PROCEEDINGS

The Eighteenth Annual Auxiliary of North Carolina met with St. Mary's Church, Wilson County, Thursday, May 24, 1945.

The opening hymn for the convention was "Give of Your Best to the Master," followed by a period of meditation led by Mrs. R. C. Wiggs, speaking from Phil. 3: 8, using as her subject, "That I May Win Christ."

Words of welcome were spoken by Mrs. Ruby Narron with response by Mrs. Lillie Mae Sasser.

MORNING SESSION

A letter was read from our president, Mrs. Clarence Bowen, stating due to recent illness it was impossible for her to attend. Also a letter was read from Mrs. Oliver Smith, our recording secretary expressing regrets at not being able to attend as she was out of the state with her husband in service.

After the reading of the minutes and roll call of officers the following ministers were recognized: Henry Melvin, E. G. Holland, T. E. Beaman, J. H. Worley, J. C. Griffin, W. A. Hales, Albert Harris, M. L. Johnson, J. R. Forrest.

Mrs. J. C. Griffin, 2nd Vice-President, acting as President, asked the body to be much in prayer for the success of the day as sickness and other hindrances kept our officials from being present. Only three officers were present to carry on the necessary routine business and substitutes were appointed.

REPORTS OF THE VICE-PRESIDENTS

First—Mrs. Raymond Sasser, being unable to attend, her report was read by acting secretary. She urged each auxiliary to have a library or reading circle. By reading, the more we want to do. We cannot learn or do too much, so let's get busy for our Master.

Second—Mrs. J. C. Griffin spoke encouraging about all phases of her work, challenging us to do better the coming year.

Third—Mrs. R. C. Wiggs gave an interesting mission report and presented the urgent need for a chapel to be erected on our mission field in Cuba.

Fourth—Mrs. Paul Thigpen, unable to attend, her report read. She asked each auxiliary to take a Stewardship offering to buy tracts to distribute to our service men.

Fifth—Mrs. J. C. Moye, unable to attend. Orphanage report given by Superintendent Evans. He urged the need of single sheets and pillow cases.

Sixth—Mrs. T. E. Beaman, unable to attend, her report read by acting secretary.

The oldest minister present, Rev. J. H. Worley, gave us some encouraging facts concerning the auxiliary work and challenged us to go on higher heights and greater service in the future, than we had done in the past.

Preparatory to the convention message the congregation was led in song by Rev. Albert Harris.

We enjoyed the able delivered message by Rev. Henry Melvin, using as his subject, "Maximum Christians," taken from Phil. 3: 8. The speaker stresses to be maximum Christians: 1st. We must be found in Him; 2nd. Know Him. 3rd. Be an example. 4th. Stand fast in the faith. 5th. Seek to reach the greatest quantity attainable.

The convention was dismissed for lunch. Rev. W. A. Hales pronounced the benediction.

AFTERNOON SESSION

Rev. R. C. Wiggs, substituting for Mrs. Ruth Moye Clark, led the devotions, using as his subject "Our Maximum for Others." Scripture taken from Romans 10: 1. He said the Willey's were an example of a couple that have and are giving "Our Maximum for Others." The hymn, "Tell Me the Story of Jesus," was sung, followed by prayer.

Rev. James A. Evans, Superintendent of the Orphanage, and Mrs. L. E. Ballard, brought news from the Home at this time. Mr. Evans said that most of the funds raised for the Orphanage, women helped raise them, they assist in clothing, feeding, educating, and physical training of the children of the Orphanage. Mrs. Ballard told of the Christmas party being very much enjoyed by the children and Mrs. Herman Nobles, was adopted as Orphanage mother for the year, having done much for the happiness of the children on several occasions. Offering was taken for the home amounting to \$61.64.

The report of the field worker was received.

The reports of the secretary and treasurer were received.

The committee on reports made honorable mention of all Districts but no banner was awarded as they did not know where banner was.

One petition for next year's session was reported: Union Grove, Wayne County. This invitation was accepted.

The Finance and Apportionment Committee made its report and it was received. (See reports.)

Mrs. L. E. Ballard requested that we have daily vacation Bible School in every church and use the three young girls available from our Bible school.

Mrs. Bruce Barrow was designated as our delegate to the National Auxiliary.

Mrs. J. H. Oglesby presided over the memorial service.

A rising vote of thanks was extended to Mrs. Nobles for fine way she has kept treasurer, without pay for several years.

The secretary was asked to send greetings to Mrs. J. C. Moye, who was unable to attend due to illness.

The song "Blest Be the Tie," was sung. We were dismissed by Mrs. Katie Sawyer Jackson.

Two districts reported by letter, and their reports may be summarized as follows:

Rock Fish Auxiliary—No convention this year due to gas shortage and other hindrances—local work doing fine.

Piedmont—No statistics—report local work doing well. Letters were written to the first vice-president of the Central and Pee Dee Auxiliary, but to date their reports have not been received.

During the year two articles were written and published in the Baptist in the interest of our work. The first article concerned the observance of special months of enlistment of new members and gave suggestions for holding and bringing back old members. The fact that a 10% increase in membership and an average attendance of 50% is necessary to be an A-1 auxiliary was also stressed.

The second article was an appeal for auxiliaries to organize a circulating library or reading circle. By reading we learn and the more we learn, the more we want to do. We cannot learn or do too much, so let's get busy for our Master.
