

LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION:

Recommendation Letter #1: At Presbytery Meeting, April 27, 2013, Moderator appointed Bros. Glyn A. Pool, John D. Yeats and Charles O. Marable to study amending our Association Articles of Faith and Constitution, defining the association's position on same sex marriage. Bro. Glyn A. Pool read the letter from the committee recommending changes to the Muscle Shoals Stateline Free Will Baptist Association Articles of Faith with the addition of Articles of Faith 19, 20, 21 and Association Constitution Article 16.

Recommendation Letter #2: Bro. Edward Burbank read the letter recommending that churches without a pastor, contact the Presbytery Moderator and the Presbytery will send a minister for no longer than one year. If church is not financial able to pay minister, Home Mission Board will pay minister \$100.00 each Sunday, as long as funds are available. Said church must send a letter to the Home Mission Board requesting funds.

#### OTHER BUSINESS:

Butler Grove was only church not reporting. Motion was made and seconded to retain church according to "General Business-Article 6".

Burns Chapel Free Will Baptist asked by letter to host the Muscle Shoals Stateline Free Will Baptist Association 2014 Session. #### **GENERAL BUSINESS:**

We your Committee on General Business, beg leave to report as follows:

- 1. We recommend that we retain a three member Home Mission Board and each Church send \$25.00; however, stronger Churches give according to their ability. We recommend that the money be used in the bounds of our Association to help spread the Gospel of Jesus Christ. We recommend all Home Mission Board members be required to sign a bank signature card when elected to the Board, and the Chairman of the Board be responsible to keep records of the bank account and supply copies to other Board Members. We recommend the Board have the authority to make disbursements of funds from said account by written check only with the signature of two Board members on the check. (Rev.2007)
- We recommend that each Church donate to the Children's Home of their choice, located in Eldridge, AL and Greeneville, TN.
- We recommend that the host church for the Annual Association Meeting choose the preaching hour minister.
- We recommend that the Moderator of conferences in our Churches see that the members present vote for or against each move.
- We recommend that preachers, deacons, and members in this Association be a member of one Church only.
- We recommend that any Church in this Association that does not send a letter for two years in a row be automatically dropped.
- 7. We recommend that each church in our Association adopt their own set of policies and procedures using the "Church Rules" and "Form of Church Conference" in the back of the Minute Book as a guideline.
- We strongly recommend that each church only allow members to vote on any business of the church.
- We recommend each church adopt by-laws to protect itself from individuals that would use its facilities for purposes contrary to the Muscle Shoals Stateline Free Will Baptist Association Articles of Faith and God's word.

#### **APPROVAL OF LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION:**

Letter #1: Bro. Glyn A. Pool referenced the recommendation of the previously elected committee. Bro. Timothy E. Hanback made motion to accept the recommendation according as read in the Morning Session. Motion seconded by Bro. James T. Turnbow, Sr. Motion carried.

Letter #2: Bro. Edward Burbank referenced the recommendation read in the Morning Session. Bro. Timothy E. Hanback recommended, if the Letter of Recommendation was approved, a letter be written to churches in Association advising them of the Association approval and ask all churches to support Home Mission Board for funds to be available as needed. Bro. Edward Burbank made motion to accept the recommendation. Motion seconded by Bro. Charles O. Marable.

Moderator asked for any other business to come before the Association before the 2014 Association Meeting adjourned. With no further business, Moderator asked for a motion and second to adjourn. Motion was made by Bro. Glyn A. Pool, seconded by Bro. Dale Cross and motion carried to adjourn the 2013 Association and meet with BURNS CHAPEL FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH on Saturday morning before the fourth Sunday in September, 2014, at 9:00 A.M., September 27<sup>th</sup>.

Association Presbytery meeting followed.

Be it known that we, the Free Will Baptist Church of Christ being in the states of Alabama and Tennessee, do believe in the doctrine of the general atonement, we have been baptized on a profession and we are desirous of bringing about reciprocal union. We purpose to maintain the order and rules of our Association according to the following plan:

Article 1: We believe that Churches of Christ are mutually independent of each other; that a congregation form of Church government should be invariably preserved, yet we, being convinced of the utility of friendly intercourse and pious council of principles of union advantage and Christian love, hold it a duty of the Churches to pay respect to the principles, with regard to the duty of the Association.

Article 2: The Association shall be composed of all ministers and ordained deacons, and not more than three delegates, chosen by the different Churches, in our union, who, producing a letter from respective Churches, certifying their appointments, shall be entitled to seats.

Article 3: The letters so produced shall express the condition of these Churches respectively; that is, the number of members in fellowship, the number excluded, and died since the last Association.

Article 4: The body shall have no conceived power, to Lord it over God's heritage or infringe on any of the internal privileges or rights by the Churches in our union, but shall only be considered an advisory council on all things, pertaining to the internal concerns of the Church.

Article 5: The Association is to give the best advice it can in all matters of difficulty. If the union be broken between any of the Churches, said Association shall inquire into the case of the breach, and use its best endeavor to remove the difficulty; but, if the breach cannot be removed, to withdraw from the Churches, which they may look upon as unsound in principles or disorderly in conduct or practice, until they be reclaimed.

Article 6: To take up no case of any kind in this union without the consent of a majority of the Churches and then only to give advice.

Article 7: Any Church may be admitted into the Association by letters and delegates; and, if upon examination it is found orthodox and orderly, such admission shall be manifested by the Moderator, giving the right hand of fellowship to the delegate thereof.

Article 8: The Association when properly organized for business, shall consist of a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk and Assistant Clerk, who shall be chosen by the suffrage of the members present. The duty of the Moderator shall be to keep the Association in order, state questions fairly and take the minds thereon, to have no vote unless the Association be equally divided; in which case, he shall have the deciding vote. The duty of the Clerk shall be to keep a true record of the proceedings of the Association.

Article 9: No query shall be received by the Association from any Church, unless it shall have been acted upon in said Church and cannot be settled; in which case, the Association shall take up same and act upon it.

Article 10: Every motion and second shall be attended to unless withdrawn by the mover.

Article 11: We agree to settle all our business by a majority vote of the members present.

Article 12: The Association shall have the power to sit as an advisory council, give the Churches all the necessary advice in matters of difficulty; to inquire into the cause of Churches neglecting to represent themselves in the Association; to appoint any member or members, with their consent, to transact any business they may judge necessary; to invite any visiting brethren, in the ministry, to a seat in the Association; to adjourn the Association at any place that may be deemed necessary; and, to exclude from his seat any member who will not conform to the rules and decorum, and shall report his or her conduct to the Church for which they are a delegate.

Article 13: This Constitution may be amended at any regular session of the Association by a two-thirds majority vote of members present, provided the proposed Amendment be presented in writing to the body in the morning session. When a motion is voted down, it may not be brought up again for three years. (Rev.2010)

Article 14: That we receive all members by the right hand of fellowship; and, that we elect an Assistant Moderator each year, and he automatically becomes the Moderator the following year. We are also to elect the Clerk and Assistant Clerk each year. The Clerk is to be paid \$150.00 for seeing that the minutes are printed. The Assistant Clerk is to be paid \$75.00 for his service. Article 15: That our Association convene on Saturday morning before the Fourth Sunday in September each year. (Rev.2010) Article 16: All churches that make up the body of the Muscle Shoals Stateline Free Will Baptist Association must adhere to all rules, and Articles of Constitution and Articles of Faith, or be subject to dismissal from this body. (Revised 2013)

#### **RULES OF ORDER OF THE ASSOCIATION**

- The Association when convenes shall be opened and closed with singing and prayer.
- Only one person shall speak at any time and he shall rise and address the Moderator.
- No person shall be interrupted by anyone except the Moderator until he is through speaking, nor shall the Moderator, unless he breaks the order.
- The person speaking shall adhere to the subject in question and shall not cast personal reflection on him who has spoken before.
- No person shall speak more than three times on any subject without leave of the Association.
- No member shall laugh or whisper in the time of public speech.
- No member shall address each other except by the appellation of brother or sister.
- No member shall absent himself from the Association without leave.
- The names of the members of this Association shall be enrolled and called over as often as the Association may think necessary.
- No person shall speak more than five minutes, at any time, without leave from the Association.
- 11. Any person who shall, knowingly, break any of these rules shall be reproved by the Moderator, according to the direction of the Association.
- 12. Every member of this body shall vote for or against every move that comes before it. When they fail to do this, they shall be reprimanded by the Moderator.

## MUSCLE SHOALS STATELINE FREE WILL BAPTIST CONSTITUTION OF THE PRESBYTERY

<u>Article 1</u>: Be it known that the Ordained Ministers, together with the Deacons of the Muscle Shoals Stateline Association, are the Presbytery of this Association, all of whom are ex-officio members.

Article 2: The object of the Presbytery is the mutual improvements of the ministry, their protection against hostile influences, and their purification by the casting out of unworthy members.

Article 3: The Presbytery has exclusive jurisdiction over the official character and standing of all Ordained Members and Licensed Ministers under its control.

Article 4: The Presbytery adopts a constitution, by-laws, and regulations by the majority vote not inconsistent with Free Will Baptist principles and usage.

Article 5: When a Church desires the license of a minister or an ordination of a minister or deacon, it requests the Presbytery to examine the candidate and if it thinks proper, license or ordain him.

Article 6: Before license or ordination, the candidate is examined as to the gifts, grace, and usefulness, including his personal piety, his call to the ministry, his adoption and devotion to the work, doctrinal sentiments and his general acceptance with the public.

Article 7: In ordination there is a presentation of the Bible, a prayer of consecration, charge, and the laying on of hands.

Article 8: A minister from another denomination, having first been received by a local Church, must serve twelve months in that Church, and then be recommended by it; is examined in the same way though with special care as to his doctrinal sentiments. Any Minister or Deacon coming under the hands of this Presbytery, who walks disorderly or commits an offense, must come before this body and make restitution or willingly give up such rights of license or ordination papers given him by this body.

Article 9: All Ministers' Reports shall be read before this Presbytery and adopted or rejected. No minister shall receive a card before his report is read and adopted. Any Minister failing to come in person or send a report will not receive a card, but their name will be retained in our Minutes for twelve months; then, that minister must bring a report in person at the end of the next twelve months, in order to receive a card, or they will be automatically dropped from the Presbytery, unless the Minister is confined to bed in home, hospital, etc., in which, they may send a Report by another Minister in this Presbytery, who will vouch for their health. Any deviation to stated rules due to unforeseen circumstances shall be considered on a case by case basis. All ministers' credentials shall bear the words, "These credentials valid only if the minister named hereon holds a current card." Any Minister in good standing leaving this Presbytery is to get a Letter of Recommendation and turn in his credentials. (Revised 10/28/05; 09/29/07)

Article 10: Any person or persons desiring to bring a charge against another brother, demanding a trial or the mind of this Presbytery, shall not bring the charge to the Association or to any regular Fifth Sunday Meeting; but shall ask the Moderator to call a Special Meeting at the Church where the trouble started. The Moderator shall instruct the Clerk to notify each member of the Presbytery of the time and place of such meeting. Gospel steps will be taken before we will receive a brother's credentials. Article 11: Any Minister, desiring license or ordination, must be a member of a Free Will Baptist Church in this Association twelve months before being licensed or ordained, and must preach under license for twelve months before being ordained. Then, if the Presbytery finds them worthy, ordain them; their credentials being valid, so long as they hold a current minister's card, maintain Christian conduct and remain a member of a Church in this Association. Licensed ministers shall not baptize anyone, nor shall they perform a marriage ceremony.

Article 12: The Moderator of this Presbytery shall be paid \$50.00, the Clerk shall be paid \$150.00, and the Assistant Clerk shall be paid \$75.00 for their services. The Clerk shall see to the printing and mailing of the Fifth Sunday Meetings Programs.

Article 13: The Churches shall approve their Deacons for twelve months before being recommended to be ordained. Ministers desiring to be licensed or ordained, shall have a written recommendation from the Church of which he is a member, before he is licensed or ordained.

Article 14: Any Deacon moving his membership from one Church to another in this Association, or from a Church of another Association or denomination, must be accepted to membership in one of our Churches; and, in a Special Called Conference of that Church be accepted as a Deacon, before being accepted to membership in this Presbytery.

Article 15: All the Minutes of this Presbytery, of both regular and special called meetings, shall be read, adopted and printed in the Association Minutes. However, the Minutes of a Special Called Meeting shall be read and adopted only in a called meeting.

Article 16: Any time this Presbytery takes or accepts the credentials of a Minister or a Deacon, they shall remain in the hands of this Presbytery for twelve months, and the Minister or Deacon must be recommended again by his home Church before this Presbytery can take action.

Article 17: Deleted October 25, 2003.

Article 18: Be it known, the Muscle Shoals Stateline Free Will Baptist Presbytery adopted, March 1, 2003, that women will not be accepted for ordination in this Presbytery, I Timothy 2:12; and that homosexuals will not be accepted for ordination in this Presbytery, Romans 1:20-32 and Leviticus 20:13.

Article 19: The Muscle Shoals Stateline Free Will Baptist Presbytery abides by the Biblical definition of marriage between one man and one woman. (Genesis 2:24) Therefore, if any member of the Muscle Shoals Stateline Free Will Baptist Association performs or participates in any marriage ceremony involving two of the same sex, he will automatically be expelled from the Association and we will not recommend him to any other Association or body. We make this move because we feel it is contrary to the King James Version of the Bible from which we teach and preach. (Romans 1:20-32, Leviticus 20:13). (Revised 2013)

### RULES OF THE MUSCLE SHOALS STATELINE FREE WILL BAPTIST SUNDAY SCHOOL CONVENTION

- The Convention when met shall open and close with singing and prayer.
- The officers elected the previous session shall begin their administration at the opening of each regular session.
- Only one member shall speak at a time. They shall rise and address the president and when recognized they shall speak.
- 4. No member shall laugh or whisper in time of public speaking.
- 5. No member shall be absent without permission from the president.
- The names of the ex-officio members shall be enrolled by the secretary and called as often as seems necessary by the President.
- Every ex-officio member shall vote for or against every movement that comes before the body.
- The Convention shall elect a Vice-President, Secretary/ Treasurer, and Assistant Secretary/Treasurer each year with the Vice-President automatically becoming the President the following year.

#### CONSTITUTION OF THE SUNDAY SCHOOL CONVENTION

Article 1: This Convention shall be known as the Muscle Shoals Stateline Free Will Baptist Sunday School Convention.

Article 2: The ex-officio members of this Convention shall consist of Ministers, Superintendents, Teachers, Delegates, and Deacons.

Article 3: Each Sunday School in this Convention shall be entitled to three Delegates.

Article 4: The officers of the Convention shall be a President, Vice-President, Secretary/Treasurer, and Assistant Secretary/Treasurer.

Article 5: Each Sunday School present shall be allowed 30 minutes for a program. The unconsumed time shall be devoted as the body shall deem best.

Article 6: Each Sunday School represented in this Convention shall be required to bring \$25.00 for the minute fund. The Convention shall pay to the Association Clerk \$300.00 per year for printing of Sunday School Convention Minutes in Minute Book. (Rev. 7/11)

Article 7: The Convention shall pay the Secretary/Treasurer \$25.00 and the Assistant Secretary/Treasurer \$25.00.

Article 8: The Convention shall meet on the last Fifth Sunday before the Association.

- We believe that there is but one true and eternal God, the Father, of whom are all things, everlasting to everlasting, glorious and immutable in His attributes. (I Corinthians 8:6; Isaiah 40:28.)
- 2. We believe that there is one Lord Jesus Christ, by whom are all things, the only begotten Son of God, born of the Virgin Mary, whom God freely sent into this world, because of the great love, wherewith He loved the world, and Christ so freely gave Himself a ransom for all; tasting death for every man, who was buried and rose again the third day, and ascended into Heaven; from whence we look for Him the second time, in the clouds of Heaven; at the last day, to judge both the quick and the dead. (I Timothy 2:5-6; John 3:16, Revelation 1:17; Acts 24:15; I John 2:2.)
- We believe that there is one Holy Ghost, the precious gift of the Father through His dear Son, unto the world; who quickeneth and draweth sinners home to God. (John 16:7-8; Acts 2:4; Ephesians 4:4-6; Ephesians 2:1.)
- 4. We believe that in the beginning God made man upright, and placed him in a state of glory, without the least mixture of misery, from which he voluntarily, by transgression, fell and by that means brought on himself a miserable and mortal state subject to death. (Genesis 2:17; 3:19.)
- We believe that God is not willing that any should perish; but that all should come to repentance and the knowledge of the truth, that they might be saved, for which end Christ hath commanded the Gospel to be preached among all nations; and to every creature. (Mark 16:15; John 3:15-17; I Timothy 2:4.)
- 6. We believe that no man shall suffer in hell for want of a Christ who died for him; but, as the scripture has said, for denying the Lord that bought them; because, they believe not in the name of the only begotten Son of God. Unbelief, therefore, being the cause, why the just and righteous God of Heaven, will condemn the children of men; it follows against all contradictions, that all men, at one time or other, are found in such capacity, as that through the grace of God, they may be saved. (Acts 17:30; Mark 6:6; Hebrews 3:10; John 5:10.)
- We believe the whole scripture is infallibly true, and that they are the only rules of faith and practice. (II Timothy 3:16-17.)
- We believe in the doctrine of general provision made of God in Christ for the benefit of all mankind who repent and believe the Gospel. (Luke 14:16-20,13:3-5, 24:27; Matthew 28:19-20; Acts 3:19; Mark 1:15.)
- 9. We believe that sinners are drawn of God, the Father, by the Holy Ghost, through Christ His Son; and that the Holy Ghost offers His

- divine aid to all human families, so as they all might be happy, would they give place to His divine teachings; whereas such, who would not receive the divine impressions of His Holy Spirit shall at a future day, own their condemnation just, and charge themselves, with their own damnation, for willfully rejecting the offers of sovereign grace. (Matthew 11:27; John 6:44-65; Psalms 1:1; Titus 2:11; Jeremiah 22:29.)
- 10. We believe that men, not considered simply as men, but ungodly men, were of old ordained to condemnation, considering such who turn the grace of God into lasciviousness, denying the only Lord God, Jesus Christ who bought them, and therefore, shall bring upon themselves swift destruction, but we observe that they might be saved. Therefore, the indignation and wrath of God is upon every son of man that doeth evil, living and dying, therein for there is no respect of persons with God. (Jude 1:4; II Peter 2:1-2; II Thessalonians 2:11-12; Romans 2:9-11.)
- 11. We believe that all children dying in infancy, having not actually transgressed against the law of God, in their own person are only subject to the first death, which was brought on them by the fall of the first Adam, and not that any of them dying in that state suffer punishment in hell, by the guilt of Adam's sin, for such is the Kingdom of God. (I Corinthians 15:22; Matthew 18:2-5; Mark 9:36-37; Matthew 19:14)
- 12. We believe that good works are the fruits of a saving faith; and, that in the use of the means of grace, and not out of the use of those means, eternal life is promised to men. (Revelation 22:14-15; Isaiah 2:19-20; Matthew 7:8; Jeremiah 6:16; Luke 13:34-35.)
- 13. We believe that no man has any warrant in the Holy scriptures for justification before God through his own works, power or ability, which he has in and of himself, only as he by grace is made able to come to God through Jesus Christ, believing the righteousness of Jesus Christ, to be imputed to all believers for their eternal acceptance with God. (Romans 4:24; Acts 8:20-21.)
- 14. We believe that all things are foreseen in the wisdom of God, so that God knoweth whatever can or cannot come to pass upon all supposed conditions, yet not having decreed any person to everlasting life out of respect or mere choice; farther that, He hath appointed the Godly unto life, and the ungodly, who die in sin, unto death. (Hebrews 4:13; Proverbs 8:22; Matthew 25:21-24.)
- 15. We believe, as touching gospel ordinances, in believers' baptism, laying on of hands, receiving of the sacrament in bread and wine, washing of the saints' feet, anointing the sick with oil in the name of the Lord, fasting, praying, singing praise to God, and the public ministry of the Word, with every institution of the Lord we shall find in the New Testament. (Mark 16:15; Acts 8:17; 19:6; Luke 22:19-20; John 13:5-17; James 5:14.)
- We believe the Gospel mode of water baptism is by immersion, and that believers are the only subjects for baptism.(Matthew 3:16; Mark 1:9-10; Acts 2:38; Romans 6:4; Colossians 2:12.)

- We believe in a general resurrection of the dead and a final judgment at the last day. (John 5:28-29; II Corinthians 5:10.)
- 18. We believe the happiness of the righteous is eternal, and the torments of the wicked are endless. (Matthew 25:46).
- 19. We believe that marriage is between a Man and a Woman and the establishment of the family: God created "Man and Woman" to be in relationship with one another, and stated that they should 'be fruitful and multiply', and raise children which is a part of God's creation plan for mankind. God specifically states, after he had made man and woman that everything he had made was very good and preserved the command to be "Fruitful and Multiply". This commandment establishes the family of mankind as a man and a woman with their natural desire to create children. Homosexual relationship between a man and a man or a woman and a woman is an abomination (Lev. 18:22) contrary to nature in that it does not represent what God intended when he made man and woman with physical bodies that have a "natural" way of interaction with each other to be "Fruitful and Multiply" by producing children. References: Genesis 1:26-31; 2:18; Romans 1:18-28; Ephesians 5:12-32; Hebrews 13:4; 1 Timothy 4:5, 14; 5:14; Constitution of the United States Bill of Rights Amendment I. (Revised 2013)
- 20. We believe that a Homosexual life-style is a sin against God. The prerequisite requirement for being a Believer in God is to be "Born Again"; born again of the Spirit of God. The Bible has established in truth that God will not dwell within an unclean body as such those that practice sin shall not enter into the presence of God or into heaven. Without the Holy Spirit dwelling in you, you are not of God. For this cause God gave them up unto their vile affections being filled with all unrighteousness who knowing the judgment of God, that which commit such things are worthy of death. God has stated that no sin shall enter Heaven and that sin separates man from God. References: Genesis 1:26-31; 2:18; Isaiah 59:2: John 3:3, 5,16; Romans 1:18-28; 8:9, 10; 1 Corinthians 6:19, 20; 2 Corinthians 6:16-18; Colossians 1:27; Hebrew 13:4; 1 John 3:8, 9; Constitution of the United States Bill of Rights Amendment I. (Revised 2013)
- 21. We believe that person engaged in immoral sexual behavior are sinners and shall not be allowed to participate in Muscle Shoals Stateline Free Will Baptist Association activities. Sexual misconduct and sexual immoral behavior as defined by the Bible as homosexuals, transvestites, adulterers and adulteress, fornicator's and trans-gender and a man and woman living together outside of marriage are against God's commandments and is sin. The Bible affirms that there can be no fellowship between believers and non-believers. References: Genesis 1:26-31; Romans 1:18-28; Proverbs 2:13; John 3:19; 8:12; Romans 13:12; 2 Corinthians 6:14; Ephesians 6:12; Constitution of the United States Bill of Rights Amendment I. (Revised 2013)

#### FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Jesus Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the Will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise, by His grace, to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and "to provide things honest in the sight of all men".

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, faith and good works, endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ".

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel; nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace; to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, promote the success of the Church and the Gospel.

We will, everywhere, hold the Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society, constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come and His will be done on earth as it is in Heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of Missions, the success of the Sunday Schools and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the World. And, may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

#### MUSCLE SHOALS STATELINE FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH RULES

- We agree to meet in conference quarterly or more often if necessary to transact the business of the Church.
- 2. The Moderator shall be chosen by the suffrage of the Church, in the absence of the Pastor. The Moderator shall observe good order and explain all questions, before he takes the voice of the Church, and shall have the liberty of speech as any other, but no vote unless there be a tie, when he shall cast the deciding vote.
- It shall be the duty of all members to fill their seats in conference and bear their part of the Church expenses.
- No member shall leave their seat during conference without permission from the Moderator.
- No member shall arraign another before the Church for any grievance without first taking gospel steps.
- All business brought before the Church by motion and properly seconded in a gospel-like order shall be attended to by the Church unless withdrawn by the mover.
- 7. Any person wishing to speak shall rise from his seat and address the Moderator, and if two arise at the same time, the Moderator shall decide who shall speak first, and no member while speaking shall cast any reflection on any person, but shall adhere strictly to the subject under consideration.
- No member shall speak more than twice on any subject without permission from the Church.
- 9. It shall be the duty of all Church members to be present at any Church meeting, to vote on all questions before the Church, called by the Moderator or any member of the Church, who may desire to obtain the mind of the whole Church.
- 10. If any member shall remain silent during the transaction of business of the Church, and afterward complain of what was done, the same shall be deemed disorderly, and the member so offending shall be dealt with accordingly.
- 11. The members of the Church shall not speak about another slanderously; and shall not give any report or circulation that may rise against any Church member, but shall make it known to the one the report is against and to no one else; and, any member doing otherwise shall be dealt with accordingly.

- We agree to do all business by majority of the members present, at any time.
- 13. We have but one mode of baptism, and that is by immersion, and will not accept any other baptism.
- That each Pastor, if possible, hold his own conference and that election of Pastor be done by ballot.
- 15. Any of our Churches calling a Pastor, see that he is a member of a Free Will Baptist Church and has ordination papers and card, and that he is in good standing in a Free Will Baptist Association.
