballot at each annual session by a majority of votes. The Moderator shall serve as the Associational Representative on the General Board of the State Association. The Clerk and the Treasurer shall be paid \$125.00 each, per year, plus expenses incurred in carrying out their respective duties. Each church shall send each to annual session the sum of \$30.00 as associational funds.

- ART 6. (a) This Association shall meet annually, at such time and place as may be agreed on at a previous annual session, and shall not adjourn finally until all business is transacted.
 - (b) There shall be a short business session and report from all standing committees at each quarterly meeting.

ART 7. CHURCH MEMBERSHIP IN THE ASSOCIATION

SECTION ONE: GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

A. Any Church desiring to become a member of the Mount Moriah Association of Free Will Baptists or to continue membership must adopt its Articles of Faith and conform to the use thereof and openly identify in all literature, printed material, church sign, etc. that they are indeed a FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH.

SECTION TWO: NEW CHURCHES REQUESTING MEMBERSHIP

- A. A Church requesting membership in the association must submit a letter affirming that it has read the Articles of Faith, Rules of Decorum, and the Constitution of the Mount Moriah Association and that its membership by majority vote has agreed to abide thereby. The letter shall be signed by the Church Pastor, Deacons of the Church, and the Church Clerk.
- B. A Church transferring from another association must obtain a letter in good standing from the association of which it is transferring from.
- C. The Credentials Committee shall be responsible for examining all requests of Churches desiring to become members. Upon completion of their examination they shall make a recommendation to the association during a regular business meeting session.
- ART 8. We agree as churches of this Association to use our best influences to promote the interest of all moral and benevolent institutions, such as the Temperance Cause, Sunday Schools, Missionary Work, etc.
- ART 9. Any minister pastoring a church or churches in the Mount Moriah Association shall be a regularly ordained minister in good standing and become affiliated with this Association.

- ART 10. All ministers and deacons shall be standing delegates in this Association.
- ART 11. We adopt the Treatise of Faith and Practices of the Original Free Will Baptists.

ART 12. GENERAL BOARD

- A. COMPOSITION: The General Board shall be composed of the Moderator, Clerk, and one member from each local church that is a part of this body. Each member from a local church shall serve a two-year term with one-half of the members being elected each year.
- B. DUTIES: The General Board shall formulate all ideas of business during the annual session of the Association, act as a Nominating Committee, as well as, any other responsibility so delegated by the body. It shall not have the power to commit the Association to any cause or policy not authorized by the Mount Moriah Association, nor to reverse any action of the Mount Moriah Association.
- C. MEETING DATE: The regular meeting date for the General Board will be two weeks prior to the annual Association meeting (the Saturday before second Sunday in October) and remain the same each year.

ART 13. STANDING COMMITTEES

SECTION ONE: CREDENTIALS COMMITTEE

A. The Credentials Committee shall consist of three lay brethren and two ordained ministers, elected at the annual session of the Association, each serving a five (5) year term, the senior member coming off each year. A committee member cannot serve more than one term without a year's leave.

- B. It shall be the responsibility of this committee to examine letters coming to this body from churches, ministers, and other Associations. This committee shall also examine all ministers who become a part of this body, either by ordination or by letter, and make the recommendations to the Association.
- C. It shall be the duty of this committee to make an annual report to the Association as to the standing, character, and orthodoxy of the ministers and churches of this Association.

SECTION TWO: MISSIONS AND CHURCH EXTENSION COMMITTEE

- A. The Missions and Church Extension Committee shall consist of three (3) lay brethren and two ordained ministers elected at the annual session of the Association, elected for a five-year term, the senior member coming off each year.
- B. It shall be the responsibility of this committee to take charge and promote the cause of Missions and Church Extension of this Association and to take oversight of any Mission Church so organized.
- C. The Mission Committee shall have a Secretary-Treasurer and use funds for Mission and Church Extension work.
- D. The Mission and Church Extension Committee shall make a report to the annual session of the Association.

SECTION THREE: BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

- A. COMPOSITION: The Christian Board shall be composed of five members. These are elected to serve a five-year term with one expiring each year
- B DUTIES: The Christian Board shall act in an advisory capacity to the youth organization of the Association. The Christian Board shall work with all churches in the Association to promote the youth work and other related projects. The Christian Board, along with the youth officers and host church, shall plan the program.

- ART 14. The Moderator of the Association shall be an ex-officio member of all Boards and Committees.
- ART 15. No person shall be allowed to serve on more than one Standing Board or Committee, with the exception of the General Board. A person may be a member of the General Board and still be eligible for a Standing Board or Committee.
- ART 16. <u>DEACONS</u>. To be ordained, he must be elected by the church of which he is a member. A deacon must meet the conditions stated in the third chapter of 1 Timothy, verses 8-13. The term "husband of one wife" means he shall not have more than one living wife, that is, he shall not be married to one wife at the present time and there be a wife still living from a previous marriage. The same shall apply to the wife, she shall have only one living husband. The ordination council shall consist of at least one ordained minister and two deacons of the Mt. Moriah Association.
- ART 17. MINISTERS. The authority to ordain or license ministers has its source in the local church.
 - A. LICENSED MINSTERS. Must be a member of a church which belongs to the Mount Moriah Association. He must give evidence to his church that he is divinely called to preach, whereupon the local church is authorized to examine him for license. This examination should include the areas of the candidate's life, doctrine, reputation, and his convictions and abilities regarding the work of the ministry. The ministerial license shall be valid for a period of one year but is renewable annually. He must have his license renewed annually by said church and kept enforced until ordination. He is free to exercise all the privileges and responsibilities of an ordained minister with the exception of pastoring a church and officiating at the observances of the ordinances and weddings.
 - B. ORDINATION. He must follow the guidelines for licensed minister. A minister must meet the conditions stated in the *third chapter of 1 Timothy, verses 1-7.* The term "husband of one wife" means he shall not have more than one living, that

is, he shall not be married to one wife at the present time and there be a wife still living from a previous marriage. The same shall apply to the wife, she shall have only one living husband. After he has been licensed and has proven his worth to the local church, the local church has the authority to ordain or ask the Association to ordain. The place of ordination and ordination council will be selected by the candidate. The ordination council shall consist of at least three (3) ordained ministers from the Mount Moriah Association

C. RULES FOR MINISTERS.

- a. Ministers wishing to transfer from another Free Will Baptist Church or another Association into the Mount Moriah Association, shall present a letter of good standing from the church or Association of which he is a member, be examined by the Credentials Committee, and be approved by this Association.
- b. Ministers of other denominations who unite with our churches shall be a member and if they wish to preach, they must follow the procedure required for our licensed ministers.
- c. Ministers of this Association, that are in good standing, shall be granted a card annually, signed by the Clerk and Moderator with the minister's name address, and the church of which he is a member.
- d. Any minister who is on the ordained ministers list and does not attend an Association meeting in any one year or who MAKES NO CONTACTS will be dropped from the ordained ministers' list.
- e. Any minister who behaves himself unbecomingly to his calling into the ministry of the gospel shall be reported by the Credentials Committee to the Association, who shall deal with him.

ART 18. This Association shall be a member of the Alabama State Association of Free Will Baptists. It is expected that each church will send the necessary fee for representation in the State body.

CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise, by His grace, to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of Scripture, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, faith, and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ."

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel; nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace. To be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society, constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come and His will be done on earth as it is in Heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday Schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.
