# PROCEEDINGS

The Women's Auxiliary Convention of the Free Will Baptist Church in North Carolina, held its twelfth annual session with the Hopewell Church on May fourth and fifth, 1938.

The morning devotions began at 10:30 and were led by the Rev. J. H. Worley of Selma. Greetings from the local church were extended by Mrs. Herman Johnson and the response on the part of the Convention was made by Mrs. C. B. Thompson of Goldsboro.

The president's message pertained to the different departments and stressed in particular the Educational Loan Fund.

The minutes were read by the secretary and approved with the following correction: Rev. R. N. Hinnant conducted the devotional at the evening service at the previous session instead of Rev. G. C. Joyner.

Special music was rendered by the Revs. Pittman and Hinnant.

The following committees were appointed:

Nominations-Mrs. L. H. Wetherington, Mrs. W. C. Sasser, Mrs. J. R. Hoggard.

Banner-Mrs. E. C. Morris, Mrs. Bessie Holland, Mrs. James Hinson.

Resolutons-Mrs. M. A. Woodard, Mrs. R. F. Pittman, Mrs. J. W. Overman.

Revs. Pittman and Hinnant sang "I'm Satsfied with Jesus." The morning message was then delivered by the Rev. R. N. Hinnant, based on a recent trip to the Holy Land,

Mrs. M. A. Woodard, in the absence of Mrs. W. G. Wilson, led the afternoon devotions. Prayer was offered by the Rev. R. P. Harris. A male quartet composed of Revs. Tyson, Hinnant, Pittman, and Melvin sang. A new society reported to the Convention from Tippett's Chapel, Western District.

Reports of Vice-presidents were given. (See reports)

Rev. G. C. Joyner, pastor of the Smithfield Church, gave the financial status of his church, stating their needs and asking that some action be taken to help them save the church property. A motion prevailed that the following committee be appointed to devise ways and means of assisting the Smithfield Church. Mrs. M. L. Johnson, Mrs. G. B. Thompson and Mrs. J. C. Griffin. This committee reported as follows: "Your committee on the

Smithfield Church recommends that the matter be taken up with each local aid. Let them state the amount for which they are willing to become responsible. Each District President to keep in touch with each Aid and see that the pledges are paid."

A group of girls from the Orphanage sang "Somebody Needs a Blessing." Rev. M. E. Tyson, superintendent, spoke concerning recent improvements at the home and stressed the Rally Day to be held on May 11th. The girls then sang, "Love Is the Theme."

News from our missionaries was given by Mrs. J. H. Oglesby. Facts were given concerning their work. And a personal letter to the Convention from Mrs. T. H. Willey was read. A motion was carried that Rev. Henry Melvin be Mrs. Oglesby's co-worker in sending the motor to Rev. Willey, missionary to South America.

Reports from the various districts were given by the following:

Pee Dee by Mrs. Georgie Frost Barnes; Albemarle by Mrs. E. C. Morris and the Western by Mrs. S. H. Styron.

The singing of the Doxology concluded the day's session.

#### Evening Session

The evening session was devoted to a service of fellowship. This service was led by Mrs. J. H. Oglesby. The congregation sang "Willing Am I," and "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms." Mrs. Maggie Overman led the assemblage in prayer. "Wear a Crown" was sung by the congregation, which was followed by a message on the "Meaning of Fellowship" by the Rev. S. H. Styron. He gave various Scriptures and an original poem in discussing the theme. The congregation then sang "When We All Get to Heaven."

The president expressed appreciation for the fellowship she had with her co-workers since serving in that capacity.

Rev. R. N. Hinnant continued his message on the Holy Land. Describing many scenes which coincide with the Scriptures. Mrs. Georgie Frost Barnes then sang, "You and I." Rev. Teague, Missionary Baptist pastor expressed his enjoyment of the convention. Rev. M. L. Johnson pronounced the benediction.

#### Morning Session

The morning session opened with the congregation singing "Jesus Calls Us." Sentence prayers were led by Mrs. J. H. Oglesby. Matthew 26:30 formed the basis for the morning's meditation. The hymn "Take My Life and Let It Be" sung by the congregation closed the devotions.

Brief reports were given of the following districts: Pee Dee, Eastern, Cape Fear and Central.

The congregation enjoyed a solo sung by the Rev. R. F. Pittman. Rev. J.C. Griffin led in prayer for the mother of Mrs. Alice E. Luption, National President.

The minutes of the previous day were read and approved.

Motion carried that \$300.00 be kept in the treasury at all times for any emergency.

Motion sustained that the Educational Loan Fund be recorded.

The directors for Orphanage and Literature and Publications made their reports. (see reports)

The National Report was read by Mrs. E. P. Harris.

The following delegates were appointed: National Convention, Mrs. C. B. Thompson. State Association of Churches, Mrs. R. N. Hinnant.

Rev. R. N. Hinnant explained the work of the pastor's School to be held at Davis in the summer.

The banner was awarded to the Eastern District which had made a gain of ten new societies.

The report on petitions read and accepted. The Church of Johnson's Union was the only church petitioning for the 1939 session.

Motion carried that another cup be bought for the Stewardship Contest.

A model Aid Meeting was given by the Eastern District which was both helpful and interesting.

#### Afternoon Session

Mrs. Henry Watson led the afternoon devotion. "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms" was sung. Scripture read by leader and paryer offered by the Rev. S. H. Styron.

Finance report read and accepted.

Motion made that all extra monies be placed in the general fund.

Report of nomination read and accepted. The following officers being elected: Mrs. Henry Melvin, president; Mrs. J. C. Griffin, vice-president; Mrs. Herman Nobles, treasurer; Mrs. D. W. Parker, recording secretary; Mrs. J. P. Barrow, corresponding secretary.

A rising vote of thanks was tendered Mrs. G. F. Barnes for her faithfulness and loyalty during her term of office.

The report of the Resolutions committee was accepted as read.

The report of the Finance and Apportionment Committee read and accepted.

A rising vote of thanks was tendered the Church and community for their hospitality in entertaining the Convention.

Stewardship report by the president and contest conducted. The cup was awarded to Issabelle Barrington of the Eastern District.
