# PROCEEDINGS

The Women's Auxiliary Convention of the Free Will Baptist Church in North Carolina, held its thirteenth annual session with the Johnson Union Church on May third and fourth, 1939.

Song at this time was "Take Time to Be Holy" with prayer by the Rev. J. C. Griffin. Adjournment for lunch.

The opening song of the afternoon session was "Love Divine All Love Excelling" with Mrs. Frank Shirley in charge of devotions; reading all of the fifteenth chapter of the Gospel according to John. A duet at this time was rendered by the Revs. R. E. Tripp and E. C. Morris.

The congregation became refreshed by singing "When the Roll is Called Up Yonder."

The Rev. M. E. Tyson represented the orphanage. He made mention of all facilities that the ladies have placed there and gratitude was expressed for same. A very beautiful memorial service was conducted by Mrs. Major Williams for our deceased workers who have gone on for their reward.

The Declamation Contest was conducted by Mrs. Clarence Bowen. The intermediate winner was Lorena Morgan of Selma, and the junior winner, Madge Davis of Tees Chapel; the former of the Western District and the latter of the Cape Fear.

Anyone who heard the splendid missionary program could not shut his heart to those who are in darkness, but gave of their means and then went home with new zeal to work harder for the Master. The program was conducted by our third vice president, Mrs. J. H. Oglesby and given by the Bridgeton Church Missionary Society. An offering taken amounted to \$10.34. Dismissal by prayer.

Rev. R. N. Hinnant, delegate from the State Association to our Convention, voiced pleasure of being with us.
