

PROCEEDINGS

The Nineteenth Annual Auxiliary of North Carolina met with Union Grove Church, Wayne County, May 23, 1946.

The opening hymn, "Take Time to be Holy," followed by a period of meditation led by Mrs. Leon Godwin, speaking on the subject: "Ourselves for Christ." Prayer by Mrs. M. L. Johnson.

MORNING SESSION

Our President made timely remarks for the opening of convention, stressing the need of cooperation in carrying out a successful day in all phases of our Woman's Auxiliary work.

After the reading of the minutes and roll call of officers, the following ministers were recognized: Revs. J. R. Bennett, Henry Melvin, Bruce Barrow, M. W. Roach, P. D. Hamilton, J. D. Vernelson, E. G. Holland, J. Albert Harris, W. H. Lancaster, G. C. Joyner, W. R. Williams, M. A. Woodard, Clinton Lupton, F. A. Rivenbark, S. A. Smith, W. K. Jordan, Rashie Kennedy, J. C. Griffin, Thos. E. Beaman, J. W. Alford, J. H. Worley, Mrs. Lizzie McAdams, Mrs. Gladys Beame.

Mrs. Moye explained why we needed three more members to the advisory Board for Cragmont, Those being appointment at an Executive Committee meeting at Ayden. Thus making the committee as follows: Mrs. J. C. Moye (47), Chairman; Mrs. Elizabeth Pollard (48); Mrs. N. E. Harris (49); Mrs. Bagley Morris (50); Mrs. M. E. Godwin (51); Mrs. Walter Rhodes (52). Rev. Henry Melvin further explained that it was a requirement of the main State Board and article VI—Cragmont Assembly One, was read, as follows; To own six shares of stock in the Cragmont Assembly, Inc., as one of the four organized State bodies of Free Will Baptist of North Carolina who were the original organizers of our State Assembly grounds to represent our convention at annual stockholders meetings, and on other official business, the convention shall elect the six stockholders on the five, four, three, two, one years. Thereafter at each annual convention a new member shall be elected for a term of six years,

REPORTS OF VICE-PRESIDENTS

First—Mrs. M. A. Woodard gave an interesting report on the church library work and stressed the need of placing wholesome reading material in reach of our children and young people.

Second—Mrs. M. L. Johnson, made her report on Christian Education, challenging us to help train our youth to a more excellent standard.

Third—Mrs. Alice E. Lupton urged the Third Vice-Presidents to be more

co-operative with the Missionary program and that we pray and work together for its promotion and extension.

Fourth—Mrs. E. G. Holland asked each individual to encourage our knowledge of the trust which God has placed in our hands, as faithful stewards in the service of the Lord.

Fifth—Mrs. J. C. Moye gave a glowing orphanage report and set her goal as \$1,000.00 for the coming year. She asked that we continue our support in all the different phases for the home and its needs.

Sixth—Mrs. James A. Evans, reminded us to not forget our old ministers who had so faithfully paved the way for us of to-day.

Preparatory to the Convention message the congregation was led in song "Living for Jesus," by Rev. Albert Harris.

We had a real spiritual feast in the message by Rev. Clinton Lupton, using as his subject "Our Lives for Christ," Phil. 1:21. "For me to Live is Christ, and to die is gain." He challenged us to live for Christ, what our lives would mean for Christ and our lives should speak for Christ and our gain would be everlasting life.

An offering was taken for the Orphanage amounting to \$75.00. Closing song 238. We were dismissed for lunch by Rev. Phillip Woodard.

AFTERNOON SESSION

Mrs. Walter Rhodes led the devotions in the afternoon session, using as her subject, "Our Possessions for Christ." The song "Lead on, O King Eternal," was sung by congregation.

Mrs. Marie Gaskins presided over a very impressive memorial service and Rev. Albert Harris sang, "At the End of the Road."

The fourth, fifth and sixth Vice-Presidents gave their reports, (see reports)

The field worker gave her report. (see report)

The reports of the secretary and the treasurer were received.

A motion was made and second to use "Book Fund" in treasurer, on quota for the college expansion program.

Rev. J. R. Bennett made timely remarks on Christian Education. He said in part, churches want the best educated preachers, we have the doctrine, we want it presented properly. He asked this Woman's State Auxiliary to help put across the \$100,000.00 campaign for new purchases at the College. This must be raised this year and North Carolina's quota is \$20,000.00.

We heard a report on the ministers institute at Cragmont.

Rev. J. C. Griffin, field secretary for the state Association, was presented by President. Mr. Griffin outlined some of the work of our State and National bodies, with special emphasis on the Five-Point Program in North Carolina.

One petition for next year's session was reported: Edgemont Church, Durham, N. C. This invitation was accepted.

The finance and apportionment committee made its report and it was received. (see report)

Mrs. Ballard gave a summary of the plans for the Woman's conference at Cragmont August 25-31, 1946, urging our women to attend.

Motion made and carried to include in our constitution and By-laws, The article VI of our State Sunday School convention. Motion carried to own six shares of stock in Cragmont Assembly, Inc., as one of the four organized State bodies of Free Will Baptist of North Carolina who were the original organizers of our State Assembly grounds. These to represent our Women's Auxiliary convention at annual stockholders meetings.

A committee was appointed to work out a new report blank at earliest date possible to meet the needs of our present day work. Committee as follows: Mrs. M. A. Woodard, chr. Mrs. M. E. Godwin, Mrs. Bruce Barrow, Mrs. J. R. Bennett, and Mrs. J. C. Sasser.

The needs of the orphanage was expressed as new single bedspreads.

The Nominating committee gave their report.

A motion was made and carried to retain Mrs. Herman Nobles as treasurer for Anna Phillips Loan Fund.

The Resolutions Committee gave their report. (See reports)
The closing song was a duet by Mrs. Ballard and Mrs. Moye.
We were dismissed with prayer by Mrs. Georgia Frost Barnes.
