MINUTES

OF FIFTEENTH ANNUAL SESSION

N. C. FREE WILL BAPTIST SUNDAY SCHOOL CONVENTION-INSTITUTE

The fifteenth annual session of the N. C. Free Will Baptist Sunday School Convention-Institute convened with the Swannanoa Free Will Baptist Sunday School, Swannanoa, North Carolina, Wednesday through Friday, April 21-23, 1954. The theme of this session was "Edifying Christ Through the Sunday School," text, Acts 9:31, "Then . . . the churches . . . were edified . . . and walking in the fear of the Lord . . . were multiplied."

Cragmont Assembly, Inc., is located just a few miles from Swannanoa, and through the joint cooperation of the Swannanoa Church and Cragmont, many delegates stayed at Cragmont during the convention.

The convention got off to a good start on Wednesday evening, April 21, at 8:00 o'clock, with an "Old-Fashioned Revival Hour" under the direction of the local host pastor, Rev. Wayne Smith. The local choir furnished special music, and the sermon was delivered by Rev. Billy Morris.

THURSDAY MORNING, APRIL 22, 1954

Registration of delegates, visitors, ministers, and officers was begun on Wednesday and continued Thursday morning at 9 o'clock.

The morning session was opened with congregational singing and prayer, led by Rev. R. P. Harris, convention song leader. The welcome address was given by Mr. Cecil Redmond, superintendent of the host Sunday School. The response was given by Rev. LaRue Davis. Morning devotions were conducted by Miss Zalene Lloyd, using as her text, John 21:15-17.

Vice-president, Rev. Herman Hersey, presided over the morning session. At this time he called convention into a short, introductory business session.

Motion made and seconded to adopt the printed minutes of last convention as printed. Motion carried.

Motion to adopt minutes of Executive Board of May 9, 1953. Motion carried. Motion to postpone action on minutes of Executive Board of August 15, 1953, until agreement between Mission Board and this convention can be presented to convention for approval. Motion carried.

Motion to adopt minutes of Executive Board of January 21, 1954. Motion carried.

Brother Raymond T. Sasser brought the president's message. He asked the congregation to sing the chorus entitled "I have the Sunday School Enthusiasm." "The State Sunday School United Program" was used as his subject, and James 4:17 for his text. The message was a real challenge to each one present to do a greater work in our Sunday Schools and churches.

The Convention Message was delivered by Rev. R. P. Harris. He used Scripture from the second chapter of Colossians for his text, subject, "Edifying Christ." He urged those present to follow a three point program in Sunday School work, 1. position, 2. possession, 3. progression.

We were dismissed for the noon meal with prayer by Rev. Wayne Smith.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON

The afternoon session was opened with congregational singing. Rev. Burkette Raper conducted the afternoon devotions, using for his subject "Edifying Christ Through Witnessing."

Rev. Hubert Burress, Director of Denominational Enterprises, gave a detailed

report on his work, stressing unity among our Sunday Schools.

Mr. Cicero Smith, president of the Second Union Central District Sunday School Convention, gave a good report on the work of their convention.

Mr. Fountain Taylor, past president of the Third Eastern District Sunday School Convention, gave an oral report on the work of their convention.

Mr. W. P. Bunn, president of the Second Western District Sunday School Convention, gave a good report on the work of his convention, stressing the importance of all Sunday Schools in the state being a member of a district convention.

Mr. Walter Sandlin, president of the Fifth Eastern Union District Sunday School Convention, reported on the work of the Fifth Eastern Convention.

Mrs. Harold Stevens, a returned missionary from Africa, gave a very interesting report on the conditions in Africa.

Mr. Fountain Taylor, proxy for the president of the State Convention of Churches, brought greetings from the State Convention.

Rev. James A. Evans gave a very interesting report about Cragmont Assembly, Inc., and Mt. Allen College.

Mrs. S. A. Smith brought greetings from our orphanage at Middlesex.

Rev. Herman Hersey, delegate to the National Sunday School Convention, gave an interesting report pertaining to the functioning of the National Convention.

Rev. Burkette Raper, vice-president of the State League Convention brought greetings from the convention. He stressed the need for leagues in our churches for training our people for the duties to be performed.

The need for a Free Will Baptist Press representative to be in attendance at the various meetings was stressed by Rev. Burkette Raper.

Benediction was pronounced by Rev. Roy Rikard, and we were dismissed until the evening session, at eight o'clock.

THURSDAY EVENING

The evening service was opened with congregational singing. Miss Mary Lou Sandlin rendered a solo, "I'd Rather have Jesus." We were then led in chorus singing by Mrs. L. E. Ballard, president of the State Woman's Auxiliary Convention, after which she brought us a very inspiring message from their convention.

FRIDAY MORNING, APRIL 23, 1954

The morning session was opened with congregational singing. Rev. Burkette Raper led the congregation in prayer. Rev. Roy Rikard conducted the morning devotions, using James 1:5 for his Scripture text, subject, "Edifying Christ Through Teaching."

Rev. L. E. Ballard gave a written report about the Cragmont lots leased by the convention. Motion to accept the report. Motion carried,

Motion made for Nominating Committee to nominate three trustees for our property at Cragmont Assembly. Motion carried.

Motion that Executive Board prepare an amendment to the Constitution and

By-Laws to provide for the duties of the trustees for property at Cragmont. Motion carried.

Mrs. W. P. Bunn, chairman of Digest and Reports Committee, gave their report. Motion to accept the report and to give the committee a vote of thanks for their work. Motion carried.

Mr. Milton Wiggs, convention treasurer, gave the treasurer's report. Motion to accept report with a rising vote of thanks. Motion carried.

Mr. Charles Simpson, chairman of Finance Committee, gave their report. Motion to accept report. Motion carried.

Rev. Ballard read the document relating to the agreement between the State Mission Board and the State Sunday School Convention, relative to their plans for mutual cooperation in organizing new Sunday Schools.

Motion to accept Executive Board minutes of August 15, 1953, which were tabled Thursday, was made and passed by unanimous vote.

Motion that written report of agreement between Mission Board and this convention be entered into the minutes. Motion carried.

Mr. Walter Sandlin, chairman of Resolutions Committee, gave their report. Motion to eliminate and strike from the report the first resolution. Motion carried. Motion to accept the balance of the report. Motion carried.

There was a discussion concerning the meeting place for the 1955 convention. There were two petitions submitted: The Free Will Baptist Orphanage, Middlesex, N. C., and Mt. Allen College, Mount Olive, N. C. The convention voted to go to Mt. Allen College. Mr. Fountain Taylor stated that the assembly grounds for the Third Eastern District would probably be ready by next year, and that their district would cooperate with the college in entertaining the convention. Motion was amended to accept the joint invitation.

Motion for field secretary to make available the posters needed to use in local Sunday Schools for training purposes, with the details of this service to be worked out by the Executive Board. Motion carried.

Mr. Albert Proctor, chairman of Nominating Committee, gave the committee's report. Motion to accept report. Motion carried.

Rev. Rashie Kennedy conducted the installation service. It was a very impressive service, challenging each officer and director with their respective duties and responsibilities.

The closing Hymn was "Blest Be the Tie," and we were dismissed by prayer.

Minutes of Executive Board Meetings

OF THE

NORTH CAROLINA SUNDAY SCHOOL CONVENTION INSTITUTE

May 9, 1953

The Executive Board of the State Sunday School Convention Institute met at Hopewell Church May 9, 1953. The meeting was called to order by the president. Prayer was offered by Rev. L. E. Ballard.
